## 19 Texans Die By Violence In Weekend Period

Nineteen Texans died violently over the weekend.

Traffic accidents claimed most lives. Shootings, stabbings and drownings accounted for the other.

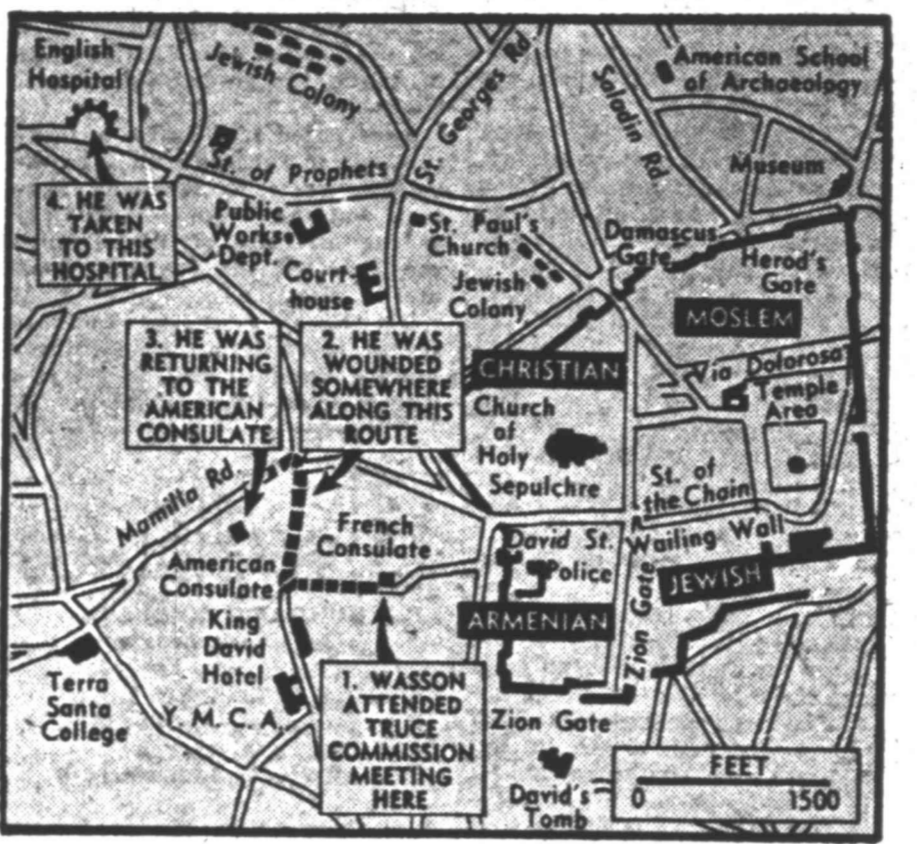
Three Texans were killed late Sunday in a two-car collision one mile east of Elgin, La. They were Girth Chamberlain, 40, Beattin, and his two step-children, Dorothy Elizabeth, six, and Ronald Wesley Cumbly, four. The children's mother was critically hurt.

Three persons were shot to death and two others critically wounded in gunplay shortly after midnight Saturday in and near Waco.

## Bloody Battle For Holy City Goes On After UN Deadline

Arab officials indicated Monday rejection of the United Nations' demand for a cease fire in Palestine. The young State of Israel had accepted, contingent upon Arab compliance.

The British Foreign Office said the Arabs plan to ask a 36-hour extension of the cease fire order, which expired at 11 a. m. CST.

An Arab League official in Cairo said the Arab countries are willing to stop shooting in Palestine only if the Jewish Army is disbanded and partition shelved.

NEW YORK — (AP) — A break of as much as \$5.05 a bale struck the New York Cotton Market Monday as the federal government temporarily halted exports under the Marshall Plan, but the lower prices attracted domestic buying and cotton started a rebound.

Plans for the most colorful and complete parade ever to herald the opening of a Midland rodeo were mapped Monday by the parade committee for this year's world championship show.

Chairman T. Paul Barron and Committeeman Arnold Scharbauer and Frank Cowden, Jr., joined in inviting everybody to enter the parade.

Participants will meet on the west side of the Midland High School campus at 2:30 p. m. June 3. The parade will form there and proceed eastward on Texas Street to Lorraine, South to Main, East to Main, North to Texas, and East to the Catholic Church on Texas. The parade will disband there, so rodeo contestants and others can go on to the rodeo grounds.

Some parts of Midland were well damped by a shower Sunday night, while others were left high and dry. The City Rain gauge registered .06, but only a trace fell at Midland Air Terminal.

It was a shower such as dotted the vast ranching and farming country from Abilene to Rowell during the afternoon and night. Though the scattered moisture failed to break one of the worst droughts in the section's history, it freshened agriculturalists' hopes that parched, almost-barren pastures and fields might yet be saved. And continued cloudy skies Monday morning, along with forecasts of more showers, gave added promise a genuine rain might be in the near offing.

## Meat Handlers Go Back To Work At Most Strikebound Plants

CHICAGO — (AP) — CIO meat handlers streamed back to work Monday at a majority of the major packing companies' plants.

Only at the seven plants of Wilson and Company, Cudahy Packing Company in Kansas City, and a few independent houses where contract details were being settled did pickets continue on duty.

The walkout continued at the Rath Packing Company, Waterloo, Iowa, and at the Morrell plant at Ottumwa, Iowa.

At Kansas City, Kans. the return to work was halted by employees of the Cudahy Packing Company, who congregated at plant gates and resumed picketing. Pickets with signs, "We want our jobs back or else no work," said a new dispute had arisen over seniority of returning strikers.

## Chrysler, CIO Will Reopen Negotiations In 13-Day-Old Strike

DETROIT — (AP) — Gov. Kim Sigler announced Monday that Chrysler Corporation and the CIO United Automobile Workers had agreed to reopen negotiations on the 13-day-old strike.

The governor came to Detroit to enter the 13-day-old strike situation. His announcement said only that the two sides had agreed to go back to the bargaining table together for the first time since the walkout of 75,000 employees May 12.

Negotiations broke off a few hours before the strike began and had not since been resumed.

Sigler's announcement came on the heels of an announcement that the biggest General Motors Corporation local in the UAW-CIO had turned thumbs down on a strike against that firm.

## SE NETTON REGION GETS A NEW OIL PROSPECTOR

Taylor Refining Company and Pan American Production Company No. 1 Rieck, is reported as a wildcat to be about 3,500 feet in Southeast Sutton County.

The venture is located 1,980 feet from north and 680 feet from east lines of section 8, block A-4, TCRB survey. It is reported to have depth to about 10 feet, and to be temporarily shut down.

## Gulf Has Not Yet Taken Test At Midland Venture

Gulf Oil Corporation No. 1-E Bryant, in Central Midland County, was still circulating and conditioning in the hole and the drilling mud, with the total depth still at 8,410 feet, in an unidentified line.

The project continues to show considerable gas, and a rainbow of oil on some of the drilling fluid. The gas is still rather heavy, and that condition has prevented the operator from attempting a drill-test, up to now.

# McKenney on Bridge

This is the first of three articles giving you a glossary of the terms used in bridge. I suggest that you clip them out and put them in your bridge book. Then when you run across a term you do not understand, you can look up its meaning.

**Balance of Strength**—When two opponents hold strong hands, the remaining high cards are called the "balance of strength." The balance of strength may all be in one hand or may be divided between two.

**Blind Lead**—The initial lead.

**Block**—(1) To hold up the master card of the opponents' suit. (2) To fail to unblock partner's suit.

**Business Double**—One made primarily for the purpose of doubling the value of undertricks. See Informative.

**Clash**—A hand devoid of trick-taking possibilities, or nearly so.

**Cash**—To lead one or more winning cards; usually, to lead all one's winning cards; to run.

**Chicago**—A hand void of trumps.

**Convention**—A practice in declaration or play which has some generally understood special significance.

**Coup**—A brilliant play. (Grand Coup—The discarding of a superfluous trump.)

**Down and Out** (Lead)—The opening lead of leader's highest card of the suit, followed by the lead (or play) of the next lower, etc.

**Duck**—To omit winning a trick when able to win it.

**False Card**—To play or lead a card unconventionally for the purpose of deception.

**Finesse**—To play the lower card of a tenace; or to lead a lower touching card toward a higher (but not touching) card and to play under the card led.

**Force**—To lead a card which ISLANDS OR RISING

### Briton Leads Arab Legion

Brig. John Baggot Glubb, British commander of Trans-Jordan's Arab Legion, will continue to lead King Abdullah's troops against the Palestine Jews, London sources say. The 40 British commissioned officers who helped Glubb Pasha train and direct the Legion also will remain. Small, studious, stooped, scar-chinned Brig. Glubb went to the Middle East in 1920, after service in World War I. He has been there ever since. Called "the second Lawrence of Arabia," he is feared and respected by the Arabs even more than Lawrence was. He helped form Iraq out of the once-Turkish Mesopotamia, pacifying fierce desert tribes that had known no masters except their sheiks. In 1930 he organized the Desert Patrol, part of the Arab Legion, then commanded by Col. Frederick Peake. When Colonel Peake resigned in 1939, Glubb Pasha took over. He whipped the Legion into a desert blitzkrieg unit of 5,000 men—the most potent striking force in the Arab world. It did yeoman service for Britain against the Axis forces. Now, nearly double its original strength, it is spearheading the Arab attack on the new Jewish state of Israel.
