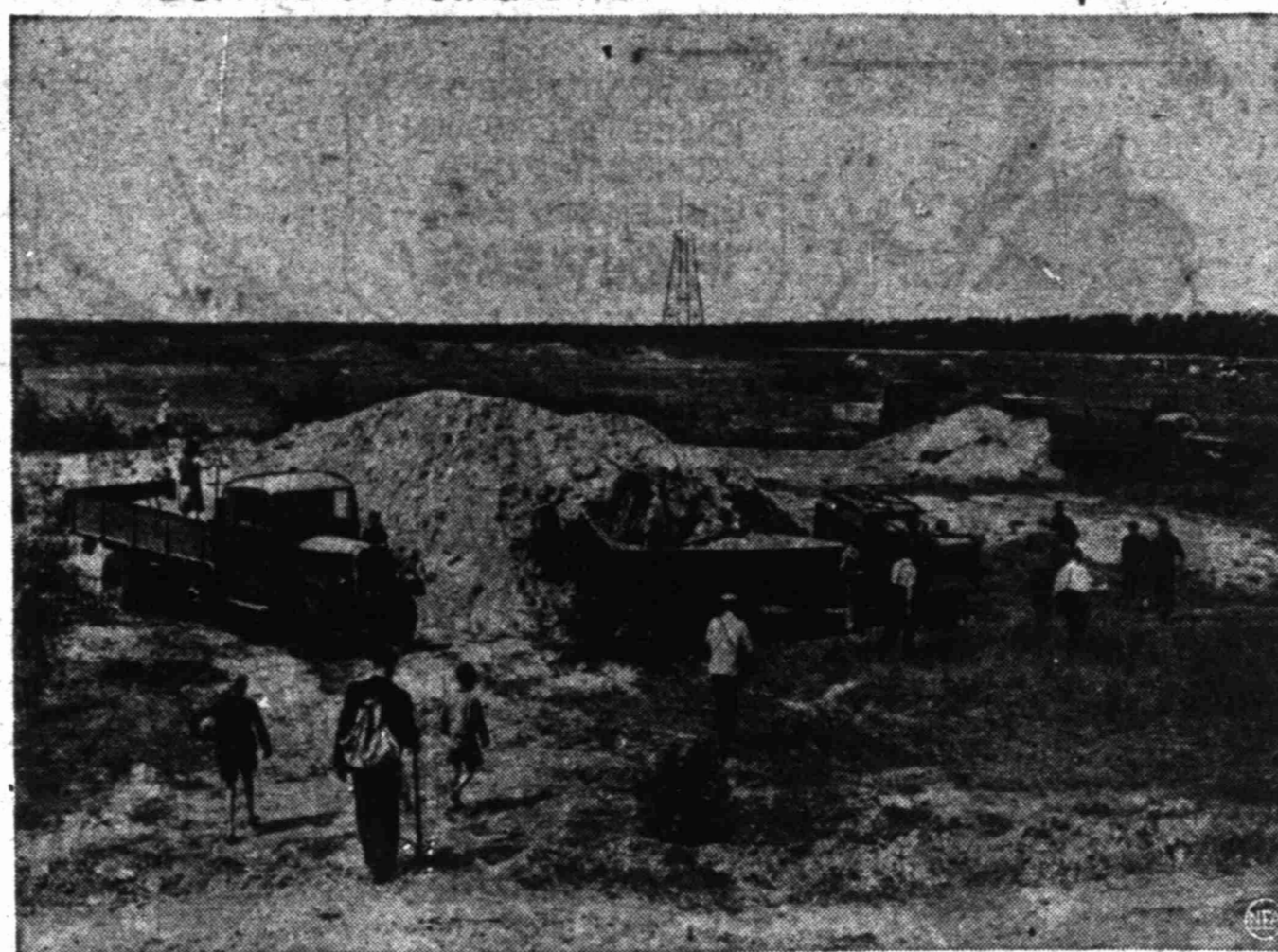

Navajo Indians Want No Houses; Mud Hogans Are Warmer Than Wood

CHICAGO — (NEA) — The Navajos don't know they're starving and they live in mud hogans, because they are warmer than houses. Thus does Viola Noble, "photographer to the Navajos" for many moons, criticize recent reports on the general theme of "Lo, the Poor Indian."

For 11 years Mrs. Noble and her husband, Dr. Tom Noble, an eminent U. S. surgeon, have been spending three weeks to four months a year among the Navajo, studying them and making pictures of these once seldom-photographed proud people.

They have gained their confidence to the point where aged Tall Singer, tribal medicine man, came with his squaw two summers ago and waited for the light to get just right for his sitting.

Last Summer Tall Singer almost cried as he told her, "Our people don't want a dole. It would kill our race. We want a loan, so we can build dams and windmills. We want to irrigate our land. We want to educate our young." Tall Singer died this past Winter at 85, but his philosophy is the philosophy of the Navajo, says Mrs. Noble.

Without proper training in cleanliness and hygiene, Mrs. Noble and her physician husband believe that modern housing would kill the Navajo.

"They spit on the floor of their hogan without a thought. Tuberculosis is the most prevalent killer. Spitting on the floor of a mud hut does not spread germs as spitting on a wooden floor does," she says.

"They do not have water to wash wooden floors, though Tall Singer's proposed loan with its consequent windmills and dams would provide this. There's plenty of water under the desert.

No Source Of Fuel
"There is no source of fuel to warm wooden houses. But the Navajo can pick enough twigs and branches off the canyon floor of his Arizona reservation to warm his little hogan."

Mrs. Noble agrees with Tall Singer that the only thing that will help the race permanently is to educate the young people. Her proposal is for schools and hospitals.

The Navajo wonders at the flood of clothing, food and money that has poured into reservation headquarters as a result of recent disclosures of their supposed plight. She blames much of the publicity on politics—the desire of prospective job-seekers to take over Indian Service positions.

One old man said, "I can't take that money. My wife will think something's funny."

Mrs. Noble insists the Indians are not hungry, and they're not cold.

"They eat things that are good for them," she says. "The kids get the best. I've never seen a skinny Navajo youngster. My pictures prove that."

The Navajo, she adds, is not as poverty-stricken today as he has been in times past. There has been more rain in the past two years. They have been able to raise more sheep and therefore have more wool.

Mrs. Noble also disagrees with much of the popular censure of the trader.

"The trader has been the Navajo's friend," she says. "He never

Former Ruhr Steel King Goes On Trial

KOENIGSTEIN, GERMANY — (AP) — Fritz Thyssen, 74, former Ruhr steel king who broke with Adolf Hitler at the outbreak of the war, went on trial Monday before a German denazification court.

Thyssen fled to Switzerland the day before the outbreak of war in 1939. He telegraphed Hitler that he opposed Nazi war policy.

From Switzerland he went to Monte Carlo and Southern France. The Vichy government extradited him to Germany, where the Gestapo sent him to a concentration camp.

He was "liberated" by the American Army. Prosecutors in the International War Crimes Trials at Nuernberg did not want him, but German authorities held him to face denazification charges.

Spy Inquiry Dilemma Shows Flaws In Our Espionage Laws

By PETER EDSON, NEA Washington Correspondent. WASHINGTON—Where the congressional investigations of wartime Communist spy rings are leading is hard to tell.

Miss Bentley's disclosures are only part of the story. Before any hard and fast opinions are formed on the case, it should be known what testimony other witnesses gave before the New York grand jury which has been investigating U. S. communism for months.

Another difficulty is in proving that this harmed the United States. If the information did eventually get to Russia, it was not an enemy, but an ally. Spy Rings Operated. What this may demonstrate more than anything else is that Communist spy rings in the United States were well organized and well trained to operate within American laws.

Czech General Reaches U. S. Zone of Germany

FRANKFURT, GERMANY (AP)—The 16th Czech general to flee the homeland since the Communist seizure of power last February has reached the United States zone of Germany.

Loyalist Demos Threaten Ouster Of Dixiecrats

AUSTIN (AP)—Texas Loyalist Democrats are threatening to boot the rebellious Dixiecrats out of the party if they won't promise to support the Truman-Barkley ticket in the presidential election.

A cheering caucus of party-line Democrats here Sunday declared open war on the Dixiecrats, demanding removal of any elector who refuses to take the party pledge.

The meeting, called by Mayor Tom Miller of Austin to map plans for the fight that will come to a showdown at the September convention in Fort Worth, authorized a statewide organization to make sure the Loyalists turn out in force.

The caucus was informed that a canvass of county convention returns showed the Loyalists have 1,048 potential votes, the Dixiecrats 751, and the views of 560 delegates are not known.

"I say we have the votes but it is important that we see to it that the loyal delegates reach Fort Worth," Calvert advised.

Russian Teachers' Cases Should Awaken U. S. To Red Methods

By DEWITT MACKENZIE, AP Foreign Affairs Analyst. If America isn't finally awake to the machinations of Communism it isn't the fault of a fate which staged the amazing escape of the Russian school mistress from Soviet diplomats in the heart of New York City.

Conan Doyle never dreamed up anything more startling than the case of Mrs. Oksana S. Kosenkina. But maybe we had to learn the truths of life by seeing her hurl herself to grave injury from the third story window of the Soviet Consulate, where she says she was imprisoned.

If we needed anything to cross the T's and dot the I's for us, it was Soviet Foreign Minister Molotov's brusque demand that both these teachers be surrendered immediately to Soviet authorities.

However, the Bolsheviks have been taking advantage of their Allies' tolerance since the war. They even have gone to the extent of carrying out wholesale spying in Britain, Canada and the United States, as was brought out by Canada's exposure of the great Red spy-ring.

The Communists also have received much encouragement from the lenient attitude of self-styled "liberals" who have maintained that anything done in the name of a political ideology must be O. K. These free-thinkers have shrugged off the fact that Communism has been overthrowing governments by force right and left in Eastern Europe ever since the war.
