Anti-Trump Republicans come to terms with Cruz

 FORT MYERS, Fla. — Anxious Republican officials are coming to terms with the idea that their second least favorite GOP presidential candidate — polarizing Texas conservative Ted Cruz — may be the party's best last chance

to stop Donald Trump. Possible Cruz supporters include reluctant Senate colleagues and former presidential rivals with strong ties to major donors, who have long feared Cruz's purist ide-

ology but dread the prospect of a Trump nomination even more. The first-term Texas senator on Wednesday announced the backing of one former primary opponent, Carly Fiorina, and is seeking the backing of another, Jeb Bush, on Thursday. "It's an outsider year, and the most logical person to

take on Trump based on past performance is Ted Cruz," said another former presidential opponent, South Carolina Sen. Lindsey Graham. Earlier in the year, Graham likened the choice between Cruz and Trump to "being shot or poisoned." "He's not my preference," Graham said of Cruz. "But

we are where we are. And if Trump wins Florida and Ohio, I don't know if we can stop him." Indeed, next Tuesday's winner-take-all contests in Florida and Ohio have injected a sense of urgency into the GOP's anti-Trump move-

Academic upgrades on BSISD agenda

An update on the plan to turn around the academic performance of the district's four elementary schools will be on tap for the next meeting of the Big Spring Independent School board of trustees.

Last year, the district's four elementary schools failed to meet standards based on results from state mandated testing according to the Texas Education Agency rating system. However, the district, which

had been designated as a low academically performing district, received a "met standards rating" when TEA announced school ratings in May.

In February, TEA officially announced the district was back to full accreditation. It was placed on accredited warned status in 2015.

In other business, trustees are expected to take care of some housekeeping issues including canceling the upcoming elections. After the cutoff date for candidacy declarations, only the incumbents officially filed to seek another term negating the need for this year's election.

Trustees meet at 5:15 p.m. Thursday in the high school board room, 707th Place.

Proceeds help club fund youth programs in area

No one's really sure when the Kiwanis Club of Big Spring began their annual pancake supper. But if attendance is any indication, no one's ready for it to end, either.

Hundreds of area residents are expected to flock to the Howard College cafeteria Friday when the Kiwanis hold the supper — the club's major fundraiser of the year — from

4:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.

For \$6, attendees can eat their fill of pancakes, bacon and sausage. Tickets will be available at the door or through any club member, and to-go orders are welcomed.

Money raised from the supper will be used to benefit youth-oriented service projects in Big Spring, such as the Westside Daycare Center, as well as college scholarships for area high school students.

The local Kiwanis Club has been a Big Spring fixture since the 1920s, and all anybody really knows is that the organization's flapjack feast began a few years later. When pressed, club members estimate the dinner has been an annual event for at least 60 years.

"This is a long-standing tradition," said club member Ann Duncan.

A strong and devoted woman, she cared for their four children (Laura, Greg, Cindy and Mike) with love, patience and kindness as Ralph proudly served his country as a USAF fighter pilot in the Korean War, then, as a member of the USAF Thunderbirds Aerial Demonstration Team and, finally, as a fighter pilot in Vietnam. Lynette never wavered in her dedication to her family and husband, constantly looking after their well-being.

When Ralph retired in 1973, the Brooks family returned to Big Spring to join Lynette's parents' business - Blum's Jewelers. She was a constant fixture at the family business and enjoyed meeting and greeting customers and friends. 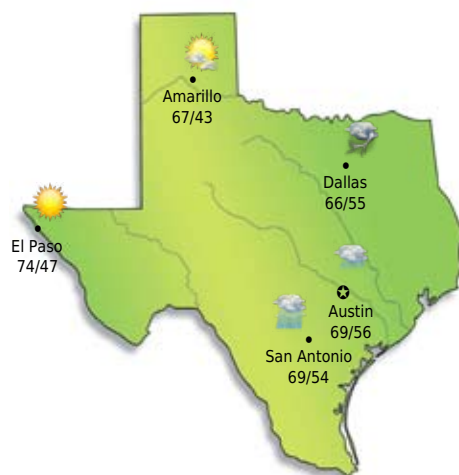

Trump pivots to general election, in his own unorthodox way

MIAMI (AP) — In his own unorthodox way, Donald Trump is unmistakably evolving into a general election candidate.

The over-the-top billionaire is talking about flexibility in his hardline immigration policies. He's pledging to moderate his bullying tone, acknowledging that women in particular may be turned off by his brash brand of politics. And he's working to assume the mantle of GOP standard-bearer, calling for party unity and promising to help fellow Republicans win their own elections in November.

"It's very, very important as a Republican that our senators and congressmen get re-elected," Trump said Tuesday during a late-night news conference at one of his Florida resorts.

To be sure, Trump is still very much doing things his way. His pledge to help other candidates came just before a lengthy promotion of his brand, all while flanked by tables of Trump wine — as well as bottled water and a display of raw steaks, which he no longer sells. His calls for party unity are still bracketed by jabs at rivals "Little Marco" Rubio and "Lying Ted" Cruz.

But there are clear indications Trump is confident he'll emerge from the turbulent primaries as the GOP nominee — and that he knows he has work to do to broaden his appeal with general election voters and his own party's leaders.

Who's best for Hispanics? Clinton, Sanders debate

MIAMI (AP) — Fighting for Florida and beyond, Hillary Clinton and Bernie Sanders tangled in an intense debate Wednesday night over who's the true friend of American Hispanics, trading accusations over guest worker programs "akin to slavery" and the embracing of "vigilantes" against immigrants.

They had even worse things to say about Republican front-runner Donald Trump.

Facing off just six days before Florida gives its verdict on the presidential race, Clinton faulted Sanders for repeatedly voting against a 2007 comprehensive immigration reform bill; he faulted her for opposing a 2007 effort to let people who were in the country illegally obtain driver's licenses.

Had the immigration package passed back then, Clinton said, "a lot of the issues we are still discussing today would be in the rearview mirror."

Sanders retorted that he opposed the legislation because it included a guest worker program "akin to slavery."

Fukushima clean-up workers from bottom of contractor system

MINAMISOMA, Japan (AP) — The ashes of half a dozen unidentified laborers ended up at a Buddhist temple in this town just north of the crippled Fukushima nuclear plant. Some of the dead men had no papers, others left no emergency contacts. Their names could not be confirmed and no family members had been tracked down to claim their remains.

They were simply labeled "decontamination troops" — unknown soldiers in Japan's massive clean-up campaign to make Fukushima livable again five years after radiation poisoned the fertile countryside.

The men were among the 26,000 workers — many in their 50s and 60s from the margins of society with no special skills or close family ties — tasked with removing the contaminated topsoil and stuffing it into tens of thousands of black bags lining the fields and roads. They wipe off roofs, clean out gutters and chop down trees in a seemingly endless routine.

Coming from across Japan to do a dirty, risky and undesirable job, the workers make up the very bottom of the nation's murky, caste-like subcontractor system long criticized for labor violations. Vulnerable to exploitation and shunned by local residents, they typically work on three-to-six-month contracts with little or no benefits, living in makeshift company barracks. And the government is not even making sure that their radiation levels are individually tested.

"They're cleaning up radiation in Fukushima, doing sometimes unsafe work, and yet they can't be proud of what they do or even considered legitimate workers," said Mitsuo Nakamura, a former day laborer who now heads a citizens' group supporting decontamination laborers. "They are exploited by the vested interests that have grown in the massive project."

Facing off just six days before Florida gives its verdict on the presidential race, Clinton faulted Sanders for repeatedly voting against a 2007 comprehensive immigration reform bill; he faulted her for opposing a 2007 effort to let people who were in the country illegally obtain driver's licenses.

Had the immigration package passed back then, Clinton said, "a lot of the issues we are still discussing today would be in the rearview mirror."

Sanders retorted that he opposed the legislation because it included a guest worker program "akin to slavery."

ment.

The billionaire businessman is calling on mainstream Republicans to unify behind his candidacy ahead of next week's primaries, which could give him an insurmountable delegate lead.

"If I win those two, I think it's over," Trump told CNN's "Anderson Cooper's 360."

"Instead of fighting it, they should embrace it," he added on Fox News Channel.

Bush planned to confer with all the candidates — save Trump — ahead of Thursday's GOP debate. He met privately with Florida Sen. Marco Rubio on Wednesday, and planned to meet with Cruz and Ohio Gov. John Kasich on Thursday.

Bush and Trump engaged in heated confrontations throughout Bush's campaign, repeatedly referring to each other as "loser."

The GOP establishment's overwhelming favorite, Florida Sen.

Marco Rubio, picked up where Bush left off, but struggled badly in Tuesday's round of primary contests, failing to pick up a single delegate. Trump won three of the contests and Cruz won one.

Now, in the midst of a weeklong march through Florida to save his candidacy, Rubio concedes that he went too far in insulting Trump.

"My kids were embarrassed by it and if I had it to do over again I wouldn't," Rubio said on MSNBC Wednesday night.

Rubio's weak standing has forced some of his supporters to consider Cruz.

"I could see myself as a Cruz supporter," Nevada Sen. Dean Heller, a Rubio supporter, said Wednesday. "I agree with Cruz 80 percent of the time. There are things I don't agree with him on, but if we are agreeing 80 percent of the time and he's a conservative, we are going to get along just fine."

Still, no Republican senator has endorsed Cruz, who called Majority Leader Mitch

McConnell a liar and helped engineer the 16-day partial government shutdown in 2013. Half a dozen Senate Republicans said Wednesday that they hadn't heard from either Trump or Cruz.

Trump has one Senate endorsement, from Alabama's Jeff Sessions, while Rubio has endorsements from 14 senators.

Fiorina, though, offered Cruz an immediate dose of credibility with his party's skeptical donor class. She told a Miami crowd on Wednesday that she's "horrified" by Trump.

"The truth is that Donald Trump and Hillary Clinton are two sides of the same coin," she charged, standing alongside Cruz. "It is time now to unite behind the one man who can beat Donald Trump, who can beat Hillary Clinton."

In the latest Democratic debate, Clinton and Bernie Sanders tangled Wednesday night over who's a true advocate for Latinos.

Facing off just six days before Florida's primary, Clinton faulted Sanders for repeat-

edly voting against a 2007 comprehensive immigration reform bill; he faulted her for opposing a 2007 effort to allow people who were in the country illegally to obtain driver's licenses.

Sanders surprised Clinton with a win Tuesday night in Michigan, a victory that breathed new life into his White House bid. But Clinton, who won Mississippi, padded her delegate lead and is now halfway to the number needed to clinch the nomination.

On the Republican side, things are far more chaotic.


"The Republican establishment is in its death throes," said longtime tea party leader Mark Meckler. "The only remaining candidates are 100 percent anti-establishment."

TCU sends Tech home early

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — TCU had been in most of its games this season, only to come up short in the closing minutes.

The Horned Frogs used that experience to their advantage Wednesday.

Chauncey Collins scored 19 points, hitting three free throws in the final seconds, and the Big 12 tournament's No. 10 seed dealt a major blow to Texas Tech's NCAA Tournament hopes with a 67-62 victory in the first round at the Sprint Center.

"A lot of games we came close, the last four minutes," Collins said. "During that timeout, it was a tied ballgame, we just had to give it our all, put our backs against the wall and live with the results."

Brandon Parrish added 15 points, Vlad Brodziansky had 13 and Malique Trent had 10 for the Horned Frogs (12-20), who scuffled into the Sprint Center having lost seven consecutive games but will now face No. 9 West Virginia — the tournament's second seed — in Thursday's quarterfinal round.

"Anybody want to help me out by taking Huggs and his players out?" TCU coach Trent Johnson asked.

Justin Gray and Zach Smith scored 13 points apiece for the seventh-seeded Red Raiders (19-12), who now face a long weekend of waiting. Texas Tech has a strong RPI thanks to a series of wins over ranked teams, but could have used a victory in the Big 12 tournament to make Selection Sunday more comfortable.

"We've proven ourselves throughout the whole season, won Gray said. "I think we've put ourselves in a pretty good position to make the tournament."

The Red Raiders forged a 31-30 halftime lead despite a virtuoso effort from Collins, who was 4 of 5 from beyond the arc and had 16 points by the intermission.

The 6-foot sophomore left the crowd in Sprint Center buzzing when he dunked over a defender late in the first half to give the Horned Frogs a brief lead. Collins appeared to land awkwardly after the dunk, though, and he held his hip with a grimace while running back on defense.

Asked where the dunk ranked among his best plays, he replied: "No. 1, definitely."

While the Horned Frogs' leading scorer left the game, he seemed to lose some of his pep. But the rest of his teammates picked up the slack early in the second half, embarking on a 13-0 run to take a 43-36 lead. Parrish did most of the damage, knocking down a pair of 3s during the charge.

The Red Raiders countered with a 9-2 run of their own to knot the game 45-all.

The matchup between old Southwest Conference

rivals was tied five more times down the stretch, the last time coming at 58-58 on a basket by Smith with just over a minute left.

Brodziansky scored with a scooping layup to give TCU the lead back, then Trent corralled Aaron Ross's missed shot and raced up court, converting a 3-point play for a 63-58 lead with 34.3 seconds to go.

Smith scored quickly at the other end and Texas Tech fouled Collins, who only managed to make the first of two free throws. Then, after Ross scored his only points of the game to make it 64-62 with 16 seconds left, Collins was sent to the foul line once more — this time he made both of the shots.

Texas Tech squandered its last offensive chance and Brodziansky hit one more foul shot to seal it.

"The body of work we put in throughout the year, strength of schedule, wins we've had, I think we have a very good shot at getting in," Texas Tech coach Tubby Smith said of the NCAA Tournament. "We obviously didn't help ourselves tonight, but

TCU — you get into a tournament like this, somebody is going to get beat."

Morris, Drummond too much for Mavs

DALLAS (AP) — The Detroit Pistons are moving in the right direction, while the Dallas Mavericks are looking for answers.

Marcus Morris scored 20 points, including two 3-pointers during a decisive fourth-quarter run, and Andre Drummond had 25 points and 17 rebounds to help the Pistons beat the Mavericks 102-96 Wednesday night.

Drummond leads the NBA with 54 double-doubles. Tobias Harris added 19 points for Detroit, which won its 33rd game — one more than all of last season.

"We've got a younger team," Drummond said. "(Coach) Stan (Van Gundy) has done a good job of bringing in guys that can really spread the floor. We have a lot of shooters on the team. It makes teams really think about who you're going to match up with."

Following a tight first

three quarters, Kentavious Caldwell-Pope stole an outlet pass and drove for a layup to give the Pistons an 82-81 lead in the fourth. That started a 12-2 run that included Morris' two 3s, the last to go up 92-83 with 5:21 to go. That was the largest lead either team held in the game.

Chandler Parsons and Dirk Nowitzki each scored 25 points for Dallas, which lost its season-high fourth in a row and has now lost 32 games, the same number it lost in all of 2014-15.

"We always do some good things," Nowitzki said. "We just made some bad mistakes here and there, and some bad possessions. Some bad bounces, a missed rotation. When you're in a funk, you've got to play through your mistakes."

The Mavericks are in a stretch with nine out of 10 games at home but have gone 4-5 in that time.

Detroit erased an eight-point deficit with a 17-2 run in the second quarter and led 54-52 at halftime. Drummond scored the team's last 10 points of the half over a 4:09 span despite making only 4 of 11 free throws

during that stretch. He finished the half with 20 points.

McClain back to Cowboys on one-year deal

IRVING, Texas (AP) — Rolando McClain is returning for a third in season in Dallas, where the middle linebacker revived his career after quickly flaming out as a high draft pick in Oakland.

The agency that represents McClain, Sports Trust Advisors, said in a tweet that the 26-year-old agreed to a con-

tract Wednesday, the first day of free agency. The deal is for one year at \$5 million, according to a person with knowledge of the contract who spoke to The Associated Press on condition of anonymity because terms weren't released.

The eighth overall pick by the Raiders in 2010, McClain

was dumped after three disappointing seasons and spent a year away from football before the Cowboys traded for him out of desperation when Sean Lee went down with a season-ending knee injury in the first offseason workout of 2014.

Oakland released McClain after the 2012 season, and he

ended up in Baltimore but never played for the Ravens. He retired once, and walked away from the game again in April 2014 shortly after deciding to return.

Three months later, with Lee out for the year because of a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee, Baltimore sent McClain to Dallas

in a trade also involving late-round draft picks just before training camp.

Despite lingering questions about his desire to play because he frequently sat out of practices, McClain ended up second on the team in tackles with a career-high 108 in 2014.

It's unlikely that you will convince your sister to treat her depression by talking to a doctor or a therapist. You have tried discussing it, to no avail. Unless you are willing to remove Dad from the home, you have little influence on her forms of relaxation. If she is abusive or neglectful, report the situation to Adult Protective Services. And whenever possible, please take over so that your sister can get a break. Being the primary caregiver is a tough job, no matter what shape you're in, and it may be more stressful for your sister

than you realize.

Dear Annie: I have read with interest the many letters from both men and women of a certain age who are dealing with sexual and intimacy issues. Then I read the letter from "Three Sexy Broads in Vermont." First, I applaud them and count myself in the same league -- over 70 and still sexy.

Contract Bridge

Don't Count on Friendship

North dealer.
Neither side vulnerable.

NORTH
♠ A 7 3
♥ A
♦ 7 6 2
♣ K Q 8 6 5 2

EAST
♠ Q J 8 5
♥ 8 5 4 3
♦ K 3
♣ A J 10

SOUTH
♠ K 10 9 2
♥ K Q 6
♦ A J 10 5
♣ 7 4

The bidding:
North ♠ Pass East 1♦ Pass
South 1♦ Pass West 3NT

Opening lead — jack of hearts.

Assume you're in three no trump and West leads a heart. You win with the ace and see that your best source of tricks lies in clubs. So let's say you play a diamond to the ace at trick two and lead a club to the queen.

If East is a good friend of yours, he wins with the ace, and you have

no trouble making the contract after establishing dummy's clubs. But if East's aim is to win, he ducks the queen of clubs, and you go down one or two tricks. You end up with only one club trick instead of the four or five you had hoped to make.

Now let's go back to trick two and lead a low club from dummy! This unusual play forces East to win the trick and allows you to establish the clubs and cash them later on. It succeeds not only when the clubs are divided 3-2, but also when either defender has the singleton ace.

It is true that the suggested method of play will cost you a trick if West started with the doubleton or tripleton ace of clubs. But this is a relatively insignificant trick that you can afford to lose in the interests of making the contract.

The point is that the best chance for the contract lies in making sure that you score four club tricks, and that the most promising move in this direction is a low club play from dummy at trick two. The play might be startling in its nature, but that is hardly a good reason for failing to make it.

This Date In History

Today is Thursday, March 10, the 70th day of 2016. There are 296 days left in the year.

Today's Highlight in History:

In 1876, Alexander Graham Bell's assistant, Thomas Watson, heard Bell say over his experimental telephone: "Mr. Watson, 'Ai come here, 'Ai I want to see you' from the next room of Bell's Boston laboratory.

On this date:

In 1785, Thomas Jefferson was appointed America's minister to France, succeeding Benjamin Franklin.

In 1864, President Abraham Lincoln assigned Ulysses S. Grant, who had just received his commission as lieutenant-

general, to the command of the Armies of the United States. The song "Beautiful Dreamer" by the late Stephen Foster was copyrighted by Wm. A. Pond & Co. of New York.

In 1880, the Salvation Army arrived in the United States from England.

In 1914, the Rokeby Venus, a 17th century painting by Diego Velazquez on display at the National Gallery in London, was slashed multiple times by Mary Richardson, who was protesting the arrest of fellow suffragist Emmeline Pankhurst. (The painting was repaired.)

In 1933, a magnitude 6.4 earthquake centered off Long Beach, California, resulted in 120 deaths.

In 1949, Nazi wartime broadcaster Mildred E. Gillars, also known as "Axis Sally," was convicted in Washington D.C., of treason. (She served 12 years in prison.)

In 1952, Fulgencio Batista once again became leader of Cuba in a bloodless coup that deposed President Carlos Piro Socarras.

In 1969, James Earl Ray pleaded guilty in Memphis, Tennessee, to assassinating civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr. (Ray later repudiated that plea, maintaining his innocence until his death.)

In 1973, the Pink Floyd album "The Dark Side of the Moon" was first released in the U.S. by Capitol Records (the British release came nearly two weeks later).
