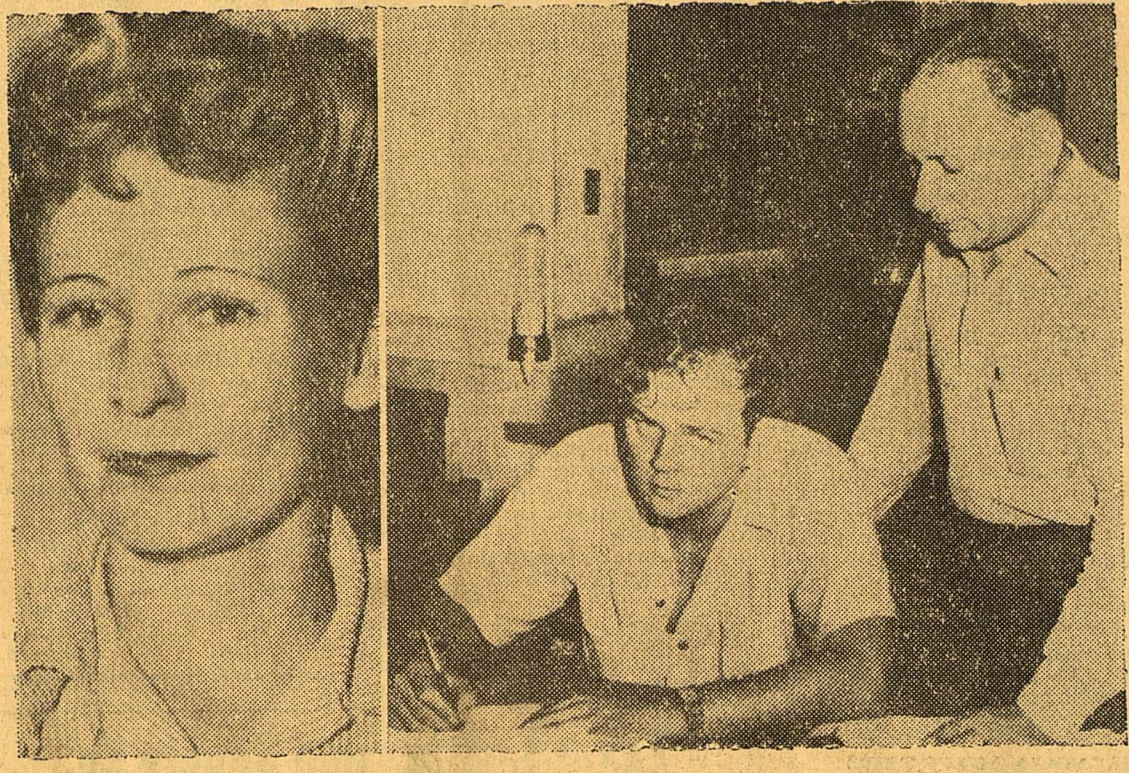

Several attempts to make such an investigation had failed when the packer slipped. Currently the packer was at 8,357 feet.

MAGNOLIA AGAIN TRIES TO TEST NO. 1 WHEELER

Magnolia Petroleum Company No. 1 Wheeler, East-Central Winkler County wildcat, 660 feet from south and east lines of section 13, block 40, psi survey, and five miles west of the Wheeler field, tried a drillstem test at 9,389-9,447 feet in the Devonian. The packer failed. There was no test. An effort was being made to take a test at from 9,332 feet to the total depth at 9,447 feet.

Magnolia No. 1-DD State-Walton, about three and one-half miles north and slightly east of Kermit, and 2,310 feet from south and 990 feet from east lines of section 7, block B-3, psi survey, was drilling ahead below 8,263 feet in Devonian chert. No effort has been made to run a test on this project, since one run to total depth of 8,257 feet, had a recovery of a small amount of drilling fluid, with no shows of oil, gas or water.

BORES WARDENS BOAR HUNTING

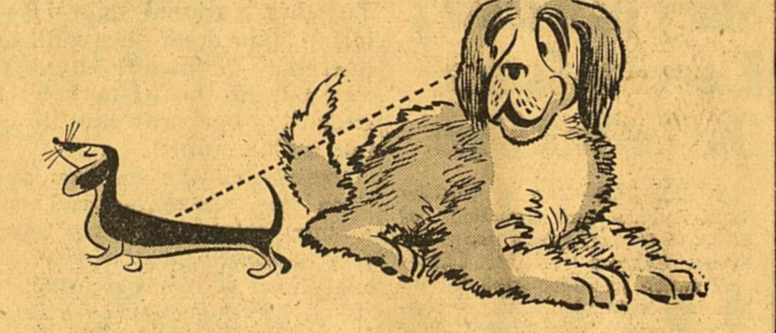

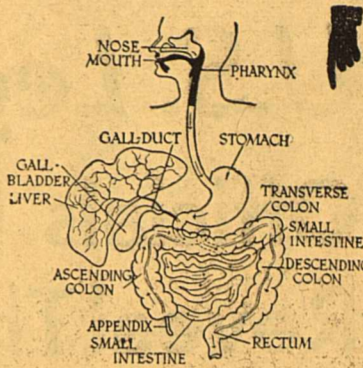

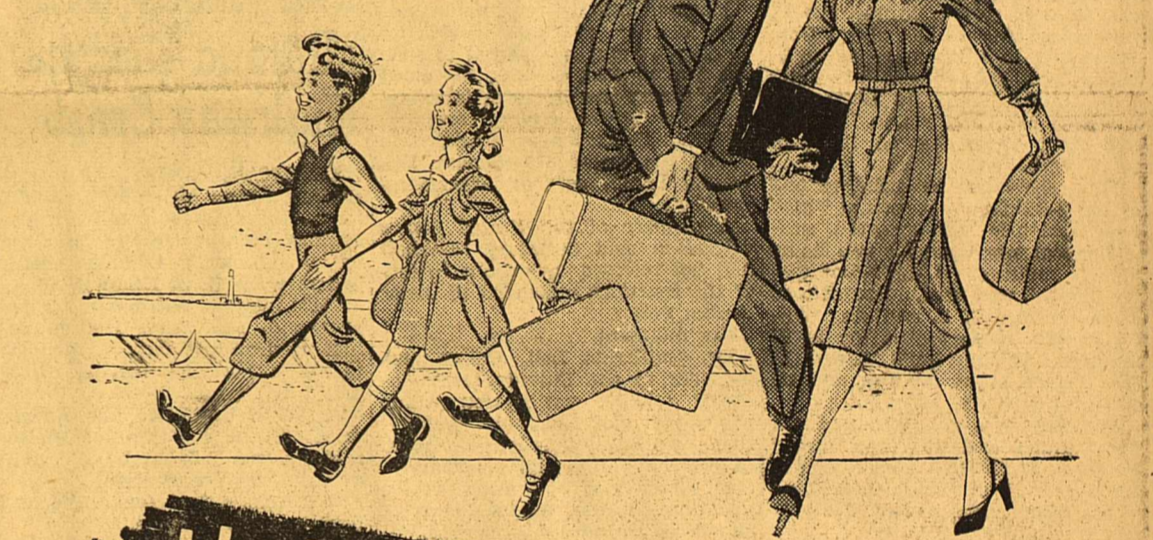

Monahans Scores Again

Hats off to the citizens of Ward County who again this year at Monahans staged the biggest and most successful V-J Day celebration in Texas and the Southwest.

The event, well arranged and exceptionally well handled, attracted thousands of visitors from over a wide area, and received favorable publicity for Monahans and for the Permian Basin area.

The staging of such a celebration requires work, planning and then more work, but above all is required the full assistance and cooperation of the citizens as a whole. The alert, energetic and progressive residents of our neighboring city of Monahans went all-out in sponsoring and staging the successful affair. The event certainly was in keeping with the occasion which it celebrated.

Monahans citizens last year hit upon the idea of celebrating V-J Day and of making it the outstanding event of its kind in this area. The 1946 affair was so outstanding and so successful that they decided to make it an annual occasion. The Ward County V-J Day celebration now is an established institution of the Permian Basin.

Congratulations to Ward Countians and best wishes for their future celebrations.

Bluff Alone Won't Do It

There has been quite a migration recently into the American occupation zone of Germany from the east. German war prisoners are being sent back from Russia at the rate of about 1,500 a week. An official report says all of them are unfit for work. Hard labor and scanty rations have made them useless to the Soviet government. Now the Americans get to feed them.

These prisoners from behind the iron curtain have some interesting stories to tell. Whether they are based on fact or wild surmise we do not know. But they sound disturbingly plausible. At any rate, let us add these stories to what else is known about Russia and try to revise the general picture. Assuming the stories to be true, we get something like this:

The Russians are maintaining a huge force of men under arms. They are experimenting in the field of new weapons. But they are also concentrating on conventional munitions and armaments. Inferior labor and material are going into the production of consumer goods. The best labor and material are being used to get ready for World War III.

The new Soviet line of "re-education," for the lads who enjoyed their taste of non-Communist life while on European duty, is this: Europe lost two world wars because her people insisted on living high. Russia pulled in her belt and won World War II single-handed. Now, by concentrating on guns instead of butter, she is preparing to win the inevitable third world war. After that, perhaps, there will be pie in the sky. But not now.

All this fits in interestingly with an article in this month's American magazine called "Let's Have a Show-down With Russia." It is by Rep. Charles A. Eaton, chairman of the House Foreign Affairs Committee, a former Baptist minister, and scarcely a man of a war-mongering nature.

Eaton, like many Americans, is fed up with Russian deception and evasions. "Russia today is maintaining a larger military force than any other nation has ever maintained in peacetimes," he writes. "And still her leaders are crying for the rest of the world to disarm. Their audacity is unmatched in world diplomacy."

He suggests that America call the Soviet bluff by an aggressive attitude, assume active leadership of the peace and freedom-loving nations, and read Russia out of the United Nations if necessary.

That is an appalling extremity, though it may yet be necessary. However, there is no present assurance that, if psychology failed and force had to be used, the ensuing holocaust would end in a victory for freedom.

We may argue today that the United States can out-produce Russia, and that Western Europe can out-produce the Russian orbit. We may argue that the Russian people do not want war, and that there can be no real unity in a country where half the population is hired by the secret police to spy on the other half.

But the real question is what Russia, through threats and force, can do with the hand she holds. Before this government calls Russia's bluff, it must be dead sure that it has the high cards.

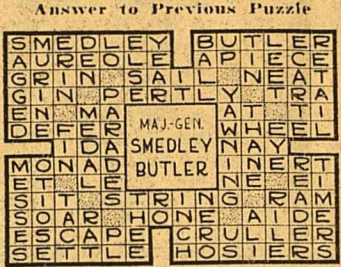
Selling Capitalism

This seems like a wonderful opportunity to tell Europeans at first hand, and in an unofficial way, of the workings of the economic system on which free Europe pins its hopes. An active, healthy capitalism is creating the prosperity without which the Marshall Plan or any similar plan won't work. Crude Production Is Up Week Of Aug. 16

TULSA, OKLA.—(AP)—Production of United States crude oil reached a new all-time high for the week ending August 16 when production averaged 5,165,175 barrels daily, an increase of 51,535 barrels over the previous week the Oil and Gas Journal said Tuesday.

Texas also established a new record of 2,306,050 barrels when it jumped 22,550 barrels over the previous week. Kansas with a gain of 17,250 barrels to 300,350, is at the highest level since August 18, 1943.

Other large gains include: Wyoming up 5,310 barrels to 121,610, Michigan up 5,225 barrels to 47,140, California up 4,900 to 925,700, Colorado up 4,040 to 44,100, Montana up 1,160 to 24,110, and Oklahoma up 1,150 to 389,700.

Eastern was down 3,300 barrels to 63,500, Illinois down 3,200 to 174,000, Indiana down 1,850 to 15,950, and Mississippi was down 1,600 barrels to 98,335.

LUBBOCK — (AP) — The Texas Technological College homecoming will be held Nov. 29 instead of Oct. 18.

"I, for one, would be for telling Joe Stalin to stop right now. And if it came to war, which would be extremely unlikely at this stage, we would be in better shape to fight now than we would be at a future date when Russia would be fully entrenched in the smaller nations around her, and fully armed and equipped for war, and perhaps in possession of the secret of the atom bomb." Gary said he is for cutting national expenses in order that taxes may be lowered, especially for the low-income groups.

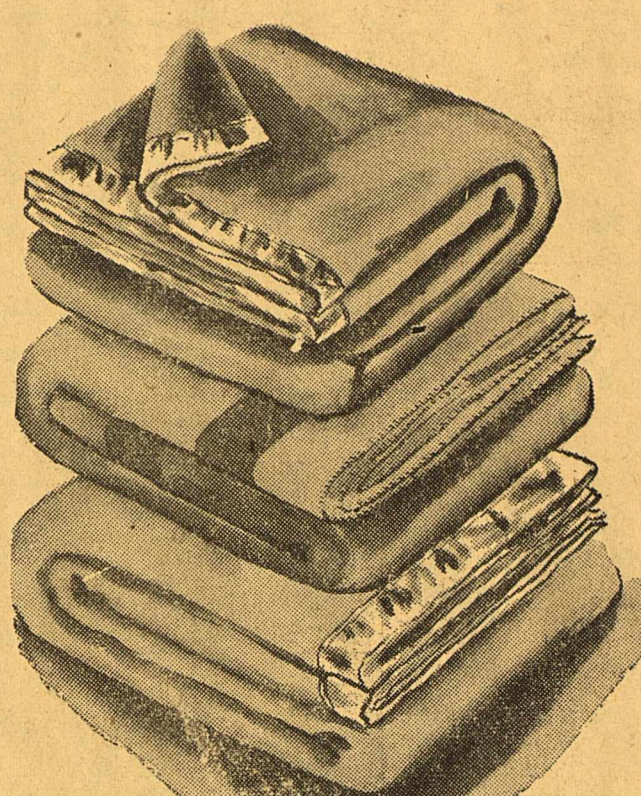
