'Arrangements for studying ew ideas, medicines, and pracices are carried out by medica ssociations from local levels or up. Medical associations play definite part in good medical prac ice and they are a service both the doctor and his patient."

Anderson went on to give statis cs outlining the strong advance ents made by the medical proession in recent years. "For instance." he said. "there is only ne mothers death per 10,000 hildbirths now, whereas just ten ears ago there was four times hat number. The deaths that do ccur are usually traced to a ack of pre-natal care of the other by doctors.'

Anderson also touched on high edical costs, "Doctors admit the ost of medical care is too high,' e said, "but high costs are a re sult of inflation and not of the loctor's wanting to make more noney. Everything is higher. The general cost of living has riser 91 percent in the past ten years lone whereas doctor's costs durng the past 20 years have in reased only 84 percent. The real ost is virtually unchanged, especially when it is remembered hat patients are getting more for heir money now in improved and ewly invented medical technique quipment and medicines." Anderson was introduced by Dr. Carl Page of Dimmitt.
