The group made plans for the Castro County kick-off in Farm Organization Week, which will begin Thursday night with a banquet, for community workers, at the Dimmitt Methodist Church at 7:00 p. m., at which time captains will make definite arrangements for canvassing the county for organization members. A Resolutions Committee will be appointed to prepare resolutions to be presented to the State Convention of the Farm Bureau which will be held at the Herring Hotel in Amarillo November 17-19.

Every farmer in the county will be solicited to become a member of the Castro County Farm Bureau during this drive.

Re-locating a door may give a better entrance to the house from the back rather than through the kitchen, or-at least route it to one side of the workcenters in the kitchen. Since the back door usually leads directly to the drive, and most families use the back door most of the time, the space between hall, stairs and first floor rooms, should be a direct route from the back door.

Changing a room to give a work room with closets and doors conveniently placed for work clothes, cleaning and laundry equipment may mean a use for the spare bed room. Providing more places to store equipment and clothes is another means of lessening the traffic troubles.


