## Big Spring man remains in jail

A Big Spring man is cooling his heels at the Howard County Detention Center this morning after his arrest on a charge of assault with a deadly weapon.

A \$40,000 bond has been set for Johnny Joe Rodriguez Jr., 22, of 1607 Harding Street, but, as of this morning, remains in jail, according to Big Spring police officials.

On Sunday, Big Spring Police officers responded to a shots fired call in the 1500 block of Cherokee a little after 3 p.m., according to a media release from the police.

When officers arrived at the scene, they found David Morales, 38, with a gun shot wound to the arm, the release stated. Morales was taken to Scenic Mountain Medical Center by Big Spring EMS for

non-life threatening injuries. "Witnesses on scene informed officers that a black Altima had pulled in front of the residence at which time a verbal argument between the driver of the Altima (found to be Johnny Rodriguez Jr.) and Morales began," the release said. "Witnesses advised Rodriguez fired approximately three rounds in the direction of Morales, then sped away from the residence."

Later, police officers located the Altima and the suspect at his residence, the release stated. Rodriguez was then taken into custody on an Andrews County warrant for failing to pay child support.

"Big Spring Police detectives later executed a search warrant at 1607 Harding locating a silver .22 caliber revolver which is believed to be the firearm used in the shooting," the release stated. "Rodriguez was then also charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, a second degree felony."

## STAAR test results at Tuesdays BSISD board of trustee meeting

Test scores will be on tap when trustees with the Big Spring Independent School District meet Tuesday night. A report on the STAAR (State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness) results for the district is listed at the top of the board agenda. The Texas Education Agency (TEA) uses state mandated tests to

gauge student's comprehension of grade level content. Results are heavily used in deterring the academic status for a school district. In Big Spring ISD case, the district has been found to be low-performing for some years and was placed on probationary status by TEA in March. If the district fails to "meet standards" when TEA releases district ratings in August, See, **BSISD**, Page 3

# Abbott at indoor gun range to sign open, campus carry bills

PFLUGERVILLE, Texas (AP) — Gov. Greg Abbott stopped at a gun range to sign into law bills letting Texans carry concealed handguns on college campuses and openly carry them virtually everywhere else.

Abbott was at Red's Indoor Range in Pflugerville (FLOO'-gur-vihl) on Saturday. He says the laws mean Texans can be sure their Second Amendment rights will be stronger and more secure than ever before.

The Republican made expanding gun rights a top priority of his first legislative session as governor.

Texas was one of the few states not already allowing licensed residents to

wear handguns holstered, or otherwise in plain sight.

The "campus carry" bill passed despite staunch opposition from leaders of the state's top universities — but includes a concession allowing schools to carve out "gun-free zones."

For community colleges like Howard College, the law does not go into effect until August 2017. Community colleges have until then to create rules or regulations about carrying concealed weapons by licensed concealed gun owner on the campus.

"It allows for the CEO of a community college after consulting with the students, faculty and staff to create reasonable rules or regulations regarding the carrying of concealed weapons on the campus of the college," Howard College President Dr. Cheryl Sparks said recently when informing the college's board of trustees on the issue. "The rules can not generally

prohibit or have the effect of generally prohibiting the carrying concealed weapons on campus. We are suppose to take into consideration the nature of the student population, safety concerns and the uniqueness of the campus."

Howard College has three campuses — Big Spring, San Angelo and Lamesa — along with overseeing the SouthWest Collegiate Institute for the Deaf and six sites at correctional institutes. Although implementation of the bill at the correctional institute sites seems mute, the majority of SWCID students are hard of hearing or deaf. SWCID is the only self-contained community college in the United States for the deaf. Also, the Big Spring campus has a daycare facility on the site.

"That will give us some time to begin to work through this bill," Sparks said. "I know community colleges will work together. See, **GUN LAWS**, Page 3

## US targets al-Qaida-linked leader in Libya airstrikes; reports conflict on if he was killed

BENHAZI, Libya (AP) — The U.S. military says it launched weekend airstrikes targeting and likely killing an al-Qaida-linked militant leader in eastern Libya charged with leading the attack on a gas plant in Algeria in 2013 that killed at least 35 hostages, including three Americans.

An Islamist with ties to Libyan militants, however, said the airstrikes missed Mokhtar Belmokhtar, instead killing four members of a Libyan extremist group the U.S. has linked to the Sept. 11, 2012, attack on the U.S. Consulate in Benghazi that killed Ambassador Chris Stevens and three other Americans.

U.S. officials said they are still assessing the results of the Saturday strike, but Pentagon spokesman Col. Steve Warren said the military believes the strike was successful and hit the target. Neither U.S. officials nor the Libyan government provided proof of Belmokhtar's death, which likely requires a DNA test or an announcement by Belmokhtar's group that he was killed.

"I can confirm that the target of last night's counterterrorism strike in Libya was Mokhtar Belmokhtar," Warren said Sunday. "Belmokhtar has a long history of leading terrorist activities as a member of (al-Qaida in the Islamic Maghreb), is the operational leader of the al-Qaida-associated al-Murabitun organization in northwest Africa and maintains his personal allegiance to al-Qaida."

A U.S. official said two F-15 fighter jets launched multiple 500-pound bombs in the attack. The official was not authorized to discuss the details of the attack publicly so spoke on condition of anonymity. Authorities say no U.S. personnel were on the ground for the assault.

## After 6 months of consideration, Republican Jeb Bush ready to enter 2016 race for president

WASHINGTON (AP) — Jeb Bush is ready to launch a Republican presidential bid months in the making on Monday by asserting his commitment to the "most vulnerable in our society," an approach targeting the broader American electorate even as he faces questions about his policies from conservatives in his own party.

Six months after he got the 2016 campaign started by saying he was considering a bid, the 62-year-old former Florida governor will formally enter the race with a speech and rally near his south Florida home at Miami Dade University, an institution selected because it serves a large and diverse student body that's symbolic of the nation he seeks to lead.

"My core beliefs start with the premise that the most vulnerable in our society should be in the front of the line and not the back," Bush says in a video featuring women, minorities and a disabled child to be aired at the event before his Monday afternoon announcement speech. "What we need is new leadership that takes conservative principles and applies them so that

people can rise up." Bush joins the crowded Republican campaign in some ways in a commanding position. The brother of one president and son of another, Bush has likely raised a recording-breaking amount of money to support his candidacy and conceived of a new approach on how to structure his campaign, both aimed at allowing him to make a deep run into the GOP primaries.

But on other measures, early public opinion polls among them, he has yet to break out. While unquestionably one of the top-tier candidates in the GOP race, he is also only one of several in a capable Republican field that does not have a true front-runner.

## Behind-the-scenes government system keeps data 'indefinitely' on those seeking health coverage

WASHINGTON (AP) — A government data warehouse stores personal information forever on millions of people who seek coverage under President Barack Obama's health care law, including those who open an account on HealthCare.gov but don't sign up for coverage.

At a time when major breaches have become distressingly common, the vast scope of the information — and the lack of a clear plan for destroying old records — have raised concerns about privacy and the government's judgment on technology.

"A basic privacy principle is that you don't retain data any longer than you have to," said Lee Tien, a senior staff attorney with the Electronic Frontier Foundation. "The more data you keep, the more harm an attacker or unauthorized person can do."

Electronic record-keeping systems are standard for businesses and government agencies. But they are supposed to have limits on

Obviously, it will have to be tailored to every community college in the state and in our situation we have different sites and different situations that we will have to take into account. Four-year universities must be in compliance with the law by August 2016.

In order to be licensed to carry a concealed handgun in Texas, the person must be 21 years of age or older, under go a background check, take a written test and a range test.

## Searchers look for more than 20 people, dangerous zoo animals still missing in Georgia flood

TBILISI, Georgia (AP) — Rescue workers in the Georgian capital were still searching Monday for more than 20 people and an undetermined number of potentially dangerous animals that are missing after severe flooding ravaged the city's zoo and left at least 12 people dead.

Tbilisi zoo director Zurab Gurielidze said that none of the people who died was killed by the zoo animals set free in the flooding. Three zoo employees drowned.

Among the animals that fled the flooded zoo were lions, tigers, bears, wolves, a hippopotamus and one jaguar. Some, including the hippopotamus, were tranquilized and returned to the zoo. Others were shot by police, while others remain missing.

Zoo spokeswoman Khatia Basilashvili said three lions, three tigers and two jaguars were killed either in the flood or when on the loose, while the fate of five lions, three tigers and one jaguar was not yet known.

The flooding also killed about 60 homeless dogs when the waters inundated a shelter near the zoo, shelter staff said.

## 2 teenagers lose limbs in separate shark attacks in North Carolina beach town

OAK ISLAND, N.C. (AP) — Two teenagers were seriously injured in two separate shark attacks in the same North Carolina town on

Sunday, terrifying beachgoers and prompting one shocked witness to compare the scene to the movie "Jaws."

Oak Island Mayor Betty Wallace told WECT-6 that the first victim, a girl, lost part of her arm and could lose her left leg. Just over an hour later, a 16-year-old boy also was attacked by a shark and was airlifted to a hospital, Wallace said. He lost an arm.

"I saw someone carry this girl (out of the water) and people were swarming around and trying to help," Steve Bouser, who was just beginning his week-long beach vacation, told *The Associated Press*. "It was quite terrible."

The girl was bleeding heavily, and people applied makeshift tourniquets while asking her questions to try to keep her conscious. It was "quite nightmarish," Bouser said.

## Police, relatives say man linked to Dallas police HQ shooting was violent, unstable for years

DALLAS (AP) — James Boulware told family members that he had foreseen a deadly Japanese tsunami and the Newtown, Connecticut, school shooting in his dreams. Police say he choked his mother. And he seethed at police, blaming them for the lost custody of his son.

Boulware, the man authorities have linked to a weekend shooting outside Dallas police headquarters showed signs of violence and mental instability for years beforehand, according to accounts from authorities and family members.

His brother, Andrew Boulware, told *The Associated Press* that he and others in the family had tried to get him help, particularly after the 2013 incident in which he allegedly choked his mother, then fled to an East Texas town where authorities and family members thought he might attack schools and churches.

"He never was properly diagnosed," Andrew Boulware said Sunday. "He could be

the nicest guy in the world. He tried to help friends out whenever he could. He was not a bitter person."

Authorities say it was miraculous no one else was injured in Saturday's attack, in which the shooter sprayed the front of the building with gunfire just after midnight. After opening fire, the suspect drove an armored van into a squad car, still firing, then led police on a chase to a restaurant parking lot in the suburb of Hutchins. A police sniper shot the man during a standoff, but it took several hours to confirm his death out of fear that he had loaded his van with more explosives.

## Seeking comfort and career protection, China's senior party officials turn to mythical masters

BEIJING (AP) — The former Chinese security czar recently convicted of leaking state secrets did not pass classified documents to a foreign spy or a political rival.

Rather, Zhou Yongkang, a former member of the all-powerful Standing Committee of the ruling Communist Party's Politburo, shared the documents with his qigong master, who claims supernatural abilities, according to a verdict made public last week and which also convicted Zhou of massive corruption.

It's the latest example of a twisted relationship between the leadership of the party, which nominally espouses atheism, and spirituality.

Before Zhou, many senior party cadres and government officials were reported to have sought help and blessings from qigong masters, feng-shui experts, and Buddhist and Taoist monks.

- Consider a resolution authorizing the use of public funds to implement a relocation incentive program.

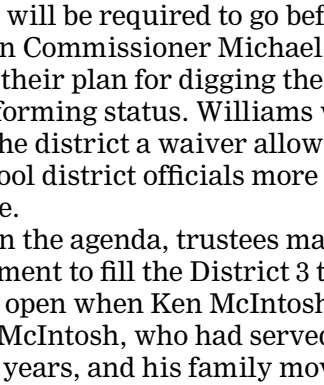

# Suspect only death in attack on Dallas police building

DALLAS (AP) — A man who authorities say opened fire outside Dallas police headquarters from his parked van, with bullets piercing the glass at the entrance and causing damage inside, was the only person killed after the gunfire turned into a street battle and standoff.

Chief David Brown said the suspect told authorities he was James Boulware and blamed police for having lost custody of his son and for “accusing him of being a terrorist.” But authorities declined to officially identify the man until a medical examiner verified it.

A police sniper shot and killed the man in his van early Saturday after, according to Brown, the department felt he still posed enough of a threat. The suspect had told police negotiators that he had explosives in the van.

“When the negotiation was on, he became increasingly angry and threatening, such that we were not only concerned with our officers there trying to contain the scene being shot by him at a moment’s notice,” but also people nearby, Brown said at a news conference.

Officers also found the man had planted pipe bombs outside police headquarters.

Police questioned Boulware’s father, also named James, later in the day Saturday, arriving while an Associated Press reporter was at the home.

Authorities said the shooting miraculously left no one else dead or injured. Among the areas damaged inside: the front desk where the worker

on duty had just gone to get a soft drink.

The suspect also fired on officers who drove up to confront him, riddling at least one squad car with bullets but not actually hitting anyone. Cellphone video shot from a nearby balcony or roof showed the suspect’s dark-colored van ram a squad car as gunshots rang out. At one point the man got out of his van and walked toward the entrance to the building firing his gun but turned around, according to Dallas Police Maj. Jeff Cotner.

Police would not say why he retreated.

The van then fled, eventually stopping in a restaurant parking lot in the suburb of Hutchins, where the standoff ensued until the police sniper shot and killed the man.

Investigators found a package of pipe bombs in the parking lot at police headquarters and at least two more pipe bombs in the van, police said.

Wary that the van may have been rigged with explosives, police used a camera-equipped robot to inspect it rather than have officers approach it immediately, which was why it took several hours to confirm the suspect was dead.

After he was confirmed dead, the van erupted in flames while the authorities were detonating the suspected ordnance inside.

Boulware’s father said that his son had strong feelings against law enforcement after he lost custody of his son, now 12 or 13 years old. Boulware spent several hours Friday at his father’s home in Carrollton, a Dallas suburb.

His father said he talked about how well his recently purchased van drove. But he also discussed a widely publicized video of a police officer in McKinney, Texas, pushing a black teenage girl to the ground and brandishing his gun at other teens.

Boulware’s father last spoke with Boulware by phone about three hours before Dallas police said the shooting began.

“Not being able to get a job and the legal system letting him down, (he) finally snapped,” the elder James Boulware told the AP in a phone interview before police arrived to question him about his son. “But I can’t say shooting at a police station is right in any way.”

The attack began around 12:30 a.m., when several police officers were standing nearby. A popular bar across the street from police headquarters was still open, and the neighborhood is also home to a boutique hotel and apartment buildings.

Reporters allowed to walk through the scene after it had been secured counted numerous

bullet holes in the front window of the police building. Number markings were all over the street to show where shell casings and other forms of evidence had been found. Blackened debris marked the spot where the pipe bombs exploded in the parking lot of the police station.

One squad car that police said had been occupied by two officers at the time had a bullet hole in the back of the driver’s seat. Police on the scene declined to say how the two officers escaped the shots or if they had ducked below the dash.

In the early confusion, witnesses reported seeing as many as four attackers, including some who had taken high positions for bet-

ter vantage points. Brown later said investigators were confident the only attacker was the suspect later killed.

Anita Grendahl was asleep in her seventh-floor apartment in a high-rise across from police headquarters when she heard gunshots loud enough to wake her up over a white noise machine in her room.

“We just woke up to a few pops and thought somebody was on my balcony, and then looked outside and saw the van crash into the car,” she said.

## Frogs whallop LSU in CWS

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — No pitcher in TCU history has as many wins as Preston Morrison, an accomplished even more remarkable when you consider he joined the Horned Frogs as a walk-on.

Before Sunday, though, he had never won a game in eight career NCAA Tournament starts. The senior finally added that to his resume, pitching seven dominant innings in the Frogs' 10-3 victory over LSU in the College World Series.

"He's the best pitcher

in the history of the school, bar none, and he's pitched great in the postseason throughout his entire career," TCU coach Jim Schlossnagle said. "He hasn't had a lot to show for it because when you're in the postseason, you're facing another great pitcher."

That looked to be the case again in the matchup with LSU left-hander Jared Poche, who had come to Omaha having allowed one run in 16 1/3 innings in the national tournament. But Poche's

inning meltdown after retiring nine in a row to start the game. TCU capitalized and won easily in the first game of its second straight CWS appearance.

Morrison (12-2), whose 37 career wins are the most of any active Division I pitcher, limited LSU to five hits and a run in seven innings. He walked none, struck out five and retired the last 12 batters he faced.

"The most important thing for me was getting another step closer to our ultimate goal, the nation-

al championship," Morrison said.

The Horned Frogs (50-13) will play a Bracket 2 winners' game against Cal State Fullerton or Vanderbilt on Tuesday night. The Tigers (53-11) meet one of those teams in an elimination game that afternoon.

LSU, in the CWS for the 17th time, showed up as the No. 2 national seed and 5-0 in the NCAA Tournament. The Tigers cruised along nicely for three innings, with

## Rangers lose game, left fielder

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) — The Texas Rangers lost the game, and maybe another left fielder.

Delino DeShields Jr. left the Rangers' 4-3 loss to the Minnesota Twins on Sunday in the top of the sixth inning with an injury to his left hamstring running in the outfield.

DeShields' status was not immediately known, but he had been filling the void for Josh Hamilton, who rejoined the club in late May and is now out until at least late-June with a strained left hamstring.

"Obviously, he's a speed guy, uses his legs," Rangers manager Jeff Banister said of DeShields. "We're going to be cautious and conservative."

DeShields was also Texas' leadoff hitter during the club's recent successful run that has seen the Rangers move into second place in the American League West after losing 16 of

their first 24 games.

DeShields' replacement, Jake Smolinski, failed to execute a sacrifice bunt in the seventh inning with the Rangers trying to break a 3-3 tie. Minnesota's one-run ninth began with a double by Eduardo Escobar that went over Smolinski's head.

With two outs, Eddie Rosario doubled to center off Shawn Tolleson (1-1) to score Byron Buxton, the No. 2 overall draft choice in 2012 who made his major league debut Sunday.

Casey Fien (2-2) pitched two scoreless innings, and Glen Perkins tossed a perfect ninth for his league-leading 22nd save as the Twins snapped a five-game losing streak.

Joey Gallo and Leonys Martin hit solo home runs for Texas in the second inning. Gallo has four homers in 11 games since being brought up from Double-A Frisco.

Texas' fifth inning ended when DeShields wandered off second base following a routine groundout to second base, and was tagged out when first baseman Joe Mauer fired to shortstop Escobar for the final out.

Rangers starter Nick Martinez pitched the starter's 10th consecutive quality start, matching the club record set in September 1978. That has been accomplished without injured starters Yu Darvish, Derek Holland, Martin Perez and Matt Harrison.

"We're definitely proud about how we go about our business," said Martinez, who went into Sunday's game with the league's eighth-best ERA at 2.65.

Twins outfielder Torii Hunter missed his second consecutive game while serving a two-game suspension for his altercation with umpire Mark Ripperger last Wednesday.

## Houston blanks Mariners

HOUSTON (AP) — Lance McCullers wasn't upset that he didn't get a chance to return for the sixth after throwing five hitless innings Sunday.

The rookie was just glad he did enough to help Houston get a win.

McCullers and four relievers combined for a two-hitter, Evan Gattis tied a career high with four hits and the Astros cruised to a 13-0 victory over the Seattle Mariners.

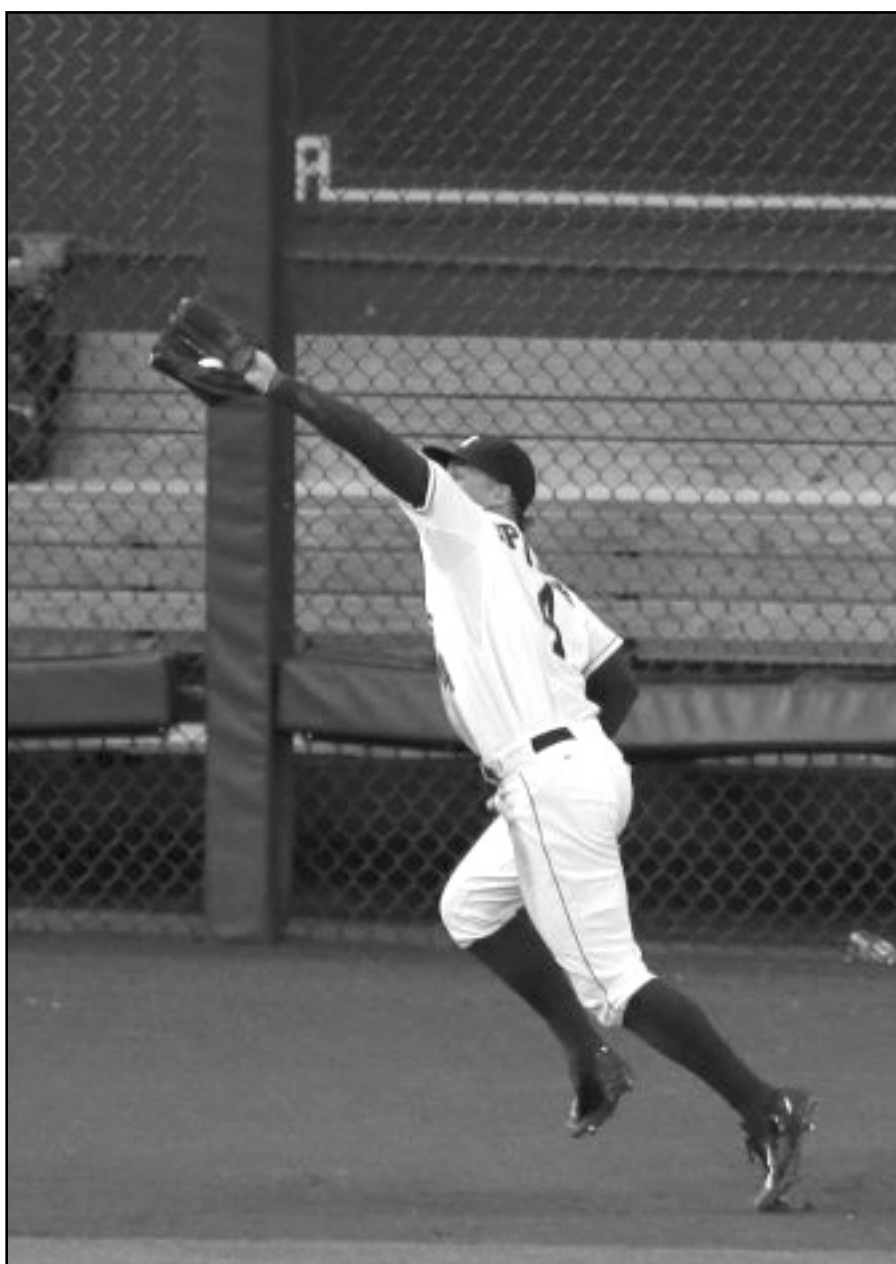
"We pitch to win ball games and to get this team down the road into the playoffs and to pitch in the playoffs," McCullers said. "Not going back out there was not a big deal."

Instead, the veteran forward proved he belonged on the ice.

While Jonathan Toews and Patrick Kane have struggled to find any room in the Stanley Cup Final against Tampa Bay, the Blackhawks have used their depth to move

within one victory of their third NHL title in six seasons. Playing alongside two other players who have been a healthy scratch this season, Versteeg assisted on Antoine Vermette's winning goal in Chicago's 2-1 victory on Saturday night.

"I think it's always about staying ready," Versteeg said Sunday. "I guess that starts in practice. Whether it be myself or (Bryan Bickell) or Ver-

my or whoever is not in the lineup on any given night, we all feel we're good players, we all feel we're players that can contribute. I don't think that confidence is lost in us."

The Blackhawks' third and fourth lines are a big reason why they can clinch the Stanley Cup at home for the first time since 1938 with a victory in Game 6 on Monday night. But the Lightning won Game 3 in Chicago and are confi-

dent they can do it again.

Stamkos and Kane are still looking for their first goal of the series, and Toews has contributed one goal and two assists. But Vermette has two game-winning goals in the final, Teuvo Teravainen scored in each of the first two games, and Andrew Shaw has a goal and two assists.

In an incredibly tight battle for the Stanley Cup — only the second final to begin with

five one-goal games — the contributions from Chicago's role players are making a difference.

Tampa Bay's depth was tested Saturday night when second-leading scorer Nikita Kucherov crashed into the Chicago net in the first period, leading to a bigger role for speedy rookie Jonathan Drouin and breaking up the Lightning's successful "Triplets" line.

A more experienced player, having developed a natural aversion to relying on finesses, would recognize the potential of dummy's clubs. He might therefore cash the A-K of clubs and ruff a club high, hoping the opposing clubs were divided 3-3. If they were, he could later use the heart ace as an entry to discard two spades on the established clubs.

If everything went perfectly, declarer would make seven on this line of play. But even if the clubs turned out to be divided 4-2, he would still have the spade finesse to fall back on. The total chance of success of this approach would be about 66 percent — surely better than a straightforward finesse, but not nearly as promising as a third alternative:

Win the diamond, cash the king of hearts, lead a club at trick three and play low from dummy! Take East's probable spade return with the ace, cash the queen of hearts, lead a club to the king and ruff a club. Then lead a heart to the ace and discard the Q-4 of spades on the A-8 of clubs.

This method of play offers by far the best chance. It does the job whether the clubs are divided 3-3 or 4-2, a combined probability of about 84 percent, and renders the spade finesse virtually unnecessary.

Tomorrow: It pays to plan the play.

Today is Monday, June 15, the 166th day of 2015. There are 199 days left in the year.

Today's Highlight in History:

On June 15, 1215, England's King John put his seal to Magna Carta ("the Great Charter") at Runnymede.

On this date:

In 1775, the Second Continental Congress voted unanimously to appoint George Washington head of the Continental Army.

In 1836, Arkansas became the 25th state.

In 1849, James Polk, the 11th president of the United States, died in Nashville, Tennessee.

In 1864, Secretary of War Edwin M. Stanton signed an order establishing a military burial ground which became Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia.

In 1904, more than 1,000 people died when fire erupted aboard the steamboat General Slocum in New York's East River.

In 1934, President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed an act making the National Guard part of the U.S. Army in the event of war or national emergency.

In 1944, American forces began their successful invasion of Saipan (sy-PAN) during World War II. B-29 Superfortresses carried out their first raids on Japan.

In 1955, the United States and Britain signed a cooperation agreement concerning atomic information for "mutual defence purposes."

In 1962, Students for a Democratic Society issued the Port Huron Statement at the conclusion of a five-day convention in Michigan.

In 1978, King Hussein (hoo-SAYN) of Jordan married 26-year-old American Lisa Halaby, who became Queen Noor.

In 1984, composer-librettist Meredith Willson ("The Music Man") died in Santa Monica, California, at age 82.

In 1994, Israel and the Vatican established full diplomatic relations. The Walt Disney animated feature "The Lion King" was released by Buena Vista Pictures.

Ten years ago: The autopsy released on Terri Schiavo (SHY'-voh) backed the contention of her husband, Michael, that she had been in a persistent vegetative state, finding she was severely and irreversibly brain-damaged and blind as well. Iraqi and U.S. forces freed Australian hostage Douglas Wood. Former Baylor basketball player Carlton Dotson was sentenced to 35 years in prison, a week after he unexpectedly pleaded guilty to murdering teammate Patrick Dennehy.

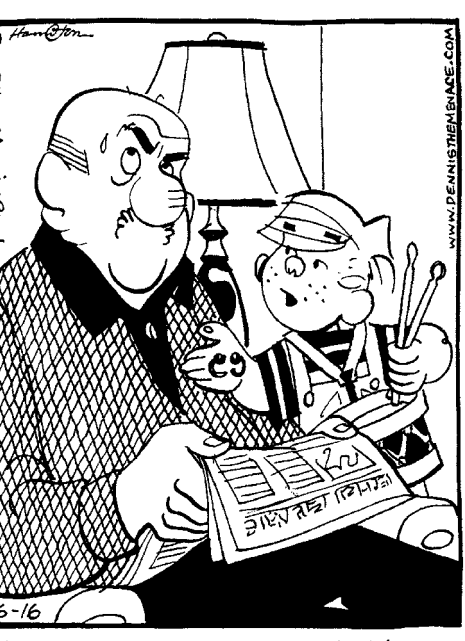
Five years ago: In his first Oval Office address, President Barack Obama promised that "we will make BP pay for the damage their company has caused," describing the massive oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico as a "siege" on the shores of America. Mexican President Felipe Calderon appealed to his fellow citizens to support the fight against organized crime just hours after troops killed 15 suspected gang members.

But in the fourth, Cody Jones hit a chopper back to Poche' leading off and wound up on third when Poche' overthrew first baseman Chris Chinea. Then, Jeremie Fagnan sent a comebacker to Poche', who looked back Jones at third before pulling Chinea off the bag with another high throw, putting runners at the corners. Connor Wanhnen and Dane Steinhagen followed with RBI singles. "He comes out in the first inning with all the

pressure in the world on his shoulders, and he strikes out the side and gets nine up, nine down and should have had 11 up, 11 down," LSU coach Paul Mainieri said. "The next two batters hit feeble groundballs right back to him and he didn't execute the play. It spiraled from there." Poche' couldn't explain his struggle to make the routine throw to first. In the fifth, TCU loaded the bases against Poche' on two walks and a single. Conner Hale booted a grounder at third, allowing one run to score, and Poche' plunked Fagnan, bringing home another. Connor Wanhnen's single drove in two more to put the Frogs up 6-1.
