## Landfill on Tuesday's city agenda

Big Spring officials will likely get the administrative wheels rolling toward getting a proposed landfill up and running when the city council meets at 5:30 p.m. Tuesday in council chambers, located at 307 E. Fourth.

The council will consider a professional services contract with Parkhill, Smith & Cooper to provide engineering services related to the facility.

The council recently purchased 300 acres of land northeast of the city limits to serve as a replacement for the current landfill, which has an estimated remaining life span of about five years. The licensing and permitting process to open the new landfill will take about five years — or the estimated life of the existing dump — and is expected to cost between \$15 million and \$18 million before the facility is open to business.

PS&C will provide services necessary to obtain a construction and operations permit

## Inmate sentenced; Castaneda to report June 20

Former Correctional Officer and Inmate Sentenced in Contraband Smuggling Case

ABILENE, Texas — A former correctional officer at Big Spring Correctional Center, Matthew Castaneda, 24,

and an inmate, Ferdinand Trinidad, 45, have been sentenced for offenses related to contraband smuggling.

Friday, Trinidad was sentenced by U.S. District Judge Sam R. Cummings to six months in federal prison. He pleaded guilty in February 2014 to one count of misprision of a felony.

Castaneda, who pleaded guilty in January 2014 to one count of making false

statements, was sentenced by Judge Cummings on May 16 to six months in federal prison and six months home monitoring. He must surrender to the Bureau of Prisons on June 20.

According to documents filed in the case, from mid-September 2012 to mid-December 2012, Castaneda accepted monetary bribes from Trinidad's wife to smuggle cell phones and other contraband

into the GEO Group-operated facility for Trinidad. Trinidad's wife would receive the contraband at her residence and then mail it to Castaneda at Big Spring Correctional Center. She would deposit money directly into a bank account that Castaneda had set up to hide the scheme.

Castaneda admitted receiving a \$1,700 bribe, and Trinidad admitted he failed to notify an authority as soon as

possible that Castaneda had agreed to bring contraband into the prison in exchange for monetary bribes.

The Department of Justice Office of the Inspector General conducted the investigation. Assistant U.S. Attorney Paulina Jacobo prosecuted.



## Forsan ISD trustees to handle routine business

FORSAN — Trustees with the Forsan Independent School District will head into the summer months tackling a mostly routine agenda for the June meeting this evening.

Among the items listed will be an update on the \$14 million project to construct a new elementary campus on land adjacent to the high

school and administrative buildings. Physical work on the project has been on-going since February with an expected completion in time for the 2015 school year.

Trustees have had to closely watch costs and consider scaling down or changing some of the smaller projects to make sure the construction costs come in on or under budget. An economic boon in the area spurred by an oil and gas re-

surge has dramatically increased living and construction costs in the last few years. Voters in the Fisd district approved a \$23.8 million bond project in May of 2013 which included funds for the construction of the new elementary school.

During the meeting, trustees will consider a contract amendment for the construction manager for the bond construction.

Trustees will meet at 7 p.m. this evening in the boardroom, located at 411 W. Sixth St., Forsan

- Consider a resolution to approve to auction off Howard County trustee properties to the highest bidder.

## Gasoline prices see slight drop

Average retail gasoline prices in Texas have fallen 2.1 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.43/g Sunday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 13,114 gas out-

lets in Texas.

This compares with the national average that has fallen 0.9 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.63/g, according to gasoline price website GasBuddy.com.

Including the change in

gas prices in Texas during the past week, prices Sunday were 7.7 cents per gallon higher than the same day one year ago and are 1.1 cents per gallon higher than a month ago. The national average has increased 0.3 cents per

gallon during the last month and stands 0.4 cents per gallon lower than this day one year ago.

"It's been yet another boring week at the pump with

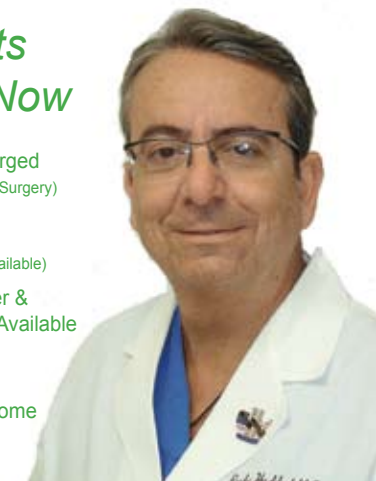

from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, which will consist of three phases.

Phase 1 will consist of the initial application to TCEQ. It gives a general project description, the proposed facility location and identifies any property owners affect-

ed by the new landfill.

The second phase, which will run concurrently with Phase 1, is much more involved. It consists of a geotechnical survey of the site, as well as studies on the hydrogeology, general geology, historical/architectural and endangered species aspect of the new landfill. These studies could take up to a year, PS&C officials said.

Finally, Phase 3 of the agreement will cover all engineering services necessary to prepare the permit document, a process that could take from six to 18 months.

The agreement also provides for PS&C support in case the application is contested for any reasons.

In other business Tuesday, the council will consider:

- An order authorizing

the auction of Howard County trustee property to the highest bidder.

- Tax abatement guidelines and criteria.

- A change order to the construction contract for improvements to the water treatment plant.

gasoline prices seeing relative calm," said GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan. "I don't recall the last time that the national average, which stands at nearly \$3.64/gal was the same yesterday, a week ago, a month ago, and also a

"If you're a motorist, I'm not sure if seeing such duplicity is bad since prices have remained high, or good, since prices are relatively calm. While I continue to hope for an eventual drop in gasoline prices, the more I'm starting to think that we just won't see any sort of major summer decline like we have the last

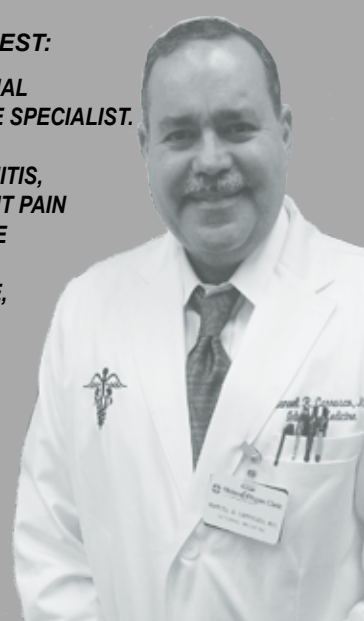

Dad is not my biological father, but he raised me. He's the only father I've known. But I think he's trying to buy my love. He

never leaves me alone and is always telling me how much better things will be. But he's lying to my face. I happen to know that when he tells me he's at work, he's drinking at a bar.

I don't want to discuss it with him. If he wants to be in my life, he has to quit drinking. Otherwise, I'm done with him. Am I wrong? -- Nevada

**Dear Nevada:** Please understand that giving up alcohol is not an easy thing for your father. We are certain he is struggling with it. Nonetheless, you should not be living with him until he can provide a stable, healthy home environment. Please look into Alateen ([al-anon.alateen.org](http://al-anon.alateen.org)) for kids whose parents

have alcohol problems. Alateen will provide information, as well as support.

**Dear Annie:** I sent my children to a Christian school so they could get a quality education along with faith and good values. Sadly, it hasn't been the experience I was wishing for. This school has more bullying than a public school.

Bullying is not just saying horrible things to each other or hitting. It also is being left out and not feeling welcome. Kids at this school who are not sports stars or whose families don't have money are outsiders. The saddest part is that it is not only the students. There are also parents who refuse to acknowledge the less well-off parents at school events.

Many children have transferred out of this school because of the bullying. I was taught that you treat others how you want to be treated. Each child is an individual and should be respected as such. I am sure other parents have these same concerns, but no one speaks up. I ask that all parents set a good example for their children and pay attention to what they may or may not be doing. so they can address it. Ultimately, parents must do what is best for their children, and sometimes that means moving them to a different school where they can prosper.

**Dear Annie:** This is for "Hurting Daughter-in-Law," whose in-laws never liked her and have cut off the grandchildren.

I married my husband 54 years ago. His parents were not happy and let me know it. My husband said to ignore it, and I tried, but they undermined me, blatantly favored his sister's children and worked to destroy our marriage. After his parents died, my husband finally admitted that they had kept up an unrelenting stream of criticism about me, hoping we'd divorce.

One of my kids is completely alienated from me because of her grandparents' subtle inferences that I "treated her differently" from her siblings. She was my gentle, insecure baby, and they destroyed her trust. -- Wish I Had Left

Today is Monday, June 9, the 160th day of 2014. There are 205 days left in the year. Today's Highlight in History: On June 9, 1954, during the Senate-Army Hearings, Army special counsel Joseph N. Welch berated Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy, R-Wis., for verbally attacking a member of Welch's law firm, Fred Fisher, asking McCarthy: "Have you no sense of decency, sir? At long last, have you left no sense of decency?" On this date: In A.D. 68, the Roman Emperor Nero committed suicide, ending a 13-year reign.

In 1870, author Charles Dickens died in Gad's Hill Place, England. In 1911, Carrie (sometimes spelled "Carry") A. Nation, the hatchet-wielding temperance crusader, died in Leavenworth, Kansas, at age 64. In 1934, the first Walt Disney animated cartoon featuring Donald Duck, "The Wise Little Hen," was released. In 1940, during World War II, Norway decided to surrender to the Nazis, effective at midnight. In 1943, the federal government began withholding income tax from paychecks.

In 1953, 94 people died when a tornado struck Worcester (WU'-stur), Massachusetts. In 1969, the Senate confirmed Warren Burger to be the new chief justice of the United States, succeeding Earl Warren. In 1973, Secretariat won the Belmont Stakes, becoming horse racing's first Triple Crown winner in 25 years.

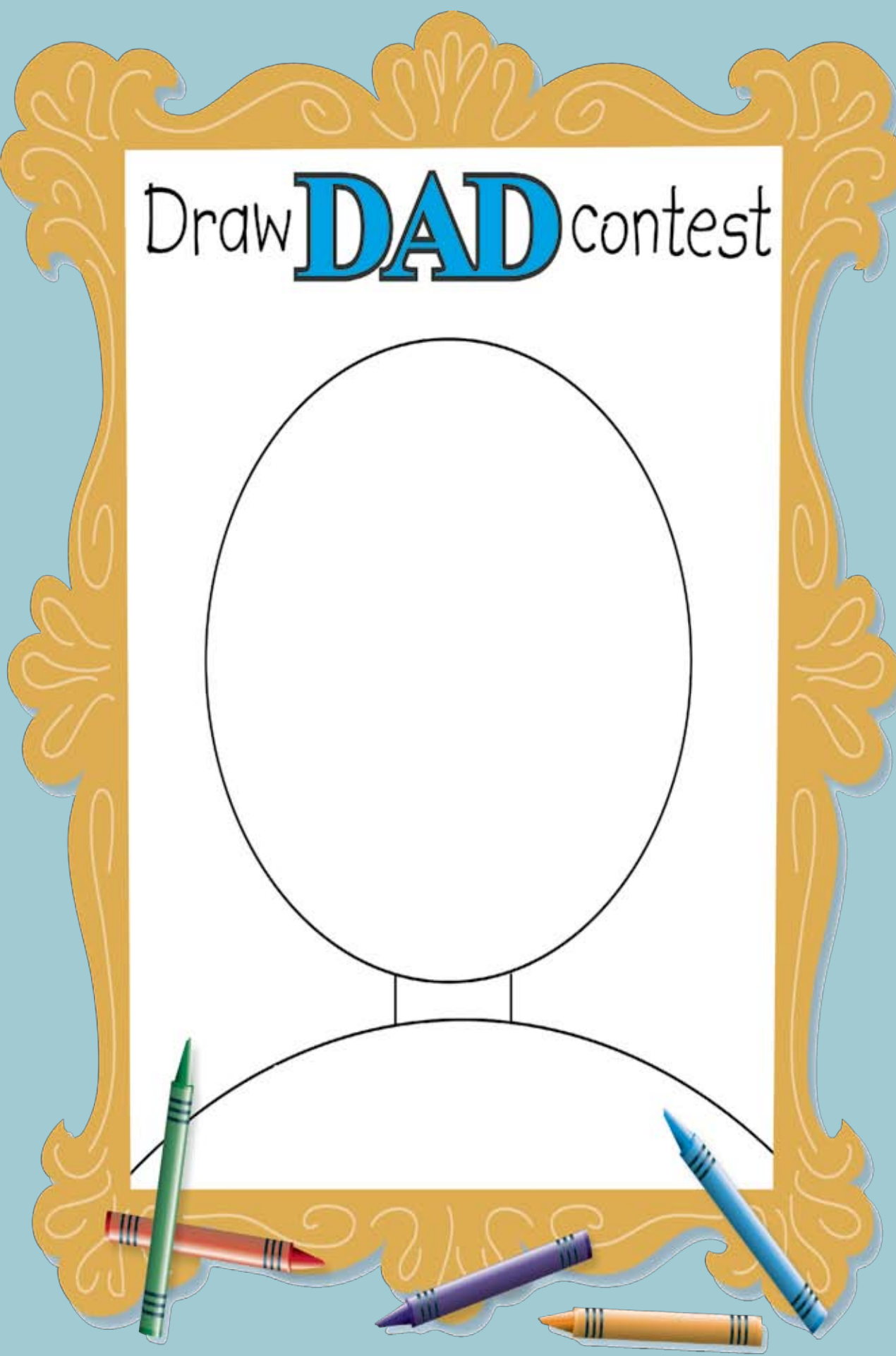
