

# Young Hero Has Been Unconscious 11 Months

SAN ANTONIO —(P)— Dickie Armstrong of Somerset will be 11 vears old next Tuesday—but his birthday may mean little to him. Dickie has been unconscious for almost a year because he made a heroic attempt to halt a runaway horse. He was injured Sept. 11, 1945, when he was thrown from his own horse in an effort to catch up with one which his seven-year-old sister war riding.

The girl was not injured, but Dickie was hurt badly.

He was rushed to a San Antonio hospital suffering from severe concussion of the brain. An emergency operation revealed he had sustained by a famous model, whose multiple "pin-point hemorrages." Dickie has outlived predictions that he would not survive, but he



# Hiroshima Two Years

in warfare exploded over this city of 343,000 people, causing 306,545 casualties, is still painfully trying to pick up the pieces. The blast killed 78,150 people and simply obliterated 60 per cent of the city. Today, approximately 50 per cent of the stricken area has been rebuilt and much of the debris removed. But there is still plenty of evidence of the terrible fate that overtook Hiroshima on Aug. 5, 1945. 



A study made by the statistical offices of the three German states in the American zone reported that the average essential expenditures of a normal consumer's family of five ranged from 170 to 185 marks in a four week's period. However, there wasn't a single industrial group in which the average earning male workers reached that level. Earning data available up to last September showed that un-

skilled building workers averaged only 131 marks in a four-week pe-Even semi - skilled and skilled workers in a number of industrial groups earned wages below expenditures.

The study emphasized that the figures on expenditures were a conservative estimate of the cost of essential goods and services and actually represent a lower level of consumption than the one on which the cost-of-living index is based. # Gold Star For Congress

The 80th Congress, which didn't make too impressive a record in its first semester, worked hard to bring up its marks in the last few days before vacation. One result of this effort, which certainly deserves a gold star, was the passage of a bill creating a 10-man joint congressional aviation policy board.

The country has been needing a group to formulate air policy for two years. Now it has two, for the President named a five-man civilian board a few days before Congress acted. It remains to be seen whether two sets of heads are better than one.

With all the work there is to be done, it is to be hoped that the two boards will co-ordinate, co-operate, and avoid the jealousies, jurisdictional disputes and politics that could foul the whole operation.

Two principal jobs are facing these two boards. They must work out a long-range plan for a national air demust work out a long-range plan for a national air defense system, and they must map a future program for a Wants Peek At Future's Planning national air transportation system.

In the defense category, a decision has to be made on how much of a production nucleus aircraft manufacturing needs. How many plane factories are to stay in business, and how many must liquidate or go into other lines of work on a full-time basis, as most of them are doing part-time today?

It will be up to these boards to decide how modern a military and commercial air force this country must have. How hotly is the United States going to pursue other nations in developing new types of engines and planes, and in mass production? Are we going to spend the hundreds of millions necessary to develop those much-talked-of supertransports and put them in the air?

It is certain that this can't be done under present conditions. Last year, both the airplane manufacturing and transport industries as a whole wound up badly in the red.

There has got to be planning and money for research on the manufacturing side, and for general airway development in operations. Such divergent things as airport expansion, all-weather flying and other safety measures, and payments for carrying air mail are all parts of the

Since the world is in the state that it is, there must be thought given to a procurement program in case of emer-Obviously, the ideal result of such a program would be a whole aircraft manufacturing and operating system just large enough for safety and efficiency, small enough to avoid an onerous burden of expense, and organized for quick and orderly expansion.


That is a big order. How well it is filled will depend on how well the two boards realize the potential advan-tage of their setup. Ideally they can perform a liaison Most of the 40,000 assorted cryfunction between Congress and the President, to whom the civilian board is responsible. If they can agree and work together, much valuable time can be saved. 


