Prosperous Sweden Worries Over Future

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP) — High prosperity and full employment are what you find in Sweden today. But there is creeping inflation, too, and the nation is gripped by fear that the good time it has enjoyed since World War II may be replaced by a hard fight for economic survival.

For prosperous Sweden faces the prospect that it may be isolated from the booming European community developing from the Common Market. This could lead to a political and economic crisis here.

What will happen if this nation of 7 1/2 million is excluded from the six-nation Common Market which may eventually embrace Britain and other countries?

Heartsearching questions and comments come from steel and farm workers and from bankers and industrialists reflecting the acute concern of Swedes over this prospect.

"Will there be a crisis and will I lose my job?"

"Many small industries will be killed off and the big industries will be hard hit."

"Sweden will be squeezed in the middle. Norway and Denmark will be trading with the West and Finland has heavy trade with the East. We'll be caught in the middle."

"Our living standard depends on our exports. Sweden will be weakened if it cannot play a part in the development of the continent."

"If Sweden is kept out of the Common Market, fruitful Nordic cooperation, which has been developing since the end of World War II, might come to an abrupt end. We would face a lonely future."

Sweden, like neutral Austria and Switzerland, is seeking association with the Common Market. But there is opposition, because these countries are politically neutral. There is some concern in West Europe that any such association would dilute the political aspects of the treaty of Rome, the charter of the Common Market.

Some West European leaders insist the neutrals cannot have it both ways. They cannot benefit from economic integration without accepting the drastic limitations accepted by the other Common Market partners to sovereignty in commerce.

So the outlook for the three neutrals to win associate membership in the Common Market is

doubtful. And Sweden thus faces the prospect of isolation from the economic community that may one day embrace close to 300 million persons.

If Sweden is left outside the Common Market, its industries will face higher tariffs on a large part of their exports.

Sweden's agriculture similarly would be hit. Nearly 80 per cent of Sweden's exports of agricultural products go to West Europe. The Common Market countries alone take 40 per cent.

So Sweden will pursue the quest for associate membership in the growing West European Trade Bloc. But all political parties agree this country will not apply for full membership involving acceptance of political obligations.

Sweden, a neutral since 1815, considers its neutrality the bulwark of peace and political balance in the Nordic area. Premier

Tage Erlander's government maintains that any change, however small, of Sweden's present foreign policy might lead to a change of the status quo in Scandinavia. In the government's view, this neutrality helps Finland to maintain its delicate position between East and West.

There is no doubt that the Swedes, if they must choose between the Common Market and neutrality, will take neutrality and with it an economic isolation almost as acute as that of the country during World War II. If this happen, one astute observer predicts: "Sweden will become more and more leftist in its domestic policies if a hard fight for economic survival develops outside the Common Market. Big government will become bigger. Huge public works projects probably will become necessary to sustain employment."

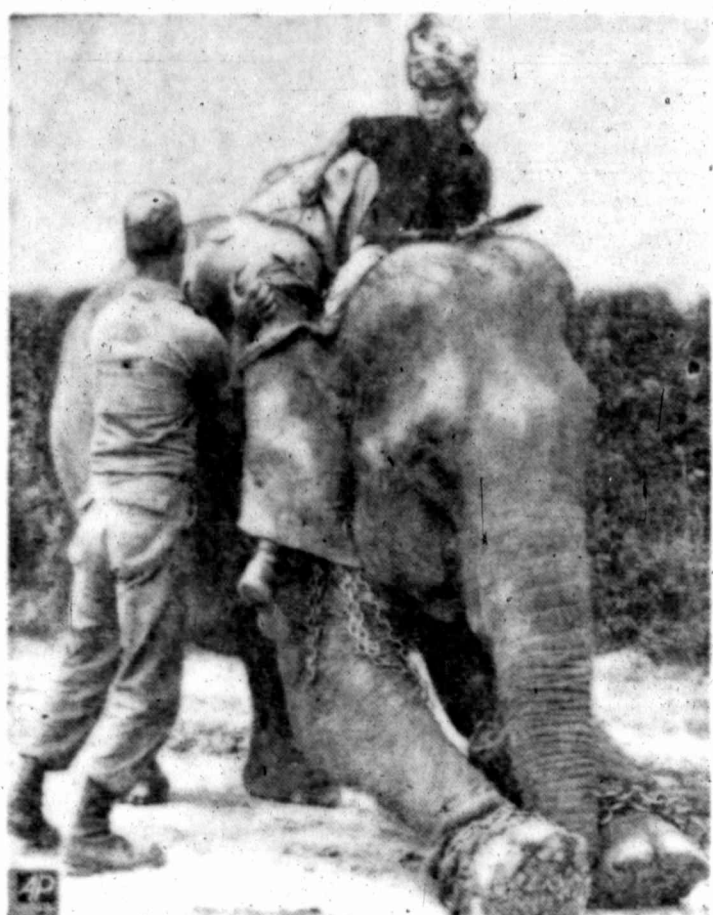

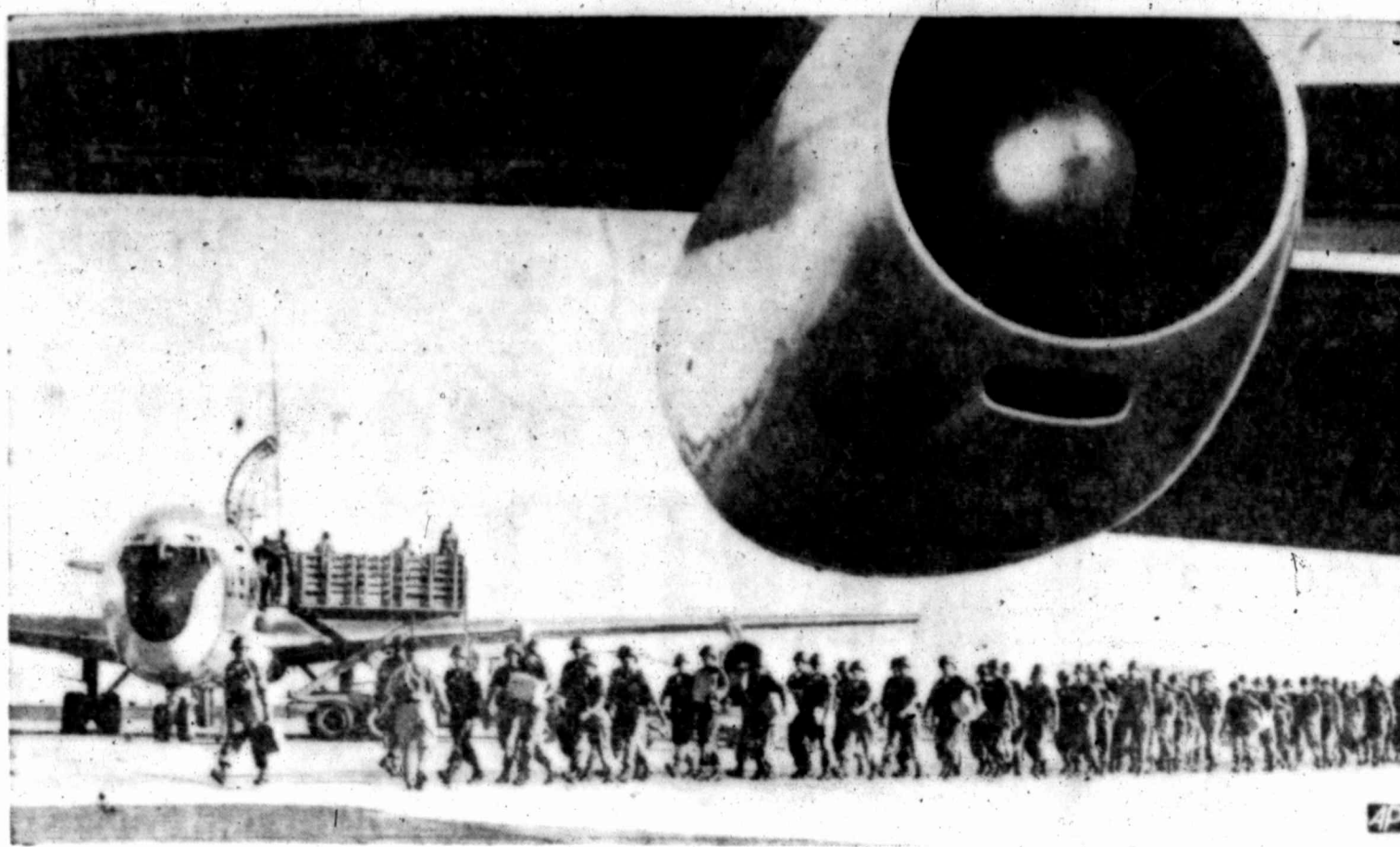

DE, ICT Students Urged To Report

Juniors and seniors in Big Spring High School interested in either the Distributive Education or the Industrial Cooperative Training programs are urged to report as soon as possible in Room 129 senior high school building.

The office will be open for enrollment of students from 9 a.m. to noon daily.

George Rice, coordinator for the Distributive Education program, and Louis R. Maneely, who directs the ICT program, point out that it is urgent action be taken at once.

Rice, who is starting his third year as coordinator of the DE program in the local school, said that 41 boys and girls enrolled in the program last year.

The project offers excellent opportunities, he said, "to learn and earn." Occupations are in the distributive fields—retailing, wholesaling and service selling.

Students are also enrolled in DE classes in such areas as school and business relationships; mathematics in distribution; communications in distribution; and specialized training in specific job areas with the assistance of the employers.

Maneely explained that the ICT

program is designed to meet the needs of those students who are interested in learning a skilled trade. These trades and crafts are limited to those approved by the Texas Education Agency for which a bona fide training plan can be made.

These occupations include: Auto mechanics, sheet metal work, electrical trades, motor rewinding, house wiring, refrigeration, welding, plumbing, carpentry, cabinet making, dental technician and nurses aides.

Blough Urges Income Tax Cut

NEW YORK (AP)—Roger M. Blough says a cut in federal income taxes would help sagging steel industry profits by freeing more money to put into plant modernization.

Blough, board chairman of U.S. Steel Corp., the No. 1 producer, also favors a cut in federal spending. He praises Defense Department efforts in this direction.

Ever since major steel companies were balked in an attempt to make a price rise stick in April, Blough has argued strongly for increased investment in steelmaking equipment as an answer to stiffening competition from abroad and new materials at home.

ROCKING THE BOAT. By Gore Vidal. Little, Brown. \$5

There are essays on politics, writing and the theater, covering a span of 15 years, in this collection of pieces by one of the Bright Boys of American letters.

Vidal's position on politics is summed up by his statement that in this country there are only two political groups, the conservatives and the reactionaries.

In covering the fields of books and the stage, he has a nice asuring style and a viewpoint flavored somewhat as the juice of the grape is flavored with herbs to create vermouth.

His forte is the smart, somewhat condescending twist of phrase that may remind older readers of the wits of the Algonquin Round Table.

Clearly, he has some interesting things to say.

One of these essays is "Barry Goldwater: A Chat," which deserves reprinting from a magazine, as an interesting specimen

of how a liberal reacts to a conservative.

Having been a novelist at an early age, then a writer for television and the stage, and more recently a political candidate, Vidal has been sufficiently involved in the current scene to have a good many sophisticated things to say about his favorite themes.

We must credit him with using a commendable device in preparing these essays for book publication. To many of them he has appended footnotes that display frank and refreshing hindsight—such as the one attached to "Writing Plays for Television," which begins, "I was wrong about everything."

And even though he believes the large audience is deserting the novel for such things as television, he himself has decided to return to the novel as the best form of expression.

It just goes to show that even the Bright Boys can adapt themselves to what they perceive to be the realities. That's one reason why this book provides some bright moments for us naive readers.

Kennedy Defends Policy Before Brazilian Students

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Kennedy told a group of Brazilian graduate students that anyone who desires war in these days is insane.

Kennedy made the comment in reply to a student's statement that while the United States talks peace, it makes preparations for war. The student said that instead of war preparations the government should be orienting the conscience of the people for peace.

Kennedy replied that he had made it very clear in the past that there would be no winner of the next war if nuclear weapons are used.

Furthermore, Kennedy said, he

was not aware of any action taken by the United States since World War II that was not in the direction of security.

He emphasized that the United States has long sought a nuclear test ban and general disarmament with inspection safeguards.

Kennedy addressed the students on the White House south lawn, and submitted to questioning.

The first questioner asked what would be the United States' reaction to socialization of production in Brazil to improve living standards.

Kennedy answered by saying that decision was up to Brazil provided it was made by free choice. Kennedy said, however, that he feels a competitive economy is best for this country.

"What we are against is tyranny," he said.

ST. LOUIS (AP)—Members of the AFL-CIO Aluminum Workers International Union, demanding greater protection from automation, struck the nation's two largest producers of aluminum today.

Borger Is Hit By Flash Flooding

Thunderstorms or showers persisted Wednesday in the Panhandle-Plains of West Texas, where Borger was hit by flash flooding the night before.

Skies were clear elsewhere over the state, and new outbreaks of grass fires troubled residents of parched Central Texas.

At Borger, a 2½-inch downpour within a few minutes sent water racing through some streets and swept a car carrying Mrs. Barbara Morrow 100 yards down a small arroyo. Hospital attendants said her injuries did not appear serious.

Wind up to 65 miles per hour in gusts accompanied the rain at Borger, which received 6½ inches only the day before. Rocks washed into several streets and water backed into a few homes from overtaxed storm sewers. Power failed in parts of the city.

The giant thunderstorm rumbled on east from Borger to Pampa and across the Oklahoma line. It pelted Pampa with hail as big as golf balls, causing damage to automobiles. One gage in Pampa caught 1.20 inches of rain in 15 minutes.

Isolated showers dotted other parts of the Texas Panhandle during the night and extended into the south part of the High Plains by early morning.

In Central Texas, a range fire controlled after charring 8,000 acres flared again late Tuesday

about 12 miles west of Austin between U.S. 283 and Fredericksburg Road. About 125 firefighters turned out to battle the blaze.

Volunteers fought another grass fire near La Grange.

Austin marked the end of its first rainless July since 1900. Scorching temperatures continued at numerous other points.

Top marks Tuesday included Presidio 106 degrees, Laredo 104, San Angelo 103, Junction and Lukin 102, College Station, San Antonio and Waco 101 and Austin 100. Dalhart recorded a high of 83.

Forecasts promised more showers and thunderstorms in the Panhandle-Plains through Wednesday night, and thunder-showers spreading into North Central and Northeast Texas by Thursday. Clear to partly cloudy and hot weather was predicted in other sections.

Temperatures early Wednesday ranged from 63 at Dalhart up to 82 at Galveston and Palacios.
