New Legal Round Set In School Battle

Another round in the legal battle, over the annexation of the Gay Hill and Center Point school districts to the Big Spring Independent School District, will be waged in 118th District Court next Friday.

Gil Jones, attorney for the Big Spring School board and the Howard County School board, will seek at that time to show that the 118th District Court lacks jurisdiction in the protest of the annexation action.

His contention will be that the Gay Hill and Center Point district trustees elected to make their appeal to the State Commissioner of Education prior to the time they filed their petition in the court here. He is basing his position on a well-established legal theory that in an appeal the route to be followed, if there is more than one open, the litigant can elect one course and one only.

Webb Officer Sent To Athens

Capt. Jesse R. Cobb of the 331st Fighter Interceptor Squadron left Webb recently for Athens, Greece, where he will serve for six months with the Royal Hellenic Air Force.

His job will be to check out Greek pilots in the F-86D Sabrejet, and to aid in setting up the first all-weather interceptor squadron in the RIAF. Beside instructor pilots, the U. S. Air Force is also sending ground control intercept (GCI) technicians on temporary duty to Athens.

Capt. Cobb came to Webb in June, 1959 after completing advance interceptor training at Perlin Air Force Base, Sherman. He has since served as an alert pilot and as an assistant flight commander.

Joining the Air Force in 1953, Capt. Cobb earned his navigator wings in 1954, after which he served for three years with the 75th Air Transport Squadron at Travis AFB, Calif. He entered pilot training in 1957 and won his pilot's wings the following year at Craig AFB, Ala.

Last month he completed the squadron officers' course at the Air University.

A native of Corpus Christi, he was graduated from the University of Corpus Christi in 1953 with a BS degree in chemistry and education.

His father, Dr. John W. Cobb, teaches at the University.

Colonel Jarratt is deputy commander for the 4221st Logistical Command in Big Spring. He is a 1926 graduate of Jacksonville High School and a 1940 graduate of Texas University School of Dentistry in Houston.

Colonel Bellamy is executive officer for the command. He is a 1936 graduate of Merkel High School and a 1940 graduate of Texas Technological College in Lubbock.

Major Prager is operations and training officer in the command, and is a merchant in Big Spring.

Colonel Hinton is commander of the command. He is a 1928 graduate of the University of Oklahoma, Norman. The colonel is employed as educational advisor at Webb Air Force Base.

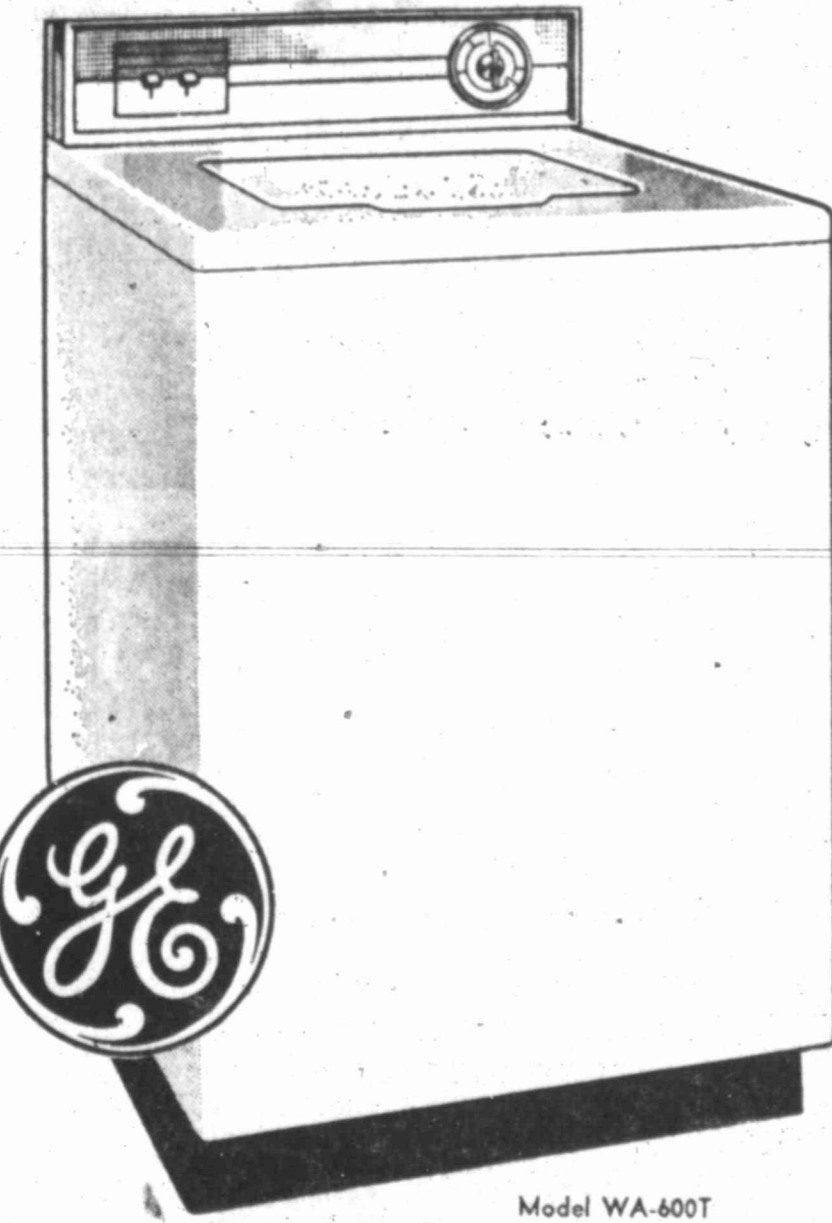

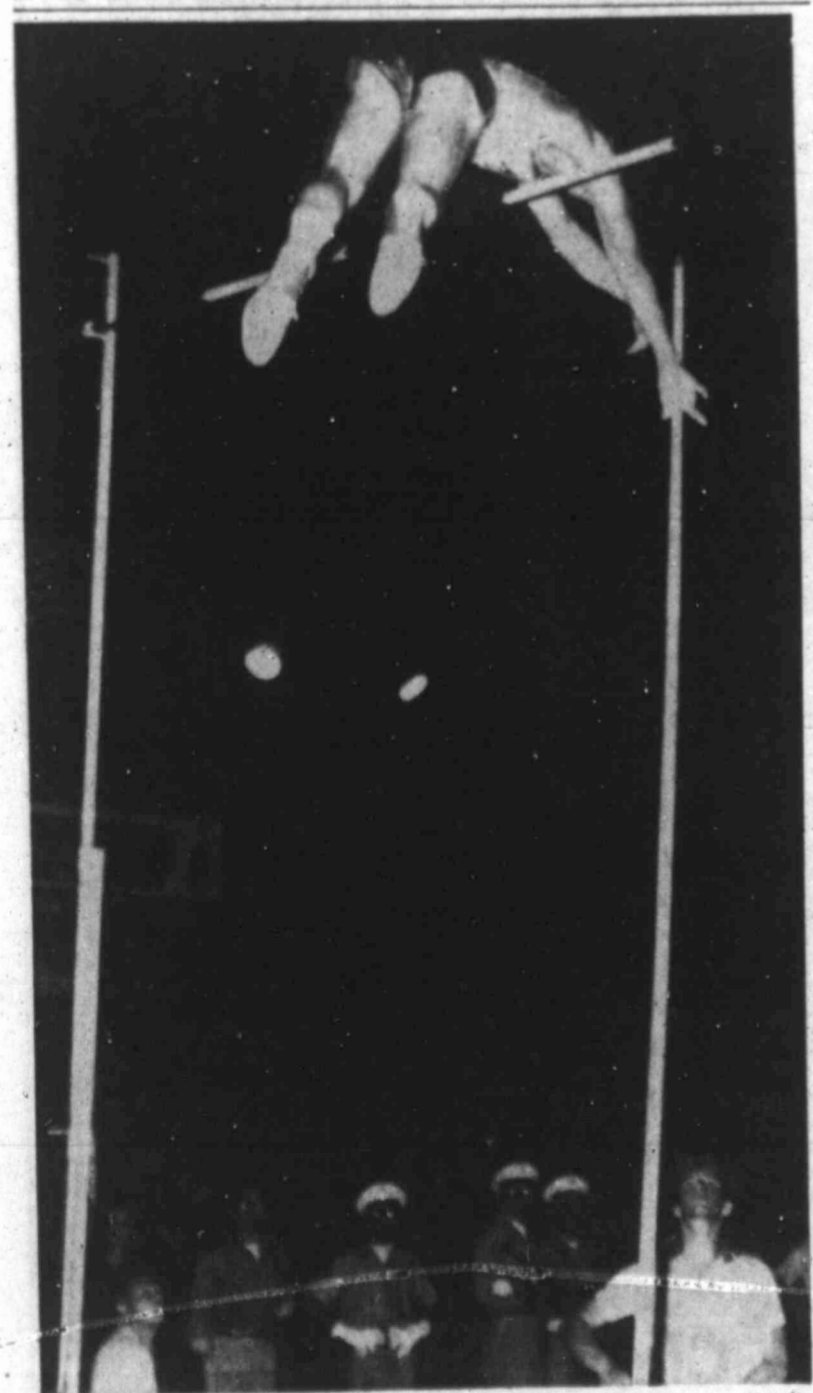

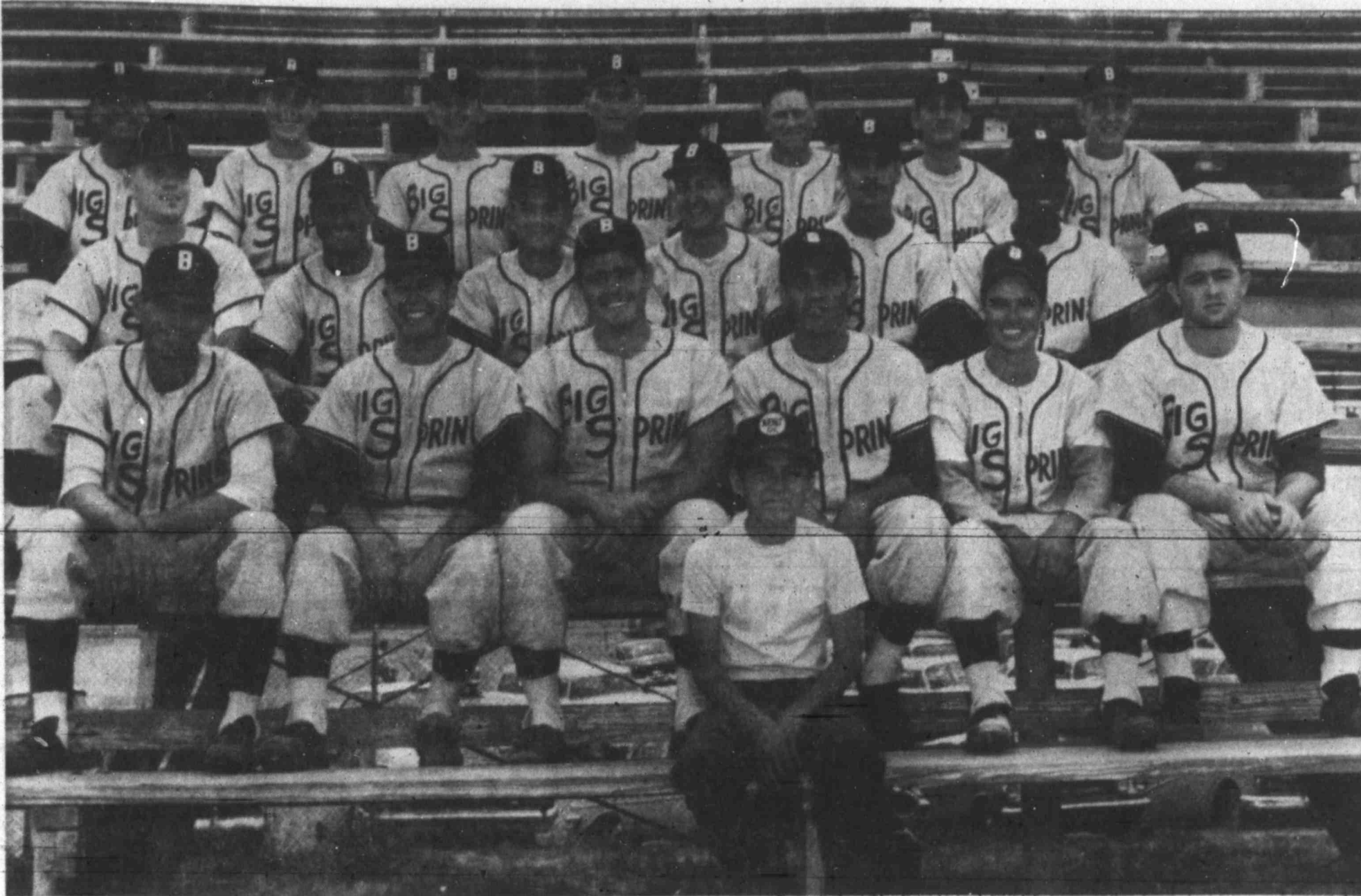
Houston Wins Disputed Game

Fund Enables University To Publish Flower Book

Establishment of a new revolving publication fund at the University of Texas which will be used initially to publish a book of Texas wild flowers in full color has been announced by Frank H. Wardlaw, director of the University of Texas Press.

The gift of Mrs. Richard French Spencer of San Antonio, the fund will be known as the Elma Dill Russell Spencer Publication Fund, Wardlaw said. Proceeds from the sale of the wild flower book will be used to publish other important Texas books.

WILD FLOWERS

The wild flower book, entitled "The Roadside Flowers of Texas," will feature full-color reproductions of 256 paintings by Mrs. Mary Motz Wills of Abilene with an accompanying text by Howard S. Irwin of the University of Texas as botany department.

"No book has been so badly needed in Texas as a beautiful, authoritative guide to the wild flowers of the state," Wardlaw said. "For nearly 50 years Mrs. Wills has been producing artistically beautiful and botanically accurate paintings of Texas flowers with the hope that some day they might be published. The farsighted and public spirited generosity of Mrs. Spencer is at last making it possible for her dream to come true."

256 PAINTINGS

The 256 paintings in "The Roadside Flowers of Texas" were selected by University of Texas botanists from among over 2,000 watercolors which have been made by Mrs. Wills throughout the years. Some of the pictures are from the artist's own collection, while others were borrowed from collections in the Texas Memorial Museum in Austin and the Witte Museum in San Antonio. The species included were selected because they are the flowers which one is most apt to encounter while traveling about the state. Irwin's

text, keyed to the pictures, contains pertinent scientific information about the flowers and also a general discussion of each in layman's language and a delineation of its range in the state.

Those who appreciate fine lithography as well as fine art will appreciate the second in a series of portfolios released by the University of Texas Press.

SIX PRINTS

The half dozen prints, which capture all the brilliance and mood of the originals of Otis Dozier, reflect the scenes he has captured in his native Southwest.

These come in a binding suitable

for permanent storage, but each one of the gravures in the collection is suitable for framing.

Otis Dozier, who calls Dallas his home, has long been regarded as one of the Southwest's leading artists. No one can view the portfolio without realizing that his reputation is richly earned, for Dozier has a way with colors that capture the brilliance and the contrasts of the Southwest. He paints with feeling as well as imagination; yet with fidelity.

DOZIER'S TALENT

Included in the selections designed to show the great breadth of Dozier's talent are those from the Texas-Louisiana swamp country to the canyons of New Mexico. Among them are "Passage to the Sea," "Swamp Night," "Landscape with Sun and Rain," "Indian Corn," "Walpi," and "Hopli Snake Dance."

John Palmer Leeper, who is director of the Marian Koogler McNay Art Institute in San Antonio, has written a brief sketch on Otis Dozier and his work, and this is printed impressively as part of the Bluffier series of Southwestern Art. At \$10, the portfolio is a rare bargain.

Rains' four other marriages ended in divorce.
