



### After The Avalanche, What Next?

The disaster which wiped out a Peruvian village last week may kill more than the estimated 3,800 already dead. More avalanches are feared as snow melts in the high Andes mountains, and a typhoid epidemic threatens to break out at the scene of the disaster. Tons of ice, rocks and mud thundered down on a peaceful village, covering an area 10 miles long and a mile wide, burying farms, plantations and the entire village. Few escaped, and most of the dead were buried too deeply for recovery. The pictures at right help to tell the story of the tragedy. In the top photo, police, aided by a few survivors, attempt to identify some of the victims. In the center picture, Indian families sit near the caskets bearing the remains of friends and relatives. And in the lower photo, an Indian stands on a log near the edge of the sea of mud, looking for something to salvage from his home. In the background are boulders that rolled down in the avalanche.



### Dollar Flow In Bad Turn

WASHINGTON (AP)—The U.S. balance of payments situation took a sharp and unexpected turn for the worse in the last quarter of 1961.

Preliminary figures indicate that the payments deficit soared to an annual rate of about \$5 billion, not far from the peak rate of \$5.7 billion recorded a year earlier at the height of a rush by foreigners to buy American gold.

In the July-September quarter of last year the deficit rate was \$3.1 billion.

The deficit, in essence, represents the difference between the amount of money Americans spend, lend, invest and give away abroad and the lesser amount received from foreign sources.

The U.S. balance of payments is considered important because it has a direct impact on the strength and stability of the dollar, the principal Western currency.

The surprising change in the payments situation was disclosed over the weekend by informed sources, who also said the precise cause had not been determined.

### Soldier Must Know How To Die, Gen. Walker Says

DALLAS (AP)—"I am convinced that a soldier, to live a full life, must know how to live—and how to die," retired Maj. Gen. Edwin Walker said Monday. Addressing the Public Affairs Luncheon Club, he said it is a commander's duty to guide soldiers toward such a full life.

The Defense Department relieved Walker from command of the 24th Division in Germany on the ground his "pro blue" indoctrination program against communism sought to influence how his troops and their dependents voted. He rejected the offer of another post and resigned from the Army to speak in support of his views.

"I will go wherever the cause takes me," he told his audience of about 500.

Walker said the State Department failed to heed advice on foreign affairs from military leaders who forewarned of such coups as that which upset Adnan Menderes in Turkey.

"When (Vice President) Lyndon Johnson comes back to this country from Asia and says that changing the standard of living is the answer to communism, then he is badly misinformed," the former general said at another point.

Prior to his talk, the luncheon club adopted a resolution calling for the Senate Military Preparedness subcommittee to study "with specific care each and every aspect of the persons and incidents concerned with the removal of Gen. Edwin Walker and his Americanism program and with the is-

suance of this vindictive order of military censorship." In a voice trembling with emotion, he reached for a handkerchief and said of the resolution: "If the men of the 24th could hear you today—they would raise this roof."

American soldiers are proud of this country, he added, and "they are the greatest salesmen you have ever seen."

Walker's talk was sponsored by the Jane Douglas chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution and the American Legion's Metropolitan Post.

WASHINGTON (AP)—Beckville, Tex., will get a \$1,700 interest-free loan for planning a water system and sewer system estimated to cost \$135,000, the Community Facilities Administration said Monday.

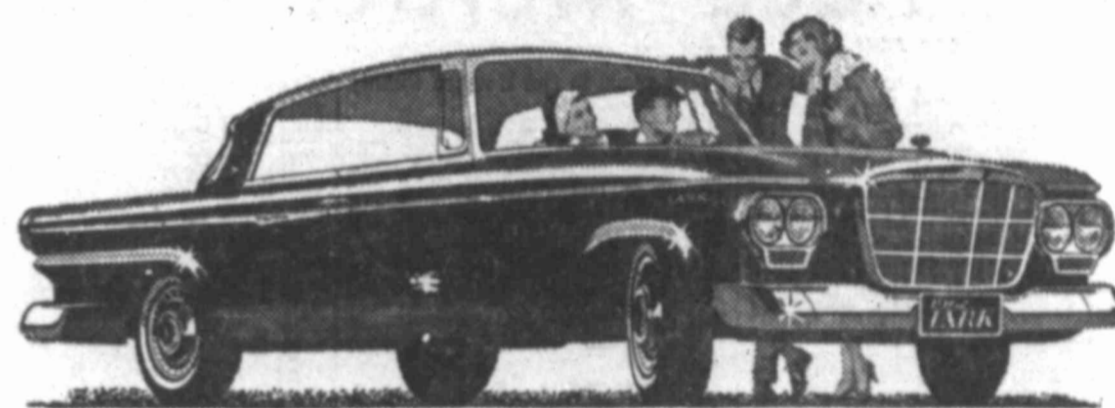

### Doctor Placed On Probation

FORT WORTH (AP)—The Texas State Board of Medical Examiners found a former University of Texas professor, Dr. Ira Jackson, 41, of Galveston guilty Sunday of habits of intemperance of narcotics and placed him on five years probation.

The board also found Dr. A. L. Hunter of Marlin, 81, guilty of prescribing amphetamine, barbiturates, narcotic derivative drugs and other compounds for which "he knew there was no therapeutic need."

Dr. Hunter's license was canceled, but the board order was stayed and he was placed on probation for one year. Dr. Jackson was placed on five years probation. Dr. M. H. Crabb, Fort Worth, secretary of the board, announced the action.

### Wilson Argues Against Water Rights Of Old Land Grants

AUSTIN (AP)—A court decision that holders of land dating back to old Spanish and Mexican grants can irrigate without limit could dry up vast lower Rio Grande Valley orchards, the attorney general says.

Atty. Gen. Will Wilson made this claim Monday during a post-submission argument to the Texas Supreme Court in a suit commonly called the Valmont Plantations case. The suit tests the rights of landowners to river water adjoining their property.

At a Jan. 9 submission before the court, lawyers for lower Rio Grande water users argued that Spanish and Mexican grants carried traditional irrigation rights. The water below Falcon Reservoir

is sought by valley irrigators, along with the right to store water in the reservoir for future use.

Wilson said in his argument that upstream riparians (owners of the traditional rights) hope to open vast Spanish grants, which now are ranchland, to irrigation and "suck the water out from under" the appropriation economy of the lower Rio Grande.

"There is not now enough water in the Rio Grande, nor will there ever be, to irrigate the presently irrigated lands plus all of the upstream Spanish and Mexican grants which front on the river and which are now ranch and pasture lands but which with modern machinery can be converted to irrigated farm lands," Wilson said.

"If this court sustains in those large ranches the right to irrigate without limitation as a matter of law from the managed flow of the Rio Grande, then certainly the vast orchards of the lower Rio Grande will die from lack of water because the upstream riparian with an unlimited right to irrigate 'has possession of his

enemy's castle' and can in times of shortage absolutely deprive the downstream owner of the right to water."

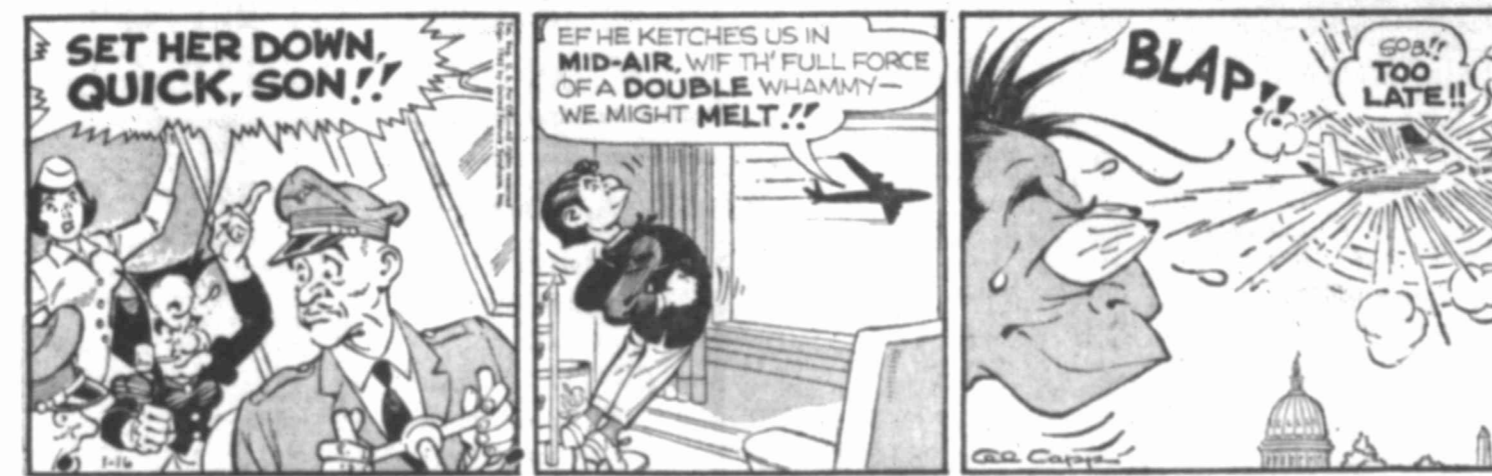

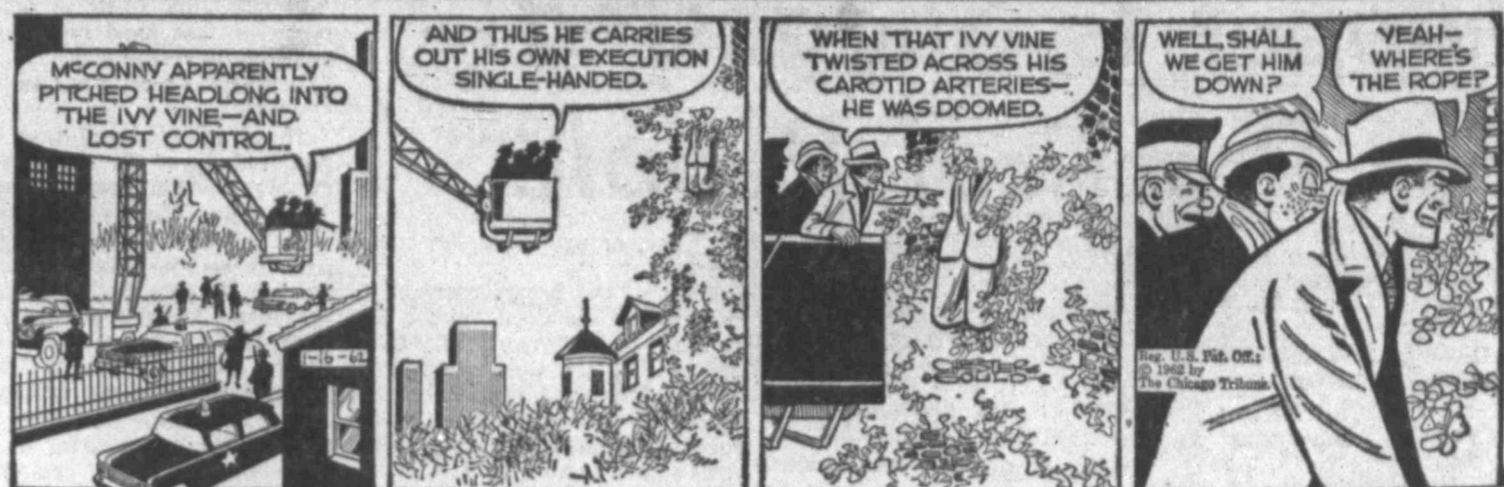

# County School Board Vote Due, But May Not Come Off

Supposedly Howard County voters will be called upon to elect three members to the Howard County School board in April. Actually, the way things now stand, no one is certain whether there will be an election or not. Walker Bailey, county superintendent, said that this county and other counties in the state have been thrown into a state of confusion by a recent ruling of the attorney general dealing with the membership and tenure of office of county school board members. He said that it all began back in 1955 when the state legislature passed a law making all county officials' terms of four-year duration instead of two years as they had been in the past. The law, as drawn, listed the offices but did not specifically designate the county school board members. It had been assumed by most counties, therefore, that the county school board members were serving on two year term schedules. Here in Howard County, for example, two members were elected one year and three the

following year. Last year, the county returned J. D. Gilmore and Fred Roman to the school board. Technically, (if the old plan was followed) Truman Jones, Jack Cook's and Jim Lewis' terms would expire this year and their posts would have to be filled at the April election. But, things have changed.

### Police Report Little Activity

### City Employs Extra Men To Help Fix Pipes

The water division, of the Big Spring public works department, is putting on three extra men to help in restoring normal water service following the freeze damage to water mains last week.

Bruce Dunn, director of public works, said pipes and mains were breaking pretty fast through Monday, but that no new breaks had appeared Tuesday morning. Lee Nuckles, water distribution superintendent, said that his crews had answered 58 calls for water shut-offs or checks for freezing; 36 minor water line and service repairs; 64 major water line repairs; and 20 calls to thaw lines and restore service. These did not include calls made through the meter department.

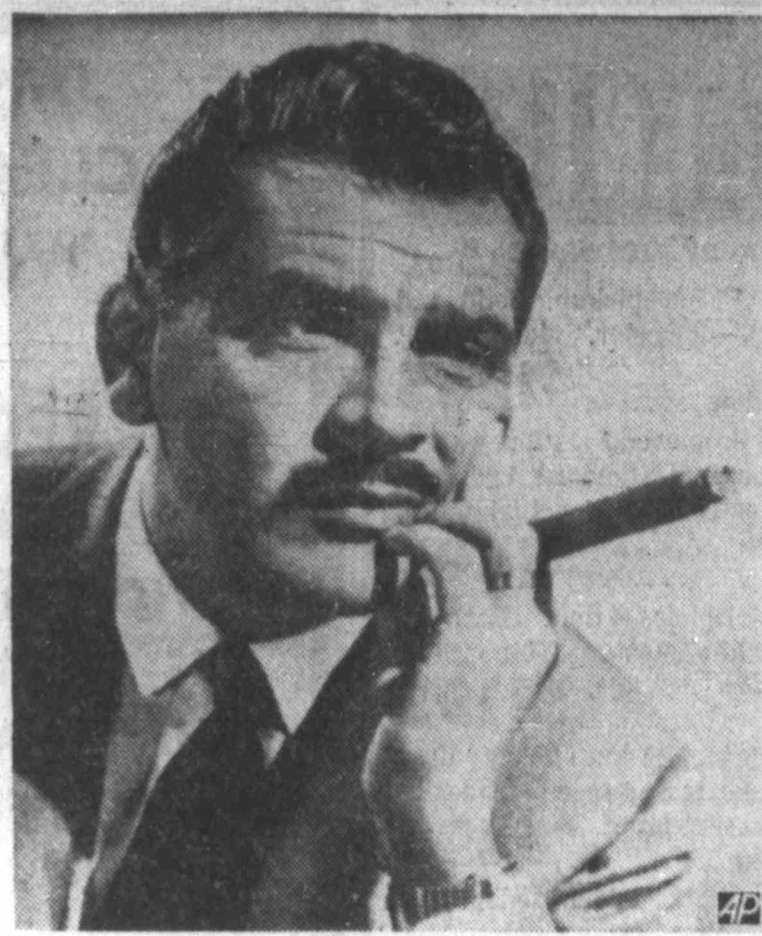

**Catholics Aim At Paganism**

VATICAN CITY (AP)—The Roman Catholic Church ecumenical council will take a firm stand against rising currents of paganism, a communique announced. The communique was issued by the council's central preparatory commission at its third session.

The commission did not mention communism by name. But Vatican sources said that the communique indicated that atheistic communism would be included in the council's condemnation of paganism.

Officially proclaimed by Pope John XXIII on Christmas Day, the council will be convened late this year. The exact date has not been set. The council will bring to Rome about 3,000 cardinals, patriarchs, archbishops, bishops, priests and specialists in church matters.

The council will be dedicated to affairs of the Roman Catholic Church, but Pope John has frequently expressed the hope that it also will serve as a step toward world Christian unity.

At the conclusion of a secret session, the commission issued its communique saying the forthcoming council will condemn rising currents of paganism, including those which "by abusing psychoanalysis attempt to justify what is directly in contrast with the moral order."

The commission session, said the communique, recalled the words of the late Pope Pius XII on moral disorientation: "The greatest sin of our times is that of no longer believing in sin."

This, said the communique, results in error concerning the moral order dependent upon God and even in denial of the existence of God.

**Medics May Quit Blue Shield**

ROCHESTER, N.Y. (AP)—More than 120 internal medicine specialists have submitted their resignations from Blue Shield.

The resignations will become effective in 13 months unless Blue Shield accepts a proposal for an independent study of the fee schedule.

The Rochester Society of Internal Medicine, which represents most of the resigning physicians, charges that serious inequities exist in the Blue Shield fee structure. The charge was formalized last Nov. 15 at a public hearing requested by Blue Shield for a rate increase. The increase subsequently was granted.

The internists contend the fees do not consistently relate to the physician's training, skill and experience. They say they have fruitfully sought correction for five years.

They cited the same \$60 fee for gastro-intestinal examination taking 30 minutes and a cardiac treatment preceding heart surgery taking 30 hours.

If the resignations become effective, the internists say they will help patients avoid hardship and assist them in finding new insurance.

**Man Jailed Here For Car Theft**

Ralph William McCommas, 20, of Arlington, was arrested on Sunday afternoon by Kellas Davis, highway patrol, and jailed on a charge that he had a stolen car in his possession.

Davis said that McCommas made a detailed statement relative to the car. He said he stole it in Arlington, placed \$3 worth of gas in it, and started West. En route he was hailed by a highway patrol officer who said he had been driving too fast and warned him to drive slower.

Davis said that the patrol officer who stopped McCommas for speeding later was informed the car was stolen and relayed the information on to Big Spring.

Davis encountered the young man in the car one mile east of Big Spring on IS 20 and brought him to the county jail.

**Convalescent Home Approved**

Approval of site has been granted by FHA for a convalescent home proposed here by Bruce Frazier.

The State Health Department also has given its approval of plans for a 100-bed layout.

The next step, said Frazier, is for the submission of preliminary plans. The basic sketches were approved at a conference during the past weekend, and Gary and Hohertz are now pressing for completion of the preliminary plans. If and when they are approved, the way would be opened for letting of bids.

Previously Frazier had announced plans for the layout which would be near the Kentwood addition in southeastern Big Spring.

**Daniel Grants Execution Stay**

AUSTIN (AP)—Gov. Price Daniel granted a customary 30-day stay of execution Monday for convicted murderer Donald Wilson.

Wilson, 21, was convicted in the Nov. 29, 1960, slaying of James Layland, 78, on his farm near Cleburne.

The stay moves the execution from Feb. 13 back to March 17.

**Portugal Faces Attacks In U.N. On Angola Policy**

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP)—Portugal faced bitter attacks from the Communist and African blocs today as foes of her policy in Angola pressed for condemnation and possible punitive measures by the United Nations.

Poland, cosponsor with Bulgaria of a resolution calling on the Security Council to consider harsh penalties against the Lisbon government, was slated to take the floor as the 104-nation General Assembly's Angola debate went into its second day.

The former French Congo also was expected to blast Portugal's administration of Angola and to demand freedom for the West African territory.

Informed sources expressed belief the African group would not discuss penalties against Portugal but would limit its proposal to a call for condemnation and a demand for Angola's independence.

Any resolution will need Western support to ensure the two-thirds majority required for adoption. The United States reportedly has made clear it does not favor any call for economic sanctions against its NATO ally.

Diplomats said U.S. delegates had told them the United States wants to see a moderate resolution which would prod Portugal to grant self-determination for Angola.

Portuguese Ambassador Vasco Vieira Garin walked out of the debate with his delegation Monday and said he would take no part in discussions of charges of Portuguese terrorism in Angola.
