## Drought leaves CRMWD scrambling

*Water district hampered by low lake levels, limited pumping capacity*

For the Colorado River Municipal Water District, it's a matter of simple math — limited number of water sources plus limited pumping capacity equals reduced deliveries to customers.

CRMWD, which had already reduced deliveries to its member cities by 10 percent this summer, announced

an additional 10 percent reduction effective July 1.

General Manager John Grant said a worsening drought and extremely low water levels have taken two of the district's three reservoirs out of the delivery equation — as of Friday morning, Lake

Thomas was about 3.5 percent full, while Lake Spence was at less than 2 percent of capacity.

That leaves Lake Ivie (currently 26 percent full) and two groundwater fields in Ward County as the district's only reliable sources of water, and CRMWD cannot produce its normal delivery quotient from just those two areas.

"We're pumping the maxi-

um amount of water we can," Grant said. "We're only able to bring in water from one reservoir and the Ward County wells, so we have limited pumping capacity ... We're in danger of overworking the system, so this (additional) 10 percent reduction gives us at least a small safety margin."

If the drought continues for an extended amount of time,

Grant said water customers could potentially face a nightmare scenario.

"If we don't get any inflow by the end of 2012, our projections indicate we will have pumped all the water out of Ivie that we can," he said.

While the only sure cure for the reservoir problem is considerable rain between

## Appraisal budget on agenda

The proposed 2012 budget for the Howard County Appraisal District will once again take center stage during Tuesday's meeting of the Big Spring City Council, as the government panel looks to make its disapproval of the fiscal plan official.

The council disapproved the proposed budget — which was presented at the May 24 meeting — on a 4-1 vote, citing a \$15,000 raise in salary for

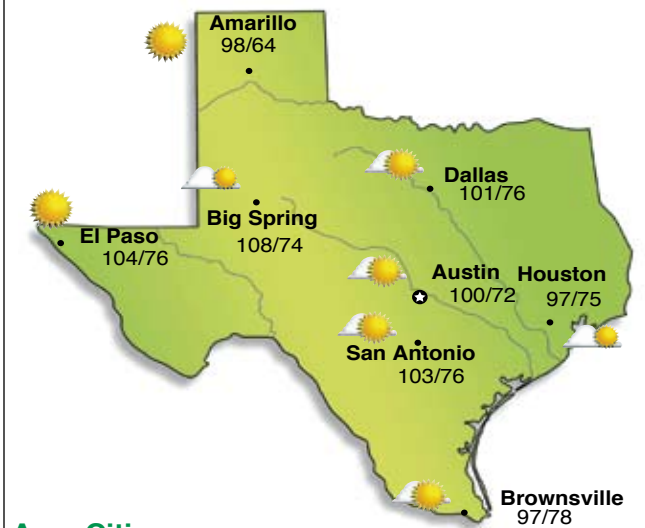

# Two killed in oilfield accident

Two Big Spring men were killed Saturday morning in an oilfield incident near Lamesa in Dawson County, the result of an accident on a Robinson Drilling Company platform.

Jason Bolt, 25, and Sandy Daves, 28, were killed when bushings on the oil rig they were working on failed, according to members of the victims' families.

Robinson drilling has been plagued by a number of oilfield accidents during the past year.

In June of 2010, two Robinson Drilling employees were rushed to Midland Memorial Tuesday following an accident at an oil derrick located 10 miles north of Midland in Glasscock County.

According to officials with Robinson Drilling, neither man sustained life threatening injuries during the accident.

In April 2010, William Ryan Locke, 35, died following an oil rig drilling accident at a location between Midland and Gardendale. Locke was believed to have been working from a ladder on the drilling rig when a piece of high pressure pipe broke away, releasing enough pressure in the Big Spring man's direction to knock him from the ladder and platform.

According to Bolt's family members, the Saturday ac-

cident is being investigated by OSHA (Occupational Safety and Health Administration).

Services for Bolt are pending at Myers & Smith Funeral Home.

Services for Daves are pending with Nalley-Pickle & Welch Funeral Home & Crematory of Big Spring.

# Casey Anthony trial enters 4th week

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) — A hair and fiber investigator for the FBI took the stand Monday as the murder trial of 25-year-old Casey Anthony enters its fourth week.

Stephen Shaw told jurors he analyzed hair found in Casey Anthony's trunk and samples taken from 2-year-old Caylee Anthony's skull, which was found in a wooded area near the Anthony home.

Shaw testified that he saw

more evidence of decomposition on the hairs taken from the child's skull than on the hair found in the trunk.

Meanwhile, Judge Belvin Perry ruled that prosecutors could not use an electronic presentation of the hair analysis as evidence, saying that he found it troubling the contents of the study were not shared with defense attorneys ahead of time. Jurors waited outside the courtroom for about 20

minutes while the issue was settled.

Prosecutors contend Casey Anthony suffocated Caylee with duct tape. The defense has argued the toddler drowned in her grandparents' swimming pool on June 16, 2008.

The child was not reported missing for 31 days. Anthony faces the death penalty if convicted.

Last week, the defense objected to hearing testimony

from a University of Florida professor who planned to present a computer animation of the way duct tape could have been used in the child's death.

Perry ruled the jury could see the animation, which featured a picture of Caylee taken alongside her mother that was superimposed with an image of her decomposed skull, and another with a strip of duct tape that was recovered with her remains.

Chief Appraiser Brett McKibben as the reason.

District 2 Councilman Manuel Ramirez Jr. was absent for the vote, District 5 Councilman Craig Olson abstained due to personal dealings with McKibben and District 6 Councilman Terry Hansen voted against the disapproval. District 1 Councilman Marcus Fernandez, District 2 Councilman Glenn Carrigan, Mayor Tommy Duncan and District 4 Councilwoman Gloria McDonald voted to disapprove the proposed budget.

According to Donnie Baker, a member of the appraisal district's board of directors for

more than 20 years, the salary increases totaled \$15,000, with approximately \$12,000 of it for McKibben.

"I assure you, every member of the board was concerned with this," Baker told Howard County commissioners — where he currently represents Precinct 2 — during a recent meeting. "This increase gets Brett's salary up with what other counties are paying. I've been on the board for more than 20 years, and it was in pretty bad shape when I came on. However, when you look at what was required (of the chief appraiser) then and what's required by state law now, there's no comparison."

Precinct 1 Commissioner Emma Brown, Precinct 3 Commis-

sioner Jimmie Long and County Judge Mark Barr all voted to approve the proposed budget. Baker abstained from the commissioners' vote because of his current position on the board of directors, while Precinct 4 Commissioner John Cline voted against the budget.

According to Assistant City Manager Todd Darden, the matter is going before the council once again because the original vote on the matter was not unanimous.

"It's simply a legal issue," Darden said. "The budget will now go through a first and final reading."

Duncan was adamant he was opposed to the increase because of tough economical times, not as a reflection on the work McKibben has done in

past years.

The budget will also go before the other local taxing entities for approval, including Forsan Independent School District, which is set to discuss the matter Monday evening.

A majority of the taxing entities would have to give the budget a thumbs-down for it to fail to be adopted.

Also during Tuesday's meeting, the council is expected to consider final reading of a change to the compensation package for city employees, revoking their previous exemption from admission fees for the city aquatic center.

First reading of the change was approved by the council during the May 24 meeting, when the council also voted to up the price of admis-

sion to the municipal facility from the previous \$2 to \$5 per person.

Tuesday's meeting is expected to get under way at 5:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers, located at 307 E. Fourth Street. For more information call 264-2401.

now and then, CRMWD is not betting the bank on that happening. Instead, the district is working to increase its pumping capacity at the Ward County fields, Grant said.

"Currently, we can only pump 16 million gallons a day from the Ward County fields," he said. "We are designing a system that would increase our pumping capacity at those fields to 45 million gallons a day ... which would cover the basic needs of our member cities and the

other municipalities we serve."

A planned pipeline to boost delivery capacity from those fields is expected to come online at the beginning of 2013. Until then, or until reservoirs receive substantial water inflow, Grant said people need to find ways to eliminate extraneous water use.

"People need to follow the guidelines (city officials) have recommended," Grant said, referring to measures such as reduced watering of lawns and other conservation measures. "They need to be aware

of the water situation — it's serious."

## Deliberations on penalty over slain Dallas officer

DALLAS (AP) — A jury in Dallas will decide whether a man convicted in the fatal shooting of a police officer who was serving a warrant should spend the rest of his life in prison.

Deliberations will resume Monday in the penalty phase for Charles Payne.

Payne was charged with capital murder in the 2009 death of Sr. Cpl. Norm Smith. Jurors on Friday convicted Payne of the lesser charge of murder and then started the punishment phase.

Jurors began penalty deliberations Saturday, but had Sunday off.

Payne testified he thought he was being robbed and did not know that the people outside the door of his apartment were police, looking for another man inside the unit.

## LBJ Library to release Pentagon Papers Monday

AUSTIN (AP) — The complete Pentagon Papers are being made public by the federal government for the first time.

The Lyndon B. Johnson Library and Museum in Austin will unveil the once-top secret, 7,000-page Pentagon study of the Vietnam War on Monday.

Simultaneous releases are scheduled at the National Archives in Washington, the John F. Kennedy Library in Boston, the Richard Nixon Library in Yorba Linda, Calif., and the National Archives in College Park, Md.

The release comes exactly 40 years after The New York Times published leaked portions of the report. A federal judge soon halted their publication, though other newspapers then began publishing the documents.

A split U.S. Supreme Court eventually struck down the judge's ruling, leading to a major legal victory for press freedom.

## 1 killed, at least 7 hurt in church van crash

TYLER (AP) — One person was killed and at least seven others were hospitalized after a Louisiana church van crashed while returning from an East Texas water park.

The Texas Department of Public Safety says the crash happened about 5 p.m. Saturday on Interstate 20 eastbound, about 12 miles northeast of Tyler.

DPS Trooper Glenn Davenport says

the van's left rear tire blew out, causing the driver to lose control and veer off the highway. The van rolled several times, ripping off the roof and ejecting eight passengers, killing one. None were wearing seatbelts.

The DPS said the identities of the dead and injured, the conditions of those hospitalized and the identity of the church that owned the van weren't available Sunday.

## Eying White House run, Perry makes LA stop

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Texas Gov. Rick Perry, a potential 2012 presidential candidate, criticized President Barack Obama for increasing access to abortion.

The conservative Republican

brought cheers from a crowd at a Hispanic anti-abortion event in Los Angeles when he said, "Every life is precious."

Perry told the crowd of about 5,000 that there's no such thing as an unwanted child in the eyes of God.

He criticized the Obama administration for its policies on embryonic stem cell research and use of federal funds for abortion. He said under Obama, abortion has become "a U.S. export."

Perry never mentioned the presidential election. The governor is a prominent voice in the GOP's Christian conservative wing, and talk about his possible candidacy increased after two of his trusted political advisers recently fled Newt Gingrich's campaign.

## Dinosaur bones part of

## more than \$5M Dallas sale

DALLAS (AP) — Private collectors have purchased dinosaur bones as part of more than \$5.3 million in rare items sold at auction in Dallas.

Heritage Auction says an allosaurus and a stegosaurus, in an offering known as the Fighting Pair, sold for nearly \$2.75 million Sunday.

The Dallas-based auction house declined to disclose the buyer, other than saying the bones would head for an overseas museum.

The Dallas Morning News reported Monday that 430 bidders took part in the auction, which also featured a stuffed polar bear, a rare fossilized bird egg and precious gems.

A set of 11-foot-by-9-foot shark jaws did not sell. The items will remain on

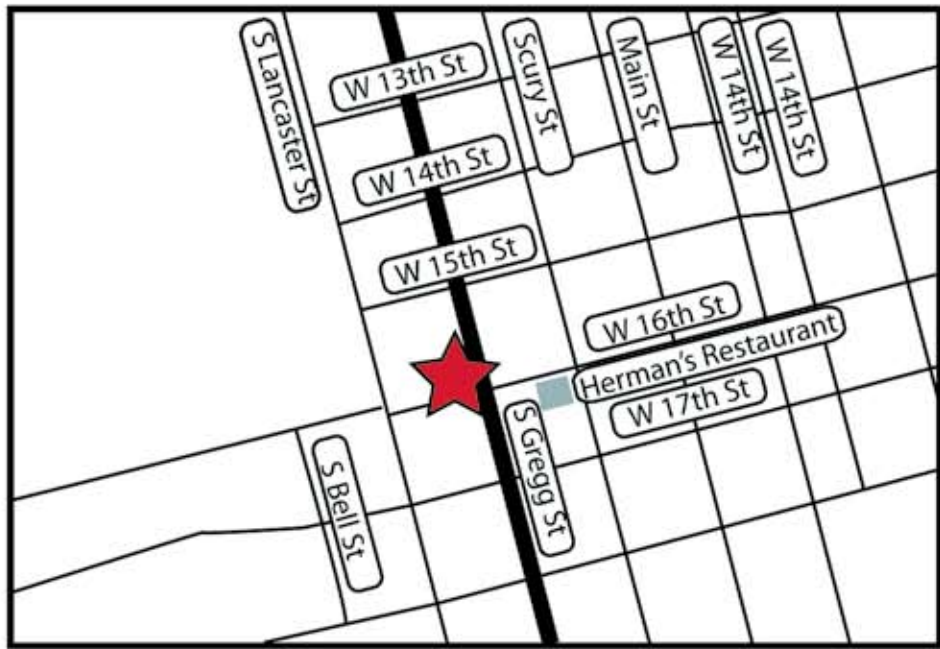

# Bareback champion returns to Big Spring to defend 2010 title

Bareback rider Justin McDaniel has been in the winner's circle plenty in his six-year ProRodeo career. Twice he's won the average at the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo, and just three seasons ago he left the bright lights of Las Vegas with the most coveted piece of hardware in the sport, the world champion's gold buckle.

And quite possibly the best regular-season paycheck McDaniel had in 2010 was at the Big Spring Cowboy Reunion and Rodeo, where he scored 76 points on Carr Pro Rodeo's Easy Does It to finish in a tie for second place behind Jared Smith. The \$617 he earned last June was not important compared to the \$103,189 he won at the NFR, but it was just as important overall.

"That was a big rodeo for me because it was the first one I'd won money on after my injury," said McDaniel, who missed the first half of season after having surgery to repair two herniated discs in his back. "I knew I was rusty, but it felt good to do well in Big Spring."

McDaniel is scheduled to return to Howard County for the Big Spring Cowboy Reunion and Rodeo, set this year for 8 p.m. Thursday, June 16-Saturday, June 18. He'd like to improve on things from last year, and he's already ahead of the game with three rodeo victories, including one the first week in June in Fort Smith, Arkansas.

But he's not the only cowboy itching to get on some of the great Carr Pro Rodeo bareback horses. Matt Bright earned \$81,489 last year riding bucking horses, the best season yet for the 27-year-old cowboy from Azle, Texas.

"Any time you can win first, it's definitely good for a guy's confidence," said Bright, who has wins in Shreveport, La., and Guymon, Okla., already this year.

For cowboys who make their livings on the backs of bucking beasts, they know how important high quality animals are to their livelihood. Carr Pro Rodeo has them, and that's why some of the top bareback riders in the business are

## Mavericks are NBA champions

### Defeat Heat 105-95 in Miami Sunday night

MIAMI (AP) — For Dirk Nowitzki, the resume is complete. He's an NBA champion.

For LeBron James, the agonizing wait continues for at least one more year.

A season that began with Miami celebrating the signings of James, Dwyane Wade and Chris Bosh — along with the promise of championships — ended on the very same floor, with the Dallas Mavericks hoisting the title trophy for the first time in their franchise history after beating the Heat 105-95 on Sunday night. The Mavericks won four of the series' last five games, a turnaround that could not have been sweeter.

"I really still can't believe it," said Nowitzki, who had 21 points and took home finals MVP honors.

He and Jason Terry, who led the Mavs with 27 points, were the two remaining players from the Dallas team that lost to Miami in the 2006 finals.

"Tonight," Terry said, "we got vindication."

James did not. Not even close, and a year unlike any other ended they way they all have so far — with him still

waiting for an NBA title.

He scored 21 points for Miami, shook a few hands afterward, and departed before most of the Mavs tugged on their championship hats and T-shirts. Bosh had 19, Mario Chalmers 18 and Wade 17 for the Heat.

"We worked so hard and so long for it," Nowitzki said. "The team has had an unbelievable ride."

So did the Heat. Unlike Dallas, theirs wasn't a joyride.

"It goes without saying," Heat coach Erik Spoelstra said. "You're never really prepared for a moment like this. ... Neither team deserved this championship more than the other, but Dallas earned it."

Make no mistake: Miami lost the finals, but the blame will be directed at James. Even he knew that after the way he left Cleveland with "The Decision" and all the animus that generated not just in Ohio but around the entire league, the only way he could silence some critics was with a title.

"It doesn't weigh on me," James said. "At all."

Still, he got even more criticism — and a thinly veiled jab

from his former owner with the Cavaliers, Dan Gilbert, who reveled in the moment on Twitter.

"Mavs NEVER stopped & now entire franchise gets rings," Gilbert wrote. "Old Lesson for all: There are NO SHORTCUTS. NONE."

And the winning owner, Mark Cuban, took what may be perceived as a jab as well: "I could care less about the Heat," he said.

Mavs coach Rick Carlisle joined an elite group, those with NBA titles as both a player and a head coach. Others on that list include the presumably retired-for-good Phil Jackson, one of Carlisle's mentors in K.C. Jones, and Heat President Pat Riley — who led Miami past Dallas in 2006, and the mastermind of what Miami did last summer by getting James, Wade and Bosh on the same team with an eye on becoming a dynasty.

It might still happen, of course.

But even after 72 wins this season, including playoffs,

the Heat lost the last game. And that means this year was a disappointment — except to just about everyone else in the NBA, or so it would seem.

"This is a true team," Carlisle said. "This is an old bunch. We don't run fast or jump high. These guys had each other's backs. We played the right way. We trusted the pass. This is a phenomenal thing for the city of Dallas."

Hating the Heat became the NBA's craze this season, and the team knew it had no shortage of critics, everyone from Cleveland (where "Cavs for Mavs" shirts were popular during these finals) to Chicago (the city James and Wade both flirted with last summer) and just about every place in between lining up to take shots at Miami.

"We could feel it," Carlisle said, noting he was repeatedly told during the finals that "billions" of people wanted to see Dallas topple Miami.

Given their newfound popularity, meet the new America's Team.

Sorry, Cowboys — your long-held moniker

might have to be ceded to your city's NBA club. When it was over, Cuban ran onto the court to hug Carlisle, then punched the air and whooped.

"I'm so happy for him. I'm so happy for Dirk," Carlisle said.

Carlisle said Riley came down to congratulate the Mavericks after the game, showing "unbelievable class." Nowitzki and Wade exchanged texts at night's end, after Wade couldn't find him during the on-court celebration to shake his hand.

"Theirtimewillcome," Carlisle said. "But now, it's our time."

When the Mavericks took a 2-0 lead in Dallas during the '06 finals, plans for their victory parade were announced. The Mavs didn't win another game in that series.

Now, that parade will finally happen, with city officials in Dallas saying early Monday that it could be several days away. And when it's over, then the league's uncertainty will truly begin. Labor strife likely awaits, and although more talks geared toward movement on a new deal are scheduled for this week, both owners and players are bracing for a lockout to begin once the current collective bargaining agree-

ment expires June 30.

Late Sunday night, the CBA was the last thing on the mind of the new champions of the NBA, whom Carlisle called "the most special team I've ever been around."

Jason Kidd, at 38 years old, got his first championship. Nowitzki got his at 32, Terry at 33. They were featured on the video screen in their building in Dallas during this series on what seemed like a constant loop, each posing with the NBA trophy and looking longingly at it, standing mere inches from it, as if to say "so close, yet so far away."

No more. It's theirs. And for the second time, James went to the finals, only to see the other team celebrate. San Antonio won in Cleveland in 2007, and four years later, he saw the Mavs party on his new floor.

"It was a failure in '07 when we lost to the Spurs when I was in Cleveland," James said. "It's a failure now."

Nowitzki sealed it with 2:27 left, hitting a jumper near the Miami bench to put Dallas up 99-89, and some fans actually began leaving. Nowitzki walked to the Mavs' side slowly, right fist clenched and aloft.

He knew it. Everyone did.

"We feel it," Wade said. "We'll feel it even more tomorrow."

Spolstra implored his team to foul in the final minute, and even then, they couldn't catch the Mavericks.

"All I remember is telling those guys that they deserved it," Bosh said. "Hands down, they were the better team in this series. ... All we can do is just admit it and move forward."

What happens with the next deal may affect the Heat more than anyone. Some owners will insist on a hard cap, rolled-back salaries and, potentially, trying to bust some current deals — which could break up the Big 3 before get another chance to win a title together.

A gloomy end to the season may bring an even gloomier offseason for Miami.

"Every situation has felt like it was an our-back-against-the-wall situation," James said Sunday morning, hours before Game 6 began. "We've been able to figure it out and find our way through and scratch our way through. This is the last test. This is the last pop quiz for us that we need to pass."

scheduled to compete in Big Spring

"Pete sure enough has a bunch of great horses," said Will Lowe of Canyon, Texas, a three-time world champion. "You dang sure know you'd better be ready when you get on one of Pete's horses."

"Anytime you ride bucking horses, you've got to have your hammer cocked."

Bright knows that as well as anyone. During the eighth round of the NFR last December, the Tennessee-born cowboy was prepared to ride Carr's Real Deal, the rank 2005 Bareback of the Year. The brown gelding reared in leaving the chute, slamming Bright into the back of the metal-piped fencing. The result was a fracture of the lumbar spine and four months away from the game. In Guymon, Bright scored a strong 87-point ride on Carr's Dirty Jacket, another bucking beast that is considered one of the best animals in bareback riding.

"I like Pete," said Clint Cannon, a two-time NFR qualifier from Waller, Texas. "He's always honest, and he always brings good horses to rodeos. He runs a good show."

"The great thing about Pete is that he's not afraid to bring his good horses. We know when we go to one of Pete's rodeos that you don't have to get on a piece of junk. You know you're going to have a chance to draw a good horse."

Rangers fall to Twins

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Francisco Liriano gave the Texas Rangers more Target Field trouble.

Liriano sniffed his second no-hitter of the season, sitting in the dugout Sunday for nearly a half-hour before Adrian Beltre led off the eighth inning with a clean single, and the Twins topped the Texas Rangers 6-1.

The Rangers fell to 1-9 at Minnesota since the new ballpark opened last year. They had won nine of their last 12 games before losing three of four in the series.

"I always say, 'Pitching stops everything,'" Rangers manager Ron Washington said. "They outplayed us for the last two ballgames."

Following Scott Baker's complete game Saturday, Liriano (4-6) needed only 64 pitches to retire the first 18 batters against the high-scoring Rangers. The lefty, who held the Chicago White Sox hitless in a wild effort May 3, sat in the dugout for 27 minutes in the bottom of the seventh before falling behind 3-0 to Beltre and giving up his first hit.

"He was trying to throw it for a strike, and he threw the pitch over the middle of the plate," said Beltre, who later scored on a single by Yorvit Torrealba.

That's all that went right for the Rangers.

Elvis Andrus was the first to reach base, on a fielding error by rookie third baseman Luke Hughes with one out in the seventh, a questioned ruling by official scorer Gregg Wong.

Then the Twins scored five times in the bottom of the inning, after an injury to Texas starter Matt Harrison.

"I got a little bit nervous in the eighth inning. I got behind in the count, and I had to throw a fastball," said Liriano, who matched a season high by striking out nine in eight innings. He allowed two hits without a walk.

The Rangers had plenty of pop in their lineup, with only regulars Mitch Moreland and Mike Napoli missing, but they looked lost against Liriano. Washington even benched Andrus after a lackadaisical play in the seventh at shortstop led to an error and contributed to five unearned runs.

"I didn't like his attitude," Washington said, adding: "Elvis is better than that. Elvis doesn't have a problem. Elvis is an excellent ballplayer, but every now and then when he gets like that I have to send a message."

Liriano came close to becoming the first

Twins pitcher to throw twin nine-inning no-hitters in the same season. Dean Chance had a pair of hitless performances in August 1967, although the first one was a five-inning game.

Roy Halladay pitched two no-hitters last year for the Philadelphia Phillies — a perfect game in the regular season and a no-no in the NL playoffs. Nolan Ryan was the last pitcher to throw a pair of no-hitters in the same regular season, in 1973 for the California Angels.

Harrison (5-6) left after being struck on his left triceps muscle by Danny Valencia's line drive leading off the seventh, and reliever Mark Lowe was given extra time to warm up. Then the Twins sent 10 batters to the plate, highlighted by Michael Cud-dyer's three-run homer to stretch the lead to 6-0.

Harrison wasn't bad himself, allowing five hits and two runs — one earned — while walking three and striking out three through six innings.

The left-hander has been bothered by pain from a kidney stone, but he bounced back from a rough start against the Detroit Tigers Tuesday by pitching strong into the seventh.

"He battled. He was throwing the ball really well," first baseman Michael Young said.

Liriano's perfect game ended with one out in the seventh, when the fast-footed Andrus hit a slow bouncer that hugged the line and Hughes, playing third base in the majors for only the fifth time in his career, tried to make a backhanded play.

The ball went under his glove and glanced off his knee toward the Texas dugout, allowing Andrus to take second. Official scorer Gregg Wong, after reviewing replays, ruled the play an error on Hughes.

But Liriano went right back at the Rangers, retiring Josh Hamilton and Michael Young on routine flyballs to finish the inning and keep the no-hitter in tact for the eighth.

"For a minute there, he just went through the lineup," Washington said. "But then he hit a wall, so I sort of wish he would've hit that wall in the first."

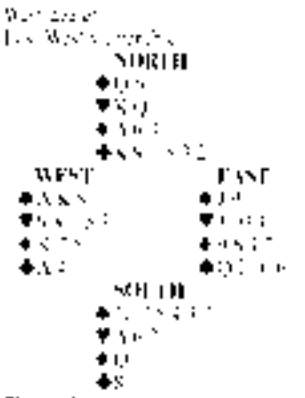

Why is there such silence about women who abuse? And why was I silent? First, I loved her and hoped she would change.

Second, I wanted to stay in the marriage to protect my daughter from my wife. Her anger was often directed at our child, too. Third, I was ashamed of myself

for putting up with it.

After years and \$55,000 in legal fees, I was finally successful in defending myself against her charges that I was the abuser and got custody of our daughter.

As a condition of being allowed to see our daughter, my ex-wife was ordered by the court to get therapy to deal with her severe emotional disturbance.

I am now in a wonderful, happy relationship with a gentle, mentally healthy woman.

My daughter is much happier and is doing better in every aspect of her life. I deeply regret all the years I wasted hoping my ex-wife would change.

Tell your readers that women can be abusers, too. It's time to break

the silence and get out

of those sick situations. And please tell us, Ann, if there are resources available for abused men. They need all the help they can get. — Finally Happy Dad

**Dear Dad:** You were brave to write, and I thank you. Abused husbands are not as rare as you think.

I have heard from several over the years and printed their letters.

The National Domestic Violence Hotline (the-hotline.org) helps abused men, as well as abused women.

For more information on local resources, please call 1-800-799-SAFE (1-800-799-7233) or, for the hearing impaired, TTY: 1-800-787-3224. P.S.: It is not wimpy to seek

protection from a physically abusive woman. Violence sometimes escalates to murder.

On June 13, 1971, The New York Times began publishing excerpts of the Pentagon Papers, a secret study of America's involvement in Vietnam from 1945 to 1967 that had been leaked to the paper by military analyst Daniel Ellsberg.

On this date: In 1886, King Ludwig II of Bavaria drowned in Lake Starnberg.

In 1911, the ballet "Petrouchka," with music by Igor Stravinsky and choreography by Michel Fokine, was first performed in Paris by the Ballets Russes, with Vaslav Nijinsky in the title role.

In 1927, aviation hero Charles Lindbergh was honored with a ticker-tape parade in New York City.

In 1935, James Braddock

claimed the title of world heavyweight boxing champion from Max Baer in a 15-round fight in Long Island City, N.Y.

In 1944, Germany began launching flying-bomb attacks against Britain during World War II.

In 1966, the Supreme Court ruled in Miranda vs. Arizona that criminal suspects had to be informed of their constitutional rights to consult with an attorney and to remain silent.

In 1967, President Lyndon B. Johnson nominated Solicitor-General Thurgood Marshall to become the first black justice on the U.S. Supreme Court.

In 1981, a scare occurred during a parade in London when a teenager fired six blank shots at Queen Elizabeth II.

In 1986, Benny Goodman, the clarinet-playing "King of Swing," died in New York at age 77.

In 1996, the 81-day-old Freeman standoff ended as 16 remaining members of the anti-government group surrendered to the FBI and left their Montana ranch.
