

Rodeo ends with memorable ride

It took three nights, but Pete Carr's bulls were finally conquered Saturday night at the 75th Cowboys Reunion and Rodeo.

Well, at least two of them were.

Danny McDowell of Jena, La., opened the bull riding event with an impressive score of 82 on a bull named Blue Chip. Then, for the next seven riders, it appeared he might be the only cowboy to stay on for eight seconds, meaning McDowell would've received the entire purse of more than \$3,000 for the event.

However, the final ride of the night turned out to be one for the ages. Lamesa's Casey Bowman mounted the bull Air Up and delivered the best performance of the night in the judges' minds. After the whistle was blown, signifying that eight seconds had elapsed, Bown was given a score of 93, giving him a gold buckle

and \$1,650.25.

Bull riding was the only event to have its eventual winner perform on the final night.

Ryan Stutes' opening score of 89 proved to be enough to claim the buckle in the bareback riding, netting the Sulphur, La., native \$1,102. Dennis Foyil of Guthrie, Okla., and Frenchman Evan Jayne shared the second-place prize money (\$688.75) with rides of 85.

Native American Todd Rangel of Gladewater and Will Payne of Beaver, Okla., split the top prize in the saddle-bronc with rides scoring 85, netting \$895.37. Amarillo's Jake Halverson and Silverton's Leland Wood posted rides of 84 that were good enough to share the second-place pot of \$463.20.

Cimmaron Thompson of Hobbs, N.M., saw his time of 4.5 seconds hold up in the steer wrestling, netting him \$1129.55. Jake Hodes of Stephenville was just a tenth of second slower for

Busch wins fifth race of year in Sonoma

SONOMA, Calif. — Joe Gibbs Racing officials knew adding Kyle Busch to their organization could be a special pairing.

They had no idea, though, how quickly they'd see a return on their investment.

Busch won his fifth Sprint Cup Series race of the season Sunday when he rolled to victory at Infineon Raceway. With his first road course win, the newcomer and crew chief Steve Addington have grabbed as many victories as teammates Denny Hamlin and Tony Stewart have combined since the

start of the 2007 season.

"When you look at it in the way that switching teams and coming to a new organization and working with Steve ... it's come a long way, our chemistry," Busch said.

A long way in a mere 16 races that have thrust Busch into stardom and made him the favorite to win the championship. He's already earned 50 bonus points to use in seeding for the Chase, and his victory Sunday proved he can rally when his momentum starts to slide.

A two-week slump sent Kyle Busch spiraling into crankiness

Catalanotto's pinch hit delivers Rangers over Nats

WASHINGTON — Frank Catalanotto helped the Texas Rangers to a rare kind of win — one that put them above the .500.

Texas has found it easy to get even but getting over the hump has been a challenge. Even after Catalanotto sparked Sunday's 5-3 win over the Washington Nationals, the Rangers (39-38) are just 4-15 when trying to reach a winning record this season.

"We're a game over .500 right

now," Marlon Byrd said. "On Tuesday, we'll be two games over."

Vicente Padilla (10-3) gave up three runs and five hits over seven innings to win for the eighth time in nine decisions since April 27. He struck out five and walked two, but wasn't in line for the win until the Rangers rallied in the eighth.

"He's been out there, hanging in there," Texas manager Ron Washington said. "He certainly gave us a chance today."

Brandon Boggs reached on a walk off Luis Ayala (1-4), and after Joel Hanrahan came on in relief, Michael Young and Josh Hamilton struck out. Boggs stole second, went to third on a wild pitch, and after a walk to Byrd, Catalanotto dribbled an RBI grounder to left.

Jarrod Saltalamacchia followed with a base hit to give the Rangers a 5-3 lead.

Eddie Guardado pitched a perfect eighth and C.J. Wilson worked the ninth for his 15th

save in 17 chances, sending Washington to its 15th loss in 21 games.

Washington is well aware of his team's struggles to get into the black.

"We've been here before. We've got to continue to play good baseball," Washington said. "And that will take care of itself."

Texas took a 2-0 lead on leadoff home runs by Boggs in the fourth and Ian Kinsler in the sixth. Kinsler's was his 12th of the season and second in two games.

Padilla allowed just one hit in the first five innings — an infield single to Washington starter John Lannan. Willie Harris, who was batting for Lannan, hit a homer to center field with one out in the sixth, his third of the season.

Texas added a run in the seventh on Ramon Vazquez's RBI single off Ayala.

Lannan hasn't won in his last six starts, but kept Washington

in the game. He allowed two runs, four hits and struck out six over six innings, without walking a batter. Lannan bruised his right wrist when Saltalamacchia lined a ball back at him in the fifth. He took his glove off when he was examined by the Nationals' training staff, but he stayed in the game. After he left the game, his wrist was X-rayed, and manager Manny Acta said he expect-

ed him to make his next start. "I didn't see it," Lannan said. "I got my glove on it. I took my glove off, just because it was kind of like pins and needles. So I kind of gave it a squeeze, found the ball and just threw it to first. It's just tight right now, just a little bruised." The Nationals have scored just four runs to support him in his last six starts. "I don't feel bad for him," Acta said. "He knows that everybody here is paying attention of how good he's pitching and how he's doing. Would I want him to have six, seven more wins than he has? Yes, I do."

It looked as if Lannan was going to lose his fifth straight decision, but Ronnie Belliard hit a tying two-run homer — his fifth of the season — with one out in the seventh. Notes: Texas OF Milton Bradley did not start for the fifth straight game. Washington said there were no plans to place him on the disabled list. Washington expects him to be ready to play in Houston on Tuesday. ... RHP Steven Shell made his major league debut for Washington, pitching a scoreless ninth. ... Max Ramirez made his debut for the Rangers at 1B, going 0-for-3. Ramirez was recalled from

Double-A Frisco on Saturday. **Astros 3, Rays 2** At St. Petersburg, Fla., Carlos Lee hit a go-ahead two-run homer and Brandon Backe pitched into the seventh inning to stop a personal three-game losing slide. **Twins 5, Diamondbacks 3** At Minneapolis, Brian Buscher had two hits and drove in two runs, helping the Twins beat struggling Brandon Webb and Arizona. Webb is 2-4 after starting the

season 9-0. **Athletics 7, Marlins 1** At Oakland, Calif., Justin Duchscherer bounced back from a first-inning home run to win his fourth straight start; Emil Brown hit a two-run single and Oakland won the rubber game. **Brewers 7, Orioles 3** At Milwaukee, Prince Fielder hit two home runs, Corey Hart and Bill Hall also went deep and the Milwaukee beat Baltimore for its sixth win in seven games.

despite his hold atop the points standings. But he snapped it with the win, which came in a Toyota that was so bad during practice he was certain he'd wreck. A poor qualifying run gave him the 30th starting position, and he steadily moved through the field and grabbed the lead from defending race winner Juan Pablo Montoya on an early restart. Nobody came close to taking the lead from him the rest of the way, but he did have to hold off a pair of challenges on two late restarts. It was Busch's 11th overall victory this season spanning all three of NASCAR's top series. It also was his second road course victory of the year, following a

Nationwide Series win in Mexico City in April. Busch celebrated with his traditional smoky burnout, then climbed from his car for his customary bow to the crowd. For once, the fans were cheering the driver they so famously love to hate. "I am really impressed with Kyle," said third-place finisher Jeff Gordon, his former teammate. "I've been around him, and I didn't think he's a really good road racer. So I think you've got to give that guy a lot of credit for his talent. To be able to get their car up front and maintain the position ... I would not have bet on that. "Obviously, he's maturing and learning and that's what it's going to take for him to maintain that points lead." Busch and his Joe Gibbs Racing crew had to wrestle with his Toyota to make it comfortable for Busch. The team made a

slew of changes following Friday and Saturday's practice sessions, but Busch still wasn't pleased as the start of the race approached. "I'm not a very happy person right now," he said as he walked into the pre-race driver meeting. That obviously changed as he charged through the field, settling down enough to inquire while leading what kind of food there would be on the plane ride home. "We unloaded here and we were absolutely junk," Busch said. "When we were here Friday, I just thought it was going to be a dismal weekend and I was wondering what tire barrier we were going to put in. It was a bad feeling, but these guys worked so hard. "It's just phenomenal that we're able to be here in Victory Lane — never before on a road course, in the Cup Series, so this

is definitely really, really special. We came a long ways with this thing." It was the remedy Busch needed after a frustrating two weeks. He won earlier this month at Dover, then embarked on his historic "triple" of three races at three different tracks in three days. Although he finished second in the Truck Series race, the first leg of his journey, he wrecked his Cup car in practice the next day before jetting off to the Nationwide Series race. He wrecked in that event and finished 32nd, then wrecked in the Cup race and finished 43rd. He wrecked in last week's Nationwide race, as well, and decided after not to hop all over the country this weekend to compete in the lower series' events in Milwaukee. Team president J.D. Gibbs said all that extra racing didn't contribute to the slump.

"He can go run long and hard, he's still young and strong," Gibbs said of the 23-year-old. David Gilliland finished a career-best second and was followed by Gordon, Clint Bowyer and Casey Mears. Montoya was sixth, followed by Ryan Newman, Matt Kenseth, Carl Edwards and Stewart. The race was fairly clean until the closing laps. David Reuitmann brought out a late caution when a flat tire caused him to run off course and into a wall of tires. That set up a restart with six laps to go, and Stewart quickly passed Jamie McMurray for second. But a spin by Kevin Harvick as they entered Turn 4 started a chain-reaction crash that took Stewart out of contention for challenging his teammate for the win. "I haven't seen it, so it's not fair to comment on that," Stewart said.

second place, giving him \$934.80. Several cowboys in the tie-down roping challenged leader Tuf Cooper's time Saturday night, but the Decatur native's 8.3 held up for a first-place prize of \$1,418.82. Stran Smith of Childress was a mere tenth of a second slower than Cooper, making \$1,174.20 for his efforts. Levelland's Shank Edwards delivered Saturday's best result in the event with an 8.6, giving him third-place money worth \$929.57. Only a tenth of a second separated first and second place in team roping as well. Kyle Cauthorn of Terrell and Clay Whisenhunt of Ravenna held onto the top spot with their opening night run of 6.2, giving them \$1,187. JoJo Lemond of Andrews and Martin Lucero of Stephenville came into the competition's final night ranked 14th in the world and they were close to stealing first-place from Cauthorn and Whisenhunt with a time of 6.3, netting \$890.63. Dakota Shipp of Gainesville and Justin Copp of Justin also deliv-

ered a money ride Saturday, registering a time of 7.1 and picking up \$593.75 for third place. Two more cowgirls posted sub-17 second times in the barrel racing Saturday, but neither could overtake leader Lizzy Allen of Abilene, who won \$1,086.28 for her efforts. No. 16 in the world Kelly Maben of Spur finished second with a time of 16.98, netting her \$931.10. Cassie Moseley of a Farwell just eclipsed that elusive 17 second barrier with a time of 16.99, taking third place and \$775.91. Overall, the rodeo committee was more than pleased with the results from its diamond anniversary. "I thought we had three outstanding performances and I was extremely pleased with the crowd we had Saturday," Board President Skipper Driver said. "The stock was excellent and we closed the rodeo with a bull ride of 93. How can it get any better than that? "We greatly appreciate the spectators who came out and supported the event," Driver continued. "And we're also grateful for the sponsors who helped make this happen. The weather was great and we had a little bit bigger of a crowd than we had last year. I couldn't be much happier with the results."

Today is Monday, June 23, the 174th day of 2008. There are 191 days left in the year. Today's Highlight in History: On June 23, 1868, Christopher Latham Sholes received a patent for his 'Type-Writer.' In 1956, Gamal Abdel Nasser was elected president of Egypt. In 1967, President Johnson and Soviet Premier Alexei Kosygin held the first of two meetings at Glassboro State College in New Jersey. In 1969, Warren E. Burger was sworn in as chief justice by the man he was succeeding, Earl Warren. In 1972, President Nixon and White House chief of staff H.R. Haldeman discussed a plan to use the CIA to obstruct the FBI's Watergate investigation. (Revelation of the tape recording of this conversation sparked Nixon's resignation in 1974.) In 1985, all 329 people aboard an Air-India Boeing 747 were killed when the plane crashed into the Atlantic Ocean near Ireland, after a bomb on board exploded. Five years ago: A divided Supreme Court, in a 5-4 decision, allowed the nation's colleges and universities to select students based in part on race. One year ago: Searchers in Summit County, Ohio, found the body of Jessie Davis, a missing 26-year-old pregnant woman. (Bobby Cutts Jr., a former Canton police officer who was the father of Davis' unborn child, was later convicted of murder and aggravated murder and sentenced to 57 years to life in prison.)
