Mayor Appeals To Ford, Union Head To End Big Strike

DETROIT—(P)—Acting Detroit Mayor George Edwards made personal appeals to Henry Ford II and Walter Reuther Monday to try to settle the five-day strike of 65,000 Ford workers.

Edwards, a former organizer for the CIO United Auto Workers, proposed three alternatives to the Ford Motor Company president and Reuther, president of the UAW: Resumption of direct negotiations, broken off a few minutes after the walkout started last Thursday noon.

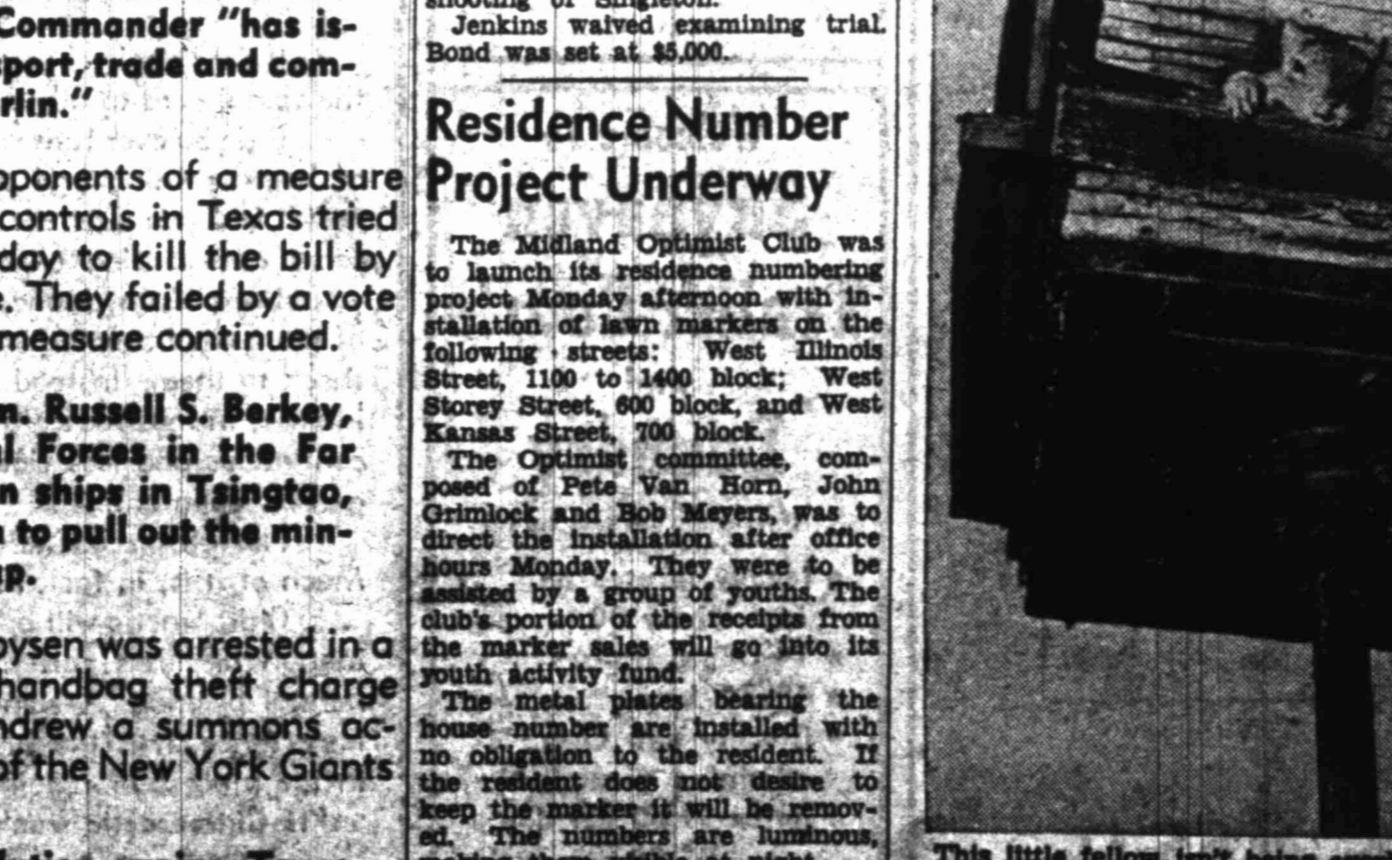

The well is 99' feet from east and 1,800 feet from south lines of section 10 block 2, TCRB survey about nine and one-quarter miles southwest of the town of Iran.

Location Made For Loving Prospector

C. O. Davis and McDaniel & Becher of Dallas have staked a 2,500-foot well in South-Central Loving County, in the unproven area immediately north of the Tun-still field.

It will be their No. 1-C E. O. Schawe, spotted 2,310 feet from north and east lines of section 48, block 54, T-1, TF survey. That puts it approximately six miles northeast of Orla. Elevation is 2,851 feet.

Cedar Lake Deep Zone Possibly Hit

The Ellenburger possibly has come in at Stanolind Oil & Gas Company No. 15 American Warehouse, deep wildcat in the Cedar Lake area of Northeast Gaines County.

The formation has not been identified officially but is thought by most observers to be the deep zone. No tentative log has been picked. There has been no estimate made as to how far the venture is into the current horizon.

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The tool was open two hours at 10:05-871 feet, with a weak blow of air to the surface for part of the period. Recovery was 170 feet of casing, with no signs of oil, gas or water.

Ralph Lowe No. 1 Cunningham-Shell, possible Pennsylvanian discovery in Southwest Gaines County, 10 miles southwest of Seminole, on the west side of the Doss field, and 650 feet from south and east lines of the northwest quarter of section 4, block A-34, pd survey, developed more oil in a drillstem test.

That investigation was at 9,242-3,977 feet in a three formation. The tool was open five hours. Recovery was 225 feet of drilling mud, 235 feet of oil and gas out drilling mud and 86 feet of free oil. No formation water was reported.

Application Does Not Mean Increase, Say Rent Officials

WASHINGTON.—(AP)—Hundreds of thousands of landlords are filling out forms needed to increase rents—but that doesn't necessarily mean a general lifting of rent ceilings.

This double announcement came over the weekend from federal rent officials. They said:

1. At least 500,000 landlords already have taken out official forms to petition for a rent increase, and the government is printing an additional 400,000 application sheets to meet the demand.
2. The rush for such forms is due to the fact that, if an increase is granted to a landlord, it dates back to the time he filed his petition. However, each petition will be handled separately, for approval or rejection.

The new rent control law directs federal officials to set ceilings that will reflect a fair net operating income for landlords. Housing Expediter T. H. Hughes released his formula for determining such a fair income a week ago.

Tornado Unroofs School Gymnasium At Schuler, Okla.

SCHULER, OKLA.—(AP)—A tornado unroofed the high school gymnasium here Sunday night and destroyed three barns and some nearby crops. No casualties were reported.

A hailstorm followed the winds, with hailstones reported the size of golf balls. These did more crop and fruit damage, and broke windows.

The storm also damaged government-owned power lines running from Denison Dam on the Red River to Arkansas.

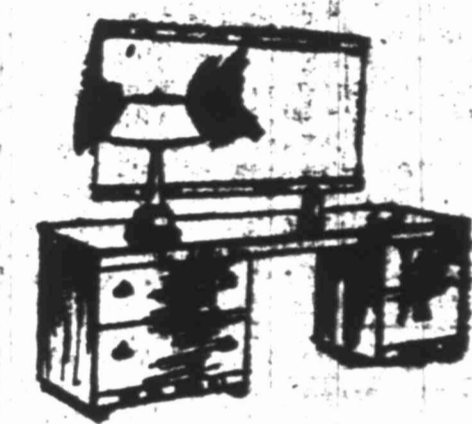

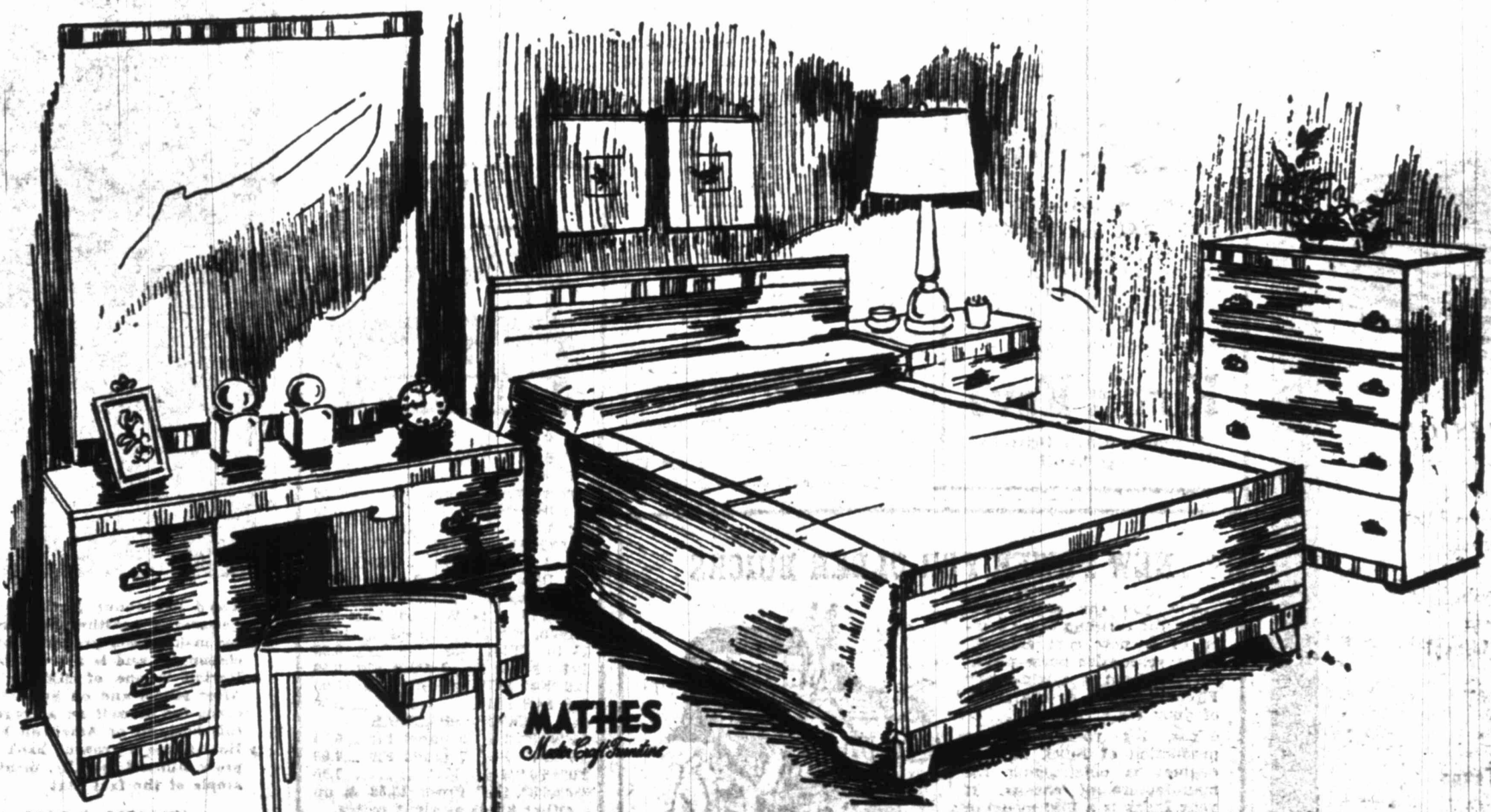

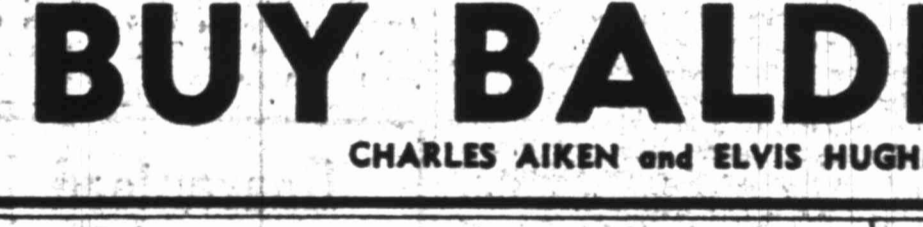
