PROPOSING A CONSTITION-AL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON NOVEM-BER 4, 1930.

Be It Resolved by the Legisla ture of the State of Texas: Section 1. That Section 5 of Article 3 of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended

so as to hereafter read as fol-The Legislature shall meet every two years at such time as may be provided by law and at other times when convened by the Governor. When convened in regular Session, the first thir-ty days thereof shall be devoted to the introduction of bills and their uncle, Ben Huseman, at resolutions, acting upon emerg- St. Francis. ency appropriations, passing up-on the confirmation of the recess appointees of the Governor and such emergency matters as may be submitted by the Governor in special messages to the Legislature; provided that during the succeeding thirty days of the regular session of the Legislature the various committees of each House shall hold hear-ings to consider all bills and resolutions and other matters then pending; and such emerg-ency matters as may be submitted by the Governor; provided further that during the follow-ing sixty days the Legislature shall act upon such bills and resolutions as may be pending and upon such emergency matters as may be submitted by the Governor in special message to the Legislature; provided however,
