Exhausted jurors recessed at 11:30 p.m. Tuesday after spending 131/2 hours in the closed, steamy Grand Jury room on the second floor of the courthouse. During the marathon session they studied six cases and heard testimony from 20 witnesses.

Most of the session was spent hearing testimony regarding the Aguinaga baby's death, which has rekindled local criticism over the admission policies at Plains Memorial Hospital.

The Dec. 8 incident received statewide attention. Both the AP and UPI are following the story, as are regional TV stations and the state's metropolitan newspapers. News media reporters and cameramen were on hand throughout the day Tuesday as the Grand Jury's investigation continued

Thinking they had been denied admission at the local hospital, the Aguinagas took their baby to Swisher Memorial Hospital in Tulia, where he received further treatment. But the baby was denied admission there because the parents were not Swisher County residents, and the Aguinagas reportedly were told to take their baby back to Plains Memorial.

The baby died while the Aguinagas were returning to Dimmitt.

food corn in the nation and we want to market it." Speaking of "what this committee can do to benefit the farmers here," King emphasized that President Carter has discretionary powers to mandate 90 percent parity prices "if we could just get through to him that he could remedy our plight" under

present laws. King said "what farmers need" includes more facilities on the Gulf coast and more rail facilities to increase exports, "gas that we can afford to pump irrigation water," research on gasahol made from corn, water importation, and a sugar act to stabilize prices for benefit of both corn and sugar beet growers.

Comparative costs of farm equipment now and a decade ago were cited by Shackelford who concluded, "Farmers must learn to agree nationwide on the fundamentals, no matter how much we are individuals, in order to demand and get fair prices. Whatever the crop, the essential for the farmer today is parity."

Role of the middleman, who is often mentioned as the beneficiary from higher grocery prices although the grower is paid less for his raw materials, was discussed by Yokum, who said "We can't cut out the middleman; we need him, but parity would benefit both him and the farmer.'

The same themes were repeated by Arnold Schwertner of Floyd County, Bill Clevenger and Jerome Friemel of Hereford in their testimony. June Saylor, Texas president of Women Involved in Farm Economics (WIFE) added another concern as she spoke of

Community needs to correct



### 'deplorable' plight of poor

#### Dear Editor:

Let me preface everything incorporated in this letter with a personal evaluation of our community. The vast majority of citizens in Dimmitt and Castro County are responsible, honest men and women of exemplary integrity, good people, hard working people, Christian people. We can thank God for His blessings in and through the leadership of the community.

Our community leaders need to be more aware of the deplorable condition of the poor here, i.e., week before last a Mexican-American laborer and his wife lost a child of a few months of age. The child had a birth defect and died in John Seeley Hospital in Galveston. The lady contacted the county judge, asking for help in getting her child buried. She contacted a priest, and at least two other clergymen in the city. In each instance she told her story through an interpreter. I was one of the clergymen she contacted, and I am also sure that her hurt and pain was as real as that of any mother in this city. She needed help, not a cheap admonition of God's eternal grace or a word from an official that she had not been a resident long enough to receive even an indigent funeral for her child.

Last week another child of indigent parents died. Again, this mother and father had to speak through an interpreter, and as always, something was lost in the translation.

Knowing the doctor involved initially, I cannot find fault with his response. He was on the ball, procedurally correct. Yet this lady's child died, and it may have been saved had the doctor's orders been carried out.

My point is quite simple. We live in a progressive city; we are responsible people, and in the name of humanity we cannot allow sick children or those who have died to go unattended. And we will not countenance any action by anyone for any reason which does allow such actions to continue.

If we don't have an adequate interpreter in the hospital, in the county courthouse, then by all that declares our own humanity, let's get one.






