Police investigate 7-11 robbery

Big Spring police are searching for a man they believe responsible for robbing a local 7-Eleven convenience store Saturday night.

Officers responded to a robbery call at the 7-Eleven store on 300 Owens around 10:30 p.m. Saturday, accord-

ing to information released by the Big Spring Police Department.

"On arrival, officers met with the clerk, who advised that he was working in the soft drink area when he heard the business door open," the release stated. "He was approached by a black male subject who grabbed him and put a knife to his stomach and demanded money from the register."

The suspect followed the clerk to the register and the clerk complied, giving the suspect the cash from the register, the release added. The suspect fled out the door and ran south.

The victim described the suspect as wearing a gray hoodie with a pink bandana covering most of his face. He was wearing blue jeans and black and white shoes.

H-E-B issues recall

SAN ANTONIO — H-E-B has issued a "voluntary and precautionary recall" for H-E-B bulk cryovac and tray packed Chorizo and H-E-B cryovac Pork Al Pastor due to undeclared peanut allergens in seasoning provided by Adams Food Flavors and Ingredients.

There have been no reported illnesses related to this precautionary recall, H-E-B officials said, but people who have an allergy or severe sensitivity to peanuts run the risk of serious or life-threatening allergic reaction if they consume these products.

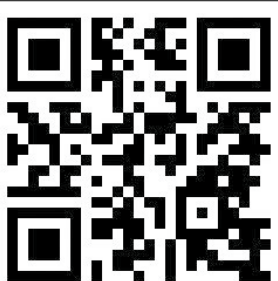
H-E-B is asking customers that may have one of these products to return it to their H-E-B store for a full refund.

H-E-B was notified of this issue on the evening of Dec 26 2014, when Adams Food Flavors and Ingredients announced that one of the spice blend ingredient components had tested positive for peanut residue, officials said in a news release.

5 dead in apartment building fire near San Antonio

CASTLE HILLS, Texas (AP) — Five people died Sunday after a fire broke out at a senior-living apartment building in the San Antonio suburb of Castle Hills, authorities said.

Castle Hills City Manager Diane Pfeil said Monday that officials haven't accounted for about 80 residents of the Wedgwood Apartments, though firefighters went through the 11-story complex and didn't find other victims. She says officials believe those residents found refuge with family or had left for the holiday before the Sunday morning fire. Authorities are calling emergency contacts for those residents to confirm their whereabouts.

Pfeil says 17 residents remain hospitalized. About 350 seniors live at Wedgwood Apartments.

A total of 150 firefighters from San Antonio and six other fire departments responded to the blaze, which was reported shortly after 6 a.m., San Antonio Fire Department

spokesman Christian Bove said.

The cause of the three-alarm fire at the 11-story high-rise is under investigation, but it appears to have originated on the third floor, Jesse said. The fire, which has been extinguished, left some "significant damage," she said.

Not all of the 216 residents listed on the building's rent rolls have been accounted for, Jesse said. It was not immediately clear how many of those residents were inside during the fire, she said. Jesse said residents are not required to check in or out of the building, which also has commercial tenants.

About 150 residents were taken by city buses to a local high school, and some

family members waited at a makeshift shelter in the cafeteria for word of their loved ones. Others residents were taken to a hotel.

Property manager Entrada Management Services was arranging for the residents' stays "if they don't have anywhere else to go," Jesse said.

The names of those killed in the fire have not been released.

"After looking at the floors, it's amazing we did not have more loss of life," San Antonio Fire Chief Charles Hood said at a news conference, adding that the smoke and fire were "communicated" throughout the building. He also said the building's third floor was gutted and the doors were charred.

Some residents walked down many flights of stairs, others were carried out, and others were evacuated down ladder trucks from the balconies of their apartments, Bove said.

"It was overwhelming. We tried to come out, but the exit doors were jammed," resident Vivian Casanova said.

It was not immediately clear when the facility was last inspected. Castle Hills City Manager Diane Pfeil told the newspaper that she was not sure when its most recent safety inspection was but said she would have that information in the next day or two.

Red Cross staff and volunteers at the shelter helped Sunday afternoon to match residents with the medications that were recovered after the building was evacuated.

According to Bove, the last time the San Antonio area saw a fire of this magnitude was in 2008 at Our Lady of the Lake University, but no one was injured.

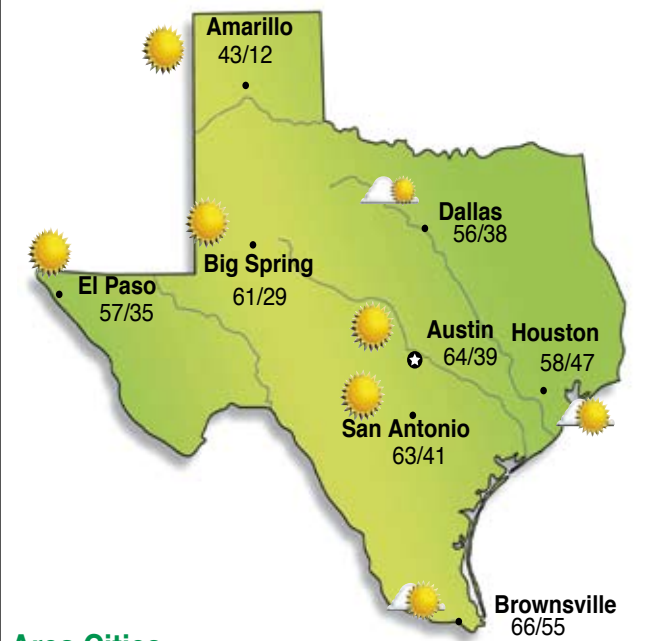

Crews seeking lost jet find oil in search area, objects farther away; no link confirmed

SURABAYA, Indonesia (AP) — An Indonesian helicopter searching for the missing AirAsia jetliner saw two oily spots in the water Monday, and an Australian search plane spotted objects elsewhere in the Java Sea, but it was too early to know whether either was connected to the aircraft and its 162 passengers and crew.

In any case, officials saw little reason to believe AirAsia Flight 8501 met anything but a grim fate after it disappeared from radar Sunday morning over the Java Sea. Wary of bad weather, one of the pilots had asked to raise the plane's altitude just before it vanished, but was not allowed because another aircraft was in the way.

"Based on the coordinates that we know, the evaluation would be that any estimated crash position is in the sea, and that the hypothesis is the plane is at the bottom of the sea," Indonesia search and rescue chief Henry Bambang Soelistyo said.

The Airbus A320-200 vanished in airspace thick with storm clouds on its way from Surabaya, Indonesia, to Singapore.

Jakarta's Air Force base commander Rear Marshal Dwi Putranto said an Australian Orion aircraft had detected "suspicious" objects near Nangka island about 100 miles (160 kilometers) off central Kalimantan. That's about 700 miles (1,120 kilometers) from the 1

NYC police boss: More dialogue, less rhetoric needed to reduce tension between police, public

NEW YORK (AP) — New York City's police commissioner called for a "lot less rhetoric and a lot more dialogue" to defuse the tension between police officers and the population they protect.

Commissioner William Bratton, speaking on NBC's "Meet The Press" Sunday, a day after the funeral for one of two police officers gunned down in their patrol car, said the "pent-up frustrations" that have caused people to take to the streets in recent weeks go far beyond policing policies across the nation.

"This is about the continuing poverty rates, the continuing growing disparity between the wealthy and the poor. It's still about unemployment issues. There are so many national issues that have to be addressed that it isn't just policing, as I think we all well know," he said.

Bratton said rank-and-file officers and much of America's police leadership feels under attack, including "from the federal government at the highest levels."

Obama's warning to GOP: I'll use veto pen to defend actions on health care, environment

HONOLULU (AP) — Warning from President Barack Obama to congressional Republicans: I have a veto pen and, come January, I won't be afraid to use it.

Since taking office in 2009, Obama has only vetoed legislation twice, both in fairly minor circumstances. But with Republicans set to take full con-

trol of Congress next year, Obama is losing his last bulwark against a barrage of bills he doesn't like: the Senate.

"I haven't used the veto pen very often since I've been in office," Obama said in an NPR interview airing Monday. "Now, I suspect, there are going to be some times where I've got to pull that pen out."

He added: "I'm going to defend gains that we've made in health care. I'm going to defend gains that we've made on environment and clean air and clean water."

1st big group of people from Greek ferry fire arrive in Bari as 150-plus more await evacuation

BARI, Italy (AP) — Exhausted and cold but safe, a group of 49 people arrived at the Italian port of Bari Monday after they were rescued from a Greek ferry that caught fire in the Adriatic Sea. Some 150 people remained trapped on the smoke-filled vessel adrift in frigid temperatures and rough seas between Italy and Albania.

At least one person was killed in the risky rescue operation and two others were injured as Italian and Greek rescue ships and helicopters worked through the night plucking passengers off the stricken vessel and bringing them to safety aboard the 10 or so mercantile ships nearby that were summoned to help.

Most evacuees were to be brought to shore later after the rescue was completed, Greek officials said, but one of the cargo ships, the Spirit of Piraeus, left ahead of the pack. After being forced by the weather to abandon plans to dock in the port of Brindisi, the ship reached Bari just after 7:30 a.m. (0630 GMT) Monday with 49 survivors aboard. The first to disembark was an injured man wrapped in a yellow striped blanket and wearing bandages around his bare feet, helped down the ship's ladder by two rescue workers.

Other evacuees, many wrapped in blankets, made their way gingerly down the ladder with assistance, some thrusting their hands in a victory sign as they waited their turn. Among them were four children.

Well, here's a comeback: Today's young Americans are more serious about giving back than their parents were.

In fact, those under age 30 now are more likely to say citizens have a "very important obligation" to volunteer, an Associated Press-GfK poll finds.

The embrace of volunteering is striking because young people's commitment to other civic duties — such as voting, serving on a jury and staying informed — has dropped sharply from their parents' generation and is lower than that of Americans overall.

Among six civic activities in the AP-GfK poll, volunteering is the only one that adults under 30 rated as highly as older people did.

With pressure off, Cowboys top Redskins

LANDOVER, Md. (AP) — DeMarco Murray passed Emmitt Smith with a change-of-direction that left a safety flat-footed.

Dez Bryant moved ahead of Terrell Owens by getting the left tiptoe down in the end zone, a touchdown that didn't count until the replay showed what a superb catch it was.

And Tony Romo? How about a 4-0 month that might help dispel the notion that the Dallas Cowboys can't be a December team.

The Cowboys prepped for the playoffs Sunday with a 44-17 win over the Washington Redskins, with Murray and Bryant breaking a pair of

prestigious franchise records along the way and the team as a whole maintaining momentum heading into its first post-season appearance since 2009.

"Right before people's eyes," Cowboys owner Jerry Jones said, "we have basically torn it up in December."

That's a change of pace from recent history, when Dallas capped three consecutive season win-or-fail losses to NFC East rivals in the final weekend, yielding back-to-back-to-back 8-8 records that fueled more doubts about Romo as a big-game quarterback.

Sunday's game didn't have the same magnitude. The result mattered only if at least

one of the later games ended in a tie, which didn't happen. The Cowboys would have also received a first-round bye with losses by both Arizona and Seattle, but that didn't happen, either. Instead, they will host Detroit next Sunday.

With the pressure off for the game against the Redskins, Dallas (12-4) did just fine — and didn't pack it in. The Cowboys went 8-0 on the road for the first time in team history.

"I've been speaking on it the whole year, we've got to grow and mature," Dallas defensive end Jeremy Mincey said. "It's clear as day these seeds are turning into flowers, and I'm

happy, man. Coach is going to continue to give us sunshine and rain, and we'll be all right."

Coach Jason Garrett deplored his full complement of available resources, opting not to give Romo's ailing back some extra rest nor to play it safe with Murray, who broke his hand two weeks ago. The Cowboys scored on their first five possessions to take a 27-7 lead, throwing in a successful onside kick along the way.

Romo played nearly the entire game, completing 22 of 34 passes for 299 yards and two touchdowns and one interception. For the month, he completed 75 percent with

12 touchdowns and one interception, and his 114.4 season passer rating is sixth best in NFL history.

Romo has a 1-3 career record in playoffs. Asked what's different this time, he said: "I'm different, so I'm excited about that aspect. I'm a different player than I was — now you got to go out and do it."

Murray rushed for 100 yards and one touchdown on 20 carries, passing Smith for the team single-season mark on a 32-yard first-quarter run with a nice move in front of safety Ryan Clark. Murray ends the season with 1,845 yards, bettering Smith's 1,773 yards in 1995.

Harbaugh, 49ers agree to go their separate ways

SANTA CLARA, Calif. (AP) — Jim Harbaugh walked through the locker room saying emotional goodbyes, offering a handshake or hug while wishing his players well and planning his long-anticipated but bittersweet departure from the San Francisco 49ers.

He just didn't specify where exactly he is headed next, though it might wind up being one of football's most poorly kept secrets. The hints were everywhere.

Harbaugh would neither confirm nor deny that he is indeed about to accept the job at alma mater, Michigan, except to acknowledge he wouldn't be around come Monday.

When asked specifically about taking over the Wolverine program, he said, "There will be announcements made concerning those things."

Harbaugh will not fulfill the final season of his \$25 million, five-year contract coaching the 49ers that he signed in January 2011, reaching a mutual agreement with the team to part ways. The announcement came after Sunday's 20-17 win over the Arizona Cardinals and following an 8-8 season in which San Francisco had hoped to establish some momentum in new \$1.3 billion Levi's Stadium.

"It's been the time of my life," Harbaugh said.

"Been a lot of great memories, great moments. ... It's been a tremendous four years, it's been a pleasure to work and serve for this organization. I feel great about what we accomplished."

Might he miss the NFL if he moves to Ann Arbor?

"Is the NFL going somewhere?" Harbaugh quipped.

The unraveling of 2014 began months ago, almost a year back, really. San Francisco lost in the NFC championship game last January at Seattle, then watched the rival Seahawks go on to win it all. Shortly after, CEO Jed York acknowledged the Cleveland Browns inquired about trading for Harbaugh.

Harbaugh guided the 49ers to three straight NFC championship games and a Super Bowl year miss.

"Jim and I have come to the conclusion that it is in our mutual best interest to move in different directions," York said.

The 49ers came close to their sixth Super Bowl championship after the 2012 season, losing 34-31 to Harbaugh's big brother, John, and the Baltimore Ravens.

Harbaugh had a 49-22-1 overall record in four years with San Francisco, which might look to promote from within to replace him. Defensive line coach Jim Tomsula's name has been mentioned.

Tannehill joins Marino in Miami record books as 4,000-yard passer

Ryan Tannehill etches his name alongside that of an NFL legend on Sunday, joining Dan Marino as the only quarterbacks in the Miami Dolphins' history to top 4,000 yards in a season.

The Dolphins' third-year quarterback completed 23 of his 39 passing attempts for 259 yards and a touchdowns in a 37-24 loss to the New York Jets.

With his effort against the

Jets, he finished the season by throwing for 4,045 yards.

Tannehill also broke one of Marino's team records in the game, becoming the Dolphin's all-time leader in pass completions in a single season by completing 392 — seven better than Marino's mark of 385 set in 1994.

For the season, the Big Spring High School product finished by completing 392 of his 590 attempts for career-best totals in yard touchdowns (27) and interceptions (12). During his career, he has passed for

11,252 yards.

Despite record-setting effort, Tannehill said he wasn't pleased with the team's inability to end a six-year playoff drought.

"I hate losing," Tannehill said. "I put in a lot of effort, a lot of time, a lot of blood, sweat and tears. Everyone in this locker room does as well. Any time you don't come out and finish the way you want to, it hurts."

Miami finished the 2014 season with an 8-8 record.

would have turned out to be South's ninth trick. But he also knew two things declarer didn't know: that the spades were not breaking, and that the opposing clubs were blocked and couldn't be run. As Lev hoped, South was unwilling to risk losing the lead to West, who could return a club through the queen. Instead, declarer rose with the diamond ace, took a successful heart finesse and cashed his heart winners. Expecting next to run the spades, he played the ace and got the bad news, at which point the position was:

South could have recovered by, for example, playing the king and another spade, discarding a club from dummy. East could score a spade, a club and a diamond, but would have to yield a trick to the diamond queen at the end. Instead, declarer led a spade to the king and ducked it to East's ten. Lev, East, now made the inspired return of the diamond five. He knew that if declarer played low, dummy's queen would almost surely win what

Today's Highlight in History: On Dec. 29, 1170, Thomas Becket, the Archbishop of Canterbury, was slain in Canterbury Cathedral by knights loyal to King Henry II. On this date: In 1808, the 17th president of the United States, Andrew Johnson, was born in Raleigh, North Carolina. In 1812, during the War of 1812, the American

frigate USS Consti-tution engaged and severely damaged the British frigate HMS Java off Brazil. In 1845, Texas was admitted as the 28th state. In 1890, the Wounded Knee massacre took place in South Dakota as an estimated 300 Sioux Indians were killed by U.S. troops sent to disarm them. In 1916, Grigory Rasputin, the so-called "Mad Monk" who'd wielded great influence with Czar Nicholas II, was killed by a group of Russian noblemen in St. Petersburg. In 1934, Japan formally renounced the Washington Naval Treaty of 1922.
