## Woman jailed after frantic chase on I-20

## Homegrown attacks like Paris worry analysts

WASHINGTON — U.S. and French intelligence officials are leaning toward an assessment that the Paris terror attacks were inspired by al-Qaida but not directly supervised by the group, a view that would put the violence in a category of homegrown incidents that are extremely difficult to detect and thwart.

Although one of the two brothers who carried out the attack at the Charlie Hebdo newspaper is believed to have traveled briefly to Yemen in 2011, where he met an al-Qaida leader, U.S. intelligence officials are not convinced that the Paris attacks were directed from abroad, despite a claim of responsibility by al-Qaida's Yemen affiliate. The claim seems hastily put together and "opportunistic," as two senior officials put it, one French and the other American, both declining to be named in order to discuss sensitive intelligence.

Investigators also are not

convinced that Amedy Coulibaly, who killed five people in Paris in separate incidents, coordinated in advance with Cherif and Said Kouachi, who killed 12 in the attack on the Charlie Hebdo newspaper.

If those assessments hold, they would place the attacks on a continuum of violence by disaffected individuals who have become sympathetic to al-Qaida, the Islamic State group or their ilk — yet are not involved in the sort of international conspiracy that

lends itself to relatively easy detection.

The cases run a gamut, disturbed Muslim convert in Oklahoma who beheaded a former co-worker at a meat packing plant in September, to the ideologically committed brothers in Paris who attacked the satirical newspaper. The Oklahoma man had no connection to any terror group, while the Kouachi brothers are believed to have consulted with al-Qaida's af-

filiate in Yemen.

On Wednesday, an Ohio man was arrested and charged with plotting to kill government officials inside the U.S. Capitol. The FBI said the man spoke of his desire to support the Islamic State group.

Other such cases in the U.S. include the 2013 Boston marathon bombings, the 2010 attempted Times Square bombing and the 2009 Fort Hood shootings. In Europe, an investigation found no direct assistance or orchestration from al-Qaida to the group that bombed a Madrid train in 2004. Likewise, authorities have found no links between international terrorists and the man who attacked Canada's parliament in October.




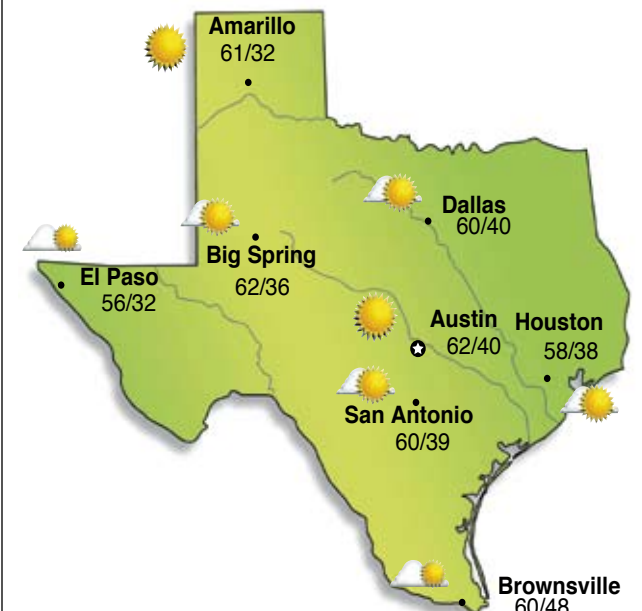

### FBI arrests 20-year-old Ohio man who wanted to 'wage jihad' on US, plotted attack on Capitol

CINCINNATI (AP) — A 20-year-old Ohio man's Twitter posts sympathizing with Islamic terrorists led to an undercover FBI operation and the man's arrest on charges that he plotted to blow up the U.S. Capitol and kill government officials.

Christopher Lee Cornell, also known as Raheel Mahrus Ubaydah, told an FBI informant they should "wage jihad," and showed his plans for bombing the Capitol and shooting people, according to a criminal complaint filed in federal court in Ohio Wednesday. The FBI said Cornell expressed his support for the Islamic State.

Cornell's arrest came only days after a grand jury indictment charged another Cincinnati-area resident with threatening to murder House Speaker John Boehner.

Boehner spokesman Michael Steel said in a statement Wednesday: "Once again, the entire Congress owes a debt of gratitude to the FBI and all those who keep us safe."

The complaint against Cornell charges him with attempting to kill officers and employees of the United States.

### Pope arrives in Philippines, where excited crowds await first papal visit in 20 years

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — Pope Francis arrived on Thursday in the Philippines, Asia's most populous Catholic nation, where ecstatic crowds awaited the first papal visit in 20 years.

Church bells tolled across the country and hundreds of children danced and waved small Philippine and Vatican flags as the pontiff emerged from the plane and was welcomed by well-wishers led by President Benigno Aquino III. A sudden gust of wind blew off his papal cap seconds after he appeared, and Francis grabbed futility for it and then smiled and descended the stairs.

The government has declared national holidays during the pope's visit, which runs through Monday. He will be in the capital of Manila and fly Saturday to eastern Leyte province, where he plans to meet survivors of Typhoon Haiyan that left thousands of people dead in 2013.

In the U.S., the FBI wasn't aware that Abusalha, a Vero Beach, Florida, resident, had become radicalized until shortly before he launched a suicide attack in Syria in May, said two U.S. officials who spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorized to be quoted discussing sensitive intelligence.

"You have individuals who are inspired by the ideology but aren't di-

rectly connected to any specific group," said John Cohen, a former Homeland Security Department counterterrorism coordinator who is now a professor at Rutgers University. "They are very difficult for our traditional counterterrorism capabilities to pick up on."

French authorities were aware of the extremists who carried out last week's attacks in France, but the men had not been perceived as significant threats by the overwhelmed domestic intelligence service.

More than 1,000 extremists have left France to fight in Syria and some have returned home. In the United States, only about 150 Americans have tried or succeeded in doing

so, and authorities say it's difficult to keep tabs on all of them.

Cherif Kouachi said he met in Yemen with Anwar Awlaki, the American cleric who was killed in Yemen in 2011 in a CIA drone strike. Don Borelli, a former senior FBI counterterrorism official, said the Paris case seems to fit a pattern: "They will go and get indoctrinated, learn all the skills, they'll get support. But then they do their own reconnaissance of the target and pick the time that's right."

That terror template, Borelli said, has evolved in part because of successful surveillance by the National Security Agency, which has been effective in intercepting conversations between terrorists overseas.

Borelli helped make the case against Najibullah Zazi, the Afghan-American who pleaded guilty to spearheading a September 2009 plot against the New York City subway system, in part through NSA intercepts of Zazi's email communications with a Pakistani-based terrorist.

"The intelligence community is a lot more tuned into picking up on those communications that are necessary to have it commanded and controlled overseas," Borelli said.

American Muslims are far more integrated into society than their counterparts in Europe, so there are fewer opportunities for disaffection and radicalization, experts say. At the same time, U.S. free speech

and civil liberties guarantees set a high bar for surveillance of potential extremists. The FBI had looked into the activities of the brothers later accused in the Boston Marathon bombing but closed the case after finding no basis to proceed.

Cohen and other former law enforcement officials say U.S. authorities need to burrow deep into ethnic communities and detect radicalization before it metastasizes. It's a combination of surveillance, source development and grassroots outreach, they say.

"How we prevent this is to develop good network of human sources who are going to assist us voluntarily," said David Gomez, a former senior FBI official.

In the Boston, Fort Hood, Times Square cases and others, Cohen said, the investigations showed that people close to the perpetrators noticed disturbing behavioral changes but failed to report them. Often, relatives are afraid their loved one will be arrested, he said.

"We need to change the way we deal with these issues and move beyond the 'report and arrest' model to more of a construct of intervention and violence prevention," he said.

Smith, West Texas Centers Chief Executive Officer.

The chili cook-off was the brainchild of Landon Sturdivant, West Texas Centers Chief Operating Officer and a longtime member of the Eagles and the cook-off organizer.

"The Eagles were looking at ways to help the community 13 years ago and we pitched the idea of the chili cook-off with the Children in Need fund being the beneficiary. Helping the community and in particular helping children made for an easy sell with the Eagles membership," Sturdivant said.

"We raised a couple thousand dollars the first year and a little

over \$10,000 each of the last few years. The fund helps hundreds of children each year," Sturdivant added. "Just this last year the Children in Need benefit fund helped almost 300 children."

said. "We don't have a lot of rules. We only ask that the chili be cooked on site and we encourage all cooking teams to prepare approximately 5 pounds of chili to help serve the public."

"This event is simple enough for the first time chili cook, but competitive enough to attract people back year after year," Sturdivant said. "We have people who have never cooked before competing alongside those who have cooked in many chili cook-offs. On several occasions, it has been the first time chili competitor that has taken 1st place. It's just a fun and very worthwhile charitable event."

Cooking teams are limited to two persons per team and the entry fee per team is only \$10.

Cooking starts at 8 a.m. and judging begins just before lunch at 11:30 a.m. For those who want to eat the cost is \$10 per person. This includes all the chili you can eat, all the condiments, a desert and a drink.

Prizes are awarded to the top 10 teams and a showmanship award will be presented to the chili team that shows the most enthusiasm and pizzazz. The competition will take place at the Fraternal Order of Eagles Aerie 3188, 703 West Third St. in Big Spring.

# Gilded youth and their pain

A Hollywood-handsome Princeton grad recently shot his hedge-fund-founder father to death. The alleged reason: Thomas Gilbert Sr.'s plan to cut his allowance by \$200 a month. You can imagine what the tabloids are doing with the story.

There's a lot going on here, and while mental illness is almost certainly part of it, as said, there's a lot going on. For the public, there's no little satisfaction (there must be a better word) in the tragedy's message for the economically struggling masses: Money can't cure all ills. Or going further, money causes ills.

Tommy Gilbert, the accused, shuttled between his Manhattan pad and the posh Hamptons. He attended swank parties and supposedly had plans to start his own hedge fund. That's not an unusual set of facts for the gilded children of America's rich.

The details that stick out are these: Tommy was 30 years old, and his parents were still giving him an allowance — of \$3,000 a month (according to the New York Post). The decision to shrink the monthly handout by a strangely small sum seemed calculated to humiliate. Moreover, the \$200 was stipulated to come out of the spending money, not rent.

I'll stop right there. I may have already overstepped the bounds in speculating about a family I

have never met. But both social and traditional media have been all over this story, theorizing that the rich may be different from you and me, to borrow from F. Scott Fitzgerald, but they are also more messed up.

The affluent have been widely perceived as impervious to the slings and arrows that afflict ordinary people. That's why relatively little research has gone into their children's psychological anguish — which in many cases is immense.

Dr. Suniya Luthar, a psychologist at Arizona State University, accidentally discovered this reality while studying inner-city teens, she writes in *Psychology Today*.

For comparison, she also observed teens from prosperous suburban families, defined as making \$150,000 or more a year.

To Luthar's surprise, the affluent teens did much more poorly on measures of drug use and binge drinking and no better than their low-income contemporaries on cheating and stealing. The richer kids were also found to have the highest rates of anxiety, depression and substance abuse of any group of children in the country.

“There is a tacit assumption — even among those most affected,” Luthar writes — “that education and money procure well-being, and that if children falter, they will swiftly get the appropriate services.”

She says that may have been somewhat true in the past, but it's no longer the case. Today's emotional disturbances are being more fueled by pressure for “high-octane achievement.”

# America handcuffed in war on terror

In the wake of President Obama's pathetic disengagement over the Islamic jihadist attacks on Paris, people are once again decrying his lack of leadership, but the problem is something more fundamental than leadership.

Even if Obama were a gifted leader, when it comes to many issues, especially confronting radical Islam, he wouldn't know where to lead us. If you misapprehend a problem, you can't possibly navigate, much less lead, toward a solution.

From the beginning of his term in office, Obama has evidenced a deep moral confusion, a distorted worldview perhaps based on a bizarre upbringing. It's not that he doesn't distinguish between good and evil; it's that he often doesn't clearly recognize which is which.

He professes to be a Christian, yet his behavior screams otherwise. Even if he actually is a Christian, he undeniably has a nostalgic attraction and sympathy for Islam, which, among other things, obscures his grasp of the enormity of the threat the world faces from Islamists.

His approach to combating Islamic terrorism is first to downplay its existence and pervasiveness.

Beyond that, it is obvious he rejects the idea that there is anything inherent to Islam that leads to radicalism and violence.

Like many of his fellow leftists, he believes Islamic radicalism is a result of historical abuses of Muslims, poverty caused by an inequitable distribution of the world's resources, and some kind of mutual irrational distrust between Islam and the Western world.

From the very beginning of his term, with his speech in Cairo and otherwise, he has shown he believes that Westerners are perhaps the main problem.

He has lectured us for what he thinks is our distorted perception of Islam and has labored to rehabilitate the image of this religion.

Do you remember him doing likewise for the Christian religion or for Christians? Or instead, do you remember his bitter-clingers slander?

He has carried his attitude on this well beyond rhetoric and into governance.

At the highest levels of his executive infrastructure, he has directed that we change the way we think and speak about jihad, radical Islam and Islamic terrorism.

He has encouraged the federal vernacular to be changed to sanitize references to Islam from our description of acts of terrorism — even those that are unquestionably committed by Islamic terrorists.

This political-correctness lunacy has had real consequences, such as handcuffing the federal government and preventing it from thoroughly investigating and monitoring the suspicious contacts and actions of Nidal Hasan, a U.S. army major and psychiatrist who fatally shot 13 people and injured more than 30 others in the Fort Hood shootings of 2009.

This attitude has continued right into the present, as Attorney General Eric Holder — curiously designated to be Obama's representative on the Paris attacks — stubbornly refuses to call out these attackers for who they are and what they represent.

French Prime Minister Manuel Valls pulled no punches in identifying the culprits and declaring, unambiguously, that France is at war against radical Islam. “It is a war against terrorism, against jihadism, against radical Islam, against everything that is aimed at breaking fraternity, freedom, solidarity,” said Valls. “Our indignation must be clear, total and last longer than three days. It must be permanent.”

When pressed by NBC's Chuck Todd and ABC's George Stephanopoulos to embrace Valls' declaration, Holder conspicuously, fecklessly and disgracefully demurred.

Holder said: “I would say that we are at war with terrorists who commit these heinous acts and who use Islam. They use a corrupted version of Islam to justify their actions.”

Many parents seem totally focused on their children's high-status accomplishments, whether in academics, in sports or in social conquest.

This puts boys especially “at risk for limited compassion and kindness,” Luthar adds. They are unhappy and desperate to make as much money as their parents. To them, that requires getting into prestigious colleges.

In her book “The Price of Privilege,” therapist Madeline Levine describes how affluent parents, however well-meaning push their children toward materialism, perfectionism and competition while being disconnected with them in a personal way. The relationships are basically mechanical in nature.

Luthar says the problem is not necessarily one of richer parents not being around or inattentive. They are often all over the kids. The problem is constant adult criticism that the children are somehow not measuring up, with little emphasis on emotional closeness.

At a time when many Americans obsess over growing income inequality, it may be hard to feel for children on the money side of the equation. But pain is pain.

But he wouldn't say we are at war with radical Islam. He and Obama prefer to call radical jihadis “extremists,” wholly omitting any reference to Islam or Islamism. Obama, as distinguished from every other Western leader, will not say Islamic terrorists made these attacks.

Even Democratic commentator Doug Schoen has had enough. He wrote: “To speak about the most serious terrorist attack on Western soil since 9/11, London and Madrid, in between speeches about his free community college plan demonstrates a fundamental lack of understanding for the gravity of the situation in Paris and, indeed, the world. ... (Obama's) words ... came off as inauthentic at best and offensive at worst. ... We are at war with radical Islam. And President Obama needs to say it.”

Lest you think this is merely a semantic quibble, please explain why President Obama refused to attend the Sunday march of world leaders in Paris, in which more than 40 European leaders and almost every French official joined in solidarity for a massive unity rally against the attacks and against radical Islam.

Explain why he didn't at least send in his place Vice President Joe Biden or Secretary of State John Kerry.

Moreover, explain why Holder was an outright no-show for the event.

Obama spends more time downplaying and denying Islamic terrorism and releasing dangerous terrorists from Guantanamo Bay than he does leading this nation in a war against it. That's because he is not committed to a war against it — and for another two years, he will be our commander in chief. God help us all.

The Howard College Hawks probably didn't know what to do with themselves on Tuesday afternoon. A day after finishing off a stretch of three games in a 5-day span with a win over Frank Phillips College, HC head coach Scott Raines said he planned to give his team a much-needed day off to regroup.

Then, on Wednesday, for the first time in more than a week, the team got on the floor to hold its first all-out practice since the marathon began.

"I think we were all ready for a break," said Raines. It gave us a chance to catch our breath, and have time to get ready for the next game."

The break couldn't have come at a more opportune time for the Hawks, who are scheduled to travel to Odessa tonight for a contest that will have huge

Coach Sherri Coale said the win was important, but she didn't over-emphasize it, and neither did her team.

Oklahoma's long-term success — 15 straight NCAA tournament appearances, six regular-

season Big 12 titles and four conference tournament titles — make such victories the expectation.

Coale said her team improved early in the season, despite a 5-5 start, and the growing pains put the Sooners in position to beat the Longhorns.

"I feel like we won this game because of what we

did in November and December," Coale said. "We just had to do hard stuff. We had to get broken into pieces to build ourselves into what we want to be. We've got a long way to go guys and a lot of improvement to make, but I'm really proud of our girls."

The Sooners (10-5, 4-0)

won their fifth straight and moved into a tie with Baylor atop the conference standings.

Texas (13-2, 2-2) was coming off its first loss of the season, a 59-57 setback at Iowa State on Saturday. The Longhorns followed that effort by shooting a season-low 26 percent from the field.

Today is Thursday, Jan. 15, the 15th day of 2015. There are 350 days left in the year. Today's Highlight in History: On Jan. 15, 1865, during the closing months of the Civil War, the Second Battle of Fort Fisher near Wilmington, North Carolina, ended as Union forces captured the "Gibraltar of the South," depriving the Confederates of their last major seaport. On this date: In 1559, England's Queen Elizabeth I was crowned in Westminster Abbey.

In 1777, the people of New Connecticut declared their independence. (The republic later became the state of Vermont.) In 1862, the U.S. Senate confirmed President Abraham Lincoln's choice of Edwin M. Stanton to be the new Secretary of War, replacing Simon Cameron. In 1919, in Boston, a tank containing an estimated 2.3 million gallons of molasses burst, sending the dark syrup coursing through the city's North End, killing 21 people. In 1929, civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr. was born in Atlanta.

In 1943, work was completed on the Pentagon, headquarters of the U.S. Department of War (now Defense). In 1947, the mutilated remains of 22-year-old Elizabeth Short, who came to be known as the "Black Dahlia," were found in a vacant Los Angeles lot; her slaying remains unsolved.

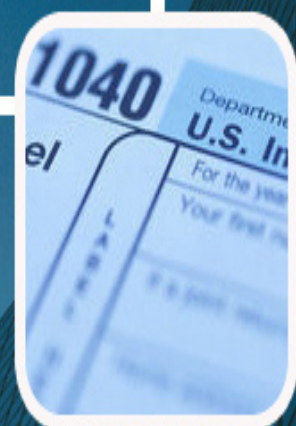
