




Gasoline economy is increased two or three miles per gallon. Test runs show that the new engine will give 20 miles per gallon at 45 miles an hour.

Another important engine improvement is the use of water line thermostats. These are automatic mechanical valves which prevent the warm water in the engine from passing out into the cooling radiator until the proper temperature is reached for maximum operating efficiency. In cold weather, the thermostats enable the engine to warm up quickly and maintain an efficient running temperature.

Ford spring design takes advantage of the principle of the transverse spring. It provides the utmost stability and safety, the practical minimum of unsprung weight with the least possible frame distortion. The Ford spring design tends to prevent the body from tilting on uneaven roads. Corners can be taken safely at relatively high speeds.

Both front and rear springs are placed crosswise. This transverse design permits free and easy action of all four wheels because the springs are attached to the axles at their outer flexible tips. This type of construction retains the important advantages of the solid axel and yet minimizes road shocks transmitted to the frame and body because the shocks are absorbed first by the nost sensitive part of the spring.

The rear spring on the 1934 car has been redesigned to provide smoother riding. Improved doubleacting hydraulic shock absorbers which act independently of weather or road syrface conditions are used. Seat cushions have deeper, softer springs. New type individual bucket eats are used in the Tudor.

Driving case also has been in creased by the use of a new 15-to-1 steering gear ratio. The frame is of the double X-type, with the X member running to the rear of the frame to give greater strength. Brakes are of the mechanical type with 186 square inches of braking surface. Other features of the chassis are a silent synchronizing transmission torque tube drive, three-quarter loating rear axel, one-piece welded teel spoke wheels and 17x5.50 tires.



School Board Preparing To Collect Delinquent School Taxes

"Following out an order passed by the school board at its regular meeting night in November, the secretary of the board is now busy in the preparation of the tax rolls for the foling of suits against delinquent tax payers up to and including the year 1930. Due to the fact that the order passed by the board calls for tax suits being filed against all delinquents on the rolls to and including the year 1930, the secretary is swamped with work and will be several days yet in compiling the necessary data for the attorney who will have charge of the tax suits.

After passing the order calling for the filing of these suits, the members of the board state that many delinquent tax payers have called and nade settlement of their taxes either in full or by installments. A provision of the order passed by the board calling for these suits provides for these delinquent taxes t e paid in installments under certain conditions and many are taking dvantage of this concession. Where a tax payer is unable to pay his enire tax bill in full, this installment arrangement enables him to pay s reasonable amount in installments from time to time and thereby eliminates a tax suit being filed in his ease and saves his having court costs, attorney's fees, etc., to pay.

"Those who have not yet made settlement of their delinquent taxes oming within the scope of the tax suit order filed by the school board may yet do so without penalties of any kind, provided they do so before the rolls are closed and turned over to the attorney for the filing of the suits. It is hoped by the board that all who are delinquent in their payments will take advantage of this additional time and pay up. It means quite a saving to the tax payers and should be taken advantage of for the little remaining time

"The school board again wishes to state that they regret exceedingly that these tax suits are necessary, but matters have reached the point to where the delinquent taxes must e collected or the schools closed. The patrons of the schools are almost unanimous in the idea that the schools must not be closed."

The code in no way limits the authority of the several States to regulate the methods of sale of intoxicating liquors, but seeks to eliminate abuses of liquor traffic and the evils of bootlegging."

With repeal transpiring a month before Congress convenes, the recovery measures giving authority for codifying industries have proved useful in providing what the President has called an effective method of meeting the emergency. Espeially as few of the 20 States where ntoxicants can be sold following repeal of the 18th amendment, have yet enacted regulatory legislation for sales.

With the codes of the brewing and liquor importing industries also effective coincident with repeal, the next codes considered jointly by the Agricultural Adjustment Administration and NRA were those for rectifiers and blenders of whiskey and for the wholesale distributing indus-

At the final session of the hearings on the liquor importers' cods, conomic advisers of the Agricultural, State, and Treasury departments revealed the Government's intention to restrict liquor shipments from countries which have established barriers against American goods. Dr. E. Mordecia Ezekiel, economicadvisor of the Agricultural Department, testified that France, Germany, and Italy were the largest wine-exporting countries and they had taken the lead in throwing up barriers against American trade. By using the power to impose liquor import quotas, he explained, the administration could improve the outlets forsurplus American agricultural and industrial commodities. Dr. Herbert Fies, economic advisor of the State Department, testified that this plan would be "a very desirable phase of our bargaining policy." Edward G. Lowry, special assistant to the Secretary of the Treasury, also a member of the Federal Alcohol Control Administration, testified that due to ncreased economic nationalism. American products have been discriminated abroad and that restraining liquor imports affords an opportunity to help correct this situ-
