County Executive Director
To provide protection from Castro County's cropland removed from production, the
Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service requires flant certain grasses and cover crops or instal
approved conservation prac approved conservation
tices on these acres.
"Conservation manage
ment on the land taken out o ment on the land taken out of
production is a requirement of the 1983 acreage reduction,
land diversion and payment in-kind programs," said agency official Melvin Barton.
The diverted acres may be The diverted acres may be
devoted to annual, biennial, or perennial grasses;
legumes, small grains, volunteer stands other than weeds or crop residue from use o no-till, or minimum-til prac-
tices. Barton said barley oats, rice and wheat may be
used as a cover crop but the crop may not be harvested
An exception to this harvest ing restriction has been made for wheat seeded prior to
January 12, 1983, on farms January 12, 1983, on farms
participating in the PIK Program. Other cover and plant ings, such as those benefiting
wildifife, may be develope wildlife, may be developec
provided they meet erosio provided they meet erosio
control standards and are approved by the Agricultura Stabilization and Conservation State Committee with the con-
currence of Soil Conservatio
Farmers are required to us necessary control measure and rodents on diverted acres. Barton said control measures for weeds need to be suffi cient to prevent the spread of
weeds and consistent with weeds and consistent wit
control practices normall carried out on similar crop land in the area
