Beware of I.D. theft

Dimmitt police are asking the public to beware of the dangers of identity theft, according to officer Sal Rivera.

"If someone calls you on the phone asking for your personal information, question them as to why they need the information," Rivera said. "Also tell them you are going to check them out before you give them any kind of information..

"But do not give out any information under any circumstances. If you think it is a scam and they are trying to get your personal information or financial information, contact the local police department."

There are several types of identity crimes, including: identify theft, mail thefts, credit card/debit card abuse, check fraud/counterfeit



Ruling on 'low performing' bad for students, schools, too

The Federal Government has promised to parents that if their student's school district gets "low performing" for 2 years straight, their student or students may transfer to another district.

Last year over two million students were eligible to petition to transfer to another school, but only 19 per cent of students in low performing schools actually transferred. That rules is bad because most students do not want leave their school, friends, and athletics.


Most parents have not been told by most districts the other side of the coin. A parent may choose to obtain a transfer or keep their student or students in the same school in which the parent can request a tutor.

Students who need help can get a tutor for the courses they did not pass. This plan sounds like a great mechanism to help students but the plan has flaws just like the transfer rule.

The tutor must be certified in the course they are tutoring. These tutors must come from a state certified list. Where can principals find these tutors? That is the problem-they don't exist.

The Federal Governments bold promise to provide transfers or tutors to students in low performing schools is a big "bust." No going to happen or will happen!

NOTICE OF CONCENTRATED ANIMAL FEEDING OPERATION APPLICATION

General Permit Authorization No. TXG920737

APPLICATION. GLEN BYRON SALYER, P.O. Box 135, Friona, Texas 79035 has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) under General Permit No. TXG920000 for authorization to operate a new dairy facility at 5,800 total head, of which 4,000 head are milking, in Castro County, Texas. The notice of intent was received by TCEQ on March 30, 2006. No discharge of pollutants into the waters in the state is authorized by this general permit except under chronic or catastrophic rainfall conditions or events. All waste and wastewater will be beneficially used on agricultural land.

The proposed facility will be located on the east side of Ranch Road 1057, approximately 0.5 mile south of the intersection of Ranch Road 2397 and Ranch Road 1057, in Castro County, Texas. The facility will be located in the drainage area of Mackenzie Reservoir in Segment No. 0228 of the Red River Basin.

A copy of the notice of intent, application, the Executive Director's technical summary, and the CAFO general permit is available for viewing at the Castro County Courthouse, County Clerk's Office, 100 East Bedford, Room 101, Dimmitt, Texas 79027.

The Executive Director of the TCEQ has made a preliminary decision to approve coverage of this facility under General Permit No. TXG920000.

PUBLIC COMMENT. Written public comments may be submitted to the Office of Chief Clerk, at the address provided in the information section below, within 30 days of the date of newspaper publication of this notice. In addition, the public may request a public meeting. If significant interest exists, the Executive Director will direct the applicant to publish a notice of the public meeting. If significant interest exists, the Executive Director will direct the applicant to publish a notice of the public meeting and hold the public meeting. The applicant must publish notice of a public meeting at least 30 days prior to the meeting in a newspaper of general circulation in the county in which the CAFO is proposed to be located. The Executive Director will consider all relevant information pertaining to whether the applicant meets the requirements of the géneral permit and will issue a written determination as to any final action on the notice of intent for coverage under the general permit.

What's the Law?

Front yards are not for walking dogs

Q. Do people have the right to walk their dogs on my front yard? My neighbor said the city has an easement and I can do nothing to stop him.

A. Your yard is private property, and that means no one has the right to trespass, even if it is to just walk a dog. The city may have an easement but that is for the city's use, not your neighbors. I suggest you let the dog walker know that you would appreciate it if he would stay off of your property. And while we are talking about dogs, consider the next question.

Q. Can my apartment fine me for not picking up after my dog? I just got an invoice for a \$25 fine.

A. An apartment may do whatever you agreed to in the lease, and no more. If the lease says that you will be fined for such behavior, or that you are subject to the rules and regulations of the complex that provide for a fine, you may be fined. On the other hand, if the lease says nothing, I don't see any way that the apartment would have the authority to "fine" its tenants. Of course, as I mention above, you do not have the right to allow your dog to use private property and you could be in violation of other provisions in your lease if you did not pick up after the dog and cause disruption to other tenants.

Q. I'm in the process of getting a divorce. My wife just filed bankruptcy. Will this affect my credit?

A. Your wife's bankruptcy will affect your credit to the extent you have any joint accounts that are not

paid in full. If you are married, you probably have some joint accounts that you will need to pay if you do not want negative information on your report. In many cases, when one spouse files bankruptcy the other should as well. I strongly recommend you discuss this with the attorney handling your divorce. If he or she is not familiar with bankruptcy, you should consult a bankruptcy specialist.

Q. I had an accident caused by a 16-year-old. The parents' insurance won't pay because she was not a covered driver. What can I do?


A. First, assuming you have uninsured motorist coverage, your insurance probably covers this claim and you should speak with your agent. If the damage is small and you do not want to report it, however, you can file a claim against the driver in small claims court. If you win and she doesn't pay, she can lose her driver's license.

Many people believe that if someone does not have insurance, that person has no liability when they cause an accident. Insurance companies pay for damage for which the insured is responsible. Insurance coverage does not affect liability. The person who causes an accident is liable for damage caused. If there is no insurance they still may be sued.


Q. I got a letter from a debt collector about a debt my bank had written off. They said they will sue if I don't pay. How can they sue on a debt

that has been erased? A. The fact that the bank

"wrote off" the debt does not mean you no longer owe the money. In many cases, writing-off the debt means that the bank has decided to stop its own collection efforts and has assigned the matter to another company, such as a debt collector. The debt collector is the one who now has the legal right to enforce the debt. If the money is not paid, the debt collector has the right to sue. To see what might happen if they do sue, look at the debt collection section on my website. Then, speak with the debt collector and see if you can work out a payment plan.
