

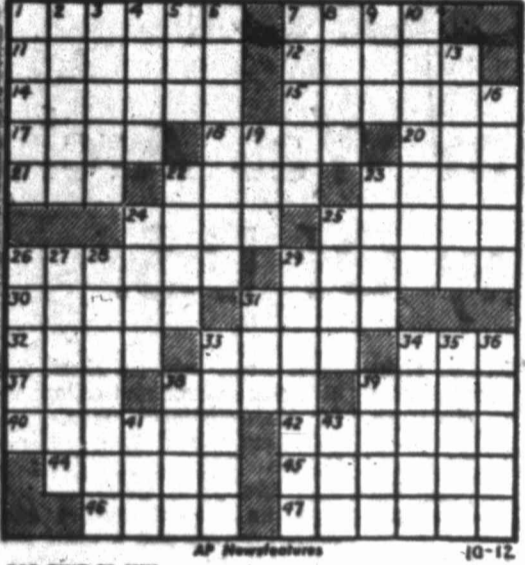

Short Skirts Violent Topic

YORK, Pa. (AP)—Are short skirts indecent?
 William N. Craley, principal of the suburban Central Union High School, says skirts with hemlines above the knees certainly are indecent.

When he made this known in personal warnings last week to a handful of the 700 girls in the junior-senior high school, he started a sizzling feud that boiled over today in the hands of a 12-member citizens committee.

At a noisy meeting Monday night, at which parents referred to Craley as dictatorial, the school board decided to let the citizens committee resolve the hemline controversy.

When one parent asked for a show of feeling on whether the board and school administration of the 700 persons at the meeting stood up.

The 96 pupils who brought the issue to a head last Friday by staging a sit-down strike in the school cafeteria were readmitted to school Monday. Observers said they didn't notice any bare knees.

DA Stymied; Road Bandits To Be Tried In California

MERCED, Calif. (AP) —Three admitted members of a red light bandit gang that terrorized motorists from Merced to Arkansas will be tried here—frustrating a Texas district attorney who wants to ask the death penalty for two of them in El Paso.

Dist. Atty. Frank Clayton of El Paso Tuesday tried to extradite Elton Hale, 41, a Livermore, Calif. hog rancher; and E. J. Minor, 31, an ex-convict from Arkansas. Clayton said he wanted Hale and Minor for sexual attacks, robberies and beatings in Texas.

But Dist. Atty. Stephen Galvin of Merced County refused to release them to Clayton and issued complaints charging the two with kidnaping, robbery and sex perversion. A similar charge was filed against Hale's cousin, J. O. Hale.

Truman Lashes Anti-Catholic Prejudice In Speech At Waco

By DAVE CHEAVENS WACO (AP)—Former President Harry Truman Tuesday night delivered what the Democrats hope will be the knockout punch against attacks on presidential candidate John F. Kennedy's religion.

In an unusually serious mood, he told a crowd that gave approval 24 times with handclaps that "innuendoes and downright lies" are being used to arouse religious prejudice. "I say to you this is un-American. It makes me sick and it makes me want to fight and that is what I am doing," Truman said.

Truman, on stage with House Speaker Sam Rayburn and Sen. Ralph Yarborough, while Texas vice-presidential nominee, Sen. Lyndon Johnson stumped the South, devoted more than half his 30 minutes speech to the question of religion.

RESPONDED WELL

The setting was in a Central Texas area heavily populated by Baptists like Truman, Rayburn and Yarborough. Many Baptist ministers and other non-Catholic clergymen have openly questioned Kennedy's qualification to serve as president in view of his Catholic religion. "I think that Jack Kennedy has responded very well to the attacks on his religion," Truman said. "He has answered all reasonable questions with patience, with dignity and candor."

He said Kennedy made it perfectly clear at Houston, "if it ever needed to be made clear, that he will exercise his duties as president of the United States free from interference from the Catholic Church. If anyone had any honest doubts about this question, it seems to me that those doubts ought to be completely satisfied by this time."

Asking the audience, estimated by local Kennedy-Johnson leaders at 5,000 to "listen carefully," he read the part of Article Six of the Constitution which declares that no religious test shall be required as a qualification to any office of public trust.

MOVEMENT

"I regret that there appears to be a widespread movement across the country to violate and overturn that provision," Truman said. He said he hoped that Texas will join the rest of the nation Nov. 8 to elect Kennedy and Johnson and "we will bury once and for all this question of religious bigotry which never should have been raised in the first place."

Truman touched off a round of laughter when he departed from his prepared speech to say that one reason he is glad he is a Baptist is that "nobody dictates to me as a Baptist."

Truman spoke in the city where a few years ago, Baylor University—the largest Baptist educational institution in the world—granted him an honorary degree. He said some of the activity against Kennedy's religion is "carried on through our Protestant churches with political money contributed for this purpose to avoid paying income tax."

"Isn't that a terrible thing?" he asked. "They are not satisfied just to run a smear campaign. They want to run it with tax free money for political purposes, so they give the money to our churches and ask them to do the dirty work for them."

The Republicans came in for their share of sharp words from Rayburn, Yarborough and National Committeeman Byron Skelton of Temple.

Skelton, speaking of Former Gov. Allan Shivers' "Democrats for Nixon-Lodge" organization, said "there is no such thing as a Democrat for Nixon." He said that Shivers should "quit sailing under false colors. He's ashamed of the name Republican."

Shivers, elected governor three times as a Democrat, is now supporting the Republican ticket for the third straight time in national elections.

CAN'T GET IN

Yarborough, a long-standing political foe of Shivers, said the former governor has been turning Republican every two years but the GOP "still won't let him in." This drew a round of laughter from the partisan crowd.

Dr. Charles Wellborn, pastor of one of Waco's largest Baptist churches, gave the invocation at the rally.

It followed Truman's appearance at Texas A.M. San Antonio, Uvalde and the LBJ Ranch on the Pedernales River 65 miles west of Austin. He called on former Vice President John N. Garner at Uvalde.

At the LBJ Ranch Truman met

with about 500 Kennedy-Johnson leaders from over the state in a session closed to reporters. Some of the workers who attended said afterward that the former president emphasized the need for hard work at the precinct level if Texas hopes to get back into the Democratic column this year after the departures in 1952 and 1956.

More Cotton Acreage Asked

WACO (AP)—The Texas Farm Bureau Tuesday asked for increased cotton allotments and no government sales of surplus cotton at market prices.

Directors requested the secretary of agriculture to increase cotton allotments by at least 10 per cent, but not more than 14 per cent. This would place the national allotment at between 17.6 and 18.3 million acres. The present program calls for a minimum of 16.3 million acres next year.

President J. H. West said: "We feel that the improvement in cotton markets along with a reduction in supplies, resulting from the operation of the Agricultural Act of 1958 makes it possible for the secretary of agriculture to give substantial increase in cotton allotments for 1961."

The board further requested that the 1961 support price be above 70 per cent of parity. Under the present law, the minimum support price next year would be 70 per cent of parity based on the average grade and staple length of the crop rather than middling 1/8-inch, as was the case previously.

Directors also asked that all cotton released from Commodity Credit Corp. stocks be sold at no less than 115 per cent of the support price. At present, the agriculture secretary can, at his own discretion, release up to one million bales for sale at the market price.

Cuban Rebels Stand Trial

SANTA CLARA, Cuba (AP)—The biggest conspiracy trial of the Fidel Castro regime rolled on here today behind doors closed to all foreign newsmen except four Russians.

Newsmen counted 170 defendants, about a dozen of them in military uniform, who entered the courtroom at the trial opening Tuesday. Defense attorneys said more than 200 were on trial.

The accused are charged with waging armed rebellion in the Escambray Mountains or with collaborating with the insurgents. Among those on trial was an American identified by the semi-official newspaper Revolution as Richard Pecoraro of Staten Island, N. Y.

A New York City fireman by that name was fired from his job earlier this year after overstaying his leave on a trip to Cuba.

A second military tribunal at Santiago in eastern Cuba, was to begin hearing evidence today against 21 men the government says invaded the northeast coast of Cuba last week. They included another American identified as Anthony Zarba.

The Armed Forces Ministry announced Tuesday night that only five of the 27-man landing party was still at large. The leader previously had been reported killed.

Argentine Regime In Troubled Waters

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (AP)—Some top military chiefs were reported ready to ask President Arturo Frondizi to resign as Argentina's government crisis grew worse.

War Secretary Gen. Rodolfo Larcher resigned Tuesday night and unconfirmed reports said the rest of the Cabinet had offered to quit.

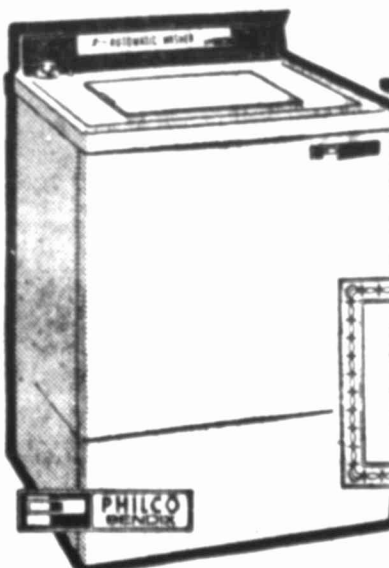

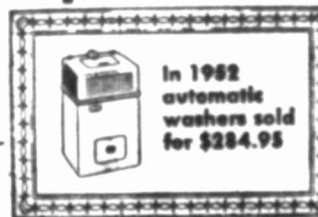

One Injury, Heavy Damage As Twisters Hit Panhandle

Tornadoes spawned during a widespread weather disturbance tore apart grain elevators, trailer homes and two drive-in theaters Tuesday night in the western section of the Texas Panhandle.

Damage was estimated by the Department of Public Safety at about \$400,000.

Only one person was reported injured—Floyd Dameron, 45, of Friona who suffered a broken shoulder when his truck was blown over.

The twisters hit three times at the town of Friona and outside Bovina in the sparsely populated section of the Panhandle. Rain and hail up to two inches in diameter accompanied the twisters.

The first tornado hit about 15 miles southwest of Friona near Bovina. Then it struck a drive-in on the west side of Friona, raised and tore into another drive-in across U.S. 60. Six trailer homes were wrecked and three damaged in the area.

The editor of the Friona Star, Dave McKeen, watched the tornado approach. He estimated damage to the first drive-in theater at \$65,000 to \$75,000.

Most of the dollar damage was done to three government grain elevators destroyed by the twisters.

Early Wednesday some scattered showers fell in Northwest Texas but in the western part of the Panhandle and in far West Texas skies were clear. Temperatures ranged from 76 at Galveston and Brownsville to 55 at El Paso. No rain was reported in the state.

Rainfall reports during the 24-hour period ending at 6 p.m. include Dalhart 1.50 inches, Canadian 75, Amarillo 48 and lighter amounts at scattered points over the state. At Weatherford, Okla., a 3.20 inch rainfall was reported.

The five-day forecast issued Wednesday calls for temperatures from 2 to 7 degrees above normal with light to moderate rainfall over the state.

Vet Land Plan Up For Vote

This is the second of three stories on the four constitutional amendments.

AUSTIN (AP)—About 40,000 veterans will know after Nov. 8 whether they have a chance to get a state loan to buy a farm or ranch.

Instead of a token cash handout to its veterans, Texas approved a method whereby land was bought by the state and resold to the GIs at low interest rates over 40 years.

The veterans land program has been cut down to a cold molasses pace because of a lack of money. Land Commissioner Bill Allcorn said unless more bonds are sold the program will stop in January.

Constitutional Amendment No. 2 would provide cash to keep the program going. The voters will decide if this is desirable.

In three previous amendments, voters gave the Veterans Land Board power to sell \$200 million in bonds. Some \$137.5 million went begging for a buyer on today's tight bond market.

The board is limited to paying 3 per cent interest. The market now is around 3 1/8 per cent. The last bond series was sold June 18, 1958 and the market has been unfavorable ever since.

The proposed amendment would allow the state to pay 3 1/2 per cent interest.

Three other amendments also are to be considered Nov. 8. One makes sweeping changes in the small loan field, another provides annual salaries for legislators and the third creates three more hospital districts.

Texas has been charging veterans 3 1/2 per cent interest but will go to the maximum permitted 4 per cent Nov. 24.

During the 11-year life of the program, more than 2,150,000 acres have been bought at a state outlay of \$136 million. About 23,000 veterans are participating. A year ago 300 tracts a month were sold. Now the average monthly total is about 65. About \$5 million is all that remains in the fund.

Those feeling Texas has done its share for the veterans argue that the program of ranch buying is out of step with the times, that the trend now is toward urbanization. They feel the state could better use its credit for purposes to benefit a larger segment of the population, such as issuing bonds for building schools or water flood projects.

Proponents say that the program costs far less than any other bonus program and may produce a profit. They point out that the amendment will allow those on the waiting list to be considered. Others want the program expanded to cover home improvements and modernization.

The hospital district amendment has no effect on any areas but Lamar, Hidalgo and Precinct 4 in Comanche County. Because of the State's outmoded Constitution, the proposal requires a statewide vote.

Citizens in the three areas later would vote again on whether the districts could levy taxes and thus have the last word on the strictly local matter.

The argument in favor of the amendment is that since the existing taxing units of local government can not provide for the needed hospital improvements another special district with taxing powers is required.

The opposition says the property tax which would be used to bring in the money is overworked now and that it also would add another level of authority to an already fuzzy chain of command in the lower levels of government.

Spy-In-Sky Rocket Fails

POINT ARGUELLO, Calif. (AP)

The United States' first spy-in-sky rocket failed to orbit for reasons being sought today by Air Force scientists with only meager clues.

Project officials announced that the first in the series of Sarnos satellites radioed back a few messages of its performance Tuesday, then disappeared.

It was to be the forerunner of satellites equipped with scanning gear so sensitive they are expected to take pictures or TV shots better than photos made from the U2 reconnaissance plane.

City Puts Limit On Feline Number

DETROIT (AP)—The Highland Park City Council has voted that no home may have more than three cats. Violators will be subject to a \$50 fine and/or 90 days in jail.

The ruling came after Police Chief Dewey T. Schultz told the council of numerous complaints of cats causing disturbances. He said he found 27 cats in one home.

Shivers Claims Kennedy Has Sold Chinese Islands

HOUSTON (AP) — Sen. John F. Kennedy "has sold the Chinese Red Islands," Sen. Shivers said today. He said Kennedy's voting record on such issues as the oil depletion allowance and state ownership of the tidelands.

Shivers said Kennedy has achieved a "perfect" voting record for the past three years. "Perfect, that is, on the score sheets of the radical Americans for Democratic Action."

Kennedy is one of three senators who never cast a vote with the southern coalition in 86 roll calls during the last session of Congress, Shivers said.

Shivers said Kennedy is not the same kind of Democrat Texans believe in.

"He and his advisers do not believe in the same principles, and he is not entitled to your vote as a Texas Democrat merely because he calls himself a Democrat," Shivers said.

"If I must choose between a party label and the best interest of Texas, he said, 'I'll take Texas.'"

He said Kennedy is a man who "never had any financial worries himself and now tells you he can spend your money better than you can."

'The Wall' Sincere But Loses Essence

NEW YORK (AP)—"The Wall," a new Broadway play based on a best-seller novel, attempts the formidable task of distilling the horror of one of World War II's most savage episodes into the dramatic confines of stage action.

The production, which premiered Tuesday night at the Billy Rose Theater, is dedicated in earnest sincerity but only partially successful in achievement.

The events, but not the essence, of human terror emerge in this recreation of the three years during which Nazi might annihilated a half-million people from the Warsaw ghetto.

Millard Lampell, a screen writer essaying his first stage project, includes many of the episodes and individuals that crowd the pages of John Hersey's book. A dozen men, women and children are centrally focussed in the large cast, and director Morton

Da Costa weaves the clash of their characters without much opportunity for subtle coloration. The rabbi, the collaborator, the fighter, the turncoat are types rather than individuals.

Only after an act and a half of careful preparation does "The Wall" reach a level of dramatic development.

George C. Scott, gruff-voiced and intense, is co-starred as the cold opportunist who tries to isolate himself from disaster. Yvonne Mitchell, an English actress making her first Broadway appearance, is the spinner teacher who leads the underground into rebellion and brings love to Scott.

The Kermit Bloomgarden-Billy Rose production is mounted by designer Howard Bay in a stage-crowding representation of the tenements and caves within the ghetto walls. For the finale, stage machinery works mightily in transforming the scene into a smoking rubble.

Jack Ready, Nixon Cool To Idea For Fifth Debate

NEW YORK (AP)—A great debate appears to be shaping up over the "great debate" between the presidential candidates.

Sen. John F. Kennedy has accepted a network offer to make time available for a fifth debate early in November.

But Vice President Richard M. Nixon is cool to the idea and has suggested that instead of a fifth debate he and Kennedy expand their fourth joint appearance to two hours.

Kennedy has not yet replied. Originally, four one-hour debates were scheduled. Two already have been held and the third is set for Thursday night.

The proposal for another debate "around Nov. 2" was made in telegrams Saturday by three Democratic senators. The National Broadcasting Co., the Columbia Broadcasting System and the American Broadcasting Co. agreed to give television and radio time and the Mutual Broad-

casting System offered its radio network facilities.

The Kennedy camp feels that the senator did so well in the first two debates that still another one would be beneficial to him. They also believe that, with the last debate now set for Oct. 21, too big a time gap would be left before the election and that the Republicans could finance a home-stretch TV blitz that the Democrats could not match because of a lack of funds.

The Republicans take another view.

Fred C. Scribner Jr., chief Republican National Committee negotiator on the four programs already scheduled, asserted that Kennedy had lost the second TV debate, held last Friday.

"It is not unusual for a man who has been beaten to ask for a return match," he said.

Nixon, in San Diego, Calif., suggested through his press secretary that the fourth joint TV appearance now scheduled for Oct. 21 be turned over to the vice-presidential candidates.

He also suggested that the two-hour debate that he proposed should be held some time in the week of Oct. 21-28 and that the time for both answering questions and for rebuttal should be increased from two-and-a-half to five minutes.

Nixon was quoted as saying that his schedule was too tight to permit a TV debate after Oct. 28.

Indian Dancer Charms Crowd

NEW YORK (AP)—A beautiful dancer from India, with jewels on her fingers, scarlet tint on her palms and the soles of her feet, and bells on her ankles, headed a dance company which charmed an international audience Tuesday night in the small Barbizon Plaza Theater.

She was the dancer Indrani in a generous dozen numbers from the ancient temples, the religion and the formal rhythmic lore of her country.

She and her male partners notably Narasimha Rao and Baliram were accompanied by flute, percussion, string and vocal music. The sound could get monotonous, but visually there was a wonderful variety with great subtlety in facial expression and the play of fingers and a fine evocative sweep in the larger motions of arms, legs and sinuous bodies.

They were most effective in the simpler things. A too complicated story could get in the way, as in the number never before performed outside India, it was said, the "Daksha Yagnya." Here the magic of these dancers was somewhat lost in the literal reading of the story of Shiva, his consort Sati and her father Daksha.

The company, which has played in numerous cities and dance centers in this country, Canada and abroad, stays here a week.

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—At a time when some stars are fleeing to bomb- and tax-proof chalets in Switzerland, it's refreshing to find a glamor pair putting up a palace right in the heart of the high-rent district.

The couple, Robert Wagner and Natalie Wood, their place is located on Beverly Drive in Beverly Hills, hard by the homes of Kirk Douglas and Rosalind Russell.

The Wagners are transforming their Southern-style mansion into a Roman palazzo. Bob gave me the 80-cent tour the other day, since Natalie was off playing a tenement wail in "West Side Story."

"Pardon the mess," he apologized. "We've been living in chaos for days. I usually wake up with a painter staring me in the face and asking me if I like the shade."

The black and white marble of the entrance and dining room needs polishing, he explained, and the gold leaf that ornaments the balustrades and columns needs finishing touches. The living room lacks the hand-woven white rug.

Still, the visitor can get a good notion of how the place will shape up. The living room is a great hall of glass and marble, with windows looking into the enclosed garden room. Two Roman figures in flowing robes preside over the fountain pools.

Outside is the big pool, a turquoise free-form that will be converted into a Roman bath with columns and statuary. Upstairs, his bedroom is built, hers isn't. Hers will feature 26 feet of wardrobe and a sunken pool in the bathroom. His has a 20-foot-high wall of wormwood. "I painted; I like it better that way."

Wagner ended the tour in the den, where they live while work is in progress. "We'll have about \$150,000 invested in the place when we finish," he reported. "That's not bad when you consider what the other houses are going for around here. One lot sold recently for \$85,000."

Imagination Can Help TV Troubles

NEW YORK (AP)—After an evening like Tuesday night, it is obvious that there is nothing the matter with television that imagination, thought and hard work can't cure.

First there was the season's first "CBS Reports," a fascinating suspense story with a happy ending. It was a documentary about the long, extensive development of the Navy's Polaris missile, invented expressly to be fired by a submerged atom-powered submarine.

CBS has had its camera lens on both the submarine George Washington and — whenever security permitted — the missile for almost five years. Thus the program (narrated by Edward R. Murrow with great simplicity) was both absorbing and instructive. It was reassuring and heartening, too, to learn about a weapon with such a war-detering potential.

About an hour later, NBC gave us the "Donald O'Connor Show," a gay program of pure entertainment — great dancing, pleasant songs, good humor and handsome backgrounds. O'Connor, who turns up on TV as rarely as Fred Astaire, is a man of many talents and the greatest of these is dancing.

Mitzi Gaynor, his pretty costar, contributed her dancing and singing abilities and it was all delightful.

And in between, if one was twisting the dial selectively, there was a very good mystery episode on "Thriller," on NBC.

Old TV series ideas never die, they just change stars and locations. For instance, ABC now has on the planning board a series called "The New Breed," concerned with the activities of the "Metropolitan Squad" of the Los Angeles Police Department. Remember NBC's "M Squad"? That was about the activities of the Metropolitan Squad of the Chicago Police Force.

Lee Marvin, who played "M Squad's" hero, soon will show up on the other side of the law. He'll play a bandit in the Oct. 26 episode of "Wagon Train."

CBS will pre-empt the time of its Sunday "Face the Nation" for an hour's special showing the 1961 models of American automobiles NBC's "Meet the Press," at the same time — 6 p.m., EDT — will interview Democratic presidential candidate John F. Kennedy.
