

State Highways; A Huge Service But Still A Costly Problem Child

How safe are Texas highways? That is always on the motorist's mind when he starts on a trip which will carry him into a rural area on public highways.

Last year 1,725 persons died in 26,584 accidents. The total killed would populate a small town little larger than Dimmitt. Most of the dead died needlessly through their own or other's carelessness.

Much blame for Texas highway accidents has been focused on state highways. But are these highways themselves at fault? Probably the answer to this question is no. Texas highways have long been among the nation's best and through reasonable caution by the motorist are safe even at high speeds.

Unless something is done in the next decade, our highways will begin taking their toll of human lives as automobiles are built to run faster than curves are graded for. And holes and buckled pavement are not making for better safety.

However, the Texas Highway Department faces a problem, a problem growing more common with state agencies every day. They need more money. Slightly over half of all Texas highways are over twenty years old meaning they are obsolete and not built for today's fast and heavy traffic.

After twenty years of service a highway begins to crack, buckle, and wear heavily. A stretch of this road will be narrow, crooked, and not as level as a modern road. Bridges built twenty or more years ago are still in use and many are one-way and weak. But bridges, costly and hard to build, many times are bypassed by funds to allow for more paving.

The cost of a highway, like the stretch from Dimmitt to Hereford for instance, will cost from \$60,000 to \$100,000 per mile. Even at such enormous expense, Texas owns and maintains over 36,000 miles of paved roads; 11,000 bridges, underpasses and overpasses; and almost 25,000 miles of city streets.

The Highway Department receives approximately \$115,000,000 per year from gasoline and license taxes, federal grants and state general appropriations. This figure exceeds any prewar total but will not build as many new miles of roads as the Department could afford in say, 1937. Now the state needs more and better roads desperately, but the cost is growing more and more prohibitive. The Department figures any portion of a highway carrying 4,000 or more vehicles per day should be made in four lanes. Based on this figure the state needs about 600 more four-laners between various Texas cities. 920 separate stretches of highway in the state carry the 4,000 units par day but only about 300 are more than two lane. Indications show Texas growing leery of three-lane roads. Too many head-on collisions result from a false sense of security the roads seem to give. As a rule more deaths are attributed to this type of highway per mile than standard two-lane roads. The Canyon-Amarillo road is a good example of this. A heavy dose of funds also goes into construction and maintenance of roadside parks and municiple streets. The Department builds and maintains those city streets which form a part of the highway system, even when they lie in the center of town. This policy generally applies only to towns of less than 15,000 population; in larger cities the highways are routed around congested areas by expressways.

system. These roads cost only about \$10,000 per mile to construct and maintenance is cheaper. And the practice is proving so worthwhile the Department will probably continue its farm roads program for an indefinite time.

What do these figures show?

They show a government service becoming more complex every day, broadening in all directions and directy or indirectly reaching every citizen of the state. The figures also show these services overreaching their funds. Will new and/or improved highways suffer from this continuing expansion? Will the state soon get the new roads it will soon need for safe and comfortable driving?

And what of the effects of overloaded trucks on the roads? Tests presently being conducted in Maryland hope to come up with some answers. Meanwhile tandem axles are jarring loose sections of concrete highway and breaking down asphalt roads. Over 3,800 cases were filed last year against truckers who exceeded the 48,000 gross weight limit. This does not include those who were not apprehended.

Texas has a problem. Castro County roads may someday deteriorate as much as some of our other state highways.
