# Pro-Red Takes Over Revolution

TUNIS, Tunisia (AP)-The new Algerian rebel leadership asserted today it will bolster military action against French rule in Algeria, but at the same time reaffirmed that a negotiated solution to the rebellion is still possible.

The statement followed Sunday's announcement of a shuffle in the rebel provisional government, shelving moderate Premier Ferhat Abbas, 62, and replacing him with pro-communist Ben Youssef ben Khedda, 41. Ben Khedda, virtually unknown outside rebel circles, is farther to the left than Abbas and favors a tougher approach in the war against the French.







TOKYO (AP)—Japanese Prime Minister Hayato Ikeda today told Soviet Premier Khrushchev he was meddling in Japan's affairs by demanding abrogation of the

U.S.-Japan security treaty. In reply to a personal message from Khrushchev, Ikeda said in effect that unless the Soviet Union has aggressive intentions against Japan, the U.S.-Japan pact could not be a threat to Moscow,

The text of Ikeda's message, delivered to Khrushchev by the Japanese ambassador in Moscow, was released by the Japanese Foreign Office.

Ikeda also told Khrushchev Japan will stay allied with the free world.

"Japan pursues freedom and democracy as the highest political ideals. This is and will continue to be our immutable policy," he

said.

Khrushchev's message said the Soviet Union could not remain indifferent to the U.S.-Japan security treaty and the presence of foreign troops. He said these ham-pered normal relations between the two countries.



#### It Is The Positive Forces That Do Good

Contemporary man has both the good and bad fortune to be living in an era of intensive self-examination. Man is more consciously aware of himself, and of his thoughts and feelings and actions, than has ever been true before. Ours is, indeed, the age of analysis.

One odd result of this is that men often hesitate to acknowledge any high motiva-tion. There is a widespread inclination to accept the dogma that everything is done out of self-interest, no matter how noble it may seen. This attitude boils down to a kind of easy contempt for the "dogooders." They too, the implication is, are motivated at bottom by their own in-

There may be an ultimate small kernel

of truth in this. Perhaps a saint has a consuming desire for the satisfaction of knowing that he behaves like a saint, Perhaps. But if cynicism goes that far, then what becomes of the idea that man's condition can be improved, and that it behooves men of good will to do what they can to help bring about improvement?

The essential point is that men, whatever their innermost motives, do perform acts and live lives of goodness and dedication to humanity. It is not the cynics but the scorned "do-gooders" who do whatever is being done to better the situation of creatures who lived in savagery not so many generations past.

#### The Professional Reliefer

The name-calling phase of Newburgh, New York's, attempt to invoke more stringent rules for welfare grants, has not yet ended. Recently City Manager Joseph Mitchell referred to some (unidentified) relief recipients as "moral chiselers."

But. Mitchell, for all alleged sour notes, struck a true and responsive chord not long ago when he advocated publication of the names of those people who receive relief. He suggested that publicity "might stimulate some of these people to strike out for themselves."

Perhaps Mitchell is being over-optimistic in thinking that publicity would promote more individual ambition. But the federal law prohibiting publication of the names on relief rolls or applicants for relief is difficult to justify. Generally speaking the neighbors of

those on relief are aware of their plight. Why should this information be withheld from the rest of the population? Something more than idle curiosity is involved. Those who pay for the support of the indigent should be permitted to know whom they are supporting. Moreover, the chiselers are sucking up aid so much needed by those in actual need.

Secretary Ribicoff has recognized, with concern, the appearance of a third generation of professional reliefers. Stringent steps to get at the root of this malignant growth should be taken. It is an admirable thing to help the helpless; it is futile and foolish to sustain the shiftless.

### David Lawrence Government Needs Church Contacts

cepts of human brotherhood throughout the world is not being utilized by the United States government. There is plenty of emphasis on "cultural exchange" in the arts, music and drama, and lots of talk about the need for technical and educational help to be furnished by the new "Peace Corps" project. But there is a tendency to overlook a powerful institution in the world today - the churches and religious organizations.

THE CONTACT between the American government and the Roman Catholic headquarters in the Vatican is tenuous. There is little contact with the high-ranking ministers of the Church of England, There is little contact with the high churchmen of the Asian religions.

The other day, the correspondent in Rome of the London "Daily Telegraph" wrote to his paper that an attempt may be made soon to initiate diplomatic relations between the United States and the Vatican. This is probably a mistaken report, and the speculation may have arisen from the fact that Cardinal Cicognani, the newly appointed Papal Secretary of State, is well acquainted in Washington, where he served 25 yearsfrom 1933 to 1958-as the Apostolic Delegate to the Catholic clergy in America. From 1939 to 1950, President Roosevelt and Truman maintained an unofficial representative-the late Myron C. Taylorat the Vatican. These relationships were especially valuable during the war and postwar periods, and were thereafter lost in a controversy that arose when President Truman recommended establishment of formal diplomatic relations with the Vatican, and Congress refused to approve.

SINCE THAT TIME, the contact between the American government and the Vatican has been confined to a few visits by dignitaries on both sides. Yet the Roman Catholic Church has tremendous influence in every country in Latin America -each of which is predominantly Catholic in its religious affiliation-as well as in France, Austria, Germany, Spain and Italy. The Vatican could do more to help the "alliance for progress" to succeed in Latin America than any other single ally.

What is needed is a special organizatioh in the United States government devoted entirely to contacts with all national church and religious groups, both inside and outside the United States. A special representative should be sent to Britain to maintain regular contacts with the clergy in the Church of England and with other Protestant church groups. Annother envoy should be sent to Rome as a contact with the Roman Catholic Church. Other representatives of the United States

WHAT COULD these American representatives do? Nearly every one of the big churches has a vast personnel of missionaries who serve all around the globe-Africa, Asia, South America. They are in close contact with the peoples of those continents. They not only can transmit information, but they can gather it,

Sometimes the church organizations get

a misconception of American purposes and policies, and their representatives repeat such misconceptions, not necessarily in the pulpits but in their informal relationships with local leaders of thought. It is vital to the whole communication policy of the United States that a means of briefing the principal church leaders of the world should be set up by the United States government-just as it spends a lot of time and money in contacting the press and movie people of various countries, as well as other organizations included in the objectives of our "cultural exchange" programs.

A FEW DAYS ago President Kennedy and other high officials of the government in Washington thought it important. enough to give several hours of their time privately to brief 700 newspaper and radio editors from all parts of the United States on the background of our foreign policy problems. It is just as important regularly to give basic explanations, for instance, to certain people in the Anglican Church in England and the Roman Catholic Church in Rome and to some of the leaders of the various Hebrew theological seminaries in different parts of the world, as well as to the leading personalities in the religious groups of Asia, where the Moslem and other religions penetrate the hearts and minds of tens of millions of human beings. For they ought to be informed of American purposes in the world today. The United States should neglect no means of communication, formal or informal, which seeks earnestly and sincerely "to win friends and influence people." War II I have promised myself a few days in Atlantic City, Now that I am finally here, I can't figure out for the life of me why it has taken 16 years to make the hundred-mile journey from New York.

SURELY ATLANTIC CITY is the All-American summer resort. Here is the middle-class Riviera, the workingman's Southampton and Newport-lively, restless and full of razzle-dazzle. As the last days of August inexorably slide off the calendar, Americans of all sizes, shapes, colors, creeds and costume are here by the tens of thousands, trying to wring a little more juice out of summer.

We pack the huge old seaside hotels that have so long been a fixture of this resort. We spill out of the postwar motels that are giving the hotels a run for their money, what with parking privi-leges and salt-water pools. We are wedged into the shabby, old, once-private mansions now turned rooming houses which so often promise "kitchen privileges" on their shingles.

BUT IT REALLY doesn't matter whether one is registered in a luxury hotel or a rooming house, for all one's waking hours are spent trying to get a whiff of salt air, a stroll on the famous boardwalk, a dip in the Atlantic or a soupcon of sand on which to sit and sun-tan.

The boardwalk is an American institution, on a par with Niagara Falls and Yellowstone. It is reserved from 6 a.m. to 9 a.m. for early birds with bicycles. The number of young fry who can badger parents onto a bicycle at such hours is amazing.

BUT FROM 9 a.m. on, the boardwalk

the ocean went to Vice President Johnson and urged him to take his plane into Berlin above the arbitrary 10,000-foot ceiling set by the Soviets. The derring-do, with or without American aerial support, would signal an end to our taking Communist dictatorship. But the Vice President shook his head.

Didn't he want to give us a story? No, he said, he didn't want to give us a story. But the impression was that he couldn't if he would. The Administration wasn't letting this good ground-gainer run with the ball

OTHERS WANTED THE Vice President to tour East Berlin, as he could readily insist upon doing. But again the signal was shaken off. This time it is an educated guess that a meaningful gesture was withheld more by the authorities in West Germany than in Washington. Didn't they want a showdown? Well, yes-but then again, no.

"Peace," a Federated Republic spo man said at our luncheon table, "is still the thing. Nothing else-not even 'show' business.' ' The West Germans want, that is, to avoid a fight. They are even pretty nervous about the beau geste of which Johnson is temperamentally capable, such as breaching the Soviet-set air corridor ceiling or inciting East Germans to free-

HERE IS A state of mind in West Germany that is not well understood back in the U.S.A. Softened by prosperity, guiltcomplexed by World War II, debilitated by love-that-peace propaganda, separated from embattled Berlin by a 110-mile buffer area, this NATO ally wants to stop Soviet aggression-up to the point of fighting it.

Responding to a welcome address by Chancellor Adenauer, and with the strains of the "Star-Spangled Banner" hardly out of hearing above our heads, the Vice President read off the hand-picked words: "WITHOUT ANY SPIRIT of belliger-

ence, but in the spirit of solemn warning, we urge the masters of the Soviet Union and East Germany who have manufactured this crisis to remember that a crime against peace will now be a crime against humanity. . To do the situation full justice, the

Germans are either very pacifistic or they are as ambivalent as a nervous wreck. The same German government spokesman, a former newspaperman who was giving the gospel to us visiting newspapermen, thought it was pretty lax of the Western Allies (meaning the U.S.A.) not to have had a plan of reaction to the sealing off of the East-West border in Berlin, and not to have set the plan into instant effect.

BUT THE SAME briefing official praised West Berlin's Mayor Willy Brandt for using such restraint as he has done so far in addressing mass rallies. "Just one wrong word-dynamite!" The Germans seem to want the Berliners to resent the Russian border-closings with everything except that trigger-word-ac-

BONN, GERMANY-Some of us over ance of the Soviet moves thus far in Berlin. It is now conceded that the closing of the frontier, over which millions of East Germans have been welcomed for many years, is done-and shouldn't, by force, be undone. Perhaps the attitude of mind is that enough's enough. No more freedomseekers, please. If this is the case, then the West and the East do have one policy in common.

BUT MORE than likely it means just what the whole of the pattern means. Europe has had a bellyful of fighting. Anything is better than war. Surrender, at one point and then at another point, is preferable to annihilation. It is as if Patrick Henry had said: "Give me Libertybut not at the price of risking my life." #### WHAT OTHERS SAY

Those who think that all is serene within ivied walls of American colleges and that professors lead untroubled lives are entitled to "another think." Out of the Harvard Business School comes word that college faculty members in many instances feel that the need to produce published works "hangs as an academic sword of Damocles" over their careers. "Publish or perish" is the rule by which

too many of them live, Harvard says. A committee "of distinguished academicans" of the American Council on Education surveyed 584 campuses and was surprised at "the extent and depth of the chaos" over whether to publish or to teach should be the prime criterion. From the viewpoint of professors, ability to teach should come first.

The complaint about publication is that too often this is measured quantitatively rather than qualitatively. That is, publication is considered by "yardage" rather than by content.

The American Council on Education committee found also that many professors believe that to appraise teaching "is in fact impossible-if not also slightly distasteful." It appears that here is a subject, and publication is another, where administrators must use their best judg-

An objection also was voiced in the committee report to the increasing trend among colleges to use student ratings of professors. While students are often "remarkably astute observers" they do not always understand the long-range effects of good teaching and their own images are often "blurred."

But students do have a canny way of assessing most professors. If a professor pursues a policy of being tough but fair, students soon find it out and the professor is known to be a good one. Students to whom he gives good grades, or whom he recommends to other professors, benefit from his tough but fair apputation. On the other hand, a professor who teaches snap courses and requires little of his students soon gets a reputation for just that sort
