Human Development
Dr. Lewellys F. Barker has explained in Hygeia Magazine how it happens that each individual is different from another. Since no two fertilized egg cells, even from the same parents, except perhaps in the case of identical twins, are ever precisely alike at the start, and no two developing human beings are ever exposed to precisely the same series of environmental influence, each human being is a unique individual, differing somewhat from any other living person, and should be considered as such.

Fast-Flying Birds
The speed of migrating birds has been variously estimated. Airplanes and stop watches have been used to gather information on this point. The slower birds fly about 20 miles per hour, and the fastest birds recorded with accuracy are two species of swifts in India. Their speed was found by E. C. Stuart-Baker to be nearly 200 miles per hour across a two-mile course.

Intaglios
Intaglio is a term applied to any recessed carving, in which no part projects beyond the original face of the material. In some cases, as in gem cutting, the entire relief is reversed. In others, as in some Egyptian wall carvings, the outline is sufficiently incised so as to allow normal relief. This type is sometimes known as cavo rilievo or sunken relief.

Park of Rivers
The Algonquin National park in Ontario, Canada, is a veritable park of lakes and rivers. The total area of the park is about 1,800,000 acres, and within its borders are numberless small and large lakes and a network of about 1,200 rivers. The lakes and streams abound in game fish, and its forests are filled with deer.

"Mavericks"
Maverick is the word used in referring to an unbranded animal, especially a motherless calf, formerly customarily claimed by the first person branding it. The name is said to be derived from Samuel Maverick, a cattle owner in Texas, who did not brand his cattle, his ranch being an island.

Use for Cellophane

Champion Liar



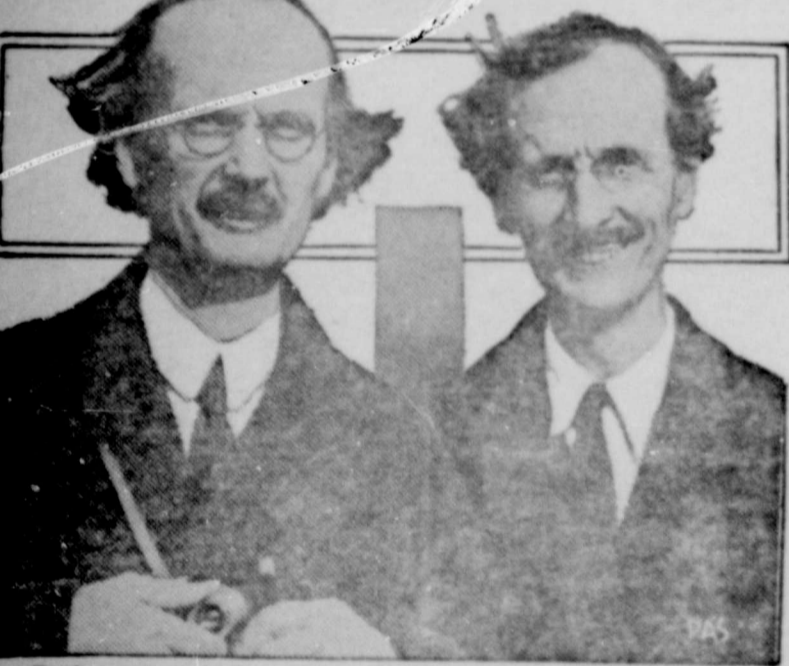

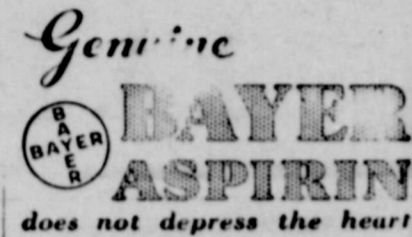
