The petroleum developed in test is the first free oil the wildcat has reported. The nearest Silurian production is a considerable distance from this new dev-

American Aid Saved Greece

WASHINGTON—(AP)—President Truman told Congress Monday "Greece is still free" because of American aid but her economic plight "has not basically improved" and the military picture is worse.

That is the way Truman sized things up as of September 30, four months after Congress set up a \$400,000,-000 fund to help Greece and Turkey combat Communistic pressure from inside and outside their borders.

The President expressed* "grave concern" that "underlying causes of economic Chinese Air and political unrest" still exst in Greece.

But in his first report to Congress on how the aid money is being used, the nearest thing to a hint that more might be asked was a state-

"The difficulties which hamper the success of this program must be overcome. Continuation of marginal subsistence only in Greece, without real progress toward recovery will provide fertile ground for totalitarian ideologies.'

The presidential report showed that up to September 30 only \$17,-460,171 of Greece's \$300,000,000 and \$1.549 of Turkey's \$100,000,000 actually had been spent with \$150,182 sed for administrative expenses However, \$154,665,000 had been made available to the various agencies carrying out the Greek program and \$20,012,000 to be spent for Turkey. Truman Is Optimistic

The report listed numerous "unfavorable developments" which have beset the air programs but said that in Greece "there is every reason to be optimistic about recovery"-if order can be restored.

"If order is not restored," Truman said, "there can be no recovery."

As for the military situation, the President said the Greek government had hoped a Summer campaign would wipe out guerrilla warfare. "However," he added, "the con-

PEIPING —(AP)—Fighting on a scale unparalleled since the bitter siege of Szepingkai early this year raged Monday at Shihkiachwang, 170 miles southwest of Peiping, and 100,000 Chinese Communists arrayed against the rail city.

Frontline dispatches reported 10, 000 of the attackers were casualties in the initial fighting in which government planes were used in unprecedented strength on orders of Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek. In Manchuria, meanwhile, government dispatches told of 7,000 Communists killed and 1,000 captured in "great victory" near Changwu, 60 miles north of Mukden. More conservative accounts placed the Communist dead at 4,000 and the captured at 500. Villages Are Fired



Edict From Caesar

James Caesar Petrillo's ban against the making of ecords and transcriptions by members of his American Federation of Musicians has caused quite a stir. But, to anyone who has followed Petrillo's career, the move was not unexpected. It was simply the longest and boldest step he has taken toward two goals which he has long been trying to reach.

One goal is to bring technical progress to a standstill. Petrillo hates the radio and its offshoots and the phonograph because, he says, they destroy employment opporunities for musicians. Probably he can no more stop this progress than the buggy-makers could prevent the development of the automobile. But that doesn't keep him

The other goal is to reduce the music business to a dead commercial level of full employment. For years Petrillo has been working to minimize, even destroy, the competition arising from the wide variance of artistic skill among union musicians. His attitude is best summed up n his now famous appraisal of Jascha Heifetz: "He just another fiddler, ain't he?"

There is some justice on the AFM president's side. Certainly it is not right that a disk jockey should make \$400,000 a year—as at least one is reputed to do—just for Midland by a commission apselecting, announcing and playing records and reading pointed by the Presbytery of El commercials, while the musicians who make the records get nothing but their initial recording fee.

But there are also injustices and weaknesses. This ban on records and transcriptions will virtually drive the record manufacturers out of business in time. It will seiously hamper the operation and entertainment standard of many radio stations, and sharply curtail programs.

In the realm of serious music, Petrillo will be doing

both the public and the symphony orchestras a disservice. Most of these orchestras have a hard enough time keeping out of the red. Cutting off their recording fees and royalties will only make their task more difficult.

Petrillo's lawyers argue that their client has a right o go out of business. But Petrillo is not a manufacturer who shuts down a factory, thus causing unemployment and perhaps curtailing the business of subcontractors or parts suppliers. For the manufacturer cannot forbid his Mr. Lynn was assistant pastor of employes or his subcontractors to seek similar work elsewhere. Petrillo can, or thinks he can.

Perhaps the most interesting thing about the latest Petrillo move is that it is the first lordly prohibition that he has decreed since the Taft-Hartley Act became law. This law no longers permits the AFM president to have private, exclusive control of the \$2,000,000 in annual royalties which the record manufacturers pay the union. There is a suspicion that the new ban may be a dog-in-themanger gesture of defiance.

It remains to be seen how the members who depend for part of their living on records and transcriptions will take this. Petrillo would do well to remember that John L. Lewis, also a powerful man, got a powerful comeuppance at the recent AFL convention when he tried to make his personal prejudice and personal ambition matters of federation policy.

If that is Petrillo's intention, he also had better have a lot of good excuses to give to the boys who make the music.

One rule of success is "keep at it"-and can be wisely applied to the purchase of government bonds.




ACREAGE FOR SALE

Do you enjoy double dummy bridge problems? A double dummy problem is a hand in which the contract must be made against any possible defense. Many players find them interesting and can recognize one quickly.

Norman Perlstein of Los Angeles, Calif., sent me the one shown today, a thirteen card problem I had never seen before. I have not shown any bidding, bidding is not given in double dummy problems. You are simply told that the final contract is seven spades by South, West opens the queen of clubs, and you are to make seven against any de fense. The best thing to do is to lay the cards out and go to work on the problem. Here is the solution.

For imning with the ace. He cashes the



king of spades and throws the nine-spot from dummy. Then the eight and seven of spades are cashed.

At trick six declarer leads the six of spades, and West, North and East must make a discard. If either West or East discards a heart or a diamond, that is the suit for declarer to lead next. If West and East both discard a club, the rest is simple. Declarer will cash dummy's high club and his own small clubs will be good.

However, if West discards either he nine of hearts or nine of diamonds, declarer leads the suit There are 4,000 miles of electrical discarded, wins in dummy with viring on the Queen Elizabeth, the ace and leads the queen of that suit. East is forced to go up with the king, declarer trumps, and that establishes the five in dummy.

Now let us say that West hangs WASH TUBBS onto his hearts and diamonds, but East discards either the three of hearts or three of diamonds. Again declarer leads the suit discarded by East, wins with dummy's ace. and as East has only the blank king left, the five is led. The king falls and declarer trumps it.

Another interesting variation is to try to make the contract with a heart or diamond opening. It can be made on exactly the same plan.
