Allies Halt Trains From Red Zone **New Move Most Positive Taken** In Berlin Crisis

BERLIN-(P)-The United States and Britain banned movements of trains Monday to and from the Russian zone of Germany. American officials said "technical difficulties" caused the stoppage.

The joint American-British action appeared to be the most positive counter-move yet taken by the Western Allies to break the Russian blockage of Berlin, now a month old.

Generals Lucius D. Clay and Sir Brian Robertson, the *American and British mili-

tary governors, took the action at a conference in Frankfurt. The restrictions are effective at once. The prohibition is against the movement of all trains "originating or terminating" in the Soviet zone.

The Red Sox Sunday climaxed a ensational seven-week surge from a dismal seventh to first placegiving Boston teams the leadership in both major leagues.

The Sox wrested the No. 1 berth from the Philadelphia Athletics by defeating the Cleveland Indians, 3-0. Meanwhile, the Athletics divided a doubleheader with the Detroit Tigers.
