Nazareth Farmer Identifies Mystery Farm Shown above is the Ed Brockman farm, four miles south of Nazareth. The Brockmans bought this farm from Mrs. Brockman's father, Frank Venhaus, in 1937. Venhaus lived here from 1913 till he sold it. The Brockmans have rebuilt every building on the place except the barn in the foreground. The house is the regular voting place for precinct No. 5. Identifying last week's mystery farm was Ed Drerup, who will receive a years subscrip-tion to the News. This is a diversified farm, raising wheat.


This is a diversified farm, raising wheat, cotton, grain sorghums, barley and a small amount of alfalfa. With 25 head of good Here* ford cows, several milch cows, registered Pol-and China hogs, and about 150 leghorn hens.

And China hogs, and about 150 legnorn hens. A rotation of cropland is used as much as possible, with deep plowing, interplanting of cowpeas in grain sorghums, barley overseeded with hubam clover, and the use of some fer-tilizers. Last year some of the best crops ever produced on the farm were made. The farm consists of one section, of which 360 across are in cultivistion Lest year there

were 117 acres of wheat, 30 of cotton, barley do about 165 of grain sorghums and 10 of alfalta. They have one irrigation well. The Brockmans have lived around Naz-areth since 1909, their parents moving to this locality in the same immigrant car. Brockman and wife, Agnes, live five miles north of Naz-areth. 


