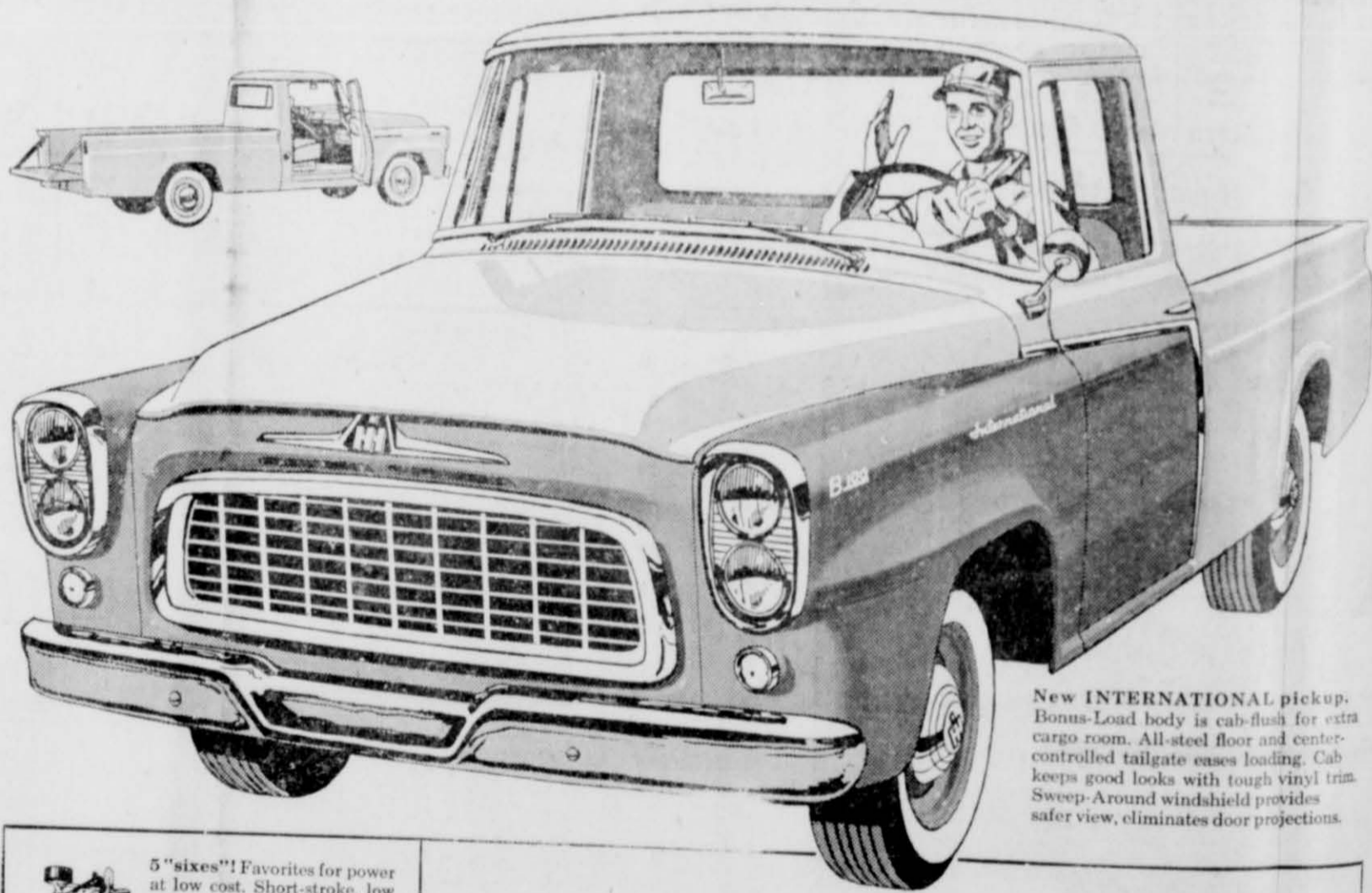

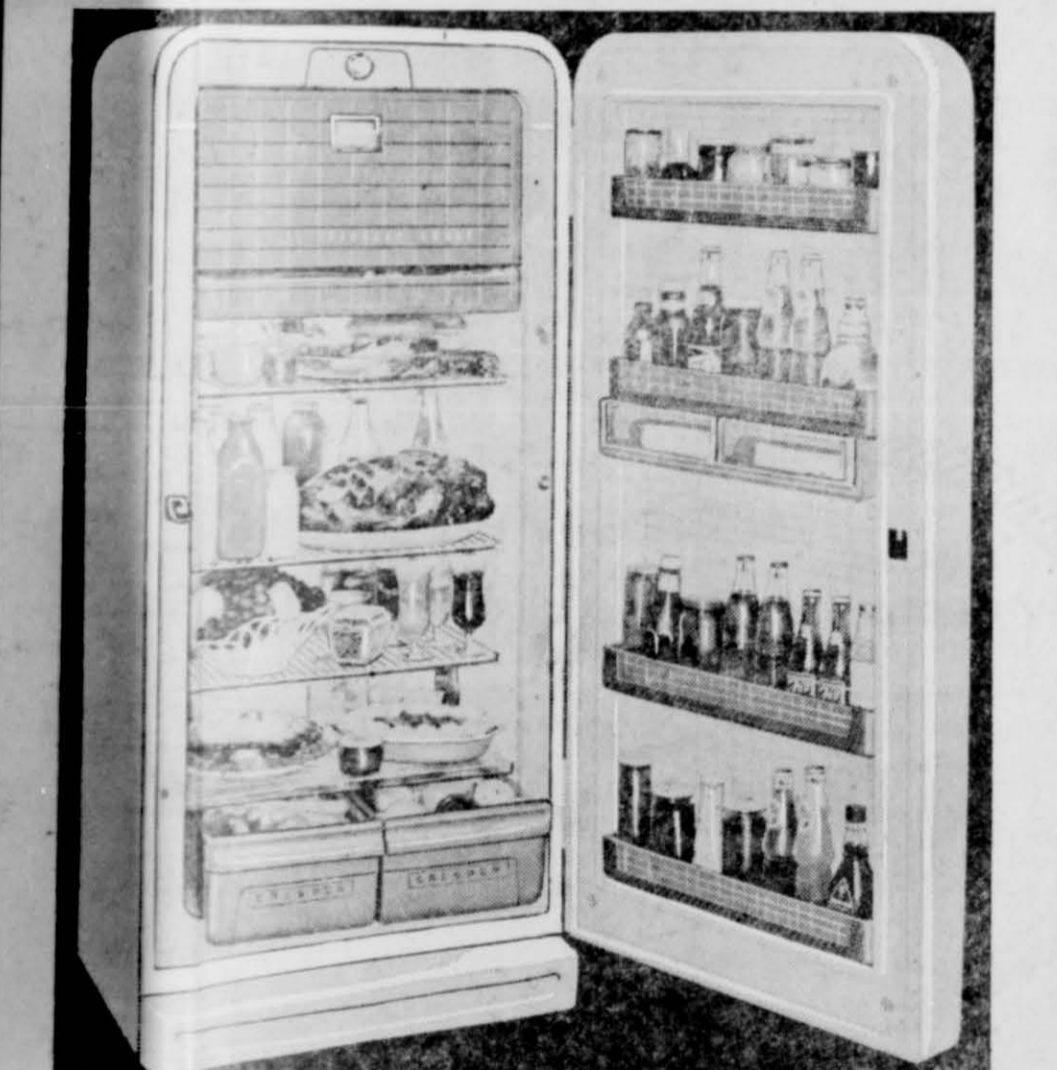

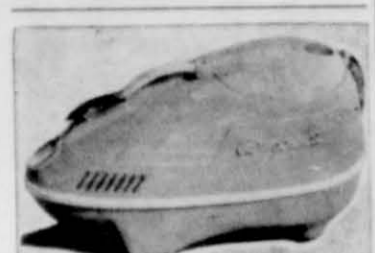

WASHINGTON NEWSLETTER

FRANK VS. WALKERLAND

The mere mention of the above case should strike terror in the hearts of all freedom-loving Americans who are laboring under the delusion that the privacy of the home is inviolate. Much will be heard about this case in the future. It is the case in which the Supreme Court of the United States recently held that, if a health inspector in the City of Baltimore, acting under the provisions of a Baltimore Ordinance, requested entry into a private home for the purpose of making a health inspection, it was the duty of the owner of the home to admit the inspector, and the failure of the owner to do so would subject him to being fined under the Ordinance. In short, the Court held that the fitting of the home owner, because of his refusal to admit the invasion of the privacy of his home, was just a violation of the 4th Amendment of the Constitution which condemns unreasonable searches and seizures. There are 9 justices on the Supreme Court. Five of these, to wit, Justices Frankfurter, Clark, Stewart, Harlan and Whiteaker, joined together to reach the said conclusion. The remaining 4, to wit, Justices Warren, Douglas, Black and Brennan, joined together in a dissenting opinion which was in direct conflict with the opinion of the majority. The majority held that the health inspector did not

need a search warrant. The minority held that the health inspector did need a search warrant. The majority opinion listed all of the authority in support of the proposition that would require a search warrant under such a situation and then stated that one was not necessary. They did say that the inspector did not have the power to force entry nor to break past the unwilling inspector. The opinion is most interesting. I wish everyone would study it very carefully, because the majority opinion seems to apologize for the decision on the ground that it is necessary as a part of a general welfare state. The opinion contains such quotes as these: "It is the very nature of a free society to advance in its standards of what is deemed reasonable and right. Representative as it does a living principle, due process is not confined within a permanent catalogue of what may, at a given time be deemed the limits or essentials of fundamental rights." (Walt v. Colorado, 338 U.S. 227). The Court also says: "The growth of cities, the crowding of populations, the increased awareness of the responsibility of the state for the living conditions of its citizens, all have combined to create problems of the enforcement of minimum standards of far greater magnitude than the writers of these ancient inspection laws ever dreamed." Many more examples could be quoted but none can, in my opinion, remedy justly the feeling that a search warrant is not necessary to enter a private home. The words of the 4th Amend-

ment are as follows: "The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized." The dissenting opinion was excellent, and I wish I could quote it in its entirety here; however, limited space will not permit. I do quote for your benefit an excerpt from the parliamentary history of England, which has long been accepted as a true expression of the constitutional meaning of the right of privacy in the home. The quotation is as follows: "The poorest man may in his cottage bid defiance to all the force of the Crown. It may be frail, its roof may shake; the wind may blow through it; the storm may enter, the rain may enter; but the King of England cannot enter: all his force dares not cross the threshold of the ruined tenement!" "The growth of cities, the crowding of populations, the increased awareness of the responsibility of the state for the living conditions of its citizens, all have combined to create problems of the enforcement of minimum standards of far greater magnitude than the writers of these ancient inspection laws ever dreamed."

### Lyndon Johnson Reports

Location of the first of five experimental plants to test various salt water conversion theories will be determined in the next two weeks.

The decision will be made by a Department of Interior site selection board which will meet May 16-19.

One of these plants will be built somewhere on the Gulf coast, a second will be on the Atlantic coast and a third on the Pacific coast. The remaining two of the five plants will experiment with converting brackish water to fresh water. One of these will be built in the Southwest and another in the Northern Great Plains.

In all, 40 Texas cities are pre-

presented in applications seeking either a coastal or an inland plant. Interior Secretary Fred Seaton said the other day the government is seeking a process that will convert salt water to fresh water at a cost of \$1 a thousand gallons—or even less.

Experts seem to believe the promise of achieving a remarkable breakthrough in saline water conversion is now a definite possibility.

The problems to develop a process that will make salt water useable in quantity at a cost low enough to make it practicable.

Think what this would mean for the future of Texas.

Vast areas of non-productive land could be opened to irrigation. Brackish or gyp water could be made drinkable.

We would be opening the door on a new horizon of development that would embrace both agricul-

ture and industry. Through a use of resources undreamed of now, would come new jobs, increased prosperity and a better life for all of us.

I believe that day is almost here.

And I can assure you that—within the Senate—we are doing day-by-day everything we can to speed its arrival.

### Tests on Sesame To Be Conducted

Adaptability tests on some 30 preliminary strains of Sesame will be conducted this year on the Blacklands and on the High Plains of the Texas Panhandle in a continuing search for new and improved varieties of the oilseed crop last year.

The tests will be conducted by the United States Department of Agriculture on sites furnished by Texas Sesame Growers, Inc. and Tom Watson on his farm at Blossom in Lamar County and by Texas Sesame Growers, Inc. at Muleshoe in Bailey County. Dr. George W. Rivers, research agronomist stationed at College Station, will be in charge of the projects.

"Our farmers are growing Sesame for a steadily growing market," says Robert L. Parker, executive vice president of Texas Sesame Growers, Inc. "and one of our greatest needs is for research which will provide us with better strains of Sesame and more information about its culture and growing habits. We are pleased to cooperate in these studies with the Department of Agriculture, and believe that Dr. Rivers' work will produce much immediately useful knowledge."

At Blossom one experiment will

compare the yields of 30 advanced test strains of Sesame with presently available commercial varieties. Consideration will be given to yield, plant height, disease (if present), maturity, oil and protein content. The same kind of experiment will be conducted at Muleshoe on 30 advanced test strains.

Similarly, tests will be conducted in both areas to evaluate the adaptability of preliminary varieties planted under field conditions. Approximately two hundred strains will be checked in each locality.

Plant spacing, levels of fertility, frost damage studies and other research information will be sought by Dr. Rivers in additional experiments at Muleshoe.

### Hi-Plains Hi-Lites

Most of the 26 varieties of wheat being tested at the High Plains Research Foundation are fully headed. Some of the later maturing varieties are just beginning to head out. Farmers interested in comparing the wheat varieties are invited to visit the experimental farm at Halfway, Dr. Longnecker, Director, said today.

Eleven of the varieties are experimental. The fifteen released varieties are Early Blackhull, Wichita, Triumph, New Triumph, Crockett, Ponca Comanche, Wheatheart Triumph and Kharkof.
