COUNTY IS SHORT OF QUOTA IN VICTORY LOAN DRIVE

According to official tabulation of Sales, by the Federal Reserve Bank, of bonds in Castro County during the Victory Loan Drive, as of December 8, a total of \$81,557.25 had been sold in the county. \$25,281.25 of which was invested in E. Bonds. The county's overall quota was set at \$90,000 and \$90,000 was the E bond quota.

Although the Victory Loan Drive officially ended December 8, all sale of bonds during the remainder of the month will apply on the county's quota. County bond officials are still urging citizens of the County to continue the purchase of bonds in a final effort to meet the county's quota.

Tuesday the SCA members looked at six different minerals which came in "Things Of Science", a package of different scientific findings which the SCA members ordered. The different minerals were Garnet, Asbestos, Serpentine, Vermiculite, Kyanite, Pyrite, and Hematite.

Garnets are found in metamorphic rock and are tiny twelve-sided stones. Asbestos Serpentine is a valuable mineral because it is inflammable and its flexible fibers can be woven or mated together. Vermiculite is used for several different things such as insulation, Wall paper, decorations, or artificial snow. Kyanite is a hard crystal which is usually found in metamorphic rock. Pyrite, an iron mineral, is also called, "fools gold". It is Hematite, the most common of iron usually found in metamorphic rock. ores, occurs in many forms. The hard variety which was sent to us is not transparent except in thin slices and appears blood-red when the light shines through it. Hematite is used in making red paint and cosmetic rouge.
