

**Castro County Grain Co. is ready for 'real good' 1975 wheat crop**

With cautious optimism, Don Gregory of Castro County Grain Co. said the county's farmers seem on the verge of harvesting a bumper wheat crop.

"The wheat looks real good—above average," Gregory said. "If the weather cooperates, I think we'll see a lot of 40 and 50 bushel wheat."

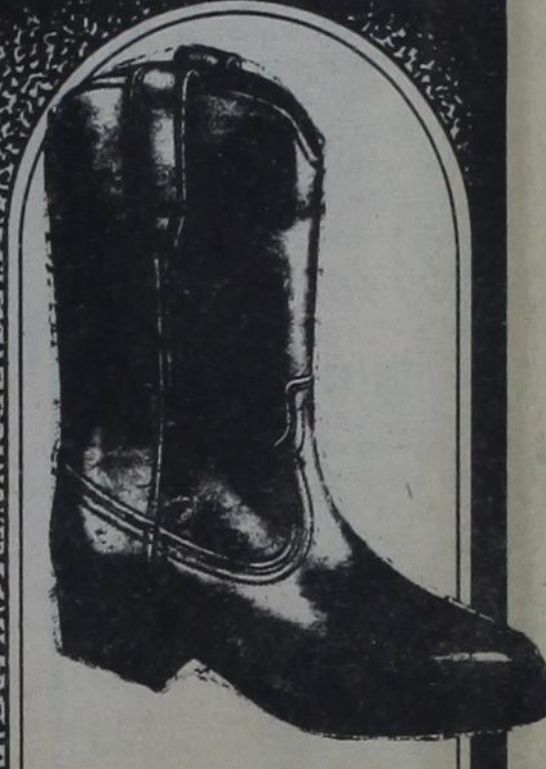

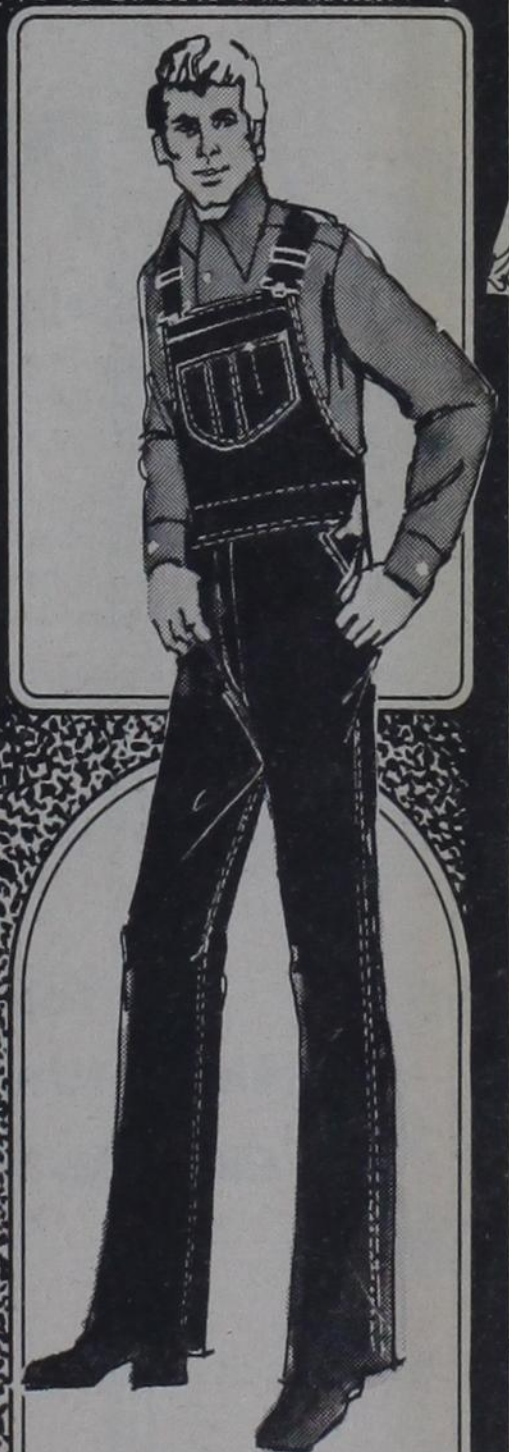

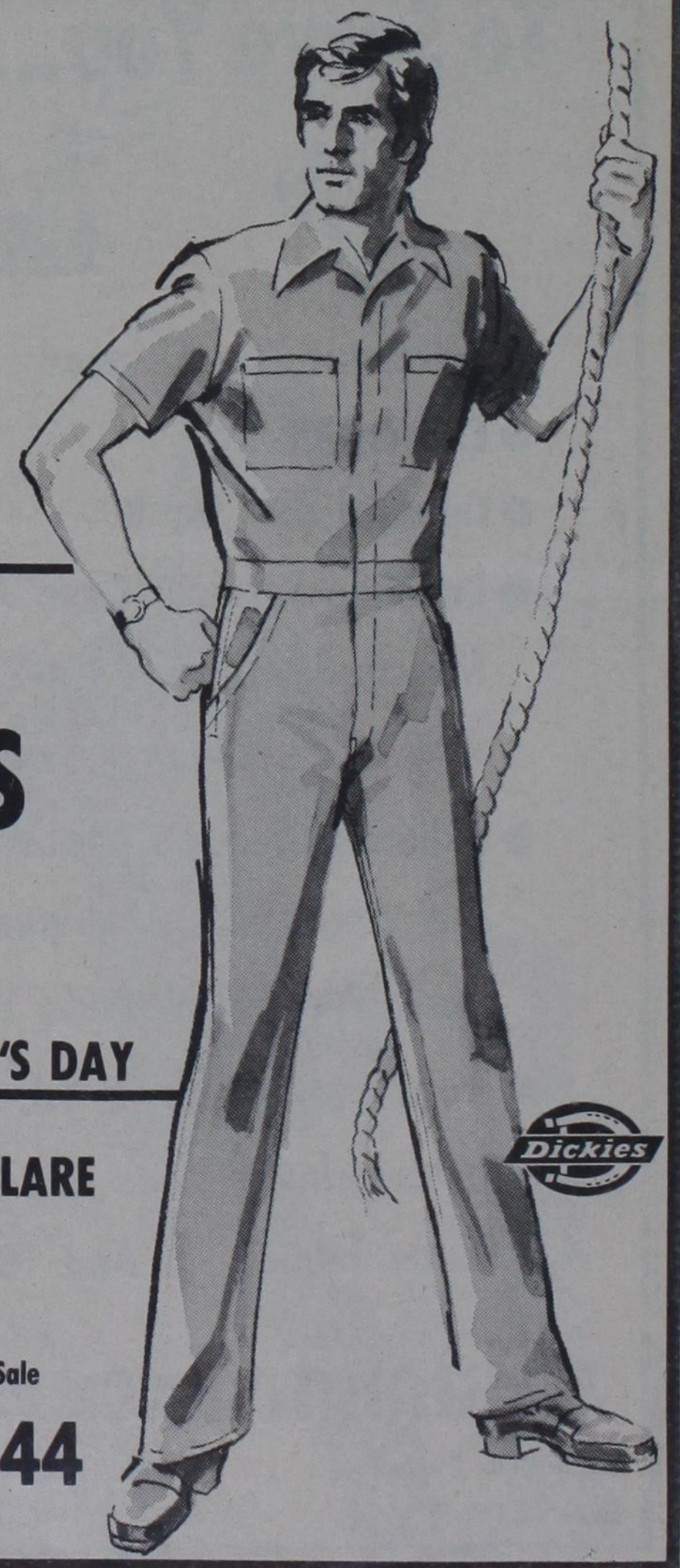

## Baskets brighten the bath

ARE YOU looking for a way to perk up your bathroom? How about using baskets? They come in all sizes, styles, textures and weaves. Plus they're great for storage.

A basket near the tub will hold soaps, lotions, bath oil and other items. How about a basket that fits over the showerhead? An open-work design will let water droplets through and an occasional wiping will keep it clean.

For unique towel storage,

affix a basket with a handle to the wall. Put the bottom of the basket to the wall and the handle out. Fill with colorful towels and use the handle as a handy rack for a towel in use.

Baskets also make handsome hampers or wastebaskets. Line a small one with a sponge to use for a soap dish. Put that pot plant in a basket and use it on a shelf or the tank top. A soft, flexible basket attached to the wall over the bathtub is also an ideal storage place for your toddler's tub toys.

HERE ARE some hints to save you some time. Take clean dishes from the dishwasher or drainer and set the table for the next meal. Then put the rest of

the dishes away. Before placing clothes in the washing machine, be sure buttons are unbuttoned. This prevents strain on buttons and buttonholes. However, close all zippers and hooks to avoid snagging.

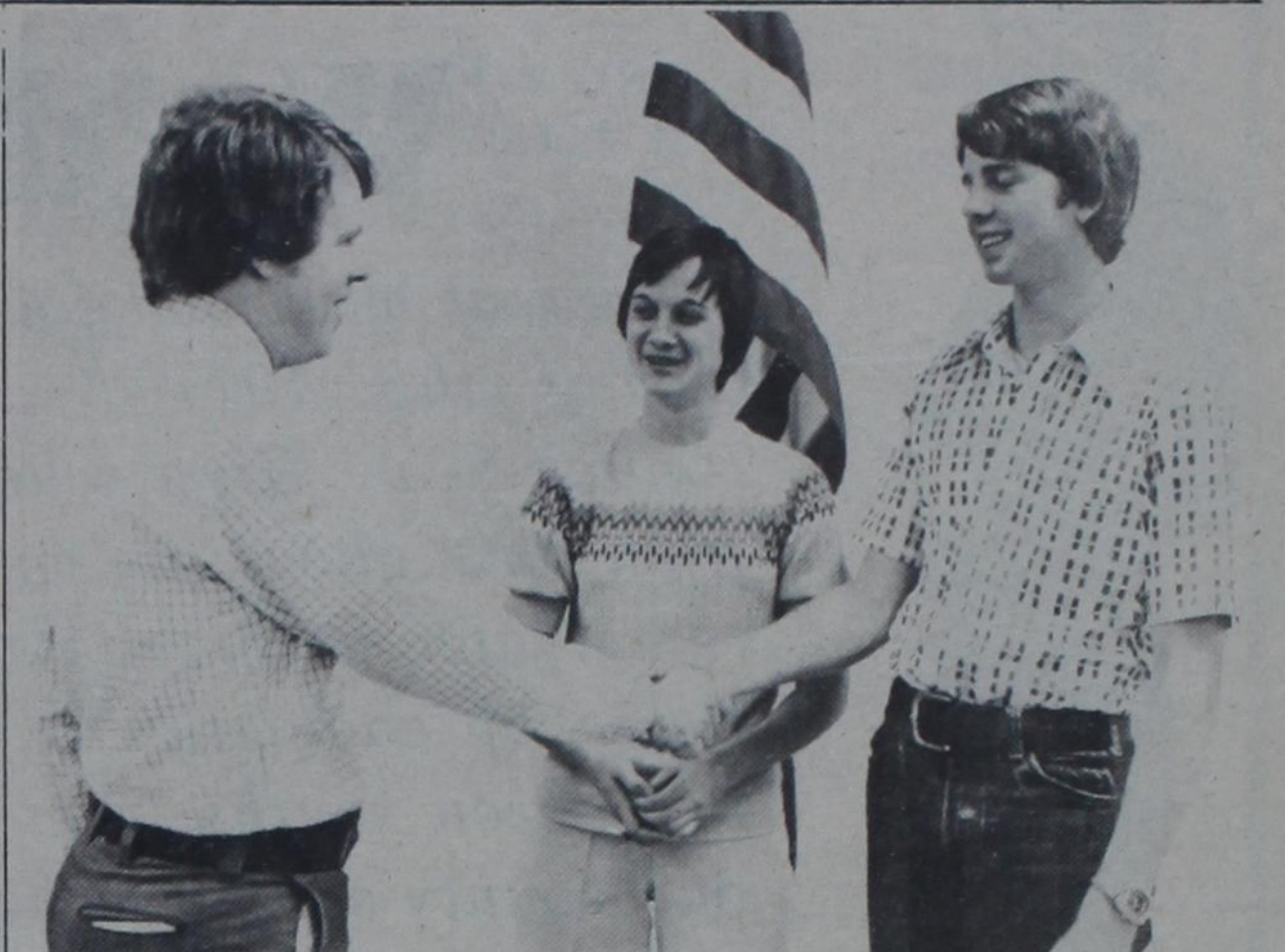


