Mrs. Karl Sammann, Poultry Demonstrator for the Prairie Chapel Home Demonstration Club, made a profit of \$48.33 on her poultry during the month of April.

Mrs. Sammann has a flock of 200 Rhode Island White hens that layed 4437 eggs during the month of April. During the month, production expenses were \$9.00, which amount includes the money paid out for 600 pounds of mash, 500 pounds of Grain and oyster shell. The total receipts were \$57.33, which shows a profit of \$48.33.
