Amateur astronomers and local residents will get a chance to turn their sights toward the heavens Saturday, June 23, as officials

with the Big Spring State Park prepare for their annual Stargazing Party atop the local landmark.

"Sunset is approximately 9 p.m. and there will be a program as soon as it gets dark enough to see

the projection, which is usually between 9:20 and 9:30 p.m.," said Park Manager Ron Alton. "I'm going to ask the astronomy club members to bone up on their constellations so we can point some

of them out." Slated for 8:30 p.m. until 11 p.m. near the park office at the top of Scenic Mountain, the program will offer something for everyone

in the family, according to Alton. "It's one of the bigger events of the year for us," said Alton. "It's a fun and educational way to spend a Saturday night outdoors with your family. You can take a tour of the night sky with area ama-

# Midland... Trinity CO2 buying Sand **Ridge Tertiary for \$130M**

NEW YORK (AP) — SandRidge Energy Inc. is selling the oil recovery company SandRidge Tertiary LLC for \$130 million in cash to Trinity CO2 Investments LLC, a carbon dioxide pipeline and supply company.

Midland, Texas-based Trinity said Monday that it purchased SandRidge's Wellman pipeline as part of the deal.

SandRidge Tertiary has projects in the Permian Ba-

sin in Texas, with proved reserves of 24 million barrels of oil equivalent as of Dec. 31. SandRidge Energy is an oil exploration and production company based in Oklahoma City.

SandRidge Tertiary's Greg West will become executive vice president, chief operating officer and a board member of Trinity CO2, while John Milam will serve as senior vice president of operations.

Trinity is part of Morgan Stanley Global Private Eq-

Shares of SandRidge Energy rose 7 cents, or 1.2 percent, to \$6.03 in premarket trading. SandRidge shares have traded in a 52-week range of \$4.55 to \$12.36 per share.

# Gasoline prices continue to fall

Average retail gasoline prices in Texas have fallen 4.8 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.38/g Sun-

This compares with the national average that has fallen 4.5 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.61/g, according to gasoline price website TexasGasPrices.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Texas during the past week, prices Sunday were 19.8 cents per gallon lower than the same day one year ago and are 26.1 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has decreased 18.2 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 16.2 cents per gallon lower than this day one year ago. "An impressive decline in average gasoline prices will

now be extended as the West Coast begins to see lower prices in the days ahead," said GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan. "With significant downward pressure on oil prices last week, motorists will continue to see prices sliding east of the Rockies, and even the West Coast will start to get in on the action, thanks to a supply situation that appears to be turning around."

#### 3 hurt in gunfire at San Antonio graduation party

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — Investigators say gunfire at a graduation party in South Texas has left three people hurt. San Antonio police say all three victims turned

up at different hospitals early Monday. No one has been arrested as police try to determine who opened fire. KSAT-TV reports detectives have linked all three

victims to the same party. Two of the injured are women who suffered leg wounds. Police say the victims are in stable condition.

Further details on the wounded and the graduation party were not immediately available.

picture, and we're playing much better baseball. They've been on top for a while with that start they had. We were winning games, but we needed to beat them."


The clubs play 13 more times during the regular season, so Torii Hunter remains confident that the Angels will give Texas a race to the finish.

# Tiger is back: Woods takes first at Memorial

DUBLIN, Ohio (AP) — For those who thought Tiger Woods' run as the world's best golfer as over, the 747-sized roar that emanated from the 16th green at Muirfield Village likely shocked them to their senses.

With one flick of his wrists, Woods reminded everyone of who he was and what he has done.

Woods slid a 60-degree sand wedge under a ball hidden by tall grass behind the 16th green, popped the ball straight up into the air where it seemed to hang for an instant, and then watched as it rolled ever so slowly toward the cup before dropping in for a 50-foot birdie that tied him for the lead at the Memorial

Tournament on Sunday. If that birdie served notice, then another on a sneaky-fast 10-foot downhill putt at the 18th assured him of his fifth victory at the tournament that Jack Nicklaus built.

So, Tiger was asked, do you think you're back?

"I won," he joked with a wide smile. "I'm sure by Tuesday I'll be retired and done, and then by the time I tee it up at the U.S. Open (at Olympic Club in San Francisco in 11 days) it might be something different. But I'll let you guys

figure that out."

Adding to the weight of the moment, the win tied Woods with Nicklaus — the tournament founder and host who handed him the crystal trophy on the 18th green — with 73 tour wins for second behind Sam Snead's record 82.

Woods said it was "awfully special" to tie Nicklaus at the Golden Bear's own tournament.

"Well, he had to rub it in my face right here, didn't he?" Nicklaus cracked.

He also saved his best for last, birdieing three of the final four holes under pressure conditions.

# Astros snap losing streak, down Reds

HOUSTON (AP) — After allowing a combined 14 firstinning runs in their last four losses, the Houston Astros were determined to get out of the opening inning on Sunday without falling behind.

Jordan Lyles let them do just that, keeping the Reds hitless until the third and going seven strong innings to lead the Astros to a 5-3 win over Cin-

cinnati. Justin Maxwell had a tworun homer to help the Astros snap a season-worst eightgame skid.

"It's not easy (when you) give another major league team a three or four spot in the first inning," Lyles said. "I had to really bear down from the get-go and not try to hold anything back or save anything. My main focus was to get through that first inning."

Zack Cozart hit a two-run homer off Lyles in the third inning, but the Reds couldn't get anything else going against

the 21 year old. He allowed five hits and struck out three in his longest

start of the year. It's the first

win of the season for Lyles (1-1) and his first since last Aug. 20.

"What an effort from Jordan Lyles. That was absolutely outstanding," Houston manager Brad Mills said. "He came right out and shut that down and started making pitches right away."

He has made five starts for Houston, but spent most of the season in Triple-A. Brett Myers pitched a 1-2-3 ninth for his 13th save.





# **Texas takes NCAA golf title**

LOS ANGELES, Calif. (AP) — Texas won its third NCAA men's golf championship defeating Alabama on a 20foot birdie putt by senior Dylan Frittelli on Sunday at Rivera. With the match tied at two, Frit-

telli, who is from South Africa, came to the 18th hole all square with Cory Whitsett. After Whitsett's birdie chip came up well short, Frittelli drained his birdie opportunity.

"I don't even know what happened," Frittelli said. "It was all a blur. I just wanted to make that putt. It was amaz-

Alabama took the first two of the five matches. Hunter Hamrick defeated Julio Vegas 6 and 5, while Bobby Wyatt knocked in a 30-foot chip from behind the green to down Toni Hakula, 1 up.

Texas then won the next two matches. Jordan Spieth closed out fellow freshman, Justin Thomas, 3 and 2, while Cody Gribble went 3-0 in match play, defeating Scott Strohmeyer, 2 and 1, leaving Frittelli to earn the Longhorn's third championship.

"It came down to the last hole with two great players," Texas Coach John Fields said. "Dylan did something fantastic. We are so fortunate."

Texas also won NCAA Championships in 1971 and 1972, when PGA Tour golfers and major championship winners, Ben Crenshaw and Tom Kite were on the team.

"This was a classic 1 versus 2 match up," Alabama Coach Jay Seawell said. "You hate to lose, but Texas did what they needed to do and they are a great team."

# TCU knocks A&M out of contention

COLLEGE STATION, Texas (AP) - Stefan Crichton threw a six-hitter and Derek Odell homered to lead TCU to a 10-2 victory over Texas A&M on Sunday, eliminating the College Station Regional's top seed.

The Horned Frogs scored lone runs in each of the first three innings — all they'd need for the efficient Crichton (9-2), who struck out four and walked only one.

TCU (38-20) was scheduled to face Mississippi in the regional title game. The Rebels are 2-0 in the regional, and the Horned Frogs need to beat them twice.

Kyle Von Tungeln led the Horned Frogs with three hits, and had two RBIs, as did Kevin Cron and Brance

Odell's home run to right field in the bottom of the third lifted TCU to a 3-2 lead against the Aggies (43-18), who were hoping to make it to the College World Series in consecutive seasons for the first time.

ito Garozzo and Pietro Forquet were North-South for Italy, they got to four spades as shown. It was a sound contract that ordinarily would have been made, but Forquet ran into a combination of bad luck and very good defense — and went down one.

West (Edgar Kaplan) made the normal lead of the jack of clubs, and East (Norman Kay) realized that straightforward defense probably would not produce more than three tricks (two clubs and a spade).

He therefore overtook the jack of clubs with the queen and shifted to his singleton jack of diamonds. Declarer won with dummy's queen, led the jack of trumps, which held, and continued with a trump, wen by Kay with the ace.

Continuing with the plan he had formulated at the start, Kay now underled his A-K of clubs, Kaplan winning with the ten. Kaplan then returned a diamond, and Kay ruffed to put the contract down one. This sparkling defense was later

duplicated at the second table by the Italian East-West pair, Walter Avarelli and Giorgio Belladonna. They defeated four spades in exactly the same manner, and the deal proved to be a complete washout.

Most deals played in the annual world championship receive limited publicity, even though they may have been bid or played exceptionally well. Often, this is because the same result has been achieved at both tables, yielding no gain to either side. Here is one such deal from the U.S.-Italy match in 1967. When Ben-
