Check house plant problems

So you've got a house plant that just isn't growing like it should. A brief diagnosis could shed some light on the problem.

"HOUSE PLANTS often suffer from foliar and root diseases, restricted root growth, improper watering, and poor light and fertility management," says Dr. Walter J. Walla, plant

pathologist for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Yellowing or dead lower leaves can mean nitrogen deficiency or a "pot-bound" condition in older plants. Woody plants such as rubber plants, dieffenbachia and dracena are especially susceptible. Applying nitrogen fertilizer and re-potting can solve this problem, says the specialist.

"Leaves yellowing all over the plant might be the result of root rot or too much soil moisture. Root rots often develop in African violets due to over-watering. Prune rotted portions of the root, dust the root system with a fungicide, such as benomyl or captan, and re-pot the plant. To prevent excess soil moisture, adequate drainage is necessary," points out Walla.

A sudden loss of leaves is caused by rapid changes in temperature, dry air, cold drafts or exposure to gas or furnace fumes. Moving a plant from a sunny to a dark place can also cause leaf drop.

"Browning of leaf tips results from hot, dry air and a buildup of salts in the soil due to frequent light waterings. This problem can be solved by flushing the plant with excess water several times in a well drained place," notes Walla.

FUNGI, bacteria and direct sunlight may cause brown spots on leaves. Round, target-shaped spots are caused by fungi while bacteria causes spots with a water soaked appearance. Allow adequate air circulation and avoid wetting the plant's leaves during watering to reduce foliage diseases, advises the pathologist.

"Good maintenance practices are often the key to healthy house plants," contends Walla.

"ENJOY grapefruit while they last," she advised, adding that oranges will continue plentiful with very good quality."

At poultry counters, egg prices are slightly less, with grade A, large-size eggs offering the best combination of quality and economy.

In addition to eggs, Mrs. Clyatt also cited cottage cheese, Cheddar cheese, dry beans and peas, peanut butter and fish as nutritious and economical choices for traditional "meatless" meals prior to Easter.
