## Attorney General Booked For Brief Stop in Dimmitt

Attorney General James V. Allred, considered by most political prophets as the one gubernatorial candidate sure of a place in the run-off will be in Dimmitt for a few minutes next Tuesday morning at 10 o'clock. He will make a short speech in the District Court room at that time.

Allred will come from Hereford to Dimmitt and thence to Tulia and Plainview. He will make a speech in Plainview Tuesday afternoon.

The Attorney General began his Panhandle campaign tour Thursday when he was the main speaker at the opening of the pre-Centennial celebration at Pampa.

The issues being stressed by Allred in his speeches are: control and regulation of the professional lobbyists; regulation of all monopolies, particularly utilities; publication of incomes of members of the Legislature.

Allred will be introduced in Dimmitt by W. W. Halcomb.

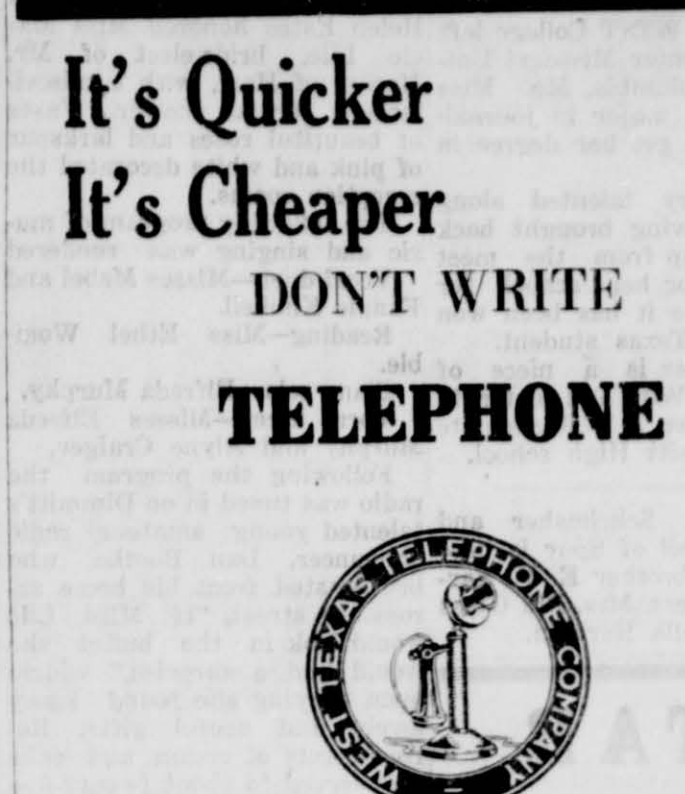
