DPS Officer Matthew Myrick remembered at Monday's ceremony

Monday's marking of Peace Officers' Memorial Day came as some local DPS officers made the trip to Austin to remember Officer Matthew Myrick who died in the line of duty in Deaf Smith County earlier this year.

Monday's ceremony is the result of an authorization to the President to proclaim May 15 of each year as Peace Officers' Memorial Day, and the calendar week of each year during which May 15 occurs as Police Week, and says, in part: "Where as the police officers of America have worked devotedly and selflessly in behalf of the people of this nation, regardless of the peril or hazard to themselves; and

"Whereas these officers have safeguarded the lives and the property of their fellow Americans; and these same officers have given our country internal freedom from the fear of the violence and civil disorder that is presently affecting other nations."

The flag, as shown in the background, was flown at the courthouse at half staff on Monday.

There are approximately 850,000 men and women who guard our communities in this country, according to County Judge Bill Sava who helped organize the morning's activities.

One statement said that in the U.S., one law enforcement officer loses his life in the line of duty every 48 to 72 hours - or one every two to three days. "As we gather here this morning, in memory of them, I ask you to join me in remembering Department of Public Safety Officer Matthew Myrick who died earlier this year in Deaf Smith County while answering a call to an accident just a few miles north of here," Sava said. "In memory of his service to the people of this area - and in memory of his sacrifice, as well as the sacrifices of his wife and children, Officer Myrick's name will be one of the names added this year to the Texas Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Austin. That ceremony will take place Tuesday. Already several of our local law enforcement officers are en route to Austin to pay tribute to his memory."

Miller, Arguijo elected to Dimmitt Council; Shaeffer wins re-election to board

Nazareth has school board vote; **Hart votes** on city and school positions

Although turnout was sparse in some elections, all three school boards in Castro County elected trustees on Saturday, while Dimmitt and Hart elected city council representatives,

In the Dimmitt City Elections, there were two places up as contested races.

In Place 1, Josh Arguijo won election with 22 votes over Amos Quintana and Janie Burgarin, who garnered two votes each.

In Place 4, Carla Miller won with 25 votes. Her opponents got two votes each.

In the election for DISD trustee, Place 5, David Schaefer, the incumbent, won re-election with 51 votes over challenger Kelby Bradley, who got'31 votes.

Both the city and school district will meet Tuesday night to canvass the votes and make the totals official.

In the Nazareth ISD, three men ran for two at-large positions. Ricky Backus, with 69 votes and Dwayne Kleman with 56 won, while Bruce Huseman finished in third place with 29 votes.

In the Hart ISD election,

three candidates ran for two at-large positions. Danny Rodriguez with 76 votes and Laura Hart with 58 won, while Manuel Minjarez III finished a very close third with 56 votes.

In the Hart city elections, there were two at-large seats up. Eliazar Castillo got 89 votes and Paul Ramirez received 64 to win.

Finishing in third place was Harold Smith with 25

Both the Hart and Nazareth boards will meet and canvass their elections as will the City of Hart. Results from all elections are not considered final until the canvassing procedure is completed.

What's the Law?

A parent can leave property to whomever he or she wants

Q. I have five brothers and sisters. Some of us are on better terms with our father than others. Our mother passed away last year and left everything to our father. I have been told that if my dad dies, the law requires my father's estate be divided equally between all the children. Is this true?

A. If your father dies without a will, his estate will be divided between all of his children. With a will, however, he has the right to dispose of his property any way he wants. For example, he can leave all of his property to his children in unequal shares, or can leave some of the children all the property and others none. In fact, the law does not require he leave any of his property to his children. The

bottom line is that under
Texas law, a person has the
right to leave property to
whomever he or she wants.
The important thing is to
have a will clearly spelling
out how you want your
property distributed after
your death.

Q. My brother helps my mother with her finances. Do I have any right to know how she is spending her money?

A. As long as your mother is competent, she can spend her money what ever way she wants. She also has the right to have your brother assist her, and neither she nor your brother has any obligation to tell you how the money is spent. It may make sense for families to talk about financial matters, but there is no obligation to do so.

Q. My father and his second wife live in my father's house. Can he leave the house to me in his will, or must he give a part of it to his wife?

A. Assuming that the house was owned before he remarried, it is your father's separate property and he may leave it to whomever he wants. If he leaves the house to you, however, his wife has the right to live there as long as she wants. Basically, you will own the house, but she has the right to remain there.

Q. How is child support computed? Does the court look at things like overtime pay, and "extra" income?

A. Child support is computed from all "net resources." This basically includes any income

received from any source. It includes overtime pay, and any other income from any source, including things like rent, interest, dividends and even gifts and prizes. The amount is reduced, however, by any taxes or social security that is paid.

Once the court determines the amount of net resources, state guidelines recommend the amount to be paid for child support. For one child, the amount is 20%, and 5% is added for each additional child.

Q. My ex-girl friend left her clothes at my apartment. After a week I told her I would throw them out if she did not pick them up. She showed up after two weeks and I refused to give her the clothes. Can I just throw her stuff away?

A. Of course not! The clothes belong to her and you have no right to destroy them. The fact that she waited two weeks to come and retrieve her property does not give you the right to throw it out. Destroying her property could result in civil, or even criminal liability.

Ag Committee impressed by unified message

A diverse group of Texas farmers and livestock producers left a solid impression on a dozen members of the House Agriculture Committee during the one and only full Committee hearing on the 2007 Farm Bill to be held in Texas.

Plains Cotton Growers Board members Rickey Bearden, of Plains, and Al Spinks, of Midland, were asked to provide testimony during the hearing.

Bearden is a past president of the organization and is the current Chairman of the PCG Board of Directors.

Spinks is a member of the PCG Executive Committee. The hearing, conducted on the campus of Angelo State University May 9, provided eleven witnesses the chance to share their thoughts about the 2007 Farm bill with members of the House Agriculture Committee in attendance. Rep. Mike Conaway, whose district hosted the hearing, and Rep. Randy Neugebauer are current members of the House Agriculture Committee and participated in the hearing. Bearden and Spinks were asked to be part of the panel representing agriculture interests across Texas.

PCG President Mike Hughes and PCG Vice President Barry Evans submitted written testimony to be included in the official record of the hearing.

Under the agreements, the city has told the other taxing entities that if for any reason a plant doesn't go in, the city will still own the plant and will scrap it. Money from scrapping the plant has been estimated at \$5 to \$10 million and the city said each entity will get its proportional share. The Castro County Hospital District and Dimmitt Independent School District have yet to vote on the matter.
