1962 feed grain program has n extended through April 16,

1962 FEED GRAIN DIVERTED

ACRES. There seems to be sommisunderstanding among producer relative to feed grain and whea MCRES. There seems to be some insunderstanding among producers relative to feed grain and wheat databilization program diverted accepted for 1962. Here are the facts: Minimum diverted, 20 percent of pase, maximum permitted, 80 percent of base. Maximum diverted 20 access plus 20 per cent of base. If more than 20 per cent is diverted he permitted feed grain acreage is the difference between the acrage diverted and the base acreage. New land broken out will not qualify as diverted acres. Diverted acreage must be cropland that was intensively cultivated in at least one of the years 1959, 1960 or 1961. Diverted acreage plots must be of regular shape, with not less than dive acres, except where the total diverted is less than five acres, and there may not be more than three plots per quarter section of land in the farm with the maximum number of plots of eight for any farm. The same acreage diverted for the 1961 program may also be diverted for 1962.

Summer fallowed use on diverted acreage must be approved by the county committee and must be kept free of vegetation and protective measures must be carried out, if necessary, to prevent erosion. All grain sorghum classified as such under the official grain sandards and mixtues of grain sorghum and counted against the permitted acreage. Not the propose for which grown will be classified as grain sorghum and counted against the permitted or base acreage only when harvested for silage. Only the land actually occupied by grain sorghum will count as grain sorghum acreage. 



# THE BLOOD OF CHRIST

(By Harold F. Savely)

The nearest to a perfect religion before Christ was the Jewish law. God found it faulty (Heb. 8:8-13) and abrogated it by the cross (Col. 2:14) that Jew and Gentile be one through his blood (Eph. 2:13-16). It was the only God-sanctioned "wall of partition" ever made to separate. Woe to any who build other religious barriers to divide and alienate his people. If the law was powerless to save, much less can demonstrate, excede or other. save, much less can denominational creeds, or other

A great flaw in the law was the lack of a saving blood. Divers washings and sprinklings of animal blood (Heb. 9:7-22), such as bull and goats, could not take away sins (Heb. 10:4).

By Christ's precious blood we are: (1) redeemed (I Peter. 1:18-21; Eph. 1:7). (2) justified (Rom. 5:9), (3) cleansed from sin (I Jno. 1:7), (4) purchased (Acts 20:28), (5) made nigh (Eph. 2;13), (6) forgiven (Col. 1:14), (7) in remission of sins (Matt. 26:28), (8) entered by a new and living way (Heb. 10:19-22), and (9) purged in conscience (Heb. 9:14).

How to appropriate his blood has been needlessly controverted. Its merits come by: (1) directions of the blood sanctified testament (Heb. 9:19, 20; 10:9, 10). (2) faith (Rom. 3:25), sprinkling of the heart (Heb. 10:22), (3) burial of baptism into Christ's sacrificial death (Rom. 6:3-18; Acts 22:16), (4) addition to the purchased church (Acts 2:47; 20:28), and (5) walking in light (I Jno. 1:7-9).
