**Social Security in Castro County**

During tax season, we receive many inquiries concerning the proper payment of taxes for undocumented aliens. These questions invariably refer to farmers who are uncertain as to how one pays FICA taxes on his undocumented workers, and what happens to these taxes. These questions likewise refer to anyone who hires employees lacking social security numbers.

In order to get a social security number, an alien must present proof from the Immigration and Naturalization Service that he is legally admitted to this country. This proof must furthermore substantiate that the alien is permitted to work in this country. If this documentation is not available the alien is not issued a social security number.

If, in spite of this the employer hires an undocumented worker he then withholds FICA taxes and sends them in without a social security number. These taxes are put into the trust funds and not associated with any individual. The undocumented alien has no access to social security benefits. Should the alien obtain legal admittance at a later date, his record may be credited with past earnings. Accomplishing this will require the full cooperation of the employer in providing detailed records of payment.

When an employer finds himself in this situation, he may wish to help his employee contact the Immigration and Naturalization Service, the closest office in this area is in Dallas. The phone number is 1-214-767-0514.

**Vegetable meet on tap Tuesday**

A panel discussion on labor management and the latest information on vegetable research, production and business practices will highlight the annual conference of the High Plains Vegetable Growers and Shippers Council at Hereford Tuesday.

The educational conference will begin at 8:45 a.m. at the Hereford Community Center, 100 Avenue C at Park Avenue, and will adjourn at 4:40 p.m. The \$5 registration includes a barbecue lunch.

Co-sponsors with the council are the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, the Deaf Smith County Vegetable Crops Committee, the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station and Texas Tech University.

"The program deals with every major concern of Texas vegetable growers, from pre-season market analysis to increasing the demand by consumers for our products," said Dr. Roland T. Roberts, area Extension vegetable specialist.

Research scientists from Texas Tech, Texas A&M University, the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station and industry will discuss work on such topics as behavior of thrips on onions, effect of drought stress on southern peas, performance of multirow onions, and use of animal tallow as antitranspirants to conserve water on vegetables.

Other research reports will include effects of nitrogen fertilization, seeding rate and irrigation on potatoes in a hot, dry season; potato tuber rot fungus organisms; temperature management during shipment of High Plains potatoes; effects of N-Serve on Potatoes, and a system for harvesting and handling High Plains onions.

Performance of potato breeding lines and Texas grown seed will be reported by Dr. Creighton Miller of Texas A&M and Doug Smallwood, Experiment Station research associate at Lubbock.

Construction of individual production cost budgets will be explained by Marvin Sartin, area Extension economist at Lubbock. Dr. Dale Pennington, area Extension soil chemist in charge of the Extension soil testing laboratory at Lubbock, will discuss the use of infrared photography as a fertility management tool.

The vegetable market

situation for 1981 will be analyzed by Dr. Gordon Powell, Extension fruit and vegetable marketing specialist, College Station.

Consumer promotion efforts will be related by Paul Bailey, marketing specialist with the Texas Department of Agriculture, Austin, and Kelly Hicks, field representative for the National Potato Promotion Board, Denver, Colo.

The panel on labor management will feature experienced growers Charles Wetegrove of Raymondville and Wes Fisher of Hereford, with Bill Weeks, executive vice president of the Texas Citrus and Vegetable Growers Assn., Harlingen.

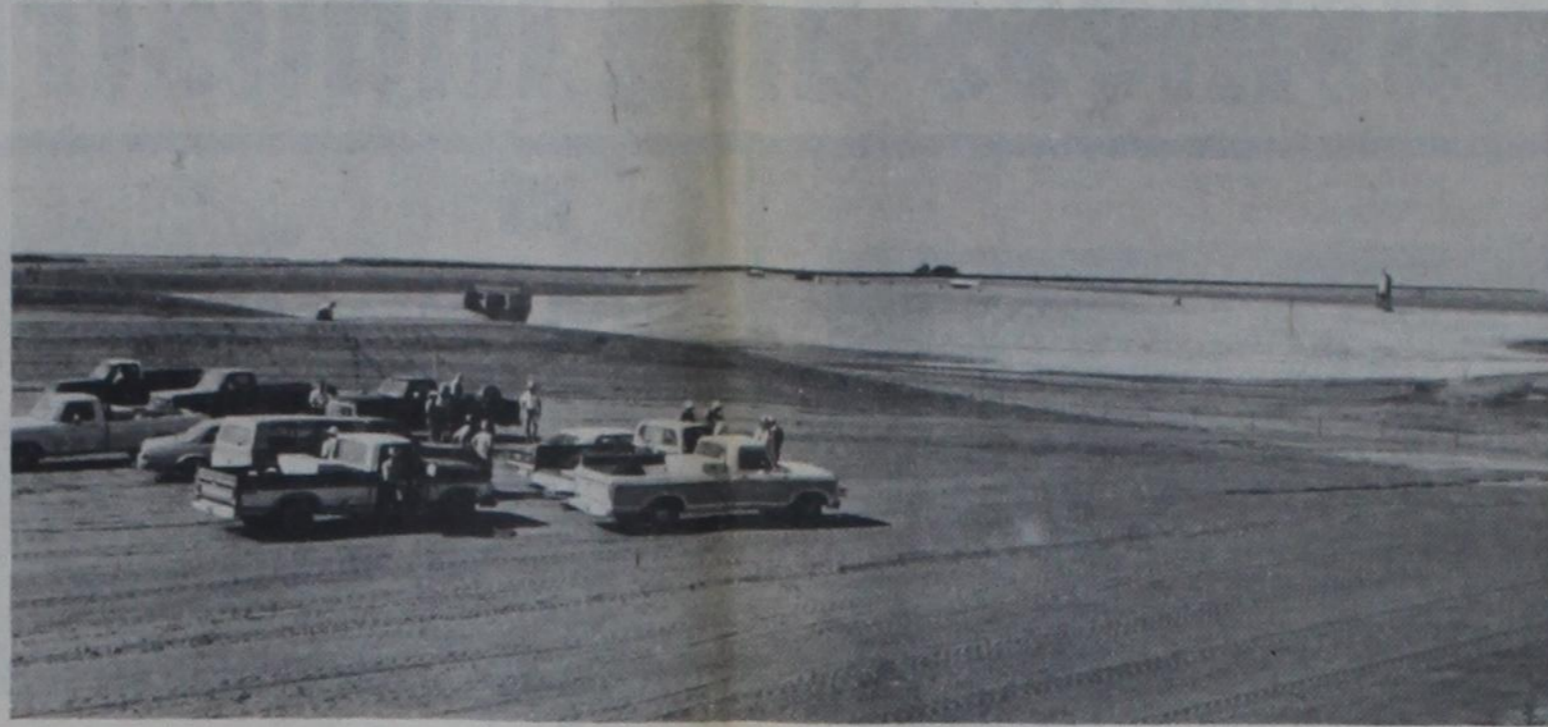

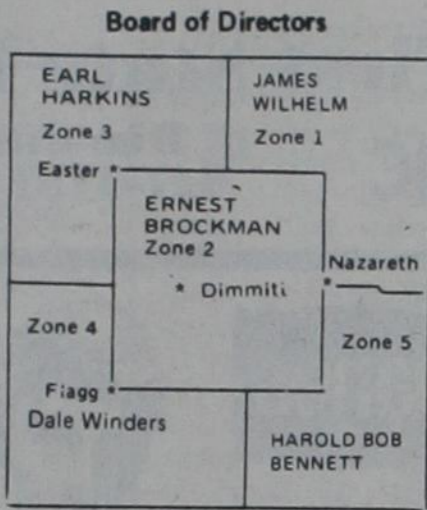

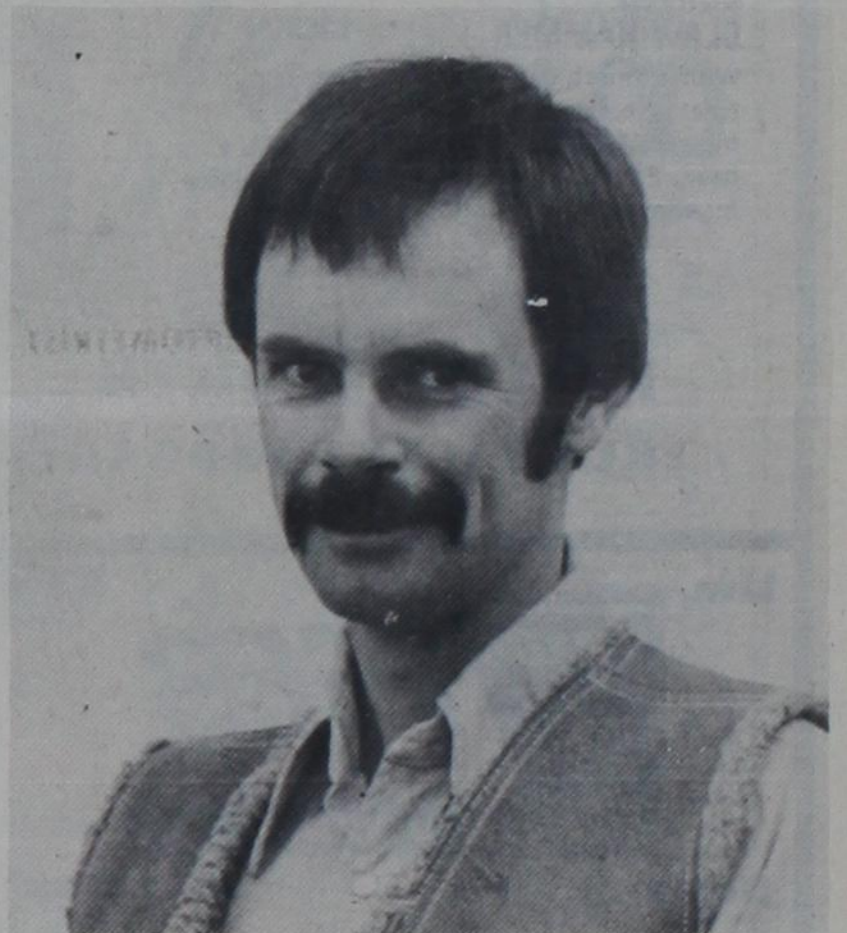

# Swifts clear big hurdle in 59-55 win over Spade

With 39 seconds left in Friday night's game, Calvin Schulte sank a pair of free throws to give Nazareth's Swifts a 57-51 lead over the visiting Spade Longhorns.

But it took another basket by Schulte with four seconds remaining to nail down a Nazareth victory, 59-55, after the tall Longhorns had executed a pair of good down-court scoring plays within 30 seconds to pull within two points.

That's the kind of game it was all night as the two teams matched their fast breaks,

pattern offenses and 2-3 zone defenses in a district contest that was important for the Swifts and crucial for the Longhorns.

It was the Swifts' second victory over the highly rated Longhorns, and put the Nazareth lads a big step closer to repeating as district champs.

With a pair of good 6-3 forwards, Spade had the height advantage, but Nazareth neutralized it with good outside shooting by Bryan Huseman (20 points), Schulte (14) and Dwayne Acker (10). Meanwhile, Dale Hoelting

was holding his own under the basket, sinking 13 points while winning a lot of rebounding tussles.

After the Swifts jumped to a 17-10 first-quarter lead, Spade closed it to 25-24 by halftime. And from then on, it was anybody's ball game.

The visitors went ahead 30-29 on a pair of free throws with 5:18 left in the third. But the Swifts followed with six unanswered points on fast breaks to take a 35-30 lead.

Then the Longhorns made another run and tied the score at 37, 39 and 41 before the

third period ended.

The two teams continued full speed ahead, staying within a basket of each other until, with two minutes left, Hoelting sank a turnaround jumper — despite being double-teamed — to open a four-point Nazareth lead, 55-51.

The Swifts used up a minute with their four-corner offense, then Schulte sank his two free throws for a six-point

lead with 39 seconds left, and Nazareth fans relaxed.

But Spade wouldn't give up, and squeezed two baskets out of the remaining seconds before Schulte's final basket iced the game.

The victory hiked the Swifts' second-half district record to 4-0 and their season mark to 23-3. Spade dropped to 14-8 and 3-1.

The excitement of the boys' game made up for the lack of

it in the girls' contest.

The turning point of the girls' game came when the Swiftettes put on their gym shoes. The Spade girls showed up, the Swiftettes did their thing, and it was 110-22 by the time the final buzzer spelled relief.

The score was 26-5 after the first quarter, 60-6 at halftime and 84-12 going into the final frame. Five Swiftettes finished in double figures while playing about two quarters each. Lori Gerber sank 31, Roxane Birkenfeld 20, Danelle Schmucker 15, Sharon Gerber 12 and Rhonda Hoelting 10.

In addition to hitting their field shots from all angles and distances, the Swiftettes put on a clinic at the charity line, sinking 16 of 18 free throws.

It was the Swiftettes' 25th victory against two losses, and hiked their record to 4-0 in second-half district play. The Spade girls' record fell to 2-19 and 0-4.

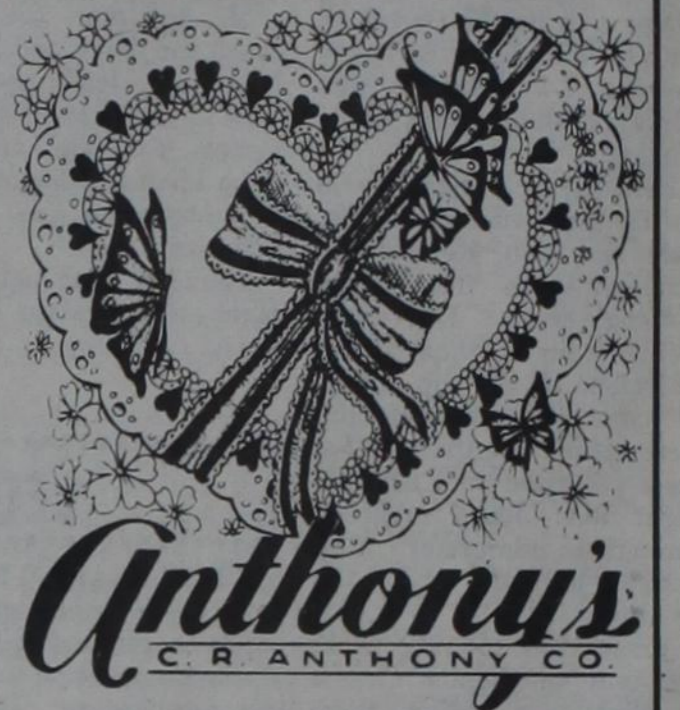
