# Jews Kill British Hostages

JERUSALEM —(AP)— The Irgun Zvai Leumi, Jewish underground agency, asserted Wednesday it had hanged two kidnaped British sergeants in reprisal for the execution of three of its members.

An extensive search by Welsh guards, Palestine police and a group of reporters for two hours along the coastal plains disclosed no trace of the bodies.

Police, the military and Jewish sources said they had no clue as to the whereabouts of the sergeants. An Irgun "communique" had asserted that the bodies would be found within two and a half miles of Natanya, where the hostages were kidnaped July 12.

The underground Jewish organiat Natanya, were tried by a "military court" and convicted on charges of "illegal entry into Palestine, being members of an illegal British criminal terrorist organization known as the British Occupation Force in Palestine, which is responsible for the suppression of Jewish rights in Palestine and for the deportation of Jewish citizens

from their homeland." As members of the British Army, the sergeants also were accused by Irgun of what it called the "murder" of Jewish women and children and of "illegal possession" of

The Irgunists hanged by the British were Meir Nakar, Absolom Habib and Yacoub Weiss. They had been condemned for the shooting, bombing jail delivery at Acre prison May 4 in which 251 convicts were set free and 16 persons killed.

The opening diamond lead was won in dummy with the ace, declarer playing the six. He led the three of spades from dummy and finessed the jack. When it held, he ruffed the three of diamonds in dummy and led the four of spades, finessing the queen.

Next the six of hearts was led and dummy's queen held the trick. The ace of hearts was cashed, and Maschke was careful to play the four from his own hand. The ten of spades was led to declarer's ace and the eight and six of spades cashed.

Now Maschke was down to the four deuces. When the six of spades was led both West and East were squeezed. When Maschke led the spade deuce, West let go the king of hearts, so the nine was discarded from dummy.
