Finch, Carole Guilty; Death Will Be Asked

LOS ANGELES (AP)—The state will ask death in its gas chamber for Dr. R. Bernard Finch and his mistress, Carole Tregoff, convicted of murdering his socialite wife with a bullet in the back.

A third jury, agreeing where two others had deadlocked, returned its verdict late Monday.

Finch, 43, handsome, tennis-loving surgeon, guilty of the first degree murder of pretty, popular Barbara Jean Finch, 35, outside their West Covina home July 18, 1959.

Carole, 24, auburn-haired, once a shapely model who became Finch's receptionist and then his paramour, guilty of second-degree murder.

Both guilty of conspiracy to commit murder.

"Conspiracy to commit murder is punishable by death in California," said Deputy Dist. Atty. Clifford Craft. "We will ask the death penalty for both defendants."

Finch, hands clasped, took his own verdict coolly. When he heard Carole's his face reddened and tears welled in his eyes. He reached past an attorney and patted her shoulder. She was sobbing.

As they were led out of the courtroom, the lovers embraced tearfully and tenderly. They stood clasped together briefly.

Under California law the same jury of 12 men and 2 women will now decree the penalty. Superior Court Judge David Coleman told them to return for this purpose next Monday.

Words Fly As Senate Vote Deadline Nears

With Texas' special Senate election exactly one week in the offing, words calculated to win votes flew in ever increasing volume Tuesday.

Numerous lesser known candidates in the cumbersome 71-man field joined more prominent contenders in ardent efforts to woo support at the polls. One of them even spoke to an empty hall Monday night after nobody showed up to hear his speech.

Reports to the secretary of state meanwhile showed 32 of the candidates had spent \$78,323 so far in bidding for the U.S. Senate seat formerly held by Vice President Lyndon Johnson.

Monday was the deadline for reporting expenses and donations, and accounts of the 32 were those delivered before closing time at the end of the day.

U.S. Rep. Jim Wright of Fort Worth and Sen. William Blakely of Dallas, Johnson's interim successor by appointment, listed the biggest totals for campaign spending and gifts from their backers.

Wright reported he had spent \$27,921 and received \$29,405 in donations. Blakely's statement detailed \$26,234 in campaign costs and \$25,557 in gifts.

Atty. Gen. Will Wilson said his expenses and donations have amounted to \$11,714 and \$9,695, respectively, and the corresponding figures from Republican John Tower of Wichita Falls were \$5,649 and \$9,637.

There were no totals from the other two of the so-called "big six" candidates—Maury Maverick Jr. and State Sen. Henry Gonzalez, both of San Antonio.

Maverick filed an itemized list of gifts including \$4,500 from Central Texans for Maverick but didn't add up the amounts. There was no report from Gonzalez before the secretary of state's office closed for the day.

Figures from the other reports ranged from no expenses and no gifts up to spending of \$1,203 and \$95 in donations for Mrs. Martha Tredway of Denison and \$1,304 and \$100 for George Davison of Abilene.

It was Harry Diehl of Houston who rented the 4,200-seat city auditorium in his home town for a speech and, after nobody appeared as audience, went ahead and delivered it anyhow before the five city employees who opened the hall.

"He said he wanted his opponents to know he went ahead with the speech," said James Trammell, one of the stage hands on duty for Diehl's appearance.

Better known candidates divided time between a broad stretch of South Texas and the wide plains of West Texas in quest of votes.

SB141, amending Texas banking code to clarify when fiduciaries may act without bond regarding moneys paid into court.

SB142, amending Texas probate code regarding reciprocity to foreign banks and trust companies acting in a fiduciary capacity in this state.

SB144, eliminating provisions regarding change of amount of water which may be appropriated by West Central Texas Municipal Water Authority in order to leave the district subject to same laws as other districts.

SB160, authorizing Texas Youth Council to convey a certain tract of land to Coricana Independent School District.

SB171, validating county parks bond elections.

HB387, making it unlawful to hunt, take or kill deer in Cooke and Grayson Counties at any time.
