Palin focuses split in GOP

DES MOINES, Iowa — If the Republican Party is on the verge of an implosion, Sarah Palin may have been the one who lit the fuse.

Palin's complicated relationship with GOP leaders over the past eight years is a microcosm of the party's broader struggles with its most restive members. What started with an embrace by party leaders evolved into wary tolerance, followed by a potentially irreparable split.

So it's perhaps little surprise that Palin is re-emerging on the national political scene at this moment of reckoning for Republicans. While she's hardly the conservative kingmaker she once was, Palin remains a favorite of the tea party insurgency, and her endorsement of Donald Trump for the 2016 GOP nomination gives him an added boost of conservative, anti-establishment credibility.

"He's been going rogue left and right," Palin said Tuesday, with a beaming Trump standing by her side. "He's been able to tear the veil off

BSFD: Structure, vehicle both total losses

A structure fire on Cheyenne Drive Thursday afternoon has left a family without a home.

According to Big Spring Fire Chief Craig Ferguson, 911 operators received a call around 4 p.m. of a structure fire in the 2400 block of Cheyenne. Firefighters had the blaze under control within 15 minutes and stayed on the scene until

7:30 p.m. to watch for any flare-ups, Ferguson said.

"The origin of the fire has yet to be determined," Ferguson said. "There was a travel trailer nearby and it was destroyed. We don't know if the fire started at the travel trailer or at the house at this time."

Both the house and the travel trailer are a complete loss, Ferguson said. Neighboring houses received heat damage from the blaze but are still livable,

he added.

No injuries were reported. The cause of the blaze is still under investigation, Ferguson stated.

Emergency personnel responded to the call with two fire pumpers, a ladder truck and two command units. Big Spring police provided assistance with crowd control.

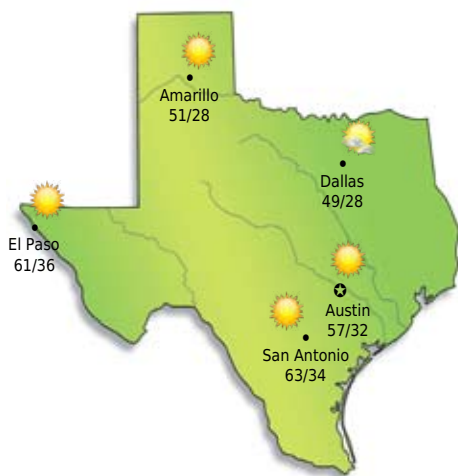

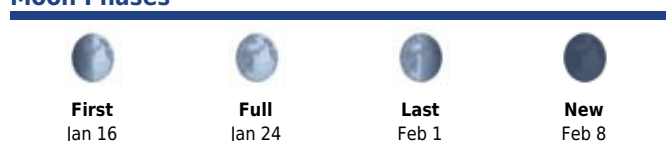

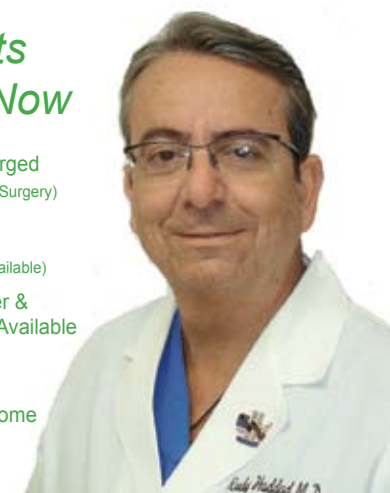

this idea of the system."

Mainstream Republicans have tried for the past several years to keep their system together by bringing lawmakers elected as disrupters into the fold rather than pushing them aside. It's a strategy that succeeded in winning the party the House in 2010 and the Senate in 2014, but it did little to achieve such conservative goals as overturning President Barack Obama's health care law or blocking increases in the nation's debt ceiling.

Now, the GOP system is cracking, leaving some in the establishment feeling they would be the outsiders in a party helmed by Trump — or by Texas Sen. Ted Cruz, a frequent tormentor of Republican leaders who is a strong contender for the nomination.

"I thought I was a traditional Republican conservative," says Bob Dole, the 1996 Republican presidential nominee who represented deep red Kansas in Congress for decades.

Dole has been an especially vocal critic of Cruz, who has blamed Republican failures in

presidential contests on the party's tendency to elect mainstream candidates like the longtime Kansas senator. However, Dole suggested in an interview Wednesday that he might be able to make peace with a Trump presidency, saying the businessman's reputation as a "deal-maker" could mean he's able to work with Congress.

Palin's endorsement of Trump is seen as a knock against Cruz, who has been on the rise in Iowa for several weeks. She campaigned for Cruz when he ran for the Senate in 2012, and he's said her support was instrumental in his victory.

For all of her firebrand conservatism, Palin owes her place on the national stage to the mainstream Republican Party. She was a little-known Alaska governor when Sen. John McCain — seen by some Republicans as an embodiment of the party estab-

lishment — tapped her as his running mate for the 2008 election.

Palin was an awkward fit as No. 2 on the ticket, but she built an enthusiastic following with conservatives. She blended more neatly into the tea party movement that blossomed during the first years of Obama's presidency and flirted with a White House run of her own in 2012 before concentrating on political punditry and reality television.

Now it's Trump and Cruz who are pushing the anti-establishment movement further than she ever managed. With less than two weeks before the Iowa caucuses kick off the nominating process, strong showings by the billionaire and the senator could turn the Republican race into a two-man contest.

To be sure, a slew of politically experienced rivals are still hoping to blunt Trump's and Cruz's momentum once

voting begins. But for now, more mainstream voters are dividing their support among Florida Sen. Marco Rubio, former Florida Gov. Jeb Bush, New Jersey Gov. Chris Christie and Ohio Gov. John Kasich, making it difficult for any one of them to mount a strong challenge.

In most recent elections, Republicans have tended to nominate center-right candidates who were seen as having the best prospects in the general election. Even after the 2010 tea party takeover in the House, the GOP nominated Mitt Romney — the former governor of moderate Massachusetts — in the 2012 presidential race.

Four years later, many Republican voters not only believe that nominating a centrist would cost them another shot at the White House, but they also are deeply skeptical that an establishment GOP president would follow through on their priorities.

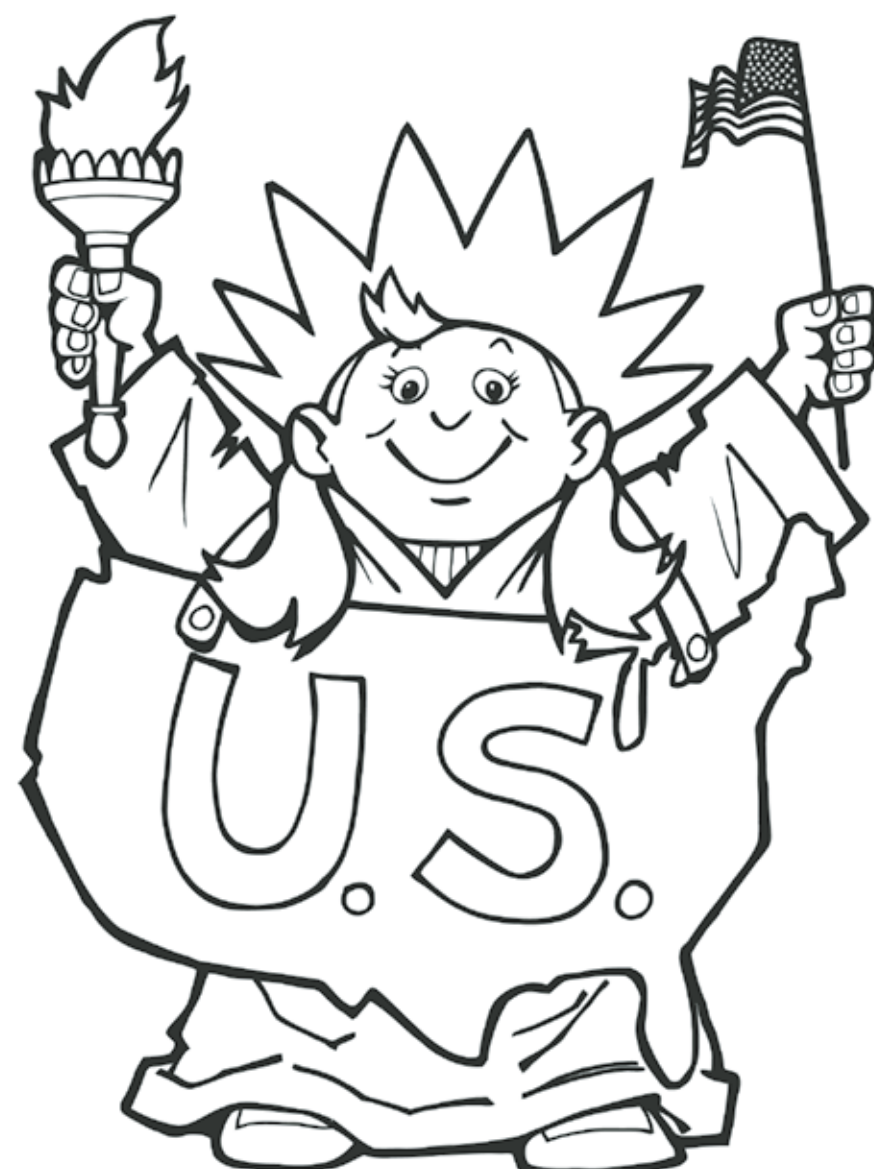

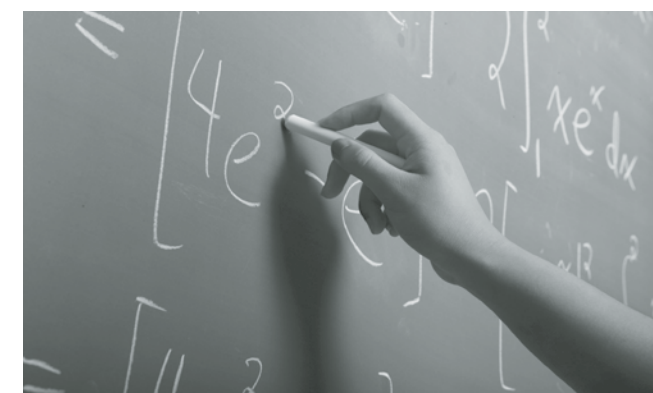

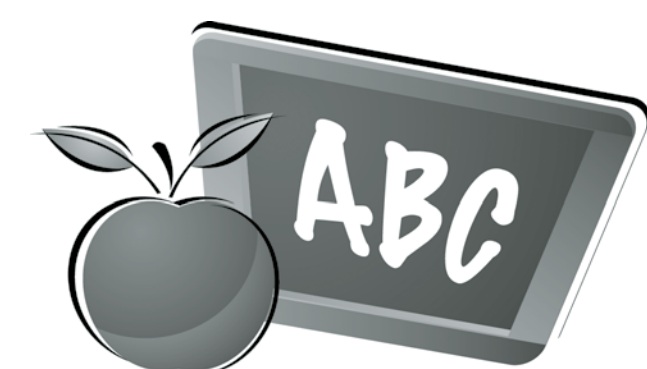

Pistons down Rockets

HOUSTON — Detroit's Andre Drummond wouldn't say whether he realized he set an NBA record by missing 23 free throws Wednesday night against the Houston Rockets.

He was more focused on the big picture than his shortcomings.

"We won the game today," he said when asked about the record.

Kentavious Caldwell-Pope and Marcus Morris each scored 22 points and the Pistons beat the Rockets 123-114, despite Drummond's 23 missed free throws.

Drummond set a career high and franchise record by attempting 36 free throws on a night he was intentionally fouled 21 times. The previous record for most misses was 22, set by Wilt Chamberlain on Dec. 1, 1967. His 36 attempts were third-most in league history, behind two 39-attempt games by Dwight Howard.

"It wasn't a chess match, it was just they wanted to foul and we let them foul," Pistons coach Stan Van Gundy said.

The Hack-A-Shaq allowed the Rockets to take the lead in the third quarter when they did it 12 straight times, but it didn't help them close the gap in the fourth when Drummond went out for good with 5 1/2 minutes left after seven hacks in the quarter and Detroit leading 107-94.

"It didn't work," interim coach J.B. Bickerstaff said. "That's it. That's all I have to say about that."

But Van Gundy had plenty to say on the subject, talking for several minutes about the NBA and commissioner Adam Silver refusing to outlaw it.

"That's the game the league wants, so that's what fans get to watch," Van Gundy said.

Drummond shot a little bit better in the fourth quarter than he did earlier in the game, making six of 12 attempts.

"I'm not going to miss them all," he said. "I've worked on it enough where I'm going to build a rhythm and over time I ended up getting one."

James Harden had his first triple-double of the season and seventh of his career with 33 points, a career-high 17 rebounds and 14 assists in the loss.

Drummond finished with 17 points and 11 rebounds.

'Horns take down No. 6 West Virginia

MORGANTOWN, W. Va. — West Virginia had just split a pair of games against Kansas and Oklahoma last week to move up the national rankings.

The Mountaineers fell flat on Wednesday night as unranked Texas upset No. 6 West Virginia 56-49.

"I have always thought, as long as I've done this, when you make easy shots and when you can't make free throws, you're not mentally into what you're doing," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said. "And we weren't mentally into what we were do-

ing."

The letdown came despite West Virginia having occupied the top of the national rankings for 20 of the last 25 polls, dating to last season.

"This is a league you cannot relax at all. It's just how the league is," the Mountaineers' Devin Williams said. "I think it's just a learning experience and we'll be back. This is something that we needed and we just got a little too comfortable."

Javan Felix scored the final nine points for Texas and led the Longhorns to a 56-49 victory over No. 6 West Virginia on Wednesday night.

Felix, who finished with 17

points, shot 4 of 9 from the field, including 2 of 3 from 3-point range, and was 7 of 8 from the foul line as a Mountaineers team (15-3, 4-2 Big 12) that had not lost at the WVU Coliseum this season.

During the key stretch, Felix had a one-hand follow-up shot, two free throws, a 3-pointer and two more foul shots for the Longhorns (12-6, 4-2).

Because of light snow, slush and ice, Texas' team bus failed to arrive at the WVU Coliseum until 6:15 p.m., just 45 minutes before the tip.

West Virginia received double-doubles from Devin Williams — 11 points, 11 re-

bounds — and Jonathan Holton — 10 points, 14 rebounds.

Texas fought back from a 28-25 halftime lead over West Virginia. The Mountaineers charged ahead 34-29 with 15:24 left.

The Longhorns were ahead 42-37 with 9:18 remaining when West Virginia battled back. After Elijah Macon missed both free throws, Jay-sean Paige got the ball and made a layup, and Holton followed with a score. Dexter Miles Jr.'s 3-pointer tied it.

Texas called a timeout with 6:17 left, then outscored West Virginia 14-7 the rest of the way.

Bills hire first full-time female NFL coach

BUFFALO, N.Y. — The NFL has its first full-time female coach.

Kathryn Smith was promoted by the Buffalo Bills on Wednesday night to take over as special teams quality control coach on Rex Ryan's staff.

She will assist special teams coordinator Danny Crossman and his assistant Eric Smith, filling the role that opened after Michael Hamlin was not retained following the season.

Smith's appointment comes after Jen Welter served a six-

week training camp internship last summer coaching inside linebackers for the Arizona Cardinals.

Smith is well-known within the Bills staff after spending this season as an administrative assistant for the team's assistant coaches. She spent the past seven years working alongside Ryan.

She was the New York Jets player personnel assistant when Ryan took over as coach in 2009. Smith then served as Ryan's assistant in 2014, his final year in New York before he was fired and then hired by the Bills.

"She certainly deserves this promotion based on

her knowledge and strong commitment, just to name a couple of her outstanding qualities," Ryan said in a statement released by the team.

"She has proven that she's ready for the next step, so I'm excited and proud for her with this opportunity."

Bills offensive lineman Richie Incognito expressed his support for Smith in a tweet.

"Congrats Kathryn!! I know you will do a great job," Incognito said in a post that included a thumb's up and smiley face.

This is not the first time the Bills broke the gender

barrier.

Linda Bogdan, in 1986, became the NFL's first female scout, when she joined the team's player personnel department. Bogdan, who died in 2009, was the daughter of late Bills Hall of Fame owner Ralph Wilson.

Several NFL teams have employed women in prominent roles in the front office. Amy Trask was the Raiders' chief executive officer for owner Al Davis from 1997 until she resigned in 2013.

The Jets promoted longtime executive Jacqueline Davidson to director of football administration last season.

Annie's Mailbox

Also, nothing in the song indicates that the gift-giver included cows. Only the maids-a-milking. Since the song was first published in 1780, we assume the recipient already had cows.

The figures we printed came from the PNC Bank (originally the Provident National Bank in Philadelphia), which calculates maids-a-milking as unskilled labor, and thus they are paid minimum wage. We will be

happy to pass along your claim that they are skilled labor and therefore entitled to more money.

We're still chuckling. Thank you so much for writing. You made our day.

Sylvia had a stubborn streak in her nature, and if she thought her opponents wanted her to do something, she would resist fiercely on the basis that anything good for her opponents was bad for her. This could, at times, make her a truly worthy adversary.

Here is a striking example of Sylvia's thinking. She was playing as usual in the expert game and led a club against three notrump. Declarer ducked the king, as well as the queen, but won the next club with the ace as East discarded a low spade.

South observed that the diamonds were blocked, and, in the hope of catching the singleton queen, he cashed the king of diamonds at trick four. When the queen did not fall, South made the excellent play of the eight of clubs. He naturally thought Sylvia would cash both of her clubs, and he planned to discard the ten of diamonds from his hand when Sylvia cashed the last club. This would allow him to untangle the diamonds and so score the rest of the tricks.

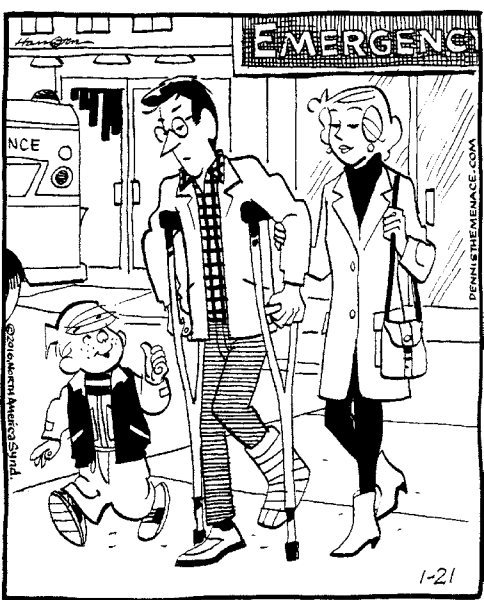
But Sylvia eyed declarer's club play with profound suspicion. It seemed obvious that South wanted her to cash her fifth club, and, being Sylvia, she firmly resisted the impulse. Instead, she returned the queen of diamonds!

This play knocked South clear out of the box. He could not duck the diamond because Sylvia would then cash her good club to set the contract. So he took the ace and tried a spade finesse, which lost, whereupon Sylvia cashed her fifth club to add yet another triumph to her extraordinary collection.

Senate panel approves bill to make school lunches tastier

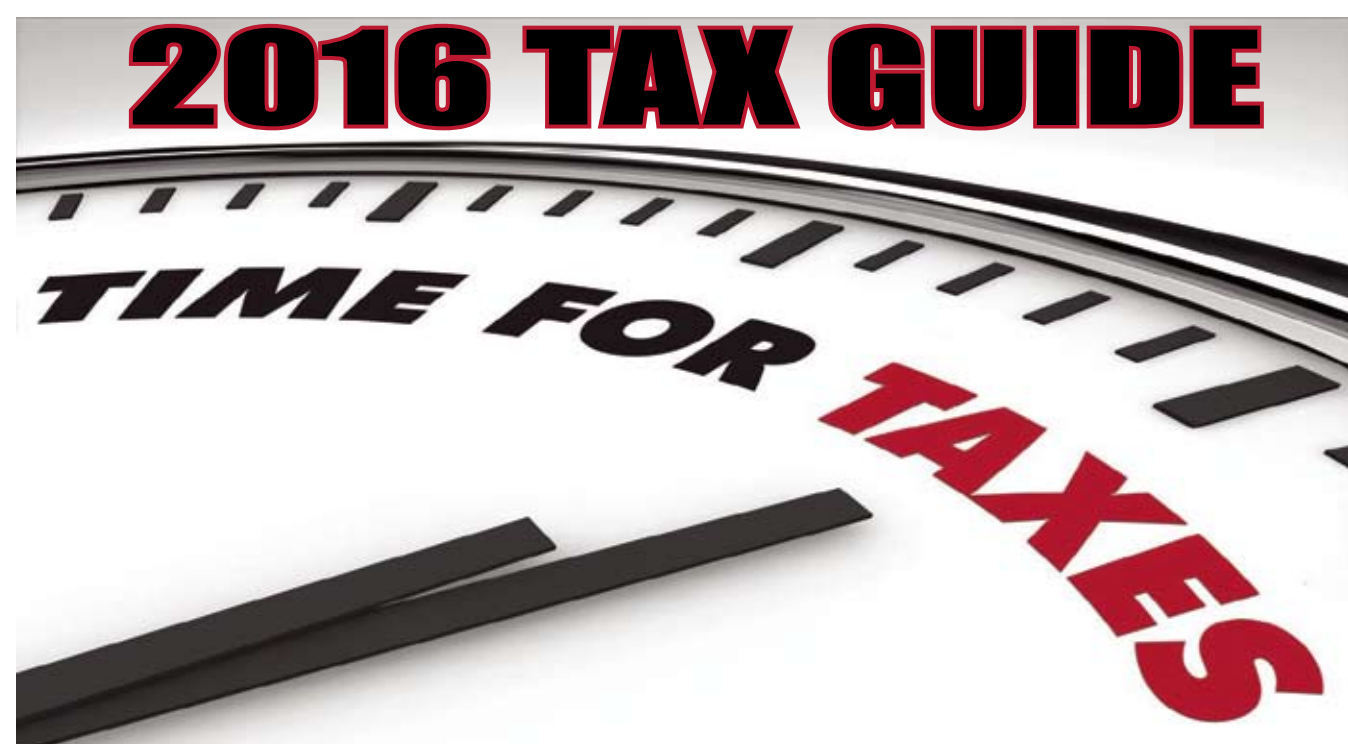
WASHINGTON (AP) — School meals could become a bit tastier under legislation approved by a Senate committee.


The bipartisan measure approved by a voice vote Wednesday is designed to help schools that say the Obama administration's healthier meal rules are too restrictive. Leaders

of the Senate Agriculture, Nutrition and Forestry Committee introduced the legislation Monday after negotiating an agreement to ease requirements for whole grains and delaying a deadline to cut sodium levels.

School lunch directors who have lobbied against the stan-

dards endorsed the deal, saying it would help them plan meals that are more appealing to students. Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack has backed it as well, saying the compromise maintains most of the healthier school meal rules that have been phased in since 2012.
