County Hospital Bond Election Tuesday

The question of whether or not Castro County will have a new hospital building goes before the voters Tuesday for a positive answer.

In a drive that started several months ago, some 180 persons signed petitions calling for the bond election. If approved, the new \$290,00 hospital would contain 32 beds and be one of the most modern such facilities in this area. The cost of the economically-designed (\$9,000 per bed vs. usual \$11,000) building has been whittled down considerably from original plans that called for an expenditure in the neighborhood of \$350,000.

The present hospital has about \$50,000-plus in equipment which would be used in a new building.

The present building, constructed about 1943 as the Hereford Prisoner of War Camp dispensary, has been considered inadequate for some time by persons interested in the hospital operation here.

A tour-conducting open house will be held at the hospital beginning at 1 p.m. Friday afternoon and last-

Chief among complaints against the present building have been the danger of fire in the frame structure; the noise, difficulty of keeping it clean, bed shortage, deteriorating wiring, shortage of bathroom facilities (only one bathroom exists in the present hospital,) and many

pair it. Hospital admissions are steadily rising. In two years

ed fifty percent, from 8 to 12 during this period.

The scope of hospital operations here are also shown in the financial report. Income in 1956 was \$63,836 and costs were \$68,461, a deficit of \$4,625. In 1957 expenses were \$76,555 versus an income of \$71,942 for a loss of \$4,613. For the first time a profit was shown during the fiscal year just ended. With an income of \$88,111 and expenses of \$86,170, there was a profit of \$1,941.

While there is no certainty that Castro County Hospital will become profit-making—few do—it is maintained by promoters of a new building that good paying customers would be lured back from modern out-of-town

tomers would be lured back from modern out-of-town facilities to the local plant. This would assure better collection rates. Actually there is a high paper profit in nospital operations here, but the incomplete collections


characteristic of county hospitals holds down much real profit.

According to printed material being circulated in favor of the hospital, approval of the proposition would bring on a state and county tax increase of 20 per cent. This reportedly does not include the school tax. Castro County's bonded indebtedness is virtually nil, so the county tax burden would be below average even with a new hospital.

No urgent overcrowding problem exists at the moment. Hospital authorities consider four beds per thousand adequate. Castro County has about 8,000 population and with 26 beds in the present hospital is six beds short of what it should be. But so far no one has had to

Some questions and answers from the CASTRO COUNTY HOSPITAL IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION

1. What is the purpose of the Castro County Hospital Bond Election?

Ans: To authorize the Castro County Commissioners Court to sell tax bonds in an amount not to exceed \$290,000.00 for the purpose of constructing a county hospital and purchase of equipment.

2. Why was this hospital bond election called?

Ass: Acting upon positions bearing the names of

Ans: Acting upon petitions bearing the names of some 180 tax paying Castro County residents, calling for a hospital bond election, the Castro County Commissioners Court set the date for the election at Tuesday, August 26.

Ans: Voters are required to have a poll tax and be resident qualified tax paying citizens of Castro County who own taxable property in Castro County and who have rendered same for taxation. Taxable property can be either real estate, automobiles, or personal property.

4. Why should the county build the doctors a hospital to practice in?

to practice in?

Ans: Hospitals are not built for doctors—they are built for the patients who must occupy them. The doctor can treat you—and earn his fee—in your home, if that is where you choose to be confined. We are not so concerned with where or how the doctors practice and earn their livelihood as we are with the treatment which will be accorded our wives, our husbands, our babies, and our parents in the low hours when there may be but a thread between life and death!

5. Is there any particular advantage that a county owned hospital has over a privately owned hospital has over a privately owned hospital.

Ans Yes, there is, in that the county owned hospital would have an "open staff," whereas the local privately owned hospitals are known as "closed staff" hospitals.

6. What is an "open staff" hospital?

Ans: Open staff refers to physicians who are allowed to use the hospitals for their patients. Any physician who is licensed and approved as a doctor by the Stafe Board of Medical Examiners.

CONSTRUCTION AND SITE

1. What will be the total cost of the hospital?

Ans: Not in excess of \$290,000.

2. Where will the hospital be located?

Ans: It will be located on the same 5-acre tract of land on which the present hospital building is located.

3. What will the hospital site cost?

Ans: Nothing! The property already belongs to the County.

4. How large will the hospital be?

Ans: Approximately 32 beds.

5. Would the \$290,000 include equipment for the hospital?

Aps: Yes—A considerable realty.

Ans: Yes—A considerable portion of the equipment can be used from our present hospital; but the new equipment needed would be included in the \$290,000 bond issue figure.

MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL OF THE HOSPITAL

1. In whom will the management and control of the hospital be vested?

Ans: State statutes provide that the County Commissioners Court appoint six resident, property-tax paying citizens as a Board of Managers.

2. Does this Board of Managers have sole control of the hospital?

Ans: Yes, unless they become deadlocked, in which case the County Judge is authorized to break the

OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE HOS-PITAL

OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE HOSPITAL

1. Who will be admitted to the hospital?

Ans: Anyone requiring hospital care, who is submitted by a physician.

Figures show that approximately 80% of all hospital patients now have hospitalization insurance.

2. Will there be doctors offices or a commercial
pharmacy in the hospital?

Ans: No. Doctors will maintain private offices, and
there cannot be any type commercial pharmacy.

3. Is it anticipated that there will be any deficit in
operation at all?

Ans: At the present time the average occupancy
is 35.3% while it is calculated that an occupancy
of 39.2% is the break-even point. With a new
facility which could offer medical and surgical
need there should be very little, if any, problem
of maintaining a better than break-even patient
occupancy.

TAX STRUCTURE AND COST TO EACH TAXPAYER

1. Will taxes be increased if the hospital bond issue

passes: Ans: Yes. To accurately arrive at the cost to each taxpayer, each taxpayer should take his 1957 State and County Tax bill and increase it by 20%.
