**Cattle Losses Mount Due To Prolonged Cold Weather**

Cattle losses in Texas have been mounting in recent weeks due to a combination of cold, wet weather and lack of quality forage. "Losses have been up sharply in some counties in the Gulf Coast region because of a combination of these factors," points out Dr. Larry Boleman, area beef cattle specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. "Also adding to the losses is the fact that the cattle in this region of the state are mostly Brahman and Brahman crosses that cannot withstand a lot of the cold, wet weather that has been around since last fall. "Most cattle can tolerate either wet or cold weather to some extent, but this fall and winter we've had the two together and that's been a big part of the problem. The fact that the type of cattle in this area have short hair and a greater surface area per unit of weight to tolerate hot summer weather also works to their disadvantage during wet, cold conditions."

Boleman also emphasizes that poor nutrition coupled with the adverse weather has led to many cattle deaths. "Cattle need quality roughages during these critical periods. However, many producers either do not have good quality hay available or have not been able to get to their herds with the feed due to boggy pastures." The Extension specialist explains that when a mature cow is in good winter condition, she generally is not too seriously affected when the temperature drops from the comfort zone of 60 degrees to around 0 degrees F. as long as she is full or foraging, has a dry hair coat, and is exposed to dry, still air.

Boleman uses the term "critical temperature" in

talking about cow maintenance during certain weather conditions. "This is the temperature at which a cow can keep up its body heat without additional feed intake. It is slightly above the temperature at which cattle begin to shiver. "A cow not getting any feed will reach a critical temperature at about 55 degrees F.," notes Boleman. "Supplying her with about 15 pounds of hay per day will lower the critical temperature to about 23 degrees F. If feed consumption is increased to the point that the cow can consume all the hay she desires along with three to five pounds of protein supplement, her critical temperature will drop below 0 degrees F."

The specialist adds that wet hair coats and increased wind speeds increase the critical temperatures of cattle. A change in wind speed from one-half to 10 miles per hour will cause cows to increase their heat production by 20 to 35 per cent to maintain body temperature. In addition to feeding cattle all the hay they can eat during cold, wet periods, Boleman also advises producers to provide shelter for cows that are calving.

Looking ahead, there appears to be no relief from the cold, wet weather that has plagued much of Texas during the past few months, particularly in the coastal regions. The 30-day outlook issued by the National Weather Service indicates continued cool, wet conditions. "This means that producers must continue to give close attention to maintaining their cattle herds by providing additional hay and protein feed," adds Boleman.

**4-H Clubbers To Study History**

Texas 4-H youth now have the chance to become more involved in their country's government and develop a deeper appreciation of its history, notes Debra Price and Billy Reagor, county agents with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. This summer 210 Texas 4-H members and 10 adult leaders will tour numerous historical points of interest and study citizenship while participating in the National 4-H Citizenship Short Course and Heritage Tour. Headquarters for the event is the National 4-H Center at Washington, D.C. The return trip will also feature a look at some of America's heritage.

Dates for the short course and tour are June 14-28, July 6-19 and July 26-Aug. 9, notes the agents. Interested 4-H'ers who are sophomores and juniors in high school should apply at the county Extension office by Feb. 15. The short course and tour is conducted by the National 4-H Foundation. Its purpose is to increase the citizenship, education and leadership abilities of 4-H members. The County Agents point out that many 4-H members view this short course and tour as the highlight of their 4-H careers. It is designed to be an unforgettable two-week learning experience.

**Crockett County Oil & Gas Field Activity Increases**

Texas Crude, Inc., Houston, No. 1-8-C Allison, Terrell County Devonian gas discovery, 1/2 mile east of the Allison (Detrital gas) field, and nine miles south of Sheffield, has been finalized for a calculated, absolute open flow of 1,395,000 cubic feet of gas daily, with gas-liquid ratio of 282,661-1. Gravity of the condensate is 57.2 degrees.

Production was through perforations at 10,718-760 feet, which had been acidized with 3,000 gallons. The following tops were picked on ground elevation of 2,628 feet; Grayburg, 1,620 feet; San Andres, 1,950 feet; Pennsylvanian, 9,992 feet; Pennsylvanian detrital, 10,030 feet; Devonian, 10,470 feet; Silurian, 11,000 feet; Fusselman, 11,028 feet; Montoya, 11,060 feet; Simpson, 11,165 feet; and Ellenburger, 12,040 feet.

Scheduled as a field test in the Allison field and drilled to 10,404 feet by Seco production Co., it was taken over by Texas Crude, deepened to 12,483 feet, with a 4-inch liner hung from 10,228 feet to total depth, and plugged back to 10,820 feet. Location is 660 feet from the north and 1,980 feet from the west lines of 8-B2-CCSD & RGNG.

A discovery, probably Wolfcamp, has been indicated in Crockett County with the flowing of gas at the estimated rate of 275,000 cubic feet daily at Hunt Petroleum Corp., Dallas, No. 1-23 Watson Ranch, in 23-ATCRR, four miles north of production in the Euleeone (Wolfcamp gas) field, separated by a 5,900-foot failure, four miles south of its No. 1-9 Watson Ranch, recently completed Canyon gas producer, 3 1/2 miles southwest of a Canyon gas extension area of the Ozona multipay field and 27 miles southwest of Ozona. Flow was through a 24-64-inch choke and perforations at 4,986-5,403 feet. Testing continued.

The Crockett County portion of the Whitehead (Strawn gas) field gained its tenth producer and a 1 1/4 mile southeast and 1 3/8 mile southwest extension with completion of Amoco Production Co. No. 1-E J.F. & M.E. Sudderth, 26 miles southeast of Ozona, for a calculated, absolute open flow of 2,325,000 cubic feet of gas per day.

Production was through perforations at 9,620-900 feet, which had been acidized with 3,000 gallons. Location is 933 feet from the south and 740 feet from the most easterly west lines of 12-GC&SF, Abst. 4436 (some maps show C.Barera). Amoco Production will drill the No. 2-B J.F. & M.E. Sudderth as a 1/2 mile southwest and a 1/4 mile east and very slightly north outpost to the same field, 20 miles southeast of Ozona. Location is 467 feet from the north and west lines of 2-K-GC&SF. Contract depth is 9,700 feet.

Texas Oil & Gas Corp., Midland, will drill the No. 1-9 Montgomery as a 1/2 mile east and very slightly north outpost to Canyon sand gas production in the Ozona multipay field of Crockett County, 10 miles southeast of Ozona.

Location is 804 feet from the north and 1,004 feet from the east lines of 9 NG-GC&SF. Contract depth is 7,000 feet.

ed by the census taker, so they were unable to be proved or disproved by local officials. However, the court voted to officially protest the census results. The census was taken by a federal agency at a cost of several thousand dollars to the county. Payment has already been made.

The Crockett County Hospital report was given and it was noted that the board is attempting to secure a third physician for the clinic.

The court reviewed the annual financial report for the hospital and the care center. It was revealed that the hospital took in \$205,586 in receipts and spent \$310,843, ending the year in the red over one hundred thousand dollars. However, the net loss was reported at \$85,000 with \$20,000 going to capital expenditures. The care center fared somewhat better, taking in a total of \$165,248 while spending \$201,649. Of the \$36,400 deficit, \$4,000 was capital expense while \$32,000 was counted the net loss.

**C of C To Survey Labor Force**

In order to ascertain the business needs of Ozona and Crockett County, the Chamber of Commerce has formed a committee in cooperation with Texas A&M Extension Service to conduct a survey of the local labor force. To do this, the Chamber will conduct a random poll through the mail. Those receiving the questionnaires are asked to complete and return as soon as possible to the chamber office.
