



These are: 1. Use old clothes which may be burned or buried after applying the material. The fire hazard is not great if your clothes are wet or while material is in a spray mixture. 2. When spraying is completed immediately bathe and change clothes and re-move contaminated clothing from the house or any structure that may be damaged by fire. and 3. Clothing used in the application of the material my be washed if a thorough job is done, but it is safer to either burn or bury said clothes.
