Permission To Enlist 25,000 **Given Tuesday**

WASHINGTON-(AP)-The Senate voted Tuesday to let the Army enlist 25,000 aliens.

The 43 to 33 vote put the permission into the twoyear draft bill. Senator Lodge (R-Mass) sponsored it.

Under Lodge's plan, the enlistees would be eligible for citizenship after five years of service.

He said the group would not be formed into a "for-eign legion" but would be spread through the Army for service.
