Dear Bill: I am in receipt of your special delivery letter enclosing the communication from our friend Pool. I think Pool is almost correct in his view of the situation. I think I could get a good vote aganst Sterling and it might be possible to beat him provided I had a good campaign fund, yet the chances are not worth the risk. I meet many people who come right out and say that Sterling has no chance even against Jim and Ma and it may be possible that we have not interpeted the real sentiment of the silent masses but I had rather risk my own judgment than that of people who have not studied the situation and I have decided not to run against Sterling. Of course, the next sixty days might bring about a change that would alter my views but I hardly expect such to be the case.. The people in Houston, and they were responsible people, too, tell me that Sterling can not carry Harris County, but I know blood is thicker than water and that that crowd would feel that they could get more out to Sterling than any one else and that when the votes were counted, the majority would be for the home man. I also think Sterling would run good in Dallas and you know that a man cannot be elected without Dallas, Houston and San Antonio

I do think there is every reason to believe that Ma will run. I was told in Houston that Jim said while there the day before I got there, that Ma would be in the race. He will no doubt run a better race against Sterling than anyone else. I would be embarrassed because I came out for him the last primary. Jim would have full sway and would be able to present some very ugly facts that could not be condoned. I think Ma would be a very dangerous opponent for Sterling. She would carry this country against him in spite of all that could be done. Of course, I could get this country out here, but I could not get Jim's strongholds and I do not think I would be particularly strong against Sterling due to the fact that I told the people one time to vote for him. Put this down in your book to remember, "If Ma runs against Sterling, look out for another Ferguson administration."

My friend Dave Shanks, a Tom Love follower from up on the north end of my district, has announced for the Senate. He was county clerk up there for years and was defeated last time on account of his fight on me. He is in fact a Republican and has always fought me teeth and toe nail. These people have nothing against me but they know that I would do as I dam pleased and this might not please them

Business up here is at a standstill. The depression, in all its fury and oppressiveness, has finally overtaken us. It is impossible to make any money as my friends are up against it. I guess I should say, "To hell with politics," but I am not going to do it. I will stay on for a better day. A fellow cannot afford to quit at forty-three. Some day they may want a real conservative and I will try not to get crippled up so that I will not be available.

I do not know when I will be down but I am going to Austin before the 15th of January. I will see you on this trip. In the meantime remember me to Mrs. Langley and accept every good wish for the happiness of each of you. Excuse this letter as I am my Yours.


