Nearly 300 Howard County residents have cast a vote in city/school board races in the first two days of early voting.

According to figures released by the Howard County Election Office, 101 votes have been cast in person at the office and

198 have ballots have been received by mail. Early voting continues through Tuesday while election day is May 10.

Voters must bring an acceptable form of photo identification in order to cast a ballot. According to the state, an acceptable form of ID is a Texas driver license issued by

the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS), Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS, Texas personal identification card issued by DPS, Texas concealed handgun license issued by DPS, United States military identification card

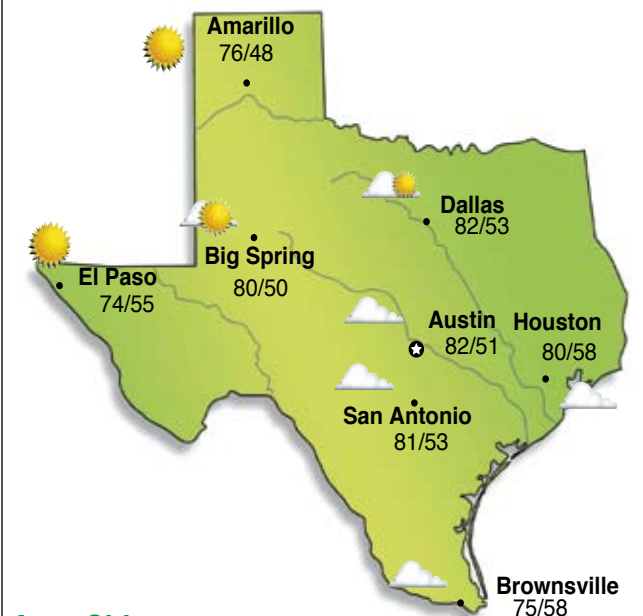



# Common Care rebrand hustle

This weekend on “Fox News Sunday,” anchor Chris Wallace credited his guest, Republican Indiana Gov. Mike Pence, with leading the nation as the “first state to fall out of the Common Core national education standards.” If only it were true.

Wallace didn't do his homework. And presidential aspirant Pence was too busy day-dreaming about 2016 to correct him.

Reality check: Last week, Pence faced the anger of hundreds of Indiana parents, educators and activists at a public Indiana Business Roundtable meeting to discuss his phony charade. The protesters openly booed Pence's derision of critics as out-of-staters and elitists. They roared their disapproval when he claimed that his “new” standards were superior and homegrown.

Indiana mom Heather Crossin, one of the earliest and strongest grassroots voices against the federalized standards/textbook/testing racket, exposed the truth: “The proposed standards are simply a cloned version of the Common Core rebranded.”

Indiana mom Erin Tuttle, also a leading Hoosier activist for true academic excellence, reported that state officials had failed to prove that their “new” scheme included “internationally and nationally benchmarked” standards as required by state law.

Indiana native and Hillsdale College professor Terrence Moore, who reviewed the “new” English standards, concluded that if the proposal were turned into him as a college paper, he would give it an F and write “plagiarism” across the top. The “new” regime recycles old Common Core ideology, eschews phonics and fails to define “what constitutes good reading and good literature.”

Indiana native, Stanford University emeritus math professor and former member of the Common Core math standards validation committee James Milgram blasted the “new” Indiana math standards supported by Pence and the state school board. He begged the state to ask qualified mathematicians to revise the standards. He was ignored. Milgram revealed that “there are even more errors in the current document than were present in (an earlier draft). The standards for these courses are completely disorganized and, mathematically speaking, can only be described as bizarre.”

Indiana mom and vigilant education analyst Joy Pullmann added: “Pence's decision is all the more foolish because Indiana has been renowned as one of the two or three states with the highest standards in the nation.

... Now Indiana has even worse standards than the Common Core Hoosier mothers and fathers spent three exhausting years attempting to defenestrate.”

It wasn't just opponents who spotlighted the “new” Indiana standards' eerie echoes of the federal Common Core program.

A pro-Common Core educator in Indiana, Tami Hicks, counseled her colleagues: “(D)on't stop your work on CCSS (Common Core State Standards) — they are just getting a new name. ... If you compare the new drafted standards to the CCSS, they will see that they are practically (or even exactly) the same.”

A spokesman from Pence's office sent me materials purporting to refute the critics. But the documents he sent revealed a fascinating tidbit: Common Core architects have generously waived copyright claims on their materials, will not sue Indiana recyclers and “did not see any problems with Indiana using excerpts or portions of the Common Core State Standards within Indiana's standards.” How convenient.

Pence's friend Republican Utah Gov. Gary Herbert also inad-

vertently spilled the beans on the Rename That Common Core Tune game. “I've talked to Gov. Pence about what they're doing there,” he told a local reporter. “In essence, they're creating what's called the Indiana Core. It's not the Common Core. It's the Indiana Core, but their standards are almost mirroring exactly what's commonly referred to as the Common Core standards. So they're just doing it in a different way, which is what we've already been doing in Utah.”

GOP Arizona Gov. Jan Brewer pulled a similar move, issuing an executive order last fall to whitewash “Common Core” from state government documents. She replaced the name with “Arizona's College and Career Ready Standards.” But the old racket is still in place. And Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation-funded lobbyists from Achieve Inc. and the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers are still in the driver's seat.

This retreat-and-rebrand strategy was explicitly championed by Fed Ed advocate and former Arkansas GOP Gov. Mike Huckabee. Huckabee told his allies at the Gates Foundation-funded Council of Chief State School Officers earlier this year that since Common Core had become “toxic,” the group needed to “rebrand it, refocus it, but don't retreat.”

While disingenuous Republican governors tout their “withdrawals” from Common Core, it's more of the same old, same old: Diluted standards, tied to testing/textbook/technology cash cows, manufactured a top-down cadre of big-government D.C. education lobbyists and big-business interests, in violation of local control and state sovereignty.

This Saturday is the nerd prom, officially called the White House Correspondents' Association dinner, a gigantic bash where the powerful of Washington, the beautiful of Hollywood and the geeks of the national press corps gather together in one giant banquet room to do ... what?

Critics say the whole affair stinks of elitism, classism and narcissism. (In my experience, it stinks mostly of bourbon.)

The New York Times, which has not attended the dinner since 2007, said through one editor: “It makes it appear that everything in one Washington is a big game, theater. But that a couple times a year the press and pols take their costumes off, sing together, mingle with celebrities and act like we are all in it together. I just don't like the appearance.”

A blogger called BooMan wrote a few years ago: “The primary importance of the WHCA Dinner is to document yearly just how out of touch our elite politicians and journalists are with the rest of the country and to confirm the rest of us in our hatred and resentment of this class of people who have led us like thieves and incompetents for decades without let up.”

To which I say firmly and with

resolve: “Can I get another drink here?”

To me, it's a party. It's fun. Though, some journalists squeezed into too-tight tuxedos or ball gowns defensively say they use the party to get information from powerful sources.

I have attended the dinner for almost 30 years, and the most powerful person I ever talked to was Vanna White.

White has been flipping letters since 1982 on “Wheel of Fortune,” which is the longest-running syndicated game show in television history and is seen in 60 countries across the globe.

Name me a politician who can say that.

I went up to White, and she extended her hand.

“Hi, my name is Vanna White,” she said.

Hi, I am James Carville's celebrity double, I said.

“You look nothing like James Carville,” she said.

Thank you, I said.

I didn't know what to say next. Would you like to dance? I asked.

“I believe the Marine Band is playing ‘The Stars and Stripes Forever,’” she pointed out.

We could sort of krump along to that, I said.

She wished me a very good evening and left.

Probably in search of a vowel.

But tell me how that leads to “hatred and resentment” of a “class of people who have led us like thieves and incompetents for decades without let up”?

True, I once sat at a table with the late Robert Bork. He was alive at the time (I think) and was the former U.S. appellate judge who was rejected by the Senate for the Supreme Court.

Bork became famous during the “Saturday Night Massacre,” in which President Richard Nixon ordered U.S. Attorney

General Elliot Richardson to fire Watergate special prosecutor Archibald Cox.

Richardson resigned rather than do so. His top deputy, William Ruckelshaus, also resigned rather than do so. Bork was next in line, and he had no problem firing Cox.

In his posthumously published memoirs, Bork said Nixon had promised him the next seat on the Supreme Court. But Nixon resigned from office before he got a chance to give it to him.

I had no idea what to say to Bork, who was seated across the table from me.

Even though the number of journalists who cover the White House full time probably numbers fewer than 150, the dinner squeezes about 2,600 people into the main ballroom of the Washington Hilton.

And except for when the president of the United States stands up and tells the jokes that have been written for him, it can be quite noisy.

Hey, that Nixon was some liar, wasn't he? I yelled at Bork.

Bork replied either “I could squash you like a bug” or “I can't hear you.” I do not know which.

Over the years, I have met Washington's and Hollywood's power elite at the nerd prom. They are the best-known entertainers, the most powerful politicians and the most influential journalists of the day.

And I always tell them the same thing: Power fades, and fame is fleeting. Sic transit gloria mundi.

That last one is Latin for “drink up.”

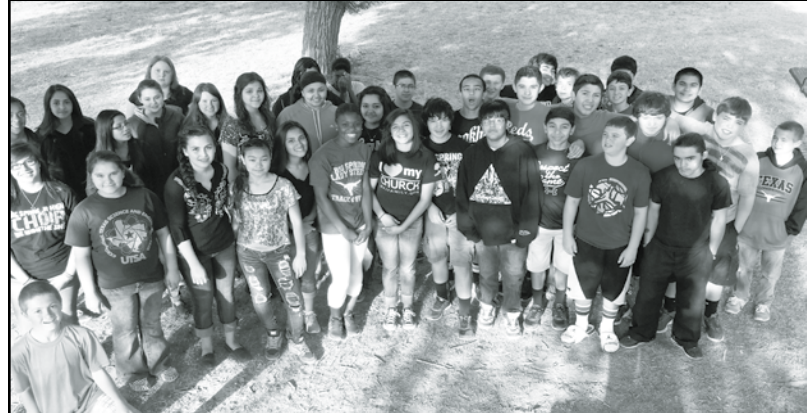
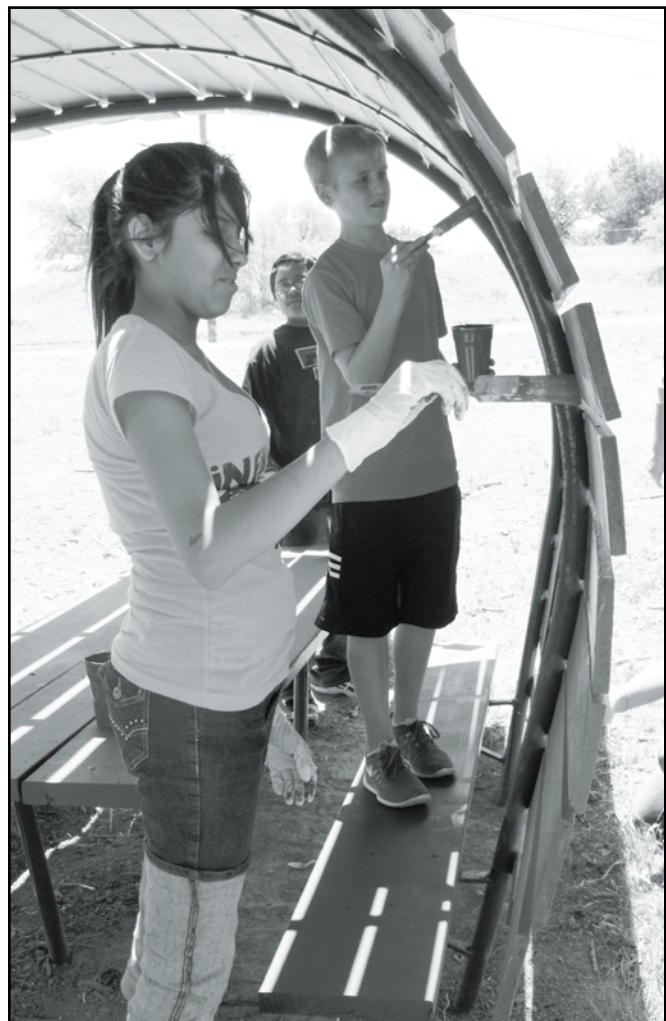

### Botched Oklahoma execution could renew 'cruel and unusual punishment' challenges

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — The botched execution of an Oklahoma inmate is certain to fire up the debate over what constitutes cruel and unusual punishment — the phrase written into the U.S. Constitution and defined by the courts, piece by piece, over two centuries.

Convicted killer Clayton Lockett, 38, began writhing, clenching his teeth and straining to lift his head off the pillow Tuesday evening after he was supposedly rendered unconscious by the first of three drugs in the state's new lethal injection combination.

The execution was halted, and Lockett died of a heart attack about a half-hour later, authorities said.

While officials later blamed a ruptured vein — not the drugs themselves — the case is raising questions about the ability of states to administer lethal injections that meet the Eighth Amendment requirement that punishments be neither cruel nor unusual.

Death penalty opponents such as the American Civil Liberties Union called for moratorium on capital punishment. And the White House said the procedure fell short of the humane standards required when the death penalty is carried out.

### Military sex assault reports up by 50 percent; officials want more men to report

WASHINGTON (AP) — Reports of sexual assaults by members of the military rose 50 percent after the Pentagon began a vigorous campaign to get more victims to come forward, prompting defense officials to order a greater focus on prevention programs, including plans to review alcohol sales and policies.

But officials are still unhappy with the low number of male victims who reported sexual assault, and they say there will be a greater emphasis in the months ahead on getting men to come forward and seek help. Final data obtained by The Associated Press show that about 14 percent of the reports filed last year involved male victims.

Defense officials said Wednesday that encouraging more men to report sexual assaults is a difficult challenge because male victims often worry that it will make people think they are weak and trigger questions about their sexual orientation. In most cases, however, sexual orientation has nothing to do with the assault and it's more an issue of power or abuse.

"There is still a misperception that this is a women's issue and women's crime," said Nate Galbreath, the senior executive adviser for the Pentagon's sexual assault prevention office. "It's disheartening that we have such a differential between the genders and how they are choosing to report."

### In response to Republican claim of 'smoking gun,' White House denies memo was about Benghazi

WASHINGTON (AP) — The White House on Wednesday denied that a staff member's email three days after the deadly attack on the U.S. mission at Benghazi, Libya, was actually about the attack. Critics have branded the electronic missive as evidence that the Obama administration sought to deceive the public about the true circumstances surrounding the deaths of four Americans during the final months of the 2012 presidential campaign.

"It was explicitly not about Benghazi," press secretary Jay Carney told journalists during his daily briefing at the White House. "It was about the overall situation in the region, the Muslim world, where you saw protests outside of embassy facilities across the region, including in Cairo, Sana'a, Khartoum and Tunis."

Sen. Lindsey Graham, R-S.C., has called the email a "smoking gun" that "shows political operatives in the White House working to create a political narrative at odds with the facts."

The U.S. ambassador to Libya, Chris Stevens, and three other Americans died in the attack on Sept. 11, 2012. Republicans contend that President Barack Obama, eager to claim in an election year that al-Qaida and terrorists in general were on the run, misled Americans by linking the Benghazi attack to protests over an anti-Islamic video when he knew otherwise.

The intelligence community compiled its own talking points for members of Congress that suggested the Benghazi attack stemmed from protests in Cairo and elsewhere over the anti-Islamic video rather than an assault by extremists. The U.S. ambassador to the United Nations, Susan Rice, used those talking points during her appearances on Sunday news shows following the attack. However, the CIA's former deputy director, Mike Morrell, later said he had deleted from the talking points the references to terrorism warnings to avoid showing up the State Department, not for political reasons.

### Sinn Fein chief Adams questioned for 2nd day over 1972 IRA abduction, killing of Belfast woman

DUBLIN (AP) — Sinn Fein leader Gerry Adams remained in police custody for a second day Thursday as detectives questioned him over his alleged role in the Irish Republican Army's abduction, killing and secret burial of a Belfast mother of 10 in 1972.

Senior politicians in Adams' Irish nationalist

party said they hoped he would be released soon without charge and accused British authorities of timing Wednesday's arrest to undermine Sinn Fein's campaigning in elections taking place in both parts of Ireland later this month.

Under Northern Ireland's anti-terrorist law Adams can be held until Friday night, by which time police must release or charge him, or seek a judicial extension to his custody.

Adams, 65, has always denied any role in the outlawed IRA, but every credible history of the Sinn Fein-IRA movement has identified him as a senior commander since the early 1970s. The IRA killed nearly 1,800 people from 1970 to 1997, when it ceased fire to permit Sinn Fein to pursue peace negotiations with Britain and leaders of Northern Ireland's Protestant majority.

Former IRA members interviewed for a Boston College-commissioned research project have linked him to the slaying of Jean McConville, a 38-year-old widow whom the IRA branded a British spy. An investigation by Northern Ireland's Police Ombudsman said there was no evidence that she was an informant.

### Toronto Mayor Rob Ford says he will take leave to seek help for alcohol

TORONTO (AP) — Toronto Mayor Rob Ford will take a leave of absence to seek help for alcohol, he said, as a report surfaced about a second video of the mayor smoking what appears to be crack cocaine.

Ford, who is seeking re-election in the Oct. 27 vote, said Wednesday he will take an immediate leave from his job and his campaign.

"I have a problem with alcohol, and the choices I have made while under the influence. I have struggled with this for some time," Ford said in statement late Wednesday.

The Globe and Mail newspaper said it has viewed a second video of Ford smoking what appears to be crack cocaine in his sister's basement. The national newspaper said two Globe reporters viewed the video from a self-professed drug dealer showing Ford taking a drag from a pipe early Saturday morning.

The video is part "of a package of three videos the dealer said was surreptitiously filmed around 1:15 a.m., and which he says he is now selling for 'at least six figures,'" the paper reported.

### CSX train derails, catches fire in Va.; latest in string of crashes involving oil tankers

LYNCHBURG, Va. (AP) — Nicole Gibs was serving a table at Lynchburg's Depot Grille across the tracks along the James River when she heard a train that sounded even louder than usual. When she looked up, she saw several train cars wobbling, and then one fell over, immediately sparking a fire.

Several others toppled "like Tyco trains," the 32-year-old said, and her manager yelled: "Evacuate!"

CSX crews were on the scene Thursday trying to quickly clean up and clear what city officials described as more than a dozen derailed train cars, some carrying

crude oil. A few caught fire Wednesday, with three tanker cars ending up in the water and leaking some of their contents. It was the latest in a string of crashes involving oil trains that has safety experts pushing for better oversight.

Nearby buildings were evacuated for a time, but officials said there were no injuries. CSX said the train was on its way from Chicago to an unspecified destination when most of the cars were knocked off the tracks. Online photos and videos showed large flames and thick, black smoke right after the crash.

### Brunei embraces strict Islamic laws, slammed as backward step by rights groups

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, Brunei (AP) — Brunei on Thursday embraced a form of Islamic Shariah criminal law that includes harsh penalties, a move slammed by international rights group as a step backward for human rights.

The tiny Southeast Asian nation began phasing in a version of Shariah that allows for penalties such as amputation for theft and stoning for adultery. Most of the punishments can be applied to non-Muslims, who account for about one-third of the 440,000 people in the oil-rich country.

Sultan Hassanal Bolkiah has introduced the law as a "great achievement" for Brunei.

"The decision to implement the (Shariah penal code) is not for fun but is to obey Allah's command as written in the Quran," he said in a speech Wednesday to announce the launch first phase of the law.

From Thursday, Brunei citizens can be fined or jailed by Islamic courts for offences like not performing Friday prayers, pregnancy out of wedlock, propagating other religions and indecent behavior.

### Stories of rescues, devastation emerge from floodwaters in Florida Panhandle, Alabama

PENSACOLA, Fla. (AP) — Valencia Norton awoke to a neighbor pounding on the windows of the mobile home she shared with a friend. Water had washed away her steps and part of the porch. She grabbed a small bag of clothes and waited.

"I was freaking," said Norton, tears streaming down her face as she recalled the scene. "I don't know how to swim."

A short time later, a firefighter came by and carried her to dry land. It was one of many rescue stories from the single rainiest day ever recorded in Pensacola, and another tale of survival after days of relentless storms across the U.S., beginning with deadly and destructive tornadoes Sunday in the Midwest.

**Bridge is not** the kind of game where a defender can play first, think later and expect to fare well. If he does, he will frequently have to pay the piper for his failure to think things through.

**Consider the present case** where West led a diamond against six hearts. East took dummy's queen with the ace and returned a club. South now had many different ways to play the hand, but he found the winning route.

**He took the club return** with the ace, drew trumps, cashed the A-K of spades and ruffed a spade. Dummy's king of diamonds then provided the entry to cash the remaining spades, so declarer made the slam for a score of 1,730 points (including 100 honors).

**Offhand**, it might seem that East-West were helpless in the matter, but that was not really the case. Had the defense functioned correctly, South would have lost the slam.

**The culprit was East**, who should not have taken his ace of diamonds at trick one. Had he instead played the three on dummy's queen, declarer's goose would have been cooked. No matter what South did from that point on, the contract would have failed. By ducking the queen of diamonds, East would have deprived declarer of a vital entry to dummy's spades after they had become established.

**Moreover**, East could tell at trick one — from examining the dummy, his own hand and West's fourth-best deuce-of-diamonds opening lead — that ducking the queen of diamonds offered a far better chance to stop the slam than did winning the queen with the ace. The one thing East could not afford to do was to win the opening lead with the ace and then start thinking about what to do next.

## Four HC players headed for new homes

Howard College President Dr. Cheryl Sparks had three simple questions in mind on Wednesday afternoon as she watched four of the school's top athletes sign scholarships with larger four-year programs.

What did they learn? What did they earn? What about life?

Never one to be at a loss for words, sophomore Demeco Blue summed it up best, saying "thanking his coaches for teaching him, the HC women for making his year memorable, and summing up the greatest lesson he learned - "Once a Hawk, always a Hawk."

"I had a great year here," said Blue, one of three members of HC head coach Scott Raines' squad to sign during the noon ceremony. "I appreciate

getting to know everyone, and what they did for us."

Blue joined teammates David Joseph and Eric Weary and softball standout Kendall Maddox in signing scholarship at the ceremony, which drew more than 50 school officials, students and fans.

A 6-foot-7 post from Amarillo, Blue signed to play next season at Texas A&M International University in Laredo, an NCAA Division II program that competes in the Heartland Conference along with the University of Texas at the Permian Basin and Lubbock Christian University.

At TAMU, Blue will be joining a Dustdevils squad that went 22-9 and advanced to the South Central Regional Tournament this past season.

Blue, who averaged 7.9 points and five rebounds per game this season, teamed with Joseph and Weary to

help the Hawks post a 24-8 record and advance to the semifinals of the Region V Basketball Tournament.

While Blue is headed near the border to continue his career, Joseph and Weary will be making the biggest leaps. Both will be playing at the Division I level next season. The two became the first Hawks to earn spots at major DI programs since current NBA standout Jae Crowder went to Marquette.

The team's captain, Joseph agreed to scholarship with Bowling Green University in Kentucky, while Weary inked a deal with the University of Houston.

The team's starting point guard, Joseph was one of the driving forces behind the Hawks' success this season. He was among the team's top scorers (13.2 points per game), registered a team-high 6.3 assists and 1.6 steals.

"I'm very grateful for the opportunity to play at the Division I level," said Joseph, an all-Western Junior College Athletic Conference selection.

By signing with Bowling Green, Joseph gave Hawk fans even more reason to keep up with Bowling Green in the future. The Falcons are coached by former HC mentor Chris Jans.

A 6-foot sophomore from Queens, New York, Joseph will be joining a Falcons program that is reloading under Jans, who was hired in mid April. BGSU is coming off a 12-20 campaign this season, including a 6-12 mark in the Mid-America Conference.

Although he will be playing in basketball-rich Kentucky next fall, Joseph said part of him will remain with the Hawks.

"I had a great time here," he said.

Today is Thursday, May 1, the 121st day of 2014. There are 244 days left in the year. Today's Highlight in History: On May 1, 1898, Commodore George Dewey gave the command, "You may fire when you are ready, Grid-ley," as an American naval force destroyed a Spanish squadron in Manila Bay during the Spanish-American War. On this date: In 1707, the Kingdom of Great Britain was created as a treaty merging England and Scotland took effect.

In 1786, Mozart's opera "The Marriage of Figaro" premiered in Vienna. In 1911, the song "I Want a Girl (Just Like the Girl That Married Dear Old Dad)," by Harry Von Tilzer and Will Dillon, was first published. In 1931, New York's 102-story Empire State Building was dedicated. Singer Kate Smith made her debut on CBS Radio on her 24th birthday. In 1941, the Orson Welles motion picture "Citizen Kane" premiered in New York. In 1960, the Soviet Union shot down an American U-2 reconnaissance plane over Sverdlovsk and cap-

tured its pilot, Francis Gary Powers. In 1961, the first U.S. airline hijacking took place as Antulio Ramirez Ortiz, a Miami electrician, commandeered a National Airlines plane that was en route to Key West, Fla., and forced the pilot to fly to Cuba. In 1971, the intercity passenger rail service Amtrak went into operation.
