"BAPTISM"

For years religious leaders have disputed about the action, subject and design of baptism. The answer to our questions on this subject, as all subjects, should come from the scriptures.

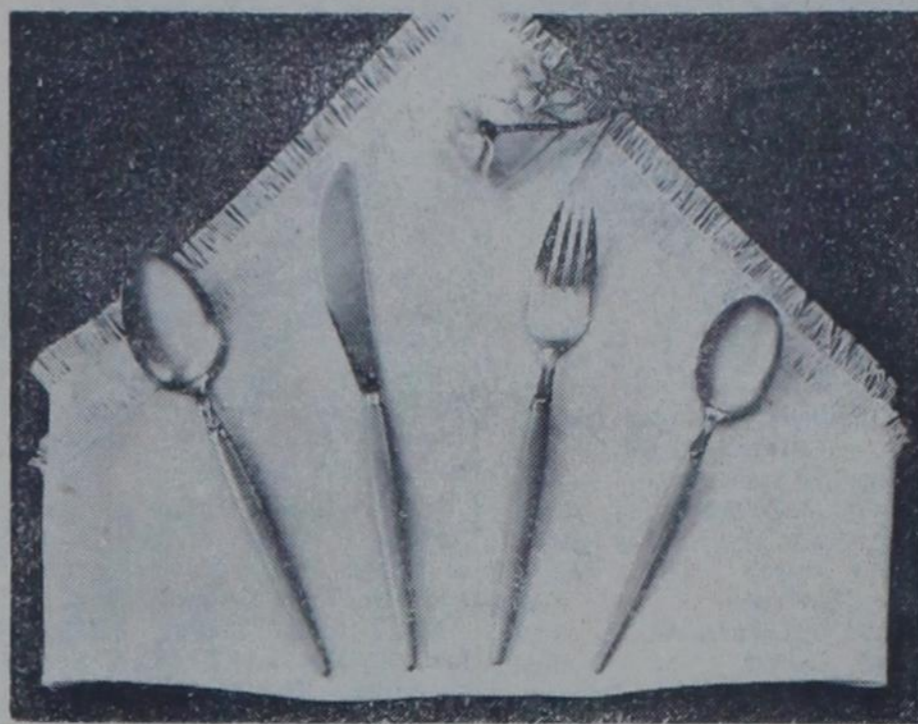

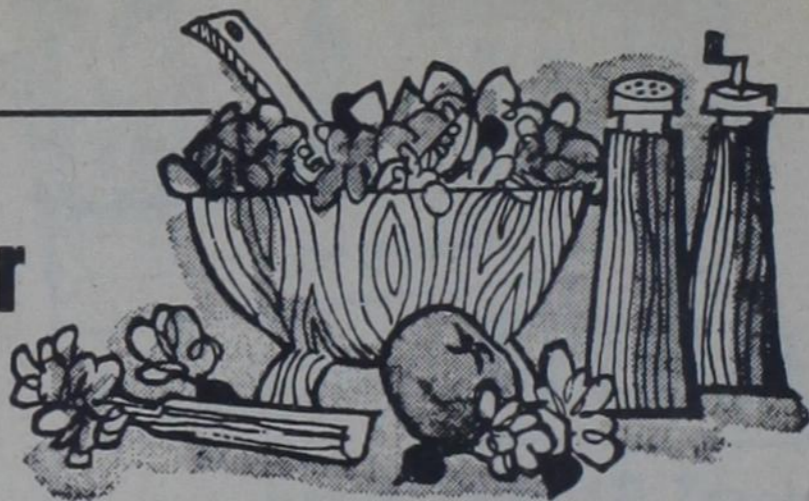

## Keep Poison Away From Children During 'Curious Years' Under 5

**THIS WEEK** has been designated as Poison Prevention Week. Let's all keep poison prevention

in mind all year. If you have a child under age 5, the chances of him being accidentally poisoned this year are 1 in 38.

Over 90 percent of all poisoning accidents involve children under 5 years of age. Why? Because these are the "curious years" when children get around fast, are fearless, will put anything into their mouths, and are too young to read labels or understand warnings.

Don't let your children have an opportunity to get poisoned.

**Traditional Easter Ham**  
If ham is traditional for Easter at your house, you're in luck. For you can expect to pay less for it than last year, says the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Lat-

est reports show that 8 to 10 percent more hogs will be ready for market this spring than a year earlier. Therefore, this is a good time to use pork.  
Pork should be cooked slowly until done for the tenderest and juiciest results. Methods of preparation vary. Depending on the cut, pork can be baked, broiled, pan-broiled, fried, braised or simmered.

**DIFFERENT** seasonings give pork a more interesting taste and look. Garlic, dry mustard, ginger, sage, thyme, rosemary, soy sauce and caraway or celery seed go especially well with fresh pork. Moist cuts of fresh pork baked with barbecue sauces are delicious, too.

You'll find glazes or sauces add flavor to both fresh and cured pork. Currant jelly, orange marmalade, peach or apricot jam, applesauce, cranberry sauce and pineapple are delicious. You may also want to select honey, barbecue sauce or pickled fruits and their juices. Sauces also may

be made from such soups as celery, mushroom and onion.  
Dressings made of apples, raisins and prunes, and spiced with cinnamon also provide real taste treats for roasts and stuffed chops.  
**TRY THIS** method for glazing your Easter ham. When the ham is done, remove it from the oven. Then remove the rind and excess fat. Score the remaining fat lightly into squares or diamonds and stud with cloves. Then cov-

er with a glaze.  
Return the ham to the oven, raising the heat to about 400 degrees F. Bake long enough to allow browning — about 15 minutes. Baste once or twice with the melted syrup that runs off the ham.  
If you don't have your own tasty glaze, you might try this one made of 1 cup brown sugar mixed with 1 teaspoon dry mustard and ½ teaspoon ground cloves. Mix with a little fat from the pan to make a stiff paste.

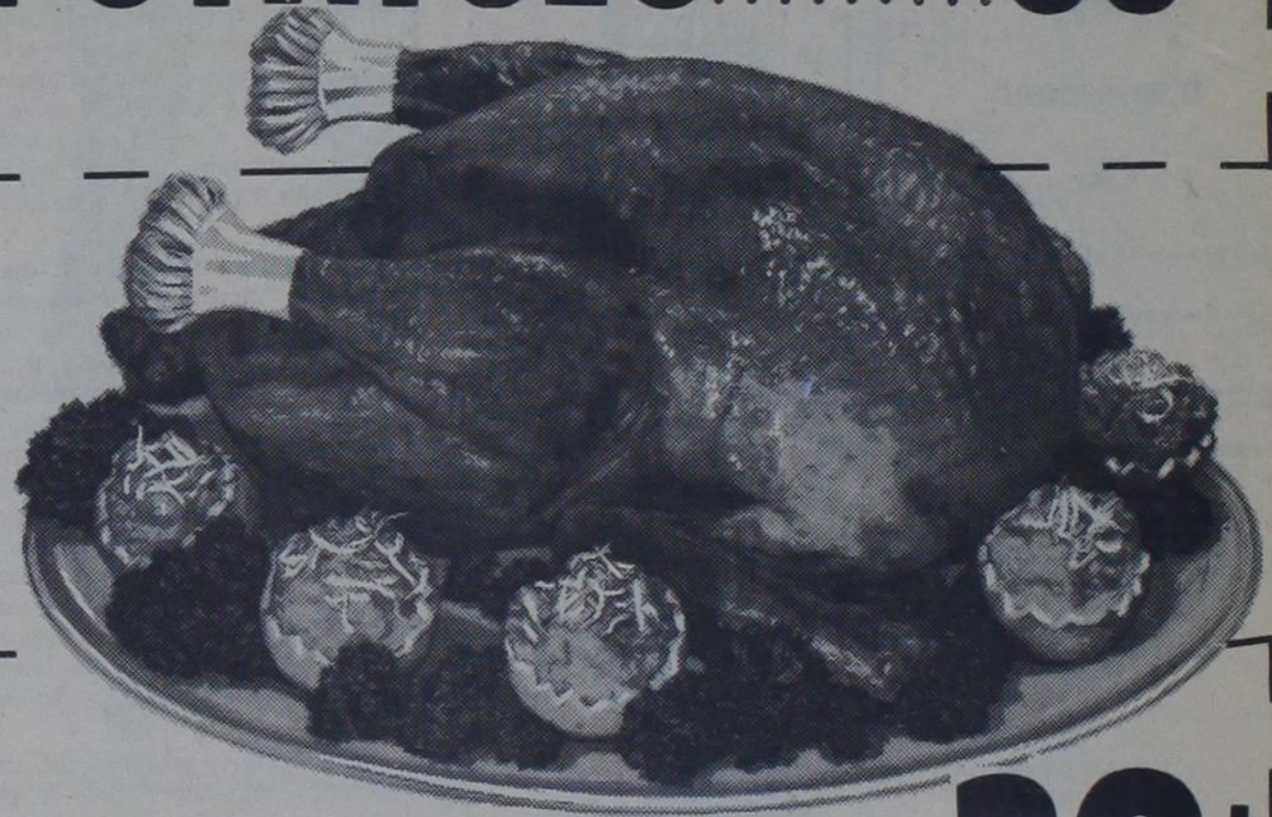

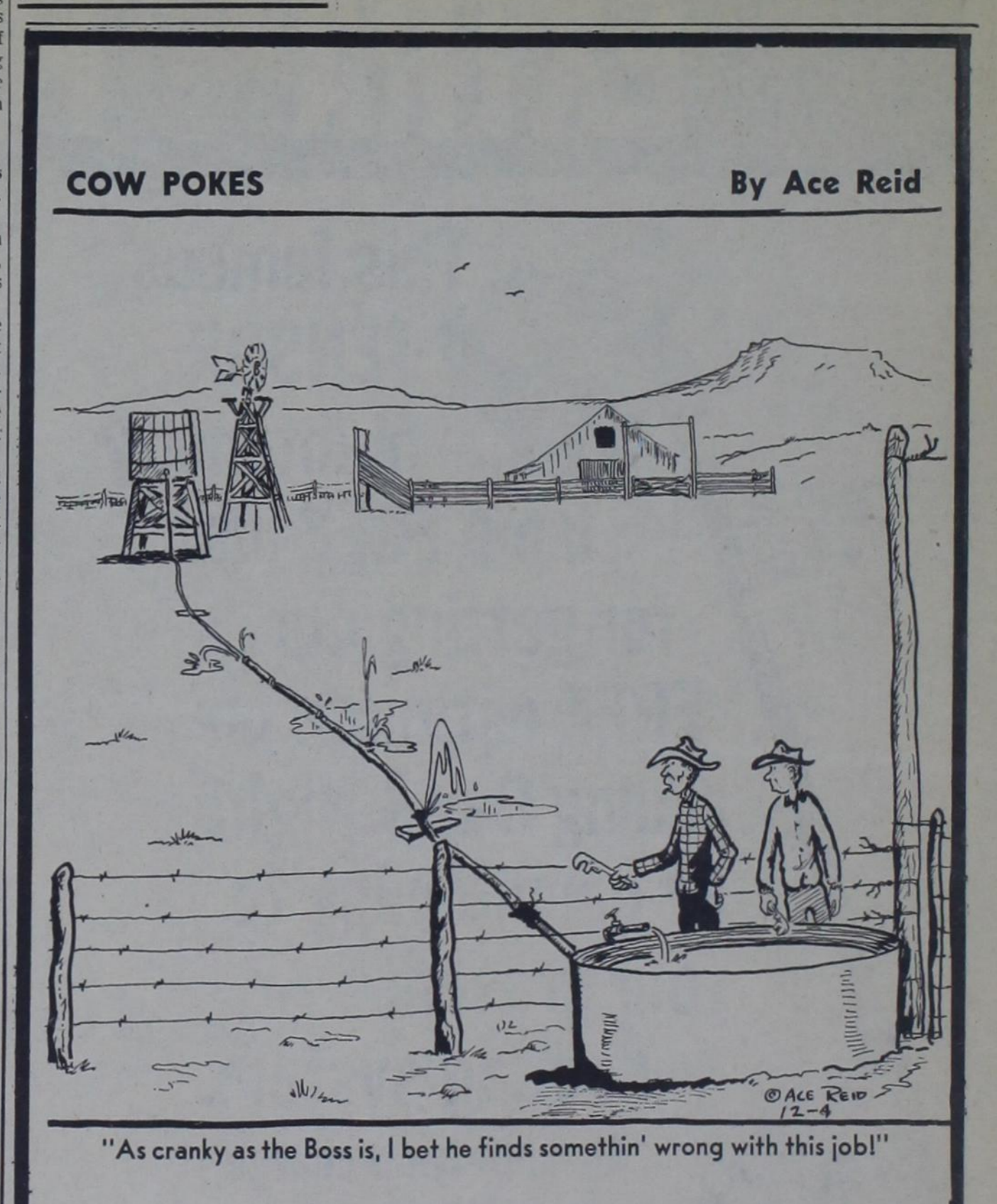
