## Survey: Gas costs stable

*Analyst: Summer prices should be lowest in 10 years*

Average retail gasoline prices in Texas have risen a penny per gallon in the past week, averaging \$2.21 a gallon Sunday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 13,114 gas outlets in Texas.

This compares with the national average that has increased 0.5 cents per gallon in the last week to \$2.39/gallon, according to gasoline price website GasBuddy.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Texas during the past week, prices yesterday were \$1.25 per gallon lower than the same day one year ago and are 3.0 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has decreased 4.9 cents per gallon during the last month and stands \$1.25 per gallon lower than this day one year ago.

"Amid all the talk about gasoline prices, I think there's a few major points no one is remembering," said Patrick DeHaan. GasBuddy senior petroleum analyst. "And that is the climate that is gasoline prices — how today's air is crisp, blue, unlike the past five years when clouds made it impossible to feel optimistic about hitting the road for summer."

GasBuddy last week forecast that summer-time gasoline prices would be at their lowest

Performing in the program are Howard College Dance Troupe members who have auditioned and receive Howard College talent

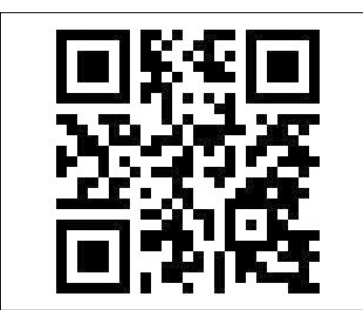

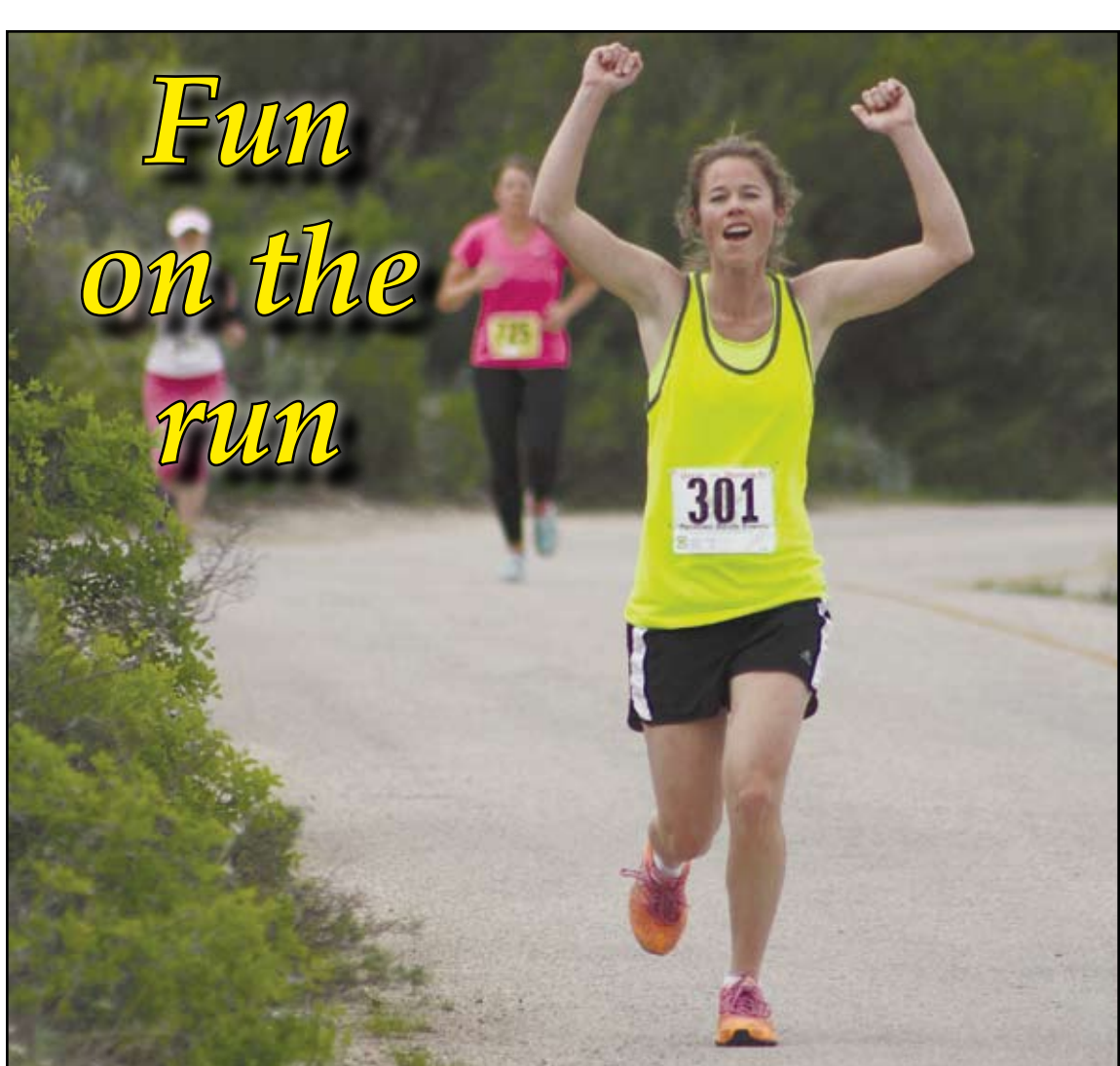

since 2005. Though it may be a close call, DeHaan says it's not always about the numbers alone.

"Sure, gasoline prices in 2009 may be close to what they are now, but who was talking about hitting the road when your job was on the line? Who cared about how low gas prices were when you weren't sure if you could even pay all of your bills? This is the first time since the 2005 that we've seen such low gasoline prices, combined with a strong economy, making it

a great time to think about hitting the road this summer," DeHaan said.

According to GasBuddy, almost a third of gas stations are priced under \$2.25 a gallon today while 80 percent are under \$2.50 a gallon and 94 percent under \$3 a gallon.

The pump landscape a year ago was far far different: No stations were under \$3 a gallon. In fact, one year ago, 99.1 percent of stations were selling over \$3.25 a gallon.

"We've come a long way, and we won't be looking back at that for quite some time," DeHaan said.

# Lefty completes Grand Slam of silver medals

AUGUSTA, Ga. (AP) — Phil Mickelson knew he needed a truly special round to catch Jordan Spieth.

Instead, Lefty settled for a familiar spot ... Runner-up.

Mickelson closed with a 3-under 69 that left him tied with Justin Rose, four shots behind the wire-to-wire winner.

"It was just a good, solid round of golf," Mickelson said. "I needed something exceptional."

The 21-year-old Spieth won with an 18-under 270, tying the Masters record for lowest overall score.

Mickelson and Rose finished

at 274, a score that would have been good enough to win the last three years. In fact, it was lower than Mickelson's score in two of his three Masters wins.

"The fact is, I would have taken 14 under at the start of the week," he said. "I played really well to shoot 14 under and I simply got outplayed by a young player who just played some incredible golf."

On a resume highlighted by five major titles, it was Mickelson's 10th second-place finish in golf's biggest events.

It also completed a Grand Slam of sorts, one he would prefer not to have.

Mickelson has now finished second in every major championship.

This won't hurt nearly as bad as all the others, especially some of those close calls in the only major Mickelson has never won, the U.S. Open.

At 44, Mickelson hasn't played all that well in recent years on the PGA Tour. But he knows how to get up for the biggest events, having won the British Open in 2013 with a stirring final-round comeback, and finishing second in the last two majors going back to the 2014 PGA Championship at Valhalla, where he was one

stroke behind Rory McIlroy.

"I don't have a great explanation other than I really focus on those events," Mickelson said. "It's not my motivation to go out and try to grind out wins week after week. I want to zero in on our four or five biggest events, and I've been fortunate in that I've been able to get some of my best golf out of those events."

Spieth dominated this Masters from start to finish. Mickelson started the final round five shots back and never got within four shots of the lead, even after holing out an eagle from the bunker at the par-5

15th hole.

He was doomed by three bogeys spread throughout the round, keeping the popular player from really getting the Augusta patrons on his side. They cheered him all the way, of course, but never unleashed one of those really big roars that would have signaled Lefty, playing just ahead of Spieth in the next-to-last group, was making a serious move.

"Every time I got a birdie here or there, I stalled with a bogey," Mickelson said. "It was a really fun tournament. I thought I played some good golf. I just got outplayed."

# Harden has 30 to help carry Rockets over Pelicans, 121-114

HOUSTON (AP) — James Harden didn't score in the fourth quarter in the New Orleans Pelicans on Sunday night.

The Houston Rockets came away with a 121-114 victory anyway thanks to the work of Dwight Howard and Corey Brewer.

Harden scored 30 points and the Rockets made a big run at the beginning of the fourth quarter to take the lead and held on for the win.

The Rockets ended a two-game skid behind the NBA-leading 35th 30-point game for Harden.

Brewer and Howard carried Houston in the opening minutes of the fourth quarter combining for all of the Rockets' points in a 14-5 run that put them on top 100-91.

"That first unit in the fourth quarter really cleared the way, pushing the lead up and creating the intensity in the arena and it carried the whole fourth quarter," Harden said.

A highlight of Houston's run at the beginning of the fourth quarter came when Howard converted an alley-oop pass before blocking a shot by Eric Gordon, grabbing the ball and

dishing it to Brewer for a layup to cap the run.

"We got in transition and everything came easy, especially when Dwight was blocking shots," Brewer said. "That's what we needed. We needed a lift. We didn't have a lot of energy or intensity and I felt like I needed to put it upon myself to bring the energy."

New Orleans coach Monty Williams thought Brewer's play early in the fourth was the key to Houston's win. Brewer had 13 points in the fourth quarter.

"The defense at the end of the third and beginning of the fourth and Brewer's energy really changed the game," Williams said.

New Orleans scored six straight points to get within five with about a minute left, but Pablo Prigioni made two free throws to extend the lead.

Anthony Davis had 27 points for the Pelicans who are fighting for the final Western Conference playoff spot.

Howard finished with 19 points and 11 rebounds and Brewer added 20 points.

The Pelicans were by eight with about 5 minutes remaining when they started in-

tentionally fouling Josh Smith to keep the ball out of Harden's hands. It was the second straight game that an opponent had used the tactic on Smith, after the Spurs did it 12 times in the second half of their 104-103 win Friday night.

New Orleans did it three times, with Smith making 3 of 6 free throws, his last one pushing Houston's lead to 112-100 before he was replaced by Howard.

They continued the hacking tactic on Howard and he also made 3 of 6 free throws before going to the bench. The Pelicans made six points in that span to cut the lead to 115-106 with 2 1/2 minutes remaining.

The Rockets were down by nine points in the third quarter when Harden got hot, scoring 10 points in a 15-6 run that tied it at 86 entering the fourth quarter. Harden made two free throws at the beginning of that run before making four layups to help Houston close the gap.

A 3-pointer by Quincy Pondexter pushed the Pelican's lead to eight points with about 10 minutes left in the third quarter. Houston then used a 10-2 spurt, with two 3s by Jason Terry, to tie it at 66.

# Conger's HR in 14th sends Astros past Rangers, 6-4

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) — George Springer didn't need a replay to know he saved a home run with a leaping catch in the 10th inning. The video just let the Houston right fielder know how far over the fence the fly ball was.

Hank Conger followed Springer's game-saving catch with a two-run home run in the 14th inning, and the Astros beat the Texas Rangers 6-4 Sunday.

"I've seen it, so I know it was gone," Springer said of the two-out drive by Leonys Martin, which came after the Rangers wiped out a 4-0 deficit. "It was over my head for sure. It was a home run, but at the time I didn't know how far over."

Texasteammates Prince Fielder and Adrian Beltre simply stared into right field from the edge of the dugout as Springer ran in celebrating the grab.

The Rangers stranded 15 runners, included the bases loaded three times, and couldn't finish off the rally despite seven walks and four hit batters by Houston pitching. But there was a simple reason in the mind of Fielder.

"If somebody doesn't catch a game-winning grand slam," he said with a smile.

Houston left-hander Tony Sipp, who benefited from the flashy catch, was

equally stunned.

"I was trying to put on my best face for TV on a walkoff," Sipp said. "I thought it was a home run. One catch turns everything."

Conger entered in the 12th inning and homered after Evan Gattis reached base for the first time this season — on a walk in his 21st plate appearance of the year.

Robbie Grossman ran for Gattis, but it didn't matter when Conger pulled a pitch from Jason Verrett (0-1) into the second row of seats in right field.

Will Harris (1-0) retired six straight batters. He struck out the side in the 12th, his 19th consecutive scoreless outing dating to August.

Samuel Deduno loaded the bases with two outs in the bottom of the 14th but got his first big league save when Rowned Odor lined out to — you guessed it — Springer in right.

Deduno got two quick outs before allowing Fielder's third single, a walk and Houston's fourth hit batter — and the second to Mitch Moreland. Plate umpire Laz Diaz ruled Moreland wasn't hit, but the call was overturned by video review.

"Couldn't get that one to kind of push us over the top," Moreland said. "Great game played by both, I think."

# Duncan leads Spurs to 11th straight win

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — Tim Duncan had 22 points and 10 rebounds to lead the San Antonio Spurs to their 11th straight victory, 107-91 over the Phoenix Suns on Sunday night.

San Antonio moved into second place in the Western Conference and took a half-game lead over idle Memphis in the South-

west Division. The Spurs have won 21 of 24.

Kawhi Leonard had 18 points and nine rebounds, Marco Belinelli added 13 points and Tony Parker had 10 points and five assists to help San Antonio improve to 55-26.

Gerald Green had 23 points and Eric Bledsoe added 20 points and 10 assists for Phoenix.

Eliminated from playoff contention Wednesday night, the Suns have lost four straight and nine of 10 to drop to 39-42.

The Spurs failed to make a basket for 4:20 bridging the first and second quarters, but never relinquished their lead. The Spurs responded by going on a 15-6 run in taking a 38-24 lead midway

through the second quarter. San Antonio's efforts even drew some on-court praise from coach Gregg Popovich.

Parker stole the ball near midcourt during the fourth quarter and raced in for a layup, prompting claps of appreciation and "good jobs" from Popovich during the ensuing timeout by Phoenix.

North-South got to seven hearts as shown and unluckily went down one when Jeff Rubens, partnered by B. Jay Becker, led a spade, which Becker ruffed.

Rubens reasoned that, based on the bidding, there was a good chance that North-South held nine spades, so he chose the spade lead as the best shot to stop the grand slam.

At the second table, where Rubens' teammates, Andy Bernstein and Becker's son Mike, held the North-South cards, the bidding went more quickly:  
East South West North  
3♣ Dble Pass 4♠  
Pass 5♣ Pass 7♠

Bernstein, North, naturally started to think in terms of a slam after his partner doubled East's pre-emptive bid for takeout, and he backed his appraisal with a cuebid of four clubs. When Mike showed more than a fair-to-middling double by cuebidding in return, Bernstein jumped to seven spades.

Strictly speaking, seven spades was not as good a contract as seven hearts — mathematically, there was a greater chance of a heart ruff with spades as trump than a spade ruff with hearts as trump — but seven spades was the winner, while seven hearts was the loser.

Sometimes luck, rather than skill, proves to be the key component in the outcome of a deal.

## This Date In History

Today is Monday, April 13, the 103rd day of 2015. There are 262 days left in the year.

**Today's Highlight in History:**

On April 13, 1965, 16-year-old Lawrence Wallace Bradford Jr. was appointed by New York Republican Jacob Javits to be the first black page of the U.S. Senate.

On this date:

In 1613, Pocahontas, daughter of Chief Powhatan, was captured by English Capt. Samuel Argall in the Virginia Colony. (During a yearlong captivity, Pocahontas converted to Christianity and ultimately opted to stay with the English.)

In 1742, Handel's "Messiah" had its first public performance in Dublin, Ireland.

In 1743, the third president of the United States, Thomas Jefferson, was born in Shadwell in the Virginia Colony.

In 1861, at the start of the Civil War, Fort Sumter in South Carolina fell to

Confederate forces.

In 1912, the Royal Flying Corps, a predecessor of Britain's Royal Air Force, was created.

In 1943, President Franklin D. Roosevelt dedicated the Jefferson Memorial in Washington D.C., on the 200th anniversary of the third American president's birth.

In 1958, Van Cliburn of the United States won the first International Tchaikovsky Competition for piano in Moscow; Russian Valery Klimov won the violin competition.

In 1964, Sidney Poitier became the first black performer in a leading role to win an Academy Award for his performance in "Lilies of the Field." Patricia Neal was named best actress for "Hud"; best picture went to "Tom Jones."

In 1970, Apollo 13, four-fifths of the way to the moon, was crippled when a tank containing liquid oxygen burst. (The astronauts managed to return safely.)

In 1975, the President of Chad, Francois Tombalbaye (tahn-bahl-BAH'yeh), was killed in a military coup.

In 1986, Pope John Paul II visited the Great Synagogue of

Rome in the first recorded papal visit of its kind to a Jewish house of worship.

In 1992, the Great Chicago Flood took place as the city's century-old tunnel system and adjacent basements filled with water from the Chicago River.

One year ago: Three people were shot to death at two sites in suburban Kansas City; suspect Frazier Glenn Miller, a white supremacist, was allegedly targeting Jews (none of the victims was Jewish). Thought for Today: "Happiness is not the absence of problems but the ability to deal with them." -Ai Charles Louis de Montesquieu, French philosopher (1689-1755).
